Elmer Towns knows a lot about the names of God. He has lectured on the names of each of the three persons of the Godhead, and written three best selling books on them, *The Names of Jesus, My Father's Names*, and *The Names of the Holy Spirit*. The last book won the Gold Medallion award from the Christian Booksellers and Christian publishers in 1996 (available on www.elmertowns.com). He has compiled the most extensive lists of the names of God (see Appendices) and now I'm excited about this daily devotional on 365 names of God in the Bible.

Towns wrote the first three books to give us information on God's names and help us understand the nature of God from His names. Many people used these books in their Bible studies or Sunday school classes. Now in this devotional he writes to our hearts, so we can feel and apply God to our everyday living. Through the names of God, we can touch God each day in a new and different way; but most importantly, God can touch us daily.

This book could be called *Talking To God on A First-Name Basis*, because it contains prayers for you to talk to God—using one of His personal names each day. This book can be an exciting journey into knowing God more intimately through His many names.

Towns' prayed that he would be anointed to write a book where readers could feel the presence of God. I believe God has answered his prayer because I felt the presence of God as I read these devotionals and talked personally to each Person of the Godhead.

JEHOVAH ROI (THE LORD, MY SHEPHERD)—TRINITY

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want" (Psalm 23:1).

The Lord is your *Shepherd*; He can lead you to green pastures where you can lie down for rest.

There can feed on green grass to regain your strength. He will lead you beside still water so you

can moisten your dry tongue. Will you follow Him today? The Lord is your Shepherd; He will

lead you in the right paths for His name's sake. He will guide you through the valley of the

shadow of death. Don't be afraid of shadows, for they are only dark eclipses created by

threatening mountains. The Shepherd will be with you in danger and lead you through dark

valleys and not leave you there.

"Shepherd, there are many paths calling to me. What is the right path for me today?

Guide me. The mountain trails through life's valleys are filled with dead-end canyons.

When I get lost, come help me."

Your Shepherd will prepare a table of food for you after you get through your dark valley. Your

favorite cup is full and running over. Eat, drink, and rejoice in His provision. The shepherd has

two sheep dogs that will pursue you if you stray. The first is His "goodness" which will keep

you following Him. The second is the Shepherd's "mercy" which will forgive any of your future

wayward steps.

"Shepherd, it feels good to happily rest beside You. When my eyes get distracted by the

things of this world, come draw me back with goodness and mercy. Shepherd, may I

dwell with You in Your house forever? Amen"

Reading: Psalm 23

Words: 257

Key Thought: The Lord wants a relationship with you.

A MORE EXCELLENT NAME—JESUS

"Having become so much better than the angels, as He has by inheritance

obtained a more excellent name than they" (Hebrews 1:4).

Jesus has A More Excellent Name than the angels. They were ministering spirits sent to help the

heirs of salvation (Heb. 1:14), but Jesus was sent to purchase salvation. He has A More

Excellent Name than Moses who led Israel out of Egypt and gave them the law (Heb. 3:3). Jesus

fulfilled the law and died to take it out of the way (Col. 2:14-16). Jesus has A More Excellent

Name than the priest who interceded for Israel (Heb. 4:14-16). Jesus gives us grace for which

they prayed. Jesus has A More Excellent Name than Melchizedek, because Jesus obtained a

better salvation and a new covenant (Heb. 7:22-24). Because of the excellence of His name, you

can go to the Father though Jesus at any time. Will you pray to the Father through the name of

Jesus?

"Jesus, I love Your name. Your name, Jesus, calms my fears and guides me each day."

Your name, Jesus, saved me and Your name, Jesus, keeps me safe."

Because Jesus has A More Excellent Name, you can pray in His name (John 14:13, 14). Because

the name Jesus has power, you can break addiction and cast out demonic powers in His name

(Acts 16:18). Because the name Jesus sets prisoners free, you can have a powerful witness to the

unsaved in His name (Acts 4:10-14). One day, every knee will bow to recognize and worship

the name *Jesus* (Phil. 2:10-12). Will you do it now?

"Jesus, I worship at the sound of Your name. You are worthy to receive all honor,

praise, and thanksgiving. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 1:1-14

Words: 262

Key Thought: The name Jesus is the key to God's power.

WORTHY—JESUS

"You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created" (Revelation 4:11). "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom, and

strength and honor and glory and blessing!" (Revelation 5:12).

Jesus is Worthy to receive our worship for two extraordinary reasons: First, we should worship Jesus because He is the Omnipotent Creator, "and without Him nothing was made that was made" (John 1:3). Jesus has given us life, purpose and existence because we were created in His image. Because of His creative act at the beginning of the world, all created beings—angels and redeemed souls—cry out praise and adoration to Jesus. Have you done it on earth?

"Lord Jesus, I cry, 'Holy, holy, holy,' for Your awesome power that created me. You are worthy to receive my praise for Your saving grace that redeemed me."

Jesus is Worthy for another reason—His sacrificial death for all people and His specific pardon of your sin. Jesus was not worthy of a cruel death, but still He chose to die for you. He became Worthy to receive all your gratitude and worship because of that sacrifice,. The One who had great glory and power in Heaven became worthy of even more adoration because He purchase redemption on the cross. John wept because he thought, "No one was worthy to open and read the scroll, i.e., the scroll was the title deed to Heaven and earth. But the Lord stepped forth to do it; He could open the scroll because He qualified to do it. That makes Jesus Worthy of all praise in Heaven and earth.

"Lord Jesus, I fall down at Your feet to cry, 'Worthy is the Lamb,' because You created all things. You are Worthy to open the scroll, because You redeemed me. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 4:1-11

Words: 266

Key Thought: Jesus is worthy of our praise because He is Creator and Redeemer.

THE GOD OF MY FATHERS—FATHER

"But this I confess to you, that according to the Way which they call a sect, so I

worship the God of my fathers, believing all things which are written in the Law

and in the Prophets" (Acts 24:14).

Paul worshipped the God of his Fathers, the God of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Joseph. The God

of all true believers in the Old Testament is our God in this dispensation. When the Lord called

Abraham and he obeyed, the Lord became his God. When Isaac lived in the Promise Land, the

Lord was his God. When Jacob gave birth to twelve sons, the Lord was his God, and each of his

sons made the Lord his God. Just as the Lord was the God who protected and guided Israel in

the Old Testament, He will be your God to help you today.

"O Lord, I've always believed in you, but when I became a Christian, you became my

personal God. Now I worship You."

Just as the Jews wondering in the wilderness worshipped the Lord in the Tabernacle, He wants

you to worship Him from the sanctuary of your body. Just as the Lord entered the Old

Testament Temple in a Shekinah Glory cloud, so He entered your body when you were saved.

The Lord's presence makes any dwelling a sanctuary; today He'll make your body His Temple.

"O God of my fathers, come make Your home in my body. I worship You as did Paul;

come be with me as you were with Paul. Be glorified through my body today. Amen."

Reading: 2 Corinthians 6:13-17

Words: 223

Key Thought: The Lord will dwell in your body just as He dwelt in the Temple.

A NAME ABOVE EVERY NAME—JESUS

"Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is

above every name" (Philippians 2:9).

The name Jesus is more excellent than Adam, the first man, because Jesus is Alpha and Omega.

Jesus' name is more excellent than Noah, who saved the world from the flood, because Jesus

will save the world from fire in the future. Jesus' name is more excellent than Abraham, the

friend of God, because Jesus was God's Son. Jesus' name is more excellent than Moses, who

delivered Israel from slavery in Egypt, because Jesus' name is powerful to deliver any from

addictive slavery to sin. Jesus' name is more excellent than any judge that defeated Israel's

enemies, because Jesus defeated sin, lust, and the devil on the cross. What has Jesus done for

you?

"Lord, when I'm in trouble, I whisper, 'Jesus'. When I want to break a habit or

overcome an enemy, I say, 'Jesus'. When I need anything, I pray, 'Jesus'."

The name Jesus is greater than any Old Testament prophet, priest, or king, because Jesus was the

focus of their ministry. The name Jesus is greater than any apostle, including Paul, because

Jesus called them, empowered them, commissioned them, and used them. What Jesus has done

for these people, He can do for you.

"Jesus, Your name is sweet to me, for it saved me from sin. Your name is powerful to me,

for it gives me strength and hope. Your name is above every name. Amen."

Reading: Acts 5:22-42

Words: 230

Key Thought: The name of Jesus is above every name on Earth.

NAME OF JESUS—JESUS

"Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of Jesus" (Colossians 3:17).

There's power in Jesus' name. Remember "that signs and wonders . . . (are) done through the

name of . . . Jesus" (Acts 4:30). The name Jesus cleansed the lepers, opened the eyes of the

blind, and He can do what you need done today. Don't forget you can get our prayers answered

in the name *Jesus*, "If you ask anything in My name, I will do it" (John 14:14).

"Jesus, give me discipline to overcome my weaknesses, power to overcome opposition,

and strength to overcome disappointments. Jesus, I claim the strength of Your name to

rid my life of all evil lusts. By Your name 'deliver us (me) from the Evil One' (Matt

6:13)."

The name Jesus can fix broken lives and can heal sickness. A man had never walked, but Jesus'

"name . . . made this man strong" (Acts 3:16). The name Jesus can dispel evil powers because a

girl was released from a demon when Paul said, "In the name of Jesus Christ come out" (Acts

16:10). The name Jesus can transform your life and ministry. So, do everything today in His

name. Remember, "Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus"

(Col. 3:17). What can the name of *Jesus* do for you?

"Jesus, Your name is sweet; it gives me joy. Jesus, Your name is comforting; it gives me

assurance. Jesus, Your name is power; I claim Your strength to overcome barriers.

Jesus, Your name is awesome; I worship Your name. Amen."

Reading: Acts 4:1-12

Words: 256

Key Thought: The name of Jesus is powerful.

THE SPIRIT OF THE LIVING GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"Clearly you are an epistle of Christ, ministered by us, written not with ink but by the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of flesh, that is,

of the heart" (2 Corinthians 3:3).

The Third Person of the Trinity is *The Spirit of the Living God* who writes the message of Christ

upon your life. There are many who will not read the Bible, but they may read the pages of your

life. So let *The Spirit of God* write the message of Christ in your attitudes and actions. Let *The*

Spirit of God embed the principles of Christ into your life. Just as The Spirit of the Living God

puts His influence in the Bible, He can put His influence into you; then, non-Christians can see

Christ in the pages of your life and come to salvation. You may be the only Bible they read.

"Holy Spirit, I open the pages of my life to You. Erase everything that is a poor

testimony. Write on the empty pages of my heart Your message of grace and

forgiveness."

The Holy Spirit does not write on pages with ink as the New Testament was written. He does not

write on stone, as the Ten Commandments were chiseled; but He writes the message of Jesus on

the human heart when He makes them like Jesus. Will you yield to Him today so He can write

the message of Jesus in your life? Then, the world can see Jesus in you. And in time you will be

given an opportunity to share your life story with people.

"Holy Spirit, I want to be an open letter that tells of Jesus; I want non-Christians to see

Jesus in my life. Amen."

Reading: 2 Corinthians 3:1-5

Words: 254

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit writes about Christ in our lives for others to read.

LIGHT—JESUS

"Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, 'I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life'" (John 8:12).

