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Description

A survey of the intellectual, political, economic, social, aesthetic, legal, ecclesiastical, and international political patterns of American civilization from the Civil War to the present. The course objectives are as follows:

- 1. To provide the student with a basic framework for understanding and evaluating the people, events, circumstances, and institutions that have helped shape American history and culture.
- 2. To develop skills in historical research and evaluation.
- 3. To encourage the student to affirm and apply Christian principles by developing a consciously biblical understanding of history as the outworking of God's eternal purpose.

Requirements and Grades

- 1. Each student is responsible for <u>all</u> assigned readings in the textbooks and supplementary materials.
- Everyone is expected to keep a looseleaf notebook for lecture notes, study sheets, and supplementary readings.
- 3. Regular attendance is expected. Students who miss more than nine hours will lose one full grade. Those who miss more than twelve hours will receive a failing grade.
- 4. Four exams are scheduled during regular classroom hours. Each 100 point exam represents one-quarter of the final grade. Grading scale: 90-100 = A, 80-89 = B, 70-79 = C, 60-69 = D, below 60 = F.
- 5. Each student who attends special lectures by Herbert Schlossberg or other special guest speakers will receive five points extra credit per lecture up to a maximum of ten points.
- 6. Ten points extra credit is also available to students who plan and take part in public policy panel discussions during the last week.
