ARTICLE FIVE PARAGRAPHS OF THE BIBLE—EXODUS 1-11

ONE

- A. Persecution under a new Pharaoh who "knew not Joseph!" (1:1-14)
- B. Godly individuals and the growth of Israel (1:15-22)

TWO

- A. He was set afloat at three months (2:1-3)
- B. Rescued, raised, and named by a princess (2:4-10)
- C. Hostility from the very Hebrew he had helped (2:11-14)
- D. He married one of the seven and became a shepherd (2:15-22)
- E. They groaned and cried; he heard and remembered (2:23-25)

THREE

- A. It burned without burning up (3:1-3)
- B. "Here's the situation: I've heard them, so I'm sending you!" (3:4-10)
- C. Excuses and more excuses! (3:11-15)
- D. He was to meet the elders in Egypt (3:16-18)
- E. After some grief they'll leave with much gold (3:19-22)

FOUR

- A. He was to show the serpent and leprosy signs first! Then, if needed, turn water into blood (4:1-9)
- B. "I will be with you and Aaron will speak for you!" (4:10-17)
- C. En route he is nearly killed (4:18-26)
- D. They welcomed the brothers and worshipped together (4:27-31)

FIVE

- A. "I don't recognize this God, so why should I release His people?" (5:1-5)
- B. Make them sweat! No more straw! (5:6-13)
- C. "A curse upon you! Conditions are now far worse!" (5:14-21)
- D. He felt God had failed him (5:22-23)

SIX

A. He was Abraham's God! He would bring them back to Abraham's land! (6:1-8)

- B. The message was reported but not received (6:9-12)
- C. Families of the first three: Reuben, Simeon, and Levi (6:13-20)

SEVEN

- A. He was eighty, his brother eighty-three (7:1-7)
- B. They matched his first miracle, but not his second! (7:8-14)
- C. He beat the water! It turned into blood! (7:15-21)
- D. They did the same, so his heart remained the same! (7:22-24)

EIGHT

- A. Frogs! Filling Egypt from the Nile to their kneading bowls! (8:1-15)
- B. Gnats! Attacking both animals and men! (8:16-19)
- C. Flies! Dense swarms in every home! (8:20-32)

NINE

- A. Livestock plague! The fields were filled with dead animals! (9:1-7)
- B. Boils! They spread as a fine dust! (9:8-12)
- C. Hail! Accompanied by thunder and lightning! (9:13-35)

TEN

- A. Locusts! They came with the wind; they covered the sun! (10:1-20)
- B. Darkness! A seventy-two hour blackout that could be felt! (10:21-23)
- C. Their final meeting (10:24-29)

ELEVEN

- A. One more would do it—their firstborn would die! (11:1-3)
- B. Not only humans, but also animals! (11:4-10)
