- C. Wisdom is better, but not for long (2:12-16)
- D. The worthless will inherit the wealth you worked for (2:17-23)
- E. Enjoy your food and work! They are gifts from God (2:24-26)

THREE

- A. You name it; there's a time for it! (3:1-8)
- B. Eternity in our hearts, for He is eternal (3:9-15)
- C. In a way, men are no better than beasts! (3:16-22)