Jesus is Light; He can show you where to walk today. He was the Light that shined into your

heart before you were saved so that you were convicted of your sin and repented. He was the

Light that pointed you to salvation. Today, He'll be your Light to show you what to do as you

walk through the many decisions that you face. Jesus is a bright shining Light. He can enlighten

you through the Scriptures, but you must study them. He can help you see clearly as you pray,

but you must seek His presence. He can give you Light to make better decisions, but you must

make time for communion with Him.

"Lord, take away my spiritual blindness. Help me see what I must do today. Don't let

me stumble or get lost. Shine light on my path."

Jesus is the Light of salvation. You may stumble when you walk outside the perimeter of Light,

so always take Jesus, the Light. Let His Light shine giving you illumination when you don't

know what to do. You can always have the blessings of *Light* when you take *Jesus* with you.

"Lord, help me make better choices; keep me from making mistakes. Be Light to help me

understand my friends and associates at work. Shine on me when I walk through dark,

threatening valleys. Lord, thank You for the warmth of Light. I feel comfortable in Your

presence. Keep me from stumbling in the night. Keep me in the Light. Amen."

Reading: John 8:1-12

Words: 252

Key Thought: Jesus is light to guide you.

THE TRUTH—JESUS

"Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the

Father except through Me" (John 14:6).

Jesus is the Truth; He cannot lie. He will always tell you what is right, and will not deceive you.

When you read His word, it will always give you an accurate record of the past, and it will give

you an honest description of what people are like today. When the Word of God predicts the

future, its predictions will come about. Jesus said God's Word "is truth" (John 17:17). Whether

you are referring to the words Jesus spoke on the earth, or His words written in Scripture; both

are true. Because He is *Truth*, He wants you to be truthful.

"Lord, it's hard to be truthful because I have a deceitful heart that always wants to put

me in the best light. Forgive my sins and help me always tell the truth."

The truth never contradicts itself; it is always consistent. What Jesus said on earth was always

consistently true. Jesus' words were always consistent with the rest of Scripture, and the

Scriptures are always consistent with itself. "The Scripture cannot deny itself" (John 10:35,

Author's Translation). Because the Bible is consistent, you can trust its message. Because Jesus

is true, You can believe in Him.

"Lord, I believe everything You've said in the Bible is true. I have based my life on the

Scriptures, and it's worked. I have read the Scriptures and they are consistent. The

more I know about the Bible, the more I realize it's consistently true in itself and its

influence is true in my experiences. Amen."

Reading: John 8:13-36

Words: 254

Key Thought: The words of Jesus are true.

HIS VOICE (MOST HIGH)—TRINITY

"The LORD thundered from heaven, and the Most High uttered His voice"

(Psalm 18:13).

God speaks in many ways. Some heard His audible voice, and to others He speaks inwardly. At

other times He spoke through prophetic utterances. He also spoke through intermediate means

such as miracles, providence, and once He spoke through Balaam's ass. But notice how many

times God spoke through nature. David said, "Each day utters a new voice" (Ps. 19:2, ELT).

David the shepherd boy declared, "The voice of the Lord is powerful . . . is full of majesty" (Ps.

29:4). The powerful wind was "The voice of the Lord breaking cedars" (Ps. 29:5). He described

the lightning as "The voice of the Lord divides the flames of fire" (Ps. 29:7). God speaks in

many ways; let Him speak to you today.

"Lord, I am quiet before You. I am listening for Your instructions for today. Speak,

Lord, for Your servant waits."

God uses the weather to accomplish His will; no one can make a storm, no one can control the

wind, temperature or rain. God uses the storms; it is His voice in the world. Never again will

God destroy the world through a flood (Gen. 9:11), but He'll use floods to punish the

disobedient, or to move those who will not listen, or to re-direct lives. God will even use

emotional floods in your life for a purpose. When the storms come, listen to His voice for He

speaks through them.

"Lord, I don't like storms, but I accept them. Help me to learn Your will from the storm

of life. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 18:1-14

Words: 279

Key Thought: God can use many ways to speak to you.

THE BREAD OF GOD—JESUS

"For the bread of God is He who comes down from heaven and gives life to the

world" (John 6:33).

Jesus is The Bread of God. Just as we eat bread to get strong for our daily activities, so Jesus

gives us mental and spiritual strength to live for Him. Just as we eat bread for enjoyment, so

Jesus is our joy and satisfaction in life. Just as we eat bread to keep living (without bread we

would die), so Jesus keeps us living. We eat the bread of Jesus when we read and study the

Word of God. We eat the bread of *Jesus* when we think on Him (Luke 2:19) and meditate on the

Word of God (Josh. 1:8). We eat the bread of Jesus when we attend church and listen to the

Word preached. And of course we could never give out the bread of Jesus to a hungry world

unless we first eat it for ourselves and experience His goodness.

"Lord Jesus, You are the Bread of life. Just as I enjoy warm bread right from the oven, I

look forward to fellowship with You more."

Jesus is The Bread of God Who Comes Down From Heaven. When we taste Him, we begin

munching on the good things of God. "Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good" (Ps. 34:8).

Jesus is satisfying Bread . . . healthful bread . . . good bread . . . life-giving bread . . . and

resurrection bread. "Whoever eats My flesh and drinks . . . I will raise him up at the last day"

(John 6:54).

"Jesus, You have good bread. I could fellowship with You forever. Could I have more?

Amen."

Reading: John 6:32-44

Words: 266

Key Thought: Jesus is the Bread of God who gives life to the world.

THE DOOR OF THE SHEEP—JESUS

"Then Jesus said to them again, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, I am the door of the

sheep" (John 10:7).

A sheepfold (John 10:1) was an enclosure to keep sheep from wandering or getting lost. It

usually had rock walls; sometimes it was enclosed with thick growing thorns to keep out thieves

or predators who would kill and/or steal sheep. A sheepfold usually didn't have a roof and had

only one door. The shepherd would sleep across the opening of the door to keep intruders out

and the sheep in. Thus, the shepherd became the door of the sheep. Sometimes, several flocks

were kept in the same sheepfold. In the morning, the shepherd "calls his own sheep by name and

leads them out" (John 10:3). Each shepherd has a different whistle and the sheep know their

master's call. "When he brings out his own sheep, he goes before them; and the sheep follow

him, for they know his voice" (John 10:4). *Jesus* is the Shepherd of the sheep and He knows you

by name. Do you recognize the Lord's voice when He calls you?

"Jesus, thank You for calling me and protecting me. I will follow where You lead."

When the shepherd becomes *The Door of the Sheep*, he puts his life on the line. The shepherd

will fight to protect his sheep because each one is precious to him. The key is *relationship*; the

shepherd knows, calls, leads, and protects his sheep. Jesus wants that kind of relationship with

you.

"Lord Jesus, I am your sheep. Thank You for giving Your life for me. I want to go in and

out of the sheepfold to 'find pasture' (John 10:9). Amen."

Reading: John 10:1-13

Words: 261

Key Thought: The Shepherd wants a protective relationship with you.

THE FATHER OF LIGHTS—FATHER

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the

Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning" (James

1:17).

God is the Father of Lights who originally created physical light, i.e., the sun and all stars. But

more than physical light, He is the Father of Spiritual Light; when you come to Him, He will

enlighten your life and give you spiritual understanding. When you walk near Father of Lights,

there is no darkness so you'll never get lost. When you're close to the Light, there are no

shadows, so you'll not be surprised or afraid of unseen fears. When you walk near the Father of

Lights, you'll see where you're going so you can walk in confidence.

"O Father of Lights, I often stumble in the dark, and it hurts to fall. Shine more light on

my path; give me eyes to see so I can walk."

The light from a burning candle makes a shadow; it is impossible to get next to a light without

causing shadows. But when you get close to God, something impossible happens. There are no

shadows. There is no "variation or shadow" in the Father of Lights. When you get close to God,

He gets close to you. He surrounds you on every side; there'll be no twilight zones and no dim

shadows. You'll be surrounded by *Light*. Isn't that where you want to live?

"I come to You, Father of Lights, in Whom there is no variation or shadow. I will walk

close to You in Your Light. I will be comfortable in the warmth of Your presence. I will

be safe where there is no threatening darkness. I will stay as close to the Light as

possible. Amen."

Reading: James 1:16-21

Words: 268

Key Thought: When you get close to God, you'll have fewer shadows.

THE VINE—JESUS

"I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears

much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5).

Jesus is the Vine, the source of your spiritual life. Abide in Him and you'll have a fruitful life.

You are the branches where His life grows and His fruit is produced. The key to fruitfulness is

relationship; you must constantly remain attached (abide) to Him, or the opposite will happen. If

you become detached, your spiritual life will not be fruitful; no fruit will grow, and the branches

of your life will begin to die.

"Lord, when I was small, I was constantly growing, but when I became an adult, I

stopped growing. I sometimes feel the same thing has happened to me spiritually. Now

that I've reached spiritual adulthood, don't let me stop growing as a Christian."

Jesus is the Vine, you are the branches. You will continue to grow as you are attached to Him.

You must do more than talk about *Jesus*, sing about *Jesus*, or even learn facts about *Jesus*. You

must abide in Him to grow and be fruitful. You must be totally dependent upon Jesus, just as a

branch is totally dependent upon the vine for everything. Just as energy (life) flows through the

vine to the branches, you must receive your energy from Jesus. The Vine must become your life;

yield to Him. The Vine has the fruit you desire; let Him grow it in you.

"Jesus, since You are my Vine, produce optimism and spiritual expectation in me. Help

me become like You, just as a branch is like the vine. Amen."

Reading: John 15:1-8

Words: 251

Key Thought: The life of Jesus flows through us when we abide in Him.

THE WAY—JESUS

"Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the

Father except through Me" (John 14:6).

Jesus is the Way to Heaven; there is no other way to get there. Will you follow The Way today?

Because Jesus is The Way, He invited some fishermen, "Follow Me, and I will make you become

fishers of men" (Mark 1:17). He invited Matthew, the tax collector, "Follow Me" (Mark 1:17).

Because Jesus is The Way, He still wants people to follow Him today.

"Lord, I've always been independent. As a child I'd pull at my parent's hand to run

ahead. When I got mad, I'd pout and refuse to keep up. But today, I submit my will to

You. Teach me to follow You."

Just as Jesus left His footprints on the sandy beach of Lake Galilee, today He wants to leave His

influence in every place in life. Jesus will do it through you. Are your "footprints" leaving an

influence for Jesus in the places you walk? When you help another, Jesus wants them to realize

He's been there. When you share the gospel with another, He wants the listeners to realize He's

been there. Jesus is The Way when you don't know where to walk or how to walk, look to Him

for direction. His way on earth was not always easy, neither will your way always be

comfortable, but it's worth it. Let Him "walk" through your life. As you follow His "way,"

leave His footprints in the lives of others.

"Lord, I'll follow You through ease or difficulty; I only ask that You go with me and help

me. Amen."

Reading: Mark 1:16-20; 2:13-17

Words: 256

Key Thought: Jesus asks you to follow His "way."

RAIN—HOLY SPIRIT

"He shall come down like rain upon the grass before mowing, like showers that

water the earth" (Psalm 72:6).

