Eager to avoid long lines in August, nearly 1,000 incoming students and their parents attended the first in a series of Early Orientation sessions at Liberty University on Friday.

Mark Etheridge plans on studying in the School of Religion — and he's enthusiastic about coming to LU.

"I felt like it's the best place to get prepared for ministry, and I felt like that's where God wanted me," he said.
