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
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Step 9: Will of God for the Disciple

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DISCERNING THE WILL OF GOD

Salvation IS a living relationship with a Person who loves us and wants the best for our lives. God not only gives us eternal life but He also gives us clear and daily direction in this life.

In **Romans 2:18** How do we know the will of God? _____

The “law” refers to the Bible, especially the Old Testament. We must be instructed by the “law” in order to know the will of God, and we must be committed to know the Word in order to be sure of making right decisions.

THE GENERAL PLAN FOR OUR LIVES

Many of us have wrong concepts about the character and personality of God. Because we sometimes think that God only wants to punish us or that He really is not interested in us, we tend to be afraid of yielding complete control to Him. How does **Jeremiah (29:11)** express God’s attitude toward us? _____

God does want all the best for us: “...plans to prosper you...to give you hope and a future”. This verse encourages us to trust in God and be obedient to His will because His purpose is to benefit us. What are the three adjectives that Paul used to describe the will of God in **Romans 12:2**?

God’s plan for us is not only good, but it is also “agreeable”. This Word means “good, fulfilling, and delightful.” God’s will is designed to give us purpose and fulfillment. What is the result of obeying the will of God as we see it in **John 15:11**? _____

For the obedient believer God’s will brings joy. The third adjective in **Romans 12:2** is “perfect.” This implies that God’s plan will surely fulfill His purpose for us. In **Ephesians 2:10** there are several important concepts:

His "workmanship" prepared us to place us in His plan "in advance". Any other plan is secondary. Can you see why it is important to get involved in His plan from the beginning of your Christian life?

PROMISES CONCERNING THE WILL OF GOD

God's specific will for your life happens as you apply biblical truths in your daily living. A life lived in daily obedience is a life lived in the "will of God. These promises will give you confidence to follow the Lord's will:

★ God has promised us specific direction.

He wants us to feel secure in the knowledge of His will in each situation that may come. Read these verses:

Psalms 25:8-10 To whom does God promise His direction? _____

A **meek** person is one who can be controlled by his superior, one who voluntarily puts himself under another's authority. The promise is for **understanding and judgment** (wisdom to make decisions).

★ God has promised to give us WISDOM to discover His will.

He does not want to hide his will from us, but neither does he make it too obvious. Only a person truly interested and committed will take the time to investigate the information the Lord has left us. Read Proverbs 2:1-4. Write the eight verbs that describe this kind of investigation:

Getting wisdom (knowing His will) requires Accepting it, Storing it, Listening to it, Applying it, Calling out for it, Crying out for it, Looking for it and Searching for it in the Scriptures.. That is to say, discovering the will of God

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requires **committing yourself to the Word of God**. What does God promise in James 1:5? _____

"Wisdom" comes as we learn the principles of the Word, and use "spiritual intelligence" as we apply these to our daily lives.

★ God has promised to work in us so that we desire to do His will.

God is engineering our lives long before it is time to make a decision. Read **Philippians 2:13**. What does God promise to do in us? _____

He will help us "to will and to do" as He prepares us to accomplish what He wants. God can transform us as we delight ourselves in Him. Read **Psalms 37:4**. If we delight ourselves in the Lord, what does He promise? _____

★ God has promised to correct us when we fail to do His will.

Read **Colossians 3:15**. The peace of God does not cause us to know the will of God, but it will be the result of obeying God's Word. What will we lose if we disobey His will? _____

That which will govern our hearts and lives is the peace of God. The word "*govern*", in Greek means "the decision making authority of a judge in an athletic event". We are to protect the unity and bond of peace in the church at all costs to us and our rights.

STEPS FOR FINDING THE WILL OF GOD

Life is a series of decisions made for different motives and objectives for which the Bible helps us control our attitudes and goals. These steps will help you in making those decisions according to God's will.

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STEP #1: PRESENT YOUR BODY TO THE LORD AS A LIVING SACRIFICE

We humans have a tendency to be egotistical and selfish. In the Old Testament, God asked his people to sacrifice the best of their flocks and other possessions. In the New Testament, He asks us to sacrifice our bodies. In **Romans 12:1** what should motivate us to be a “*living sacrifice*”? _____

The more you recognize how great is God’s pardon and mercy toward sinners, the easier it will be to yield to Jesus the direction of your life.

Being a “*living sacrifice*” is **giving yourself to the Lord**. Once we have allowed Christ to govern our lives, we are committed to the “*will of God*”, revealed in His Word.

STEP #5: BE CONSTANT IN PRAYER

God does not want us to be anxious in regard to the future. In **Philippians 4:6**, what should we do to avoid worry? _____

In prayer we can express our trust, consciously leaving the future or the consequences of our obedience in the hands of our sovereign God. This verse not only teaches us to bring our petitions to God, but also our _____?

The more we give thanks in the circumstances of life, the more God will “guard” our hearts and minds (vs. 7). Through prayer we experience the freedom from the tension of being responsible for the direction of our lives.

We find another principle in 2 Thessalonians 1:11. Who is praying for whom?

34. Paul’s team prayed regularly for the Thessalonians. He prayed that they would be “worthy” and that God would “fulfill every good purpose” of theirs and every act prompted by their faith. This is the principle: while others pray for you that God would work powerfully in your life, you should be praying for them. **WE ALL NEED OTHERS TO PRAY FOR US AND WE FOR THEM.**

35. **Conclusion:** We have the tendency to want to know God’s great purpose for us, to see if we want what He wants. The person with this attitude will not be able to know the will of God.

If God is God, and He is, , He expects us to commit to obey Him without knowing where He will take us. When we prove our obedience in small things, then God will guide us into His will in big and more important things.

In the meantime, God wants us to invest in the lives of others, building them up in the things of the Lord and evangelizing those who do not know Him.