The Holy Spirit is Rain to those who are famished; He gives refreshing life. He is Rain to those

who have stopped growing; He can replenish your leaves and roots. He is Rain to those who

have stopped producing fruit; He can make you fruitful again. Let Him rain on you.

"Lord, Rain on my parched soul. Rain on the dry ground that surrounds me. Revitalize

my branches, let my leaves soak up your life-giving water, and make me fruitful again.

Let the streams overflow their banks."

The Holy Spirit is Rain to those who are thirsty; He will satisfy your thirst. You don't have to

die in the desert for lack of water. But, you must come to Him as empty pots because only He

can fill you. Drink of the Holy Spirit; that's an active choice you must make. "If anyone thirsts,

let him come to Me and drink" (John 7:37). The Holy Spirit is Rain to signify the blessing of

God on His people. The opposite is also true; when God's people reject Him, God shuts up

Heaven. The streams of living water no longer flow. Crops don't grow and there's nothing to

eat. When God's people reject Him, the Holy Spirit will not rain on them. He is Rain. Why

wouldn't everyone want Rain?

"Lord, I've been thirsty long enough; I'll not suffer through another day. Show me any

sin that's hidden in my heart. I repent of all my transgressions. I'm coming to You for

life-giving water. Rain refreshes me. A cool drink of water is even better. Amen."

Reading: 1 Kings 17, 18

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is Rain to refresh God's people.

THE PREEMINENCE—JESUS

"And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn

from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence" (Colossians 1:18).

Preeminence means first, and Jesus wants to have first place in your life. Put Him first in your

thoughts, your choices, and your relationships. When you do every thing Jesus would have you

do, He becomes preeminent in your life. Preeminence also means the best in quality and

character. When you let Jesus control your life, you give Him the preeminence in all that you

do. Preeminence also means the highest. There is nothing higher in Heaven than Jesus, so lift

Him up in your prayer life. Give Him the preeminence in your home. When Jesus has His

rightful place, He can lead you, protect you, and cause you to grow.

"Lord, I pause to recognize Your greatness and give You first place in my life. I exalt

You to your rightful place. Come, be preeminent in my life."

Today, Jesus is not preeminent in the affairs of the nations, but in the end of the age He will rule

all ethnic peoples and nations. Also, Jesus is not preeminent in the lives of many peoples, but

one day "every tongue—including the unsaved—will confess Jesus, and every knee—including

the God-haters—will bow . . . to recognize His preeminence. Those who make Jesus preeminent

on earth will be rewarded by Him in Heaven.

"My tongue confesses that You are Lord. My knee bows to your sovereign rule of my life.

I make You preeminent in all I do. Amen."

Reading: Luke 9:28-36

Key Thought: Make Jesus preeminent in your life.

WONDERFUL—JESUS

"For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be

upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful . . . " (Isaiah 9:6).

Jesus is called Wonderful, a noun in the Hebrew language that Isaiah used as His name.

Throughout the Scriptures, the word "wonderful" is used to describe miracles; it's a word that

suggests the supernatural. Jesus is called Wonderful, the source of miracles; all supernatural

expressions come from Him. Jesus is called Wonderful, also a description of the mysterious or

secretive attributes of God. Jesus has all the attributes of God, both those seen and unseen. His

name Wonderful expresses those things about God that we don't know. His name Wonderful

reflects His incomprehensible nature. Jesus is so wonderful; we have difficulty finding words to

express it. Jesus also has a "name written that no man knows, but Him" (Rev. 19:12, Author's

Translation). It's a wonderful name.

"Lord, I praise You for Your wonderful nature and I stand in awe of the wonderful things

You do for me. Lord, when I don't know what to say in prayer, I simply worship in Your

wonderful presence."

Jesus is called Wonderful, a name that separates Him from the common things of life and lifts

Him into the realm of majestic Deity. Also, the word Wonderful expresses the concept of glory.

Jesus has God's glory who brings more glory to the Godhead. His name Wonderful puts Him in

a class all by Himself. Call Him Wonderful, the Separated One, the Distinguished One, the

Noble One, and the Only One.

"Lord, I call You Wonderful because of all I know about You in Scriptures, and I worship

You for all the wonderful things You have done for me. Amen."

Reading: Colossians 1:16-20

Words: 250

Key Thought: Jesus is too wonderful to describe.

THE GOD OF THE BEGINNING—TRINITY

"The God of beginning is your refuge, and His eternal arms are under you" (Deut.

33:27, Author's Translation).

God is The God of the Beginning—Elohim-Kedem—He started time. Before the first verse in

the Bible, there was nothing but God, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth"

(Gen. 1:1). You measure time by the sequence between events, but before *The Beginning*, there

were no human events to measure; there was only God. If God hadn't begun everything, there'd

be no abstract thing like time. You'd never be late; you'd never waste it, because you wouldn't

know what it was. If God hadn't created time, you might never had gotten anything done

because there'd be no starting time . . . quitting time . . . or over time.

"God, I'm glad You made time, You give meaning to my minutes. I know I'm using my

hours and eventually I'll. 'My times are in Your hand' (Ps. 31:15)."

God made a choice to begin everything. Why can't you follow His example? Do you have

something you need to start today? But head knowledge doesn't usually move us to begin

something. Sometimes our emotions move us to begin a project. But knowing and feeling are

not enough. You must exercise your will; you must choose to begin. Isn't that what The God of

The Beginning did? Just as He chose to begin everything, you must choose to begin today what

you put off yesterday.

"O God of The Beginning, 'Teach us to understand how many days we have' (Ps. 90:12,

NLT). Help me begin today what I must do. Amen."

Reading: Deut. 33:26-34:12

Key Thought: Just as God began everything, so I must learn to begin my projects.

A COLUMN OF SMOKE—JESUS

"And the LORD went before them by day in a column of smoke to lead the way,

and by night in a column of fire to give them light" (Exodus 13:21, Author's

Translation). "God did not lead them by way of the land of the Philistines,

although that was near (closer)" (Ex. 13:17).

Jesus was the Column that led Israel out of Egyptian bondage. He did not lead them the short

way directly from Egypt to the Promised Land. He led them the long way through the desert

where there was no water or food. He wanted them to learn to trust Him in the wilderness in

spite of these obstacles. In the same way, Jesus will sometimes lead you the long way, which

may seem to you the wrong way. Sometimes, He'll lead you where there seems to be no

outward food or water and there are obstacles. He may be leading to see if you'll trust Him.

However, there are no wrong ways when the Lord leads; just long ways with more time to teach

you the lessons to make you strong.

"Lord, Israel murmured in the wilderness; help me not complain when I don't

understand where I'm going. Israel refused to acknowledge You, but I submit to the

circumstances You bring into my life."

Jesus led Israel in both the daylight and at night; so look to Him so you won't get lost. Stop

when He stops and follow Him when He starts. Follow Him in good days and bad; follow Him

when you're hungry and when full. Where He guides He will provide.

"Lord, I want to stay as close as possible to the light in the column. I want Your

personal presence to guide me. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 14:1-3; 15:22-26

Words: 238

Key Thought: Learn God's purpose when He leads You through difficulties.

PRECIOUS—JESUS

"Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious" (1 Peter 2:7).

Jesus is Precious. A diamond is called a precious stone because it is expensive; the best

diamond in the world costs everything, so Jesus is Precious because His death cost everything.

"You were not redeemed with corruptible things such as silver and gold . . . but with My

precious blood" (1 Peter 1:18, 19, Author's Translation). Just as an item is precious because it is

scarce, or it is the only one of a kind, so Jesus is Precious because He is the only Son of God—

there is none other like Him. He is *Precious* because He is the only hope for those who are

dying. Saints hang on to Jesus because He is their guarantee of life after death. No one else

promises to be with them.

"Lord Jesus, I want to walk with You and talk with You. You are my friend, my guide, my

protector, and my God. Lord, I value my salvation; it is the most precious thing in my

life. You are precious to me."

Just as some items are sentimental or have precious memories, Jesus is Precious to us because

we remember how He saved us. We remember how Jesus has helped us so many times in our

life. But He is also *Precious* to you as we contemplate spending eternity with Him.

"Jesus, You are Precious to me; You are my Savior and Friend. I treasure You in my

heart for saving me, for keeping me, and for answering all my prayers. I look forward to

spending eternity with You. Amen."

Reading: John 12:1-11

Words: 260

Key Thought: Jesus is more valuable to us than the most precious thing in life.

THE VERY GOD OF PEACE—FATHER

"And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord

Jesus Christ." (1 Thessalonians 5:23, KJV).

When you search for peace, you'll find its source in God the Father. You won't find it in peace

treaties, police protection, or in the United Nations. True peace must be poured into the heart of

individuals before it spreads to communities or nations. True peace happens when each person

places God on the throne of his or her heart. When God rules the heart, a person gets peace over

the compulsive lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, or the pride of life. Then the Father's peace

spreads throughout your life as you make peace with others. When you find inner peace, it can

spread to families, communities, or countries. Also, a nation will experience peace to the degree

that *The Very God of Peace* controls the hearts of all its citizens.

"Lord, I want inner peace; come rule my heart. Help me influence others around me the

way You've influenced me."

There will be wars and racial turbulence in the world because people live for themselves. There

will be interpersonal friction because The Very God of Peace does not rule the hearts of

individuals. While one person may not be able to change the whole world, he can change his

world. Some think they cannot change their family, but when one changes his relationship to his

loved ones, he changes them. Experience God's peace, and then spread it to others.

"Father, help me live Your plan of peace for my family and community. Help me do my

part to be an influence for peace today. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 122

Words: 260

Key Thought: Your experience of peace can influence others.

RABBI—JESUS

"Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them, 'What do you seek?'

They said to Him, 'Rabbi' (which is to say, when translated, Teacher)" (John

1:38).

Jesus is Rabbi, a title that is the Aramaic word for teacher. The title is a transliteration which

means the letters cross over into English, letter for letter. Rabbi is the common title for teacher.

Jesus is your Rabbi. Just as you respect a teacher for what he knows—content—as he

communicates it to his hearers, so you revere Jesus as Rabbi because He is the revelation of the

Father to the world. Those "who saw Jesus, saw the Father" (John 14:9, Author's Translation).

Jesus instructs us on who the Father is and what He is like.

"Jesus, You are more than a spiritual teacher; You are the Son of God, the only One who

can teach us salvation. Be my Rabbi; teach me all I need to know. Teach me how to

walk in grace, and how to live for You."

A Rabbi is also called "master" because this person was the master of his students, i.e., a

"change agent" in the life of his students. Jesus is your Rabbi; not only for what He knows, but

because He is the "change agent" of your heart. Jesus will help you know the Scriptures and He

will help you do the will of God. Just as there is an intimate relationship between a teacher and

pupil, so your passion should be to know your Rabbi better (Phil. 3:10). Jesus wants to influence

your life and to be your Lord; will you let Him do it?

"Rabbi, I will learn Your teachings, and let the Scriptures control my life. Be the Master

of my life. Guide me and direct me this day. Amen."

Reading: John 1:29-42

Key Thought: Jesus will teach you what you need to know.

JESUS CHRIST—JESUS

"The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants—

things which must shortly take place" (Revelation 1:1).

