SB1806 (Curriculum Committee) Proposal for a new course NURS 420

NURS 420 Comprehensive Pain Management

3 credit hours

Prerequisites: NURS 210, 215, 221, 301, 302, 305, 306 or permission of the professor,

This course emphasizes the development of the nurse as an advocate pertaining to pain management. Areas of study include societal bias, ethnic and gender biases related to pain management, ethical and legal considerations, and the nurse's role in the development of a therapeutic culture for pain management. This course will establish a sound foundation for nurses to take a leadership role in pain management.

<u>SB1805</u> (General Education Committee) Integrative credit will be applied to the following courses: THEA 450, ENGL 442 and SPAN 324.

THEA 450 Musical Theatre Performance - 3 hours

(Offered fall semester only) Prerequisite: THEA 220

The history, development, and performance of musical theater as an art from the late 19th Century to the present.

ENGL 442 Musical Theatre - 3 hours

(Offered spring semester)

This course is a survey of the history of musical theatre, beginning with Vaudeville and continuing through to the contemporary stage, with special emphasis given not only to the text but to the performance aspect of the libretto as well.

SPAN 324 Christianity in Latin America - 3 hours

Features Christianity in Latin American Culture from a historical and literary perspective that will include indigenous religions, the Catholic Church and the recent explosive growth of Protestantism.

(1st Read)

<u>SB1807</u> (General Education Committee) ARTS 105 will be allowed to satisfy the General Education elective requirement.

ARTS 105 Art Appreciation - 3 hours

Development of the satisfying discourse between the student and the work of art, employing a selective survey of major achievements and movements in the visual art of Western civilization.
