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





# Comprehension



Test scores indicate that our students are proficient in LITERAL comprehension but they are weak in INFERENTIAL comprehension

*But literal questions are used more frequently in class*


Failing to remember things is a problem that plagues most of us. We forget to perform routine tasks like stopping at a grocery store on the way home or picking up dry cleaning. Worse still, we may forget important information such as a new student's name. Fortunately, there are some reasonable solutions to our forgetfulness.

**1. What is a problem that plagues most of us?**

**LITERAL** - *“Put your finger on the answer”*

**2. What audience is being addressed?**

**INFERENTIAL** - *“Put your finger on the CLUES”*