His composite name is Jesus Christ; the name Christians called Him at the end of the first

century when John wrote the book of Revelation. However, in the gospels He was mostly called

by His Greek name Jesus, which reflected His earthly life. Jesus means Joshua in Hebrew, from

the root "Jehovah Saves." In the book of Acts He was mostly called by His title, Lord, a title

that emphasized that He was the Second Person of the Trinity, a title that reflected His deity. In

the epistles He is mostly called by His office title, Christ. Put them all together, He is the Lord

Jesus Christ.

"I come to You as Savior, thanking You for salvation, but I worship before You as my

God. I marvel at the depth of Your person that is reflected in Your many names and

titles."

When His title LORD appears first in sequence, it is emphasizing He is God, i.e., the Lord Jesus

When His office title Christ appears first in sequence, it is emphasizing His

accomplishment on Calvary, i.e., Christ Jesus, the Lord. When His name Jesus appears first, it

is emphasizing His earthly humanity, i.e., Jesus Christ, the Lord. The book of Revelation is

about Him, i.e., The Revelation of Jesus Christ. The emphasis is not on judgment, symbols, or

Satan. It is the revelation of who Jesus is, and why He is returning to earth. Study to see His

many names in the first chapter of Revelation.

"Lord, open the pages of Your Word to reveal Yourself to me. Help me to understand

You as I understand Your many names and titles. Amen."

Read: Revelation 1:1-21

Words: 274

Key Thought: The names and titles of Jesus reveal His nature.

OIL—HOLY SPIRIT

"Therefore God, Your God, has anointed You with the oil of gladness" (Heb.

1:9).

The Holy Spirit is the Oil of gladness. The Lord said, "I see the oppression of My people . . . I

hear their cry . . . I know their sorrows" (Exod. 3:7, author's paraphrase). Just as the Lord knew

and identified with the suffering of His people in Moses' day, He knows your troubles today. He

is Oil who can pour Himself into your wounds; He can make you rejoice.

"Lord, Your healing Oil is good. Rejuvenate my Spirit and take away the scars of my

mind. Just as Your Oil takes away physical pain, I also want You to take away mental

and spiritual memories. Let Your Oil wash away the impurities in my wounds, and

cleanse me physically and mentally."

The Holy Spirit is Oil; when He pours His presence on your discouragement, you'll have new

zeal to live for God and new strength to serve Him – you'll rejoice! The Holy Spirit is Oil; when

He pours His presence on your failures, you'll see new opportunities in your life – you'll growl.

He is Oil who can wash away your impurities that fester and breed germs; you can be whole

again. He is Oil who gives you a second chance and a new opportunity. Let the Oil of the Holy

Spirit give you a new challenge this day.

"Lord, Your Oil has made me a new person. My hurt is gone, my body is renewed for

service, and my soul is again made whole. Thank You for today's anointing. I'll need a

new one tomorrow. Amen."

Reading: Heb. 1:1-9

Words: 259

Key Thoughts: The anointing of the Holy Spirit gives happiness and healing.

THE CARPENTER'S SON—JESUS

"Is this not the carpenter's son? Is not His mother called Mary? And His brothers

James, Joses, Simon, and Judas?" (Matthew 13:55).

Jesus was a Carpenter's Son; Joseph, His stepfather, was His legal guardian. Jesus was born of

the Virgin Mary, but it was Joseph whose occupation provided His food, clothing and shelter.

Joseph was the human father who guided Jesus' growth and taught Him a trade. Since there is

dignity in work, Jesus became a carpenter, as was Joseph. When Jesus was 12-years old, He

went to the Temple for Bar Mitzvah, i.e., to be declared as "Son of the Law." It was then Joseph

had to declare his son would take up his trade, "He shall be a carpenter." Jesus worked as a

carpenter in Nazareth until He was baptized by John the Baptist at approximately 30 years of age

(Luke 2:23). He then began His earthly ministry. What can you learn from Him?

"Lord, thank You for submitting to the limitations of a human body. You gave us an

example how to work for a living. Help me follow Your example."

Even though Jesus is God, He became a Carpenter's Son to grow as you must grow, to learn as

you must learn, and to gain favor with God and man, as you must do. But don't forget, Jesus left

us an example of how we should work. Let's follow His example.

"Lord, I want to walk through life as You walked. I want to be successful at an

occupation as You were. I want to learn obedience as You did (Heb. 5:8). I want to

please the heavenly Father as You did. Help me today. Amen."

Reading: Luke 2:40-52

Key Thought: Jesus gave us an example of earthly work.

RABBONI—JESUS

"Jesus said to her, 'Mary!' She turned and said to Him, 'Rabboni!' (which is to

say, Teacher)" (John 20:16).

Jesus is Rabboni, an unusual descriptive term for the usual word "Rabbi" or "teacher." The title

Rabboni was not used by just anyone or any student; those who had a special relationship to the

Rabbi used the title Rabboni. Because Jesus had to cast demons out of Mary Magdalene, she

called Him Rabboni. Because Jesus had given sight to blind Bartimaeus; he too called Jesus

Rabboni (Mark 10:51). Just as Mary Magdalene called Him Rabboni because she was grateful

for the forgiveness of sin, you should be as grateful as she. Just as Bartimaeus called Him

Rabboni because he was grateful for the work of God in his life, you should be as grateful as he.

"Jesus, You are my special Rabboni because You have forgiven my sins and revealed

Yourself to me. You have worked in my life."

Jesus is Rabboni; but not everyone can call Him by this unique title because not everyone has a

saving relationship to Him. But because you believe in Christ, you have a special relationship to

Him. He becomes *Rabboni* to those who desire to know Him intimately (Phil. 3:10). Paul said,

"For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Phil. 1:21). If that's your passion, you can call

Him Rabboni.

"You are my Rabboni. I am grateful for the new life You gave me. You are the

resurrected Christ, the One Mary saw on that first Easter morning. And like Mary, I call

You Rabboni with deepest love and lasting commitment. Amen."

Reading: John 20:11-16

Words: 254

Key Thought: Jesus is Rabboni to those who have a special relationship to Him.

GOD WHO IS NEAR—TRINITY

"Am I a God near at hand,' says the LORD, 'And not a God afar off? Can

anyone hide himself in secret places, so I shall not see him?" (Jer. 23:23-24).

Do you act as if God is far off? If you understand *The God Who Is Near*—Elohim Mikarov—it

would influence all your life. God is present to hear every conversation at work and within your

family. He's not just with you at church, or when you pray; He is near to you in sports and as

you drive the car. "In Him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28).

"Lord, I know You are everywhere. You are in Heaven and everywhere in the world, and

You are in my heart. Let me feel Your presence so I can live for You."

It would be hard to stretch the truth if you realized God was near when you spoke, because God

is truth. It would be hard to sin if you realized God was near, because God is pure. It would be

hard to gossip about people or rip them up if you realized God is near, because God loves all. If

you realized God Is Near, you would be more honest with money, more forgiving of others, and

more disciplined in prayer and church attendance. A father was surfing some sexy scene on

television, when suddenly he experienced someone in the room. Looking around, the father saw

his young son, and changed the channel. What would you change if you experienced God's

presence?

"Lord, I know You are here when I pray; help me feel Your presence in all that I do.

When I feel Your presence, it changes my actions. Amen."

Reading: Jer. 23:1-24

Key Thought: You will change when you realize God is near.

SAVIOR—JESUS

"For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord"

(Luke 2:11).

Jesus is the Savior, a title that means Deliverer or Preserver. Jesus has many names, i.e.,

Creator, Shepherd, King of Kings and Lord of Lords. But, the most important name may be

Savior, because He is the only One who can save you; "Salvation is of the Lord" (Jonah 2:9).

Jesus is the Savior, who will deliver you in many ways. He has saved you from the guilt of past

sin, from the present bondage of sin, and He will save you from the future penalty of sin when

you are taken to Heaven.

"Lord, You have done so many things for me, things I don't even realize. But Your most

important gift was saving me; thank You. I feel confident in Your salvation, yet I want

more. I want to enjoy all the benefits possible that come from salvation."

Jesus is the Savior (2 Pet. 1:1). John referred to Him as "Savior of the world" (1 John 4:14), that

was in contrast to the Caesars of the Roman Empire who called themselves "saviors of the

world." They could only give military deliverance. Jesus came to save you from damnation and

eternal death. He will save you from weaknesses, temptations, attacks from Satan, and addiction

to sin. He will save in all ways those who come to Him.

"I praise You Savior, for "so great salvation" (Heb. 2:3). You have saved me in so many

ways; continue to save me to the very end. Amen."

Reading: Luke 2:8-20

Key Thought: Jesus saves you completely in every way.

SHILOH—JESUS

"The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet,

until Shiloh comes; and to Him shall be the obedience of the people" (Genesis

49:10).

Jesus is Shiloh; this name means "peace-maker." He can give you peace about any and all

decisions this day. He is called *Shiloh*; a name given in the Old Testament more than 1800 years

before Christ was born. This name was reflective of His coming to make peace between the

Father and all sinners by His death on the cross (Eph. 2:14). Because of your sins, He is your

Shiloh.

"Shiloh, You gave me "peace with God" when You came into my heart at conversion.

Thank You for giving me 'peace through the blood of (Your) cross . . . '(Col. 1:20). I

yield to You; come fill my heart with Your strength, direct my thoughts, and give me

courage to choose Your will for my life."

Jesus is Shiloh, bringing peace to troubled hearts. "In Me you may have peace. In the world you

will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). Shiloh will

give you inner peace when you let Him control your heart. Jesus is Shiloh, the "Prince of Peace"

for your job, for your home, for your nation, and for the world. One day there will be a

millennium of peace when Jesus rules the world. For now Jesus is Shiloh who brings inner

peace to the human heart when people invite Him into their lives. Then we who know His peace,

must spread it into our world and our friends.

"Shiloh, come rule in my life, then influence my job, my home and my friends. Amen."

Reading: John 16:23-33

Key Thought: Jesus can give you peace.

THE FATHER OF MERCIES—FATHER

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies

and God of all comfort" (2 Corinthians 1:3).

When you call God Father, it's not just His name that you're calling upon; Father is a

relationship, you are relying on your relationship with Him. It began with a relationship between

Jesus and the Father; they loved each other throughout past eternity. Jesus died for your sins so

the Father could forgive you and receive you into God's Heaven. When you accepted Jesus as

your Savior, you were born again into God's family. Now you can enjoy an intimate relationship

in the family with both the Father and the Son. Now, you are God's child (John 1:12). Why

don't you thank Him for making you His child?

"Father, thank You for allowing me to have a relationship with You. You are the Father

of my Lord Jesus Christ and the God of all Comfort."

When you call God your Father, you're not just using a name; you're entering a spiritual

relationship. When you became God's child, He established a relationship of mercy with you.

He no longer looked at you as an alien or a sinner, but in mercy He forgave all your sin. He no

longer had to punish your disobedience. Instead He accepted you into His family, so He can

love you, protect you, and guide you. He is the Father of Mercies, and the God of all comfort.

Now you can enjoy all the blessings of the heavenlies and you can enter the intimacy of God's

presence. Will you enjoy the *Father* today?

"Father, thank You for allowing me to have an intimate relationship with You. Amen."

THE UNSPEAKABLE GIFT—JESUS

"Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15, *KJV*).

