**New Business** 

**SB 2003** - New Course in English: ENGL 341 (American Realism & Naturalism)

#### ENGL 341 (American Realism & Naturalism), 3hrs.

A study of the major writers of American Realism & Naturalism (1865-1930): Twain, James, Chopin, Crane, Dreiser, and others. Prerequisites: ENGL 101, 102 and the general education course in literature. (**First Read**)

#### **SB 2004** - New Course in Sports Management: SMGT 307 (Coaching Fall Sports)

#### SMGT 307, Coaching Fall Sports, 3hrs.

This course will function as an orientation to the coaching and management of specific individual and team sports. Furthermore, the course is designed to evaluate the knowledge and skill proficiencies (competencies) of coaching minors in selected sport and activities. The sports covered in this course are volleyball, cross country/track and field, soccer, and ice hockey. Prerequisites: Coaching minors must have completed SMGT 300. All non-coaching minors must obtain the consent of the instructor. (First Read)

#### **SB 2005** - New Course in Sports Management: SMGT 308 (Coaching Spring Sports)

#### SMGT 308, Coaching Spring Sports, 3hrs.

This course will function as an orientation to the coaching of specific individual and team sports. Furthermore, it is designed to evaluate the knowledge and skill proficiencies (competencies) of coaching minors in selected sport and activities. The sports covered in this course are wrestling, tennis, baseball/softball, and golf. Prerequisites: Coaching minors must have completed SMGT 300 and SMGT 307. All non-coaching minors must obtain the consent of the instructor. (First Read)

#### **SB 2006** - New Course in Sports Management: SMGT 312 (Sport Ministry)

#### SMGT 312, Sport Ministry, 3hrs.

This course will provide an explanation of the similarities and differences between sport and religion, the historical development and impact of muscular Christianity in North America, the use of sport as a ministry tool, the Biblical basis for sport ministry, the legal issues impacting sport and religion, and practical tools and guidelines for preparing, organizing and administering a sport ministry program. Prerequisites: SMGT 312 is open to all students who wish to use sport for ministry. However, Sport Management majors must have completed SMGT 200 and SMGT 201. (First Read)
