- E. They cried out and the wall fell down! (6:20-25)
- F. Warning! Death to one's oldest and youngest (6:26-27)

SEVEN

- A. The thief from Judah (7:1)
- B. Thirty-six died due to his sin (7:2-5)
- C. He fell on the ground and complained to God (7:6-9)
- D. "Quit crying! There's a crook in the camp!" (7:10-12)
- E. "Sanctify yourselves and begin the search" (7:13-15)
- F. He was caught and he confessed (7:16-23)
- G. Stoned and burned because of sin (7:24-26)

EIGHT