Jesus is The Unspeakable Gift; receive Him as you would receive any gift. Remember, a gift is

free; if you have to work for it, it's not a gift. You can't pay for a gift, you can't work for a gift,

and you can't charge it or put it on your credit card. All you can do is receive a gift. Jesus is

The Unspeakable Gift of Salvation; receive Him freely.

"Lord, I receive You into my heart; I am 'saved by grace through faith, not of works;

salvation is Your gift to me' (Eph. 2:8, 9, Author's Paraphrase). This gift is greater than

anything in life. Teach me to appreciate my salvation and to live accordingly."

Jesus us The Unspeakable Gift; words are not adequate to describe Him. He is greater than the

human mind can conceive, and more precious than the human heart desires. Human words can't

adequately express the worth of the salvation He gives. Jesus is The Unspeakable Gift; greater

than anything on earth. Any fun you have in the world cannot compare to His joy. Any

financial gain does not compare to His riches. Any good for which people strive cannot compare

to the satisfaction of finding Jesus and making Him the center of your life. Thank God today for

The Unspeakable Gift of *Jesus*.

"Lord Jesus, my words are not adequate to express my feelings, so look within my heart

to receive the worship that is there. And when my words-of-worship are not adequate,

look deeper in my heart to discover my love for You. Amen."

Reading: Luke 19:1-27

Key Thought: Jesus is greater than any way you can describe Him.

THE TRIUMPHANT LAMB—JESUS

"And I looked, and behold, in the midst of the throne . . . stood a Lamb as though

it had been slain" (Revelation 5:6).

Jesus is The Triumphant Lamb who was slain to give you victory. When no one else could open

the Book of Life, His death gave Him authority to unveil the mysteries of life and of the future.

He stands in Heaven with seven crowns that symbolize His ruling power. He stands complete

the Father's plan. Because *The Triumphant Lamb* will complete the Father's purpose in the last

day, He can complete the Father's purpose in your life for this day. The question is not why sin

seems to be so triumphant in this world today; the question is will you let Jesus defeat sin that

you face?

"O meek and tender Lamb of God, I come to You for forgiveness. Take away my sin.

Give me victory!"

Jesus is The Lamb who stood silently before His accusers. "He was oppressed and He was

afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter" (Isa. 53:7). Jesus

was the sacrificial yearling Lamb that took away the sins of the world (John 1:29). He

understands your frailty and weakness; He can take away your sin because He took it upon

Himself. He died for you that you might not die for your sin.

"O Lamb, out of Your weakness comes strength; out of Your meekness comes honor. I

sing a new song with those in Heaven, 'Thou art worthy to receive glory and honor and

power.' I marvel at Your greatness and sing again, 'Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to

receive wisdom, strength and blessings.' Amen."

Reading: Rev. 5:13-6:1

Words: 262

Key Thought: The Triumphant Lamb can give you victory.

A DOVE—THE HOLY SPIRIT

"And immediately, coming up from the water, He (Jesus) saw the heavens parting

and the Spirit descending upon Him like a dove" (Mark 1:10).

The Holy Spirit is like a Dove who comes to rest gently on you this day, just as He rested on

Jesus at His baptism. He is a Dove to light gently upon you to take away your anxieties. He is a

Dove to give you peace. But, it's not just the feeling of peace you need; you need the Holy

Spirit, for He is peace. Remember the promise of Jesus, "Peace I leave with you, My peace I

give to you" (John 14:27). When Jesus sends peace, the Holy Spirit delivers it. When the Holy

Spirit comes into your life, receive His gentle presence as a Dove gently coming to rest on you.

"O Holy Dove, gently rest upon me to give peace at the center of my storm. Settle my

emotions, become the controlling peace to every area of my life. Be a Dove to bring

gentleness to my soul. I yield my feelings to You."

The Third Person of the Trinity is like a Dove who lights upon you so carefully you won't even

feel it until you experience His peace in your life. He is like a Dove; He does not always come

with violent manifestations or emotional outbursts. Sometimes He comes with a quiet voice and

a whispered conversation. Be still . . . get quiet . . . wait for Him.

"Holy Spirit, I receive You as a gentle Dove. Guide me to be gentle with my words and

gentle with my actions. Transform me to be like You." Amen.

Reading: John 14; Luke 3:21-22; John 1:25-33

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit comes to make you gentle.

THE YOUNG CHILD—JESUS

"And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary

His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh" (Matthew

2:11).

Jesus was a Young Child when the wise men came to Bethlehem to give Him gifts and worship

Him. The title Young Child means more than a baby in arms. He was an infant, perhaps

crawling or maybe even walking. This suggests there was a period of time between the

shepherd's visit and the wise men's visit. It shouldn't surprise us that The Young Child grew

(see Luke 2:40, 52), for that's what children do. It shouldn't surprise us that the wise men of

understanding and position would do what they did. "They saw the young child . . . and fell

down and worshipped Him" (Matt. 2:11). Most people only cuddle young children, or enjoy

their antics; but if it's Jesus, you worship Him as God. What is your response to Jesus, The

Young Child?

"Lord Jesus, I worship at the feet of the Child Jesus, for He is God. But I also worship at

Your feet in Heaven for what You did on the cross."

The wise men worshipped the Young Child with gifts; " . . . and when they opened their

treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh" (Matt. 2:11). Today,

when you visit a newborn baby and family, you take a gift. What the wise men did is what you

should do. What are you bringing to *Jesus* today?

"Lord Jesus, I come to worship, giving You my time, my talent, and my treasure. But

beyond those things, I give You my greatest gift; I give You myself. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 2:1-12

Words: 257

Key Thoughts: The greatest gift of all is giving yourself to the Young Child.

THE ALL AND IN ALL—JESUS

"Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian,

Scythian, slave nor free, but Christ is all and in all" (Colossians 3:11).

Jesus is The All, and in All. When you become a member of His church—the Body—you are

equal with all other believers. He indwells all believers, no matter who they are. He is ready to

answer all prayers equally, no matter who prays. He protects, guides, blesses, and uses all

believers, no matter their ethnic or economic background. All have equal rights who are

members of His body, and to each Jesus is their All, and in All. No one is lost or overlooked.

You'll always have access to all that Jesus wants to give you. Will you claim it? You'll never

be left behind, nor will He exalt anyone over another. You are special to Jesus and He loves you

eternally. Jesus is all you would want, in all situations, at all times. Will you be satisfied with

Him?

"Lord, forgive me when I whine over things that don't matter and that aren't necessary."

Help me see clearly Your care for me and help me experience deeply Your love."

Jesus is all you have ever needed and when you trust Him, He'll be all you'll ever want. To find

satisfaction in life, look to the things that are important and forget about the things that are not

important.

"Lord, You are the most important One in my life. Forgive me when I've given You

second place. You are my All, and in All. Teach me to look beyond people, things and

places, so I can have satisfaction in You. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 149

Words: 253

Key Thoughts: Jesus should be the most important person in your life.

THE LIGHT OF THE CITY—JESUS

"The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God

illuminated it. The Lamb is its light" (Revelation 21:23).

When we get to Heaven, we won't need the sun that shines in our solar system. Jesus will be

The Light of That City. Jesus will be everything that we look for in light. Jesus will be

abundantly present—everywhere, all the time—so we don't need to worry about stumbling in the

dark, or bumping into things, or getting lost. Jesus will show us everything we need to know, so

we don't need to look for a reading light or for a lighted room where we can learn. Heaven will

be a perfect place, so we won't need a fire to keep us warm. And there'll be no dangers in

Heaven, so we don't need protection in the dark from predators. "Heaven will not need the sun

because the glory of God will shine in it, and Jesus will be its light" (Author's Translation).

"Lord, I know what Your light does for me now, so I look forward to Your light in

Heaven."

Light is a trademark of civilization in contrast to heathen darkness. Walk in the light on earth for

a better life . . . because you can do more in the light . . . because it's safer . . . and because it's

more comfortable. But primarily, walk in the light because you'll be closer to Jesus, who is

Light.

"Lord, remind me that when my path gets dark it's because I'm not close to You. Help

me see the Light, walk closer to the Light, and learn from the Light. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 21:22-27

Words: 257

Key Thought: Jesus will be your light in Heaven.

THE AUTHOR OF OUR FAITH—JESUS

"Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the

right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2).

Jesus is The Author of our Faith. He not only began writing the story, but He finished the

manuscript. A book is usually good because an author put it all together. Just as an author sees a

problem and scripts a solution, Jesus saw the sin-problem of humanity and scripted a solution.

Just as an author develops the story line or plot, Jesus saw what He had to do and developed a

plan to save humanity. Just as an author chooses words to express his story, Jesus is the Word

(John 1:1) who expressed the story of salvation in His life. Just as an author develops characters

or actors to live out the story, Jesus became the central character of salvation. Jesus is not only

The Author of your Faith, He has finished your story. Most people say, "I could never write a

book." In the same way, others say, "I could never hang on to salvation." But, it's not about

your ability to finish, for He's the Finisher of your Faith.

"Lord Jesus, I am in You—the Author—so I know my salvation story will be completed."

Jesus can finish your salvation story because He finished His story. He went all the way to the

cross, endured suffering, and took all the ridicule. Because He finished His task, He will help

you finish yours.

"Lord Jesus, I look to You for strength when I am weak. I look to You to carry me

through to the end. Amen."

Reading: Matt. 27:15-34

Words: 250

Key Thought: Because Jesus finished His task in providing salvation; He can see you through to

the end.

A NAZARENE—JESUS

"And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that it might be fulfilled which

was spoken by the prophets, 'He shall be called a Nazarene'" (Matthew 2:23).

There are two cities that are important to the Baby Jesus. He was born in Bethlehem as

predicted by Micah 5:2. But, God led Mary and Joseph to return to their hometown of Nazareth

so Jesus could be called A Nazarene. There is no written record of any prophets who wrote that

Jesus would come from Nazareth. Rather, look carefully at the text; it says prophet(s), meaning

more than one. Also, they spoke this prophecy; it was not written. That means several prophets

had predicted Jesus would be A Nazarene. Since everyone had to come from some place, Jesus

didn't just appear as an angel, nor did He invade the earth as a grown man. Jesus was born in

Bethlehem and grew up in Nazareth. Jesus was A Nazarene.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for coming to earth and choosing one specific spot to be born

and to grow up."

The word *Nazareth* comes from the root *naz-ar*, meaning to separate as in the Nazarite vow. The

people of Nazareth were more conservative of most Jewish towns. They separated themselves

from other people and from sin. In social, religious, and moral customs, they were extremely

separated to God. Jesus was as separated as the people of Nazareth, because He was God. Jesus

was separate from worldly and secular trends because He was raised in a town called "separated

ones." Jesus was A Nazarene.

"Lord Jesus, Your hometown must have been special for God to choose it for Your

boyhood. Thank You for becoming flesh for me. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 2:19-23

Words: 256

Key Thought: God had a special hometown for Jesus.

A SHADOW OF THE ALMIGHTY—TRINITY

"He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow

of the Almighty" (Psalm 91:1).

A shadow is both good and bad. A threatening shadow warns of an approaching storm. You are

scared when you think someone has broken into your home because you see a shadow in the

night. We are frightened of walking through the shadow of death because no one wants to die

and no one enjoys pain. Little children are afraid of some shadows because they haven't yet

learned that a shadow creates illusions that are usually not real. Don't let shadows frighten you.

