ARTICLE TWO

ADAM	CHRIST
Made in the image of God (Gen. 1:26, 27)	Made in the image of man (John 1:14)
Was given authority over all creation (Gen. 1:28)	Will be given authority over all creation (Rev. 11:15)
• Was given a wife—Eve (Gen. 2:21-25)	 Will be given a wife — the church (2 Cor. 11:2; Rev. 19:7-9)
 Was subjected to a 3-fold temptation by Satan (Gen. 3:1-5) 	 Was subjected to a 3-fold temptation by Satan (Matt. 4:1-11)
 His temptation occurred in a beautiful Garden (Gen. 2:8-14) 	His temptation occurred in a desolate wilderness (Matt. 4:1)
 He was totally defeated by the temptation (Gen. 3:6) 	He was totally victorious over the temptation (Heb. 4:15)
Adam came from the dust of the earth and possessed a natural, corruptible body (1 Cor. 15:47-49)	Christ came from above and possessed a supernatural, incorruptible body (1 Cor. 15:47-49)
Adam introduced sin and death into the world because he disobeyed God. This he passed on to all his descendants. (Rom. 5:12-14; 1 Cor. 15:22a)	 Christ introduced righteousness and life into the world because he obeyed God. This he passes on to all who believe in him. (Rom. 5:15-19; 1 Cor. 15:22b)
His sin brought a curse upon all nature (Gen. 3:18; Rom. 8:20)	His sacrifice will eventually eliminate that curse (Gal. 3:13; Rev. 22:3)
 His sin prevented access to the tree of life in the original paradise (Gen. 3:22-24) 	 His sacrifice will permit access to the tree of life in the eternal paradise (Rev. 22:2)