Remember, "He who lives in fellowship with the Lord, dwells securely under His shadow" (Ps.

91:1, Author's Translation). That means the Lord is between you and any evil that would harm

you.

"Lord, I will walk happily with You through the sunshine and I'll not change when I walk

in shadows, because You are with me in the valley of the shadow of death."

A shadow is good when you're hot and tired, and you think you can't go on. A shadow will cool

you down . . . and restore your energy . . . and let you get off your aching feet. You can even

take a restful nap in the shadow. A shadow is good when God blocks out harm. When God is

your *Shadow* that means He's near and He's protecting you.

"Lord, I need some relief. Life is tough. Meet me in the shadow of Your presence to

renew my determination and replenish my energy. Watch over me while I rest. Amen."

Reading: Ps. 91:1-16

Words: 250

Key Thought: Get under the Shadow of God so He'll be near.

THAT SPIRITUAL ROCK—JESUS

"... For they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them, and that Rock was

Christ" (1 Corinthians 10:4).

Jesus was That Spiritual Rock from which the Jews drank when they thirsted in the wilderness as

they traveled from Egypt. The spring at Horeb was dry. God told Moses to take his rod and

strike the rock. In obedience to God's command, water flowed from the rock and the people

drank. When God's people looked to Him, Christ supplied their need. He can take care of your

needs in the same way.

"Jesus, I'm not physically lost in the desert like the Jews. I have a suitable life but

sometimes I wander in a spiritual desert. I'm hot and thirsty. I need water; come quench

my thirst."

Jesus is That Spiritual Rock that followed Israel throughout their desert wanderings. He was not

a granite stone following them; He was their Lord who protected them (Exod. 17:8-16). He was

their daily manna who fed them (Exod. 16:14-22), and He was their God who supplied them

spiritual water when they thirsted. He was their light to guide them through their night; He was

the column of fire, the Shekinah Glory cloud. Jesus met every spiritual need of Israel. Just as

Jesus was with His people in the desert, so He can be with you in your spiritual desert. Call on

Him today for help.

"Jesus, I need You to follow me this day, just as You followed Israel in the desert. I need

spiritual protection when tempted. I need manna when I'm hungry. I need spiritual

water when I'm thirsty and fainting. I need You, my Spiritual Rock. Amen."

Reading: 1 Cor. 10:1-15

Words: 258

Key Thought: Depend on Jesus because He is with you.

THE SON OF THE HIGHEST—JESUS

"He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God

will give Him the throne of His father David" (Luke 1:32).

Jesus is The Son of the Highest, as no human can be. The name Most High in the original

language means El Elyon, possessor of Heaven and earth. Originally, Lucifer wanted to be "like

The Most High (God) (Isa. 14:14), the ruler of Heaven and earth. Notice the word like, Lucifer

could never have become the actual Most High God; that is a title and position that only God can

possess. Since Jesus is the Father's Son, He is The Son of the Highest, or The Son of the Most

High. One of the many reasons to worship the Father is because He possesses Heaven and earth.

Therefore, worship *Jesus* because He is *The Son of the Highest*.

"Jesus, I worship You as The Son of the Highest. Rule my heart today, just as You rule

Heaven and earth."

The heavenly Father is El Elyon who possesses all things, but He gives it to Jesus. When Jesus

sent His disciples out to serve, He said, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on

earth" (Matt. 28:18). He sends you to serve Him today with the same authority. "Go make

disciples" (Matt. 28:19). His promise to you is, "I am with you always" (Matt. 28:20). So serve

the Lord with confidence, knowing You have the Lord's power and presence with you today.

"Jesus, it is thrilling to know that You, The Son of the Highest, will be with me today."

Use me in your service; give me the power of Your authority and presence. Amen."

Reading: Luke 1:26-33

Words: 257

Key Thought: You have the backing of Jesus' authority as you serve Him.

A SOUND FROM HEAVEN—HOLY SPIRIT

"And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and

it filled the whole house where they were sitting" (Acts 2:2).

The Holy Spirit was like A Sound From Heaven when He came upon the disciples at Pentecost.

A loud sound may surprise you, a sweet sound may entice you, an unexpected sound may startle

you and familiar sounds make you feel comfortable. When Christians were praying in the Upper

Room, they didn't know what to expect. Jesus had promised to send the Holy Spirit to them

(Acts 1:8). He came upon them as a loud "sound from Heaven as of a rushing mighty wind"

(Acts 2:2). Because He was like a mighty wind, He can do mighty things in your life. The

sound filled the whole house, so He can influence your whole "world." All who prayed "Were

all filled with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:4); therefore, you are included in the "all." The Holy

Spirit can enter your life to transform all you do.

"Holy Spirit, I need to hear from You. Let me hear the sound of Your presence coming

into my life."

The Holy Spirit is A Sound From Heaven. He doesn't sound anything like what you hear on

earth. The Sound From Heaven is optimistic and filled with hope. It is sweet and good. When

you focus your ears on Heaven, you'll hear eternal things. The Sound From Heaven will make

you worship, so stop what you're doing. Be quiet and listen for Heaven's sound. The sound

you'll hear will be God Himself.

"Holy Spirit, I need You today. My mind is clear and I'm quiet. I'm waiting for Your

voice. Speak for Your servant will hear and do what you say. Amen."

Reading: Acts 2:1-8

Words: 267

Key Thought: You will hear a new and different sound from the Holy Spirit.

THE SON OF JOSEPH—JESUS

"Philip found Nathanael and said to him, 'We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph'"

(John 1:45).

Jesus is called The Son of Joseph because Joseph was His earthly stepfather and legal guardian.

Therefore we are technically right calling Jesus The Son of Joseph. Jesus was conceived in the

Virgin Mary by the Holy Spirit when Joseph was engaged to her. Joseph could have legally

annulled the engagement, but when an angel explained the supernatural birth (Matt. 1:18-25), he

married Mary. Joseph endured the embarrassing rumors that Jesus had been conceived out of

wedlock (John 8:41). As an earthly father, Joseph protected Jesus, provided for Him, taught

Him the trade of carpentry and guided His youth into manhood.

"Jesus, You are the Son of Joseph. You are the Son of God. I will follow You and

worship You."

Philip told his friend that Jesus was The Son of Joseph (John 1:45). Are you willing to tell others

who He is? Because Philip was a faithful witness, his friend Nathaniel became one of the 12

disciples. When Nathaniel had questions about Jesus, Philip simply said, "Come and see" (John

1:46). Tell your friends about *Jesus*. When they have questions, tell them to look at *Jesus*, He

will answer your questions. When your friends see who Jesus is, they will follow Him as you

do.

"Jesus I know You are human, born of a virgin, The Son of Joseph. But I also know You

are The Eternal Son of God. I will learn from You and tell my friends what I've learned.

I will worship You and be transformed by Your presence. Amen."

Reading: John 1:43-51

Words: 254

Key Thought: Tell others who Jesus really is.

THE ROCK—JESUS

"And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church,

and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18).

Jesus is the Rock on which the church is built. Some have mistakenly thought that Jesus was

referring the word "rock" to Peter. The name Peter is Petros, a reference to a small stone,

perhaps like a pebble. The word rock here is Petra, a large rock, actually like a rock ledge

sticking out of a mountain. The confusion has come because both words came from the same

root. Actually, the church is built on the rock-statement of Peter who said of Jesus, "You are the

Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matt. 16:16). The church is not a dead institution, though

some churches are dead. The church is alive because it's built on *Jesus*, the Son of the living

God. The church is alive because it's made up of individuals who believe Jesus is the Son of

God and each has accepted Him into their heart.

"Lord Jesus, I know the church is grounded on You; You are the Rock. I get stability

from You."

When the church is built on Jesus, it is as solid as a rock. Jesus is the original church planter and

church builder, for He said, "I will build." Also, the church is continually being built, for the

statement, "I will build," is a future tense verb that means, "continually being built." He's doing

it today. Finally, the church belongs to Jesus; He called it "My church." When you're in Jesus,

you're' in the church, and when you're in Jesus, you're on the Rock.

"Jesus, I know the church is growing because it is "continually being built." I know I

am secure in You because the gate of Hades can't prevail against Your work. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 16:13-28

Words: 282

Key Thought: The church is being built by Jesus.

JEHOVAH MELEK (KING)—TRINITY

"Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the king, the lord of

hosts" (Isaiah 6:5).

The Lord is Jehovah Melek, the King who sovereignly rules. He rules Heaven and the universe,

exercising His will over the earth. Just as our earthly kings rule a kingdom, so the Lord

determines the laws by which everything happens. Just as our earthly kings guide the lives of

those in His kingdom, the Lord can direct your life only if you yield it to His control. Just as an

earthly king expects obedience from his followers, the Lord wants heart obedience; He shouldn't

have to coerce you into loving Him because coercive love is not love. The King wants willing

love, willing obedience and willing worship.

"O Jehovah Melek-my King-come rule in my heart. Overcome my rebellious and

selfish heart. Make me always do things Your way."

Jehovah Melek will not force people to serve Him on the earth. Each person must either submit

to His rule and live for Him, or refuse His rule. Those who will not submit to the King in this

life will appear before Him—the King of the Universe—to be judged in the future. Then they

will be forced to recognize His authority and be forced to bow before Him in worship. But that

worship will be ineffective, because it will be coerced and come too late; for it will come after

our time of testing on this earth is over.

"O King, sit upon the throne of my heart. Rule my life today. Let Your will override my

stubborn pride. Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 6

Words: 290

Key Thought: The King wants to rule from the throne of your heart.

THE SAME YESTERDAY, TODAY AND FOREVER—JESUS

"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

Just as Jesus was present in New Testament times to lead His disciples, so He is ready to guide

you today. Jesus is The Beginning and the End, so He'll not lead you for a little while, then

forsake you. He dealt with fearful disciples when they faced a storm, so He can give you peace.

He helped Joshua face the obstacles of Jericho, so He can pull down barriers in your life. He

saw the world reject the preaching of Noah, so He can send an ark of safety when judgment

floods come. Yesterday is gone and you can do nothing about it. Tomorrow is not here and

most people fear the future. But you can do something about today. Will you live for Jesus

today?

"Lord, I put the past under the blood, so forgive all my debts. I commit my future to You;

give me courage to face what is coming; today I will do Your will."

The best thing you can do today is find the heart of Jesus and trust Him. It's good for you to

know what Jesus has done in the past; that's a basis to guide today's activity. But don't just love

Jesus just for what He did for you in the past; love Him for who He is today. Jesus is The

Eternal God who is near you to help you.

"Lord, I know You can do the same things today, that You did in the past. Help me

today. Prepare me for tomorrow. Amen."

Reading: John 21:15-25

Words: 254

Key Thought: Live for Jesus today

REDEEMER—JESUS

"For I know that my Redeemer lives, and He shall stand at last on the earth" (Job

19:25).

Jesus is the Redeemer. Before you were saved, you were owned by sin and the Devil, but Jesus

bought you with a special redemptive price. "You were not redeemed with silver and gold, . . .

but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb" (1 Pet. 1:18, 19). Jesus is your Redeemer,

and now you belong to Him.

"Lord, I sometimes forget what I was before You saved me. Never let me forget how You

redeemed me. Thank You for releasing me from the prison-house of sin. I am no longer

a slave of the Devil. How can I serve You?"

Jesus is your Redeemer because He took your curse. "Christ has redeemed us from the curse of

the law, having become a curse for us" (Gal. 3:13). He was punished for your sin; you are no

longer in bondage to sin; you are free. But as your Redeemer, Jesus did more than pay the price

to release you from bondage; He made you a son of God, "to redeem those who were under the

law, that we might receive the adoption as sons" (Gal. 4:5). Now you're a part of God's family;

now you have a privileged position in His family. Your Redeemer has taken you from being a

slave to sin and made you a part of God's family.

"Thank You, Redeemer, for not leaving me stranded in sin. Thank You for bringing me

into Your family and making me Your child. 'Redemption' is a wonderful word. I enjoy

my new position in You. Amen."

Reading: Galatians 4:1-7

Words: 260

Key Thought: Jesus redeemed you and made you a member of God's family.

CREATOR—THE FATHER

"Have you not known? Have you not heard? The everlasting God, the LORD,

the Creator of the ends of the earth, neither faints nor is weary. His understanding

is unsearchable" (Isaiah 40:28).

The Lord is *Creator*; without Him nothing exists (Col. 1:16). No person is able to create another

human. No one can create life, a soul, or the ability to think. God is the Creator who formed

man and woman, so He knows all about you.

"Lord, thank You for making me the way that I am. Thank You for making me after Your

image. Help me to reflect Your nature to others."

The Lord is the *Creator*; some think higher things evolved out of lower life, but they face an

unexplainable gap between the first molecule and nothing. But the first atom came from the

Creator. There are two particles of an atom, a proton and a neutron, with an electron swirling

around these two. His power holds them together. Break apart an atom and you'll get a massive

nuclear explosion. But there are trillion times trillion times trillions of atoms in the universe.

Consider the immeasurable possible nuclear destruction of the universe if all were to be split at

the same time. The power of that explosion is held in check by the greater power of God's

nature. Since He is in every atom, think how close He is to you. The Lord is the Creator God

who made atoms out of nothing. He is powerful enough to know your needs and close enough to

help you.

"Creator, forgive my unbelief when I doubt your existence. Forgive my stubborn will for

not trusting Your power to work things out in my life. I worship You as Creator and God.

Amen."

Reading: Psalm 19, 29

Words: 261

Key Thought: The powerful Creator knows your need.

THE SHADOW OF A GREAT ROCK—JESUS

"A man will be as a hiding place from the wind, and a cover from the tempest, as rivers of water in a dry place, as the shadow of a great rock in a weary land"

(Isaiah 32:2).

Jesus will be your Shadow of a Great Rock to protect you in your spiritual desert. Just as a

person struggling through the desert needs escape from the blistering sun, so Jesus will be The

Shadow of a Great Rock to protect you from burning trials and temptations. Just as a weary

traveler needs a resting place in the shadows before journeying on, so Jesus is The Shadow of a

Great Rock to revitalize you for the next part of your journey. Look to Him for protection and

comfort. You can walk again on the highway of life after resting in His shadow.

"Lord, today I need a little rest. Also, I need encouragement to get up and walk again in

the heat of the day. Ah, it's good to relax in Your presence."

Jesus is The Shadow of a Great Rock. There are no trees in the desert for shade. If there were

trees, they would die in the heat. But the weather can't destroy a rock. Only a big rock—big

enough to create a shadow—can help you. Jesus' shadow is big enough for you and other

pilgrims. Did you notice that He's located at the exact place in your journey where you need

Him most? Come rest a while, take off your shoes and cool down. Take a nap before you have

to go on your way.

"Lord Jesus, You are my rock of renewal; I get strength from You. But also, You are my

Rock of stability. You give me purpose in life! Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 32:1-20

Words: 259

Key Thought: Jesus will shadow you from burning trials.

KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS—JESUS

"And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written: KING OF KINGS

AND LORD OF LORDS " (Revelation 19:16).

Jesus is The King of Kings and Lord of Lords, the absolute sovereign Ruler of the universe.

Today, He has given people and nations the freedom to chose or deny His rule. Those who

choose Him will live, and those who deny Him will die. One day He will return to earth to

examine what choice each person has made. When Jesus returns, written on His garments will

be His title, "King of Kings, and Lord of Lords."

"Lord, I pray "thy kingdom come" and in anticipation of Your rule, I worship Your

majesty. O King of Kings, I want You to rule in my heart today, just as you'll rule the

universe in the future."

As King of Kings and Lord of Lords, Jesus will return to earth on a white horse, followed by the

armies of Heaven. There will be multitudes following Him, and the saints and angels will come

with Him. He will come to rule on earth, but today He's asking to rule your heart. Jesus is the

Lord of Lords; in that day, all false religions will be destroyed and all false gods will be

eliminated. Like the idols they represent, false gods will be burned with fire. Jesus will be the

only LORD in that day, for He will be Lord of Lords. The kings of this world will all be gone.

Jesus will be the only King in that day, for He will be King over all.

"O, Lord of Lords, I bow to worship You for personal salvation. I know You saved me

and transformed Me. I know You're coming again for me. I am waiting. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 21:1-8

Words: 275

Key Thought: One day Jesus will be the ultimate and only King.

THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon Me, because the LORD has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to

proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are

bound;" (Isaiah 61:1).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of the Lord God, who anointed Jesus to preach the Gospel.

Therefore, He can anoint you to effectively share the good news of salvation. Just as the Holy

Spirit sent Jesus to do miracles of mercy, so He can send you to show mercy on needy people.

Just as the Holy Spirit helped Jesus proclaim liberty to captives, so He can use you to give the

message of spiritual liberty to all. You can open the prison of sin to those who are in bondage to

Satan. Just as the *Holy Spirit* anointed Jesus for ministry, He can also use you in ministry.

"Holy Spirit, I believe in You. What You have done in ministry through Jesus, do the

same for me. I want to be used by You."

The Spirit of the Lord God led Jesus while He was upon Earth (Luke 4:1, 14). They had perfect

harmony because Jesus was one with the Father and the Holy Spirit. When you yield completely

to the Holy Spirit, He can lead you every step of each day. He can help you accomplish much

more with your life. The world has yet to see what can be accomplished through any person who

is completely surrendered to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

"Holy Spirit, I yield my life to You. Help me see areas of my life that are not yielded so I

will yield them to You. I want to be completely filled with Your presence. Amen."

Reading: Luke 4:1-20

Words: 253

Key Thought: The more you yield to the Holy Spirit, the more you can do for Him.

THE SON—JESUS

"All things have been delivered to Me by My Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father. Nor does anyone know the Father except the Son, and the one

to whom the Son wills to reveal Him" (Matthew 11:27).

Jesus is The Son; He's The Son of Man, the Son of God, the Son of the Morning, the Son of

Mary, but His most eternal relationship is *The Son* of the Father. Just as a son on earth has the

nature of his earthly father, Jesus has the divine nature of His heavenly Father; "I and My Father

are one" (John 10:30). Just as an earthly son gets life from his father, so Jesus gets life from the

heavenly Father; "For as the Father has life in Himself, so He has granted the Son to have life in

Himself" (John 5:26). Just as a son wants fellowship with his earthy father, so Jesus constantly

spent time in prayer with His Father.

"Jesus, I want to fellowship with You and the Father, just as You and the Father had

fellowship with one another."

Notice how an earthly son is like *Jesus*: a son obeys his father, just as *Jesus* obeyed the heavenly

Father; a son pleases his father, just as *Jesus* pleased the Father; a son usually looks forward to

spending time with his father, just as Jesus longed to return to His Father in Heaven (John 17:11,

13); a son is usually concerned about the reputation of his father, just as *Jesus* was (John 17:4-6).

"Jesus, You are a wonderful example of what a son should be to the heavenly Father. I

want to be obedient, respectful, and I want to please the Father, just as You pleased Him.

Amen."

Reading: John 5:19-24

Words: 251

Key Thought: Jesus reflects the characteristics of a son in His relationship to the Father.

THE WORD—JESUS

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was

God" (John 1:1).

Jesus is called The Word because He expressed the true idea of the Father, just as a written word

represents the ideas of an author. Jesus is also called The Word because He is the One who

communicated the Father's desires to the people, just as a written word communicates an

author's intention. Jesus is also The Word because He interprets the Father to the world, just as a

human author interprets a theme to readers. Words are symbols of meaning, and Jesus is the

symbol that showed the world what God was like in the flesh.

"Jesus, I look to You to show me what God is like. I will study the Word of God to better

understand God and know what He expects of me."

Jesus was the powerful Word who lived in the flesh. But Jesus' words spoken were also

powerful, for His words raised the dead, calmed storms, and comforted the hurting. Also, the

written Word of Christ is just as powerful as the spoken words of Christ. The written words of

Christ can save, heal, cast out demons, and become the basis for answered prayer (Col. 3:16,

Heb. 4:12). Jesus elevated His words to a supernatural level when He said, "The words that I

speak to you are spirit, and they are life" (John 6:63). Peter agreed with Him, "You have the

words of eternal life" (John 6:68).

"Lord, I love Your Word, because You tell me about the Father. I love Your words

because they are spirit and life. Amen."

Reading: John 1:1-14

Words: 256

Key Thought: Jesus is the Word who communicates the Father to us.

THE UNKNOWN GOD—TRINITY

"As I was passing through and considering the object of your worship, I even

found an altar with the inscription: TO THE UNKNOWN GOD" (Acts 17:23).

God is *The Unknown God*. He is the real God that is the prototype of all false gods crafted by

those who don't know the real God. Just as there is a real object from which imitations are

made, God is the real One that the world doesn't know; yet they make imitations of Him. He is

not like the false gods of gold, or silver, or stone; carved with human hands. The world doesn't

know the God of Heaven—*The Unknown God*—but He is everywhere present at the same time.

"Lord, I know You even though the world will not recognize You. I know You in

salvation, and I know You in fellowship. I want to make You known to others."

The world may think God doesn't exist and that He's unknown, but they are still accountable to

Him because He created "the world and everything in it" (Acts 17:24). Everyone is an

"offspring of God" and they "live and move and have their being" in Him (Acts 17:28). All are

responsible to seek God because He is "not far from everyone" (Acts 17:27). It is our task to let

the world see God in us.

"Lord, I will not let anything substitute for You, nor will I worship anything in Your

place. I will make room for You at the center of my life. I will worship You only.

Amen."

Reading: Acts 17:16-34

Words: 233

Key Thought: The real God of Heaven is the prototype of all false gods.

THE TRUE VINE—JESUS

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser" (John 15:1).

Jesus is the True Vine. Israel was called God's vine in the Old Testament, but the nation was an

unfaithful vine (Isa. 5:1-7). In contrast, Jesus is The True Vine. He was true to the Father's

mission for Him, when Israel was disobedient to the Father. Jesus was truthful in character and

speech. On the night before He was arrested Jesus said, "I am the true vine" (John 15:1). Just as

a vine gives life and energy through its fruit, so Jesus gives eternal life to those who believe

Him. Just as a vine gives satisfying drink, so Jesus gives joy and contentment to those who

follow Him. Just as a vine gives shade to the weary traveler, so Jesus gives shelter from the

burning sun of opposition and trouble. What do you need from *Jesus*?

"Lord Jesus, You are true. You have kept every promise concerning forgiveness, eternal

life, happiness, and protection. You are The True Vine who keeps His word."

Jesus said, "I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15:5). Looking at a vine, you can't tell

which is the original stem and which is a branch. This is what Jesus meant, "You in Me and I in

you" (John 14:20). We must stay connected to Him because "the branch cannot bear fruit of

itself, unless it abides in the vine" (John 15:4).

"Lord Jesus, You are the Vine; let Your energy flow through me. You are the source of

life; let Your fruitfulness grow through me. You are the Vine, I am the branches. Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 5:1-5; John 15:1-7

Words: 260

Key Thought: You must be attached to the Vine to get life and fruit.

PROPITIATION—JESUS

"My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous: And he is

the propitiation for our sins: and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the

whole world" (1 John 2:1, 2, *KJV*).

Jesus is the Propitiation; it is His title that means "full satisfaction." Heathens use the word

propitiation when offering sacrifices to their idols to appease their supposed wrath. Jesus is your

Propitiation—the full satisfaction—to satisfy God's punishment of your sins.

"Lord, thank You for paying the price to satisfy my sin-debt, but not just my sin; You

have died for the whole world."

Jesus is your *Propitiation*, meaning your sins are fully forgiven. "He (God) loved us and sent

His Son to be the propitiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10). Now when the Lord looks at you, He

doesn't see your sin; He sees the ledger marked, "Paid in Full." Because Jesus has satisfied your

debt, you are now free in Christ. The word propitiation is also translated Mercy Seat, as the lid

on the Ark of the Covenant. The *Mercy Seat* was the place of propitiation—satisfaction—where

the blood was sprinkled blood for forgiveness. But the title propitiation, or Mercy Seat also was

the place where the presence of God came to rest in the Tabernacle. God does not have a throne

on Earth; He sits on the Mercy Seat. Because blood is sprinkled there, it is a seat of mercy.

Now, because of *propitiation*, Jesus can come to you and His presence can abide with you.

"Lord, thank You for forgiving all my sin-debt and satisfying the indictments against me.

Help me enjoy Your forgiveness; I need Your presence in my life this day. Come. Amen."

Reading: 1 John 2:1-11

Words: 252

Key Thought: Jesus has satisfied every debt you owe because of sin.

GOD THE FATHER—FATHER

"Paul, an apostle (not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and

God the Father who raised Him from the dead)" (Galatians 1:1).

God the Father is equal in nature to God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Because God is three

persons—the Trinity—each person is separate from One another, yet God has one nature. Each

person in the Godhead is all-wise, all-powerful, and equally present everywhere. Each person is

totally holy, completely loving, and innately good. So, you must worship each person of the

Godhead with all your heart. God the Father is a title of relationship to His beloved Son and the

Holy Spirit. Just as there is a loving relationship between the members of the Godhead, so you

can have a loving relationship with others who belong to God. When you were born again, you

became a child of God, you became a member of God's family. Now you shall love others as

the Father loves you.

"Father, I praise You for Your powerful Creation and Your love for me. Jesus, thank

You for dying for my sins. Holy Spirit, I am grateful for Your transforming power in my

conversion."

God the Father is a favorite term used by Paul. His readers were mostly idol worshippers before

conversion, so they believed in God. But, they didn't know God as their Father until Paul taught

them who He was. Paul exhorted them to know *God the Father* in a personal relationship.

"O God my Father, You are first among equals in the Trinity. You are first in my life

without equal. I exalt You to the throne of my life. Let me know You better. Amen."

Reading: Galatians 1:1-12

Words: 258

Key Thought: God is the Father who you can know intimately.

THE LAMB OF GOD—JESUS

"Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29).

On the banks of the Jordan River, John the Baptist announced to the world, "Behold! The Lamb

of God . . . " (John 1:29). For hundreds of years, thousands of faithful Israelites sacrificed

millions of lambs—all looking forward to the coming of Messiah to forgive their sins. Because

Jesus was The Lamb of God, all the drudgery of sacrifice finally came to an end. Now, every

new day should be exciting because Jesus, The Lamb of God, has "taken away the sin of the

world"—including all of yesterday's mistakes. He has taken away your sins because you

believed in Him. Today is a new opportunity to serve the Lord. Thank God for the Lamb who

has taken away your sins.

"O Lamb of God, forgive me for the willful sins I do, and look deeply to see my

repentance. And purge me of the ignorant sins I don't realize I do."

Learn to worship *The Lamb*. Learn to do on earth what you'll do in Heaven. Worship should be

your passion now, as you will worship once you arrive in Heaven. When you get to Heaven, you

will join many others worshipping "Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb, forever and

ever!" (Rev. 5:13). In Heaven you will cry out with others, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain"

(Rev. 5:12).

"Jesus, Lamb of God, 'At Your name I join every knee bowing . . . and I join every tongue

confessing that You, Jesus Christ are Lord' (Phil 2:10, 11, Author's Translation).

Amen."

Reading: Rev. 5:6-12

Words: 260

Key Thought: Jesus is worthy of our worship.

THE ONE THAT HAS THE KEY OF DAVID—JESUS

"These things says He who is holy, He who is true, 'He who has the key of David,

He who opens and no one shuts, and shuts and no one opens'" (Revelation

3:7).

Jesus is The One that has the Key of David. It was given to Him by His heavenly Father. The

key gives Jesus the authority to determine who will enter the kingdom. He alone determines

who will be given access to the Father, for Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No

one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). Jesus is The One That Has The Key of

David, whereby all shall be saved. Now you must share this key—the message—with others. "I

have set before you an open door, and no one can shut it" (Rev. 3:8). You have an open door to

share the message of salvation with those you know. Jesus said, "I am coming quickly! Hold

fast what you have, that no one may take your crown" (Rev. 3:11). Don't let the door of

witnessing shut.

"Lord, I need wisdom to grasp all the opportunities I have to serve You. I need Your

wisdom to know what to say, and I need Your courage to help me speak to others about

salvation."

Jesus is the One who will open and who can shut the door of opportunity. When He opens up an

opportunity to witness, you must do so or that door may be shut to you in the future.

"Jesus, You have the key. I ask You to help me use my opportunities so others may

believe. Don't let me lose my chance to witness for You. Amen."

Reading: Acts 8:1-40

Words: 252

Key Thought: Jesus opens doors for you to witness to others.

DEW—THE HOLY SPIRIT

"I will be like the dew to Israel" (Hosea 14:5).

The Holy Spirit is Dew, and can refresh your spirit with His presence today. Feel Him! He is

Dew, coming when you can't see Him, coming gently to leave refreshment, even when you can't

see with your physical eyes. Do you feel moist? He is *Dew* that leaves your spiritual face damp

when it's not raining. Experience Him! He is *Dew* coming silently, invisibly, and softly; let His

presence work in your life.

"Lord, be Dew to refresh me when I'm tired. The unsaved don't understand spirituality,

nor do they believe in You. Be Dew to moisten my arid soul to refresh my spirit this

day."

The Holy Spirit is Dew to reinvigorate your vision; open up your soul to see more things from

God. He is *Dew* to re-challenge those who are about to give up the battle; let Him re-equip you

for spiritual warfare. He is *Dew* to re-invigorate those who quit working. He can re-enlist you

this day. He is *Dew*, like the early morning dampness that makes the grass and plants grow, even

when there's no rain. Let Him be *Dew* that gives you new purpose in life.

"Lord, sometimes I feel like I can't go forward; I want to give up. My Spirit needs a new

start; I need refreshment in my life. Come let me feel Your refreshing moisture in my

soul. I worship and praise You for the fresh challenge of this new day. Come, Dew, let

me live anew. Amen."

Reading: Hosea 14

Words: 248

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit refreshes our hearts like morning dew.

THE LORD WHO IS, AND WHO WAS, AND WHO IS TO COME—JESUS

"I am . . . the Lord who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty"

(Revelation 1:8).

Jesus is The Lord Who Is . . . Who Was . . . and Who Is To Come, He is eternal, without

beginning and without end. This description reflects Jesus' pre-existence. He lived before being

born as a baby in Bethlehem. From eternity past to eternity future, Jesus is the eternal God. You

can trust Him with your life, for He has always existed; He knows all about you; He knows your

trouble and He knows your need.

"Lord, I know You have helped people in Bible times, because You lived back then; help

me today. I believe You are eternal."

Jesus will not change the way He relates to His own. The writer of Hebrews declares, "Jesus

Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Heb. 13:8). He will do for you—and all

believers—what He has done in the past. He can't change His nature, and He will not change

His mind. Jesus can be to you today what He Has always been in the past. Moses said, "From

everlasting to everlasting, you are God" (Ps. 90:2). Before time began, He was eternal God; after

time on earth is finished, He will still be God. You can trust His promises and His care.

"Lord, I am blinded by my self absorption; help me fully see Your love and care. I am

human and frail; help me look beyond my doubts to clearly see Your presence in my life.

When I only see my needs; help me to see Your eternal nature and worship You. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 17:14-21

Words: 259

Key Thought: Jesus can help you today as He helped people in Bible times.

THE SON OF MARY—JESUS

"Is this not the carpenter, the Son of Mary, and brother of James, Joses, Judas, and

Simon? And are not His sisters here with us?" (Mark 6:3).

Jesus is The Son of Mary, born as a human baby, yet Mary was a virgin. Because Mary had not

known a man, Jesus was born sinless, without a sin nature. He lived His entire life without sin (2)

Cor. 5:21), so He could be the substitute Lamb of God without blemish for the sins of the world.

Jesus, The Son of Mary, came to His own people—the Jews—but they did not receive Him (John

1:11). Even some members of His family were blinded to who He was (John 7:5). When Jesus

preached to the people of His hometown Nazareth, "They were offended at Him" (Mark 6:3).

What is your response to *Jesus*? Will you be His disciple; will you live blamelessly for Him?

"Jesus, I believe You were 100 percent human, born of Mary; yet You are 100 percent

God. Thank You for becoming human so You could understand us. I worship You, and I

will follow Your example and strive to live godly."

Jesus, The Son of Mary, grew as a child and had favor with God and man (Luke 2:52). Mary

taught Him lessons that a mother teaches her child. Now He wants you to grow to please God as

He did. "And the Child grew and became strong in spirit, filled with wisdom; and the grace of

God was upon Him" (Luke 2:42).

"Jesus, I want You to live in my heart (Gal. 2:20) to strengthen me so I can please the

Father. Amen."

Reading: Luke 6:1-6

Words: 250

Key Thought: The human Jesus is your example of how to live.

JEHOVAH SHAMMAH (THE LORD IS THERE)—TRINITY

"The city from that day shall be Jehovah Shammah—THE LORD IS THERE"

(Ezekiel 48:35).

The name Jehovah Shammah means The Lord Is There. The Lord is already in Heaven where

you will spend eternity. Ezekiel described the city where you shall live as Jehovah Shammah, a

city of His presence. The most wonderful thing about Heaven is that He'll be there with you.

Jehovah Shammah will meet you in the valley that has the shadow of death. From there, He'll

take you to the other side. The most frightening thing about shadows is the unknown, and we

fear what we can't see. So most fear death because they can't see the other side. But remember,

a shadow can't hurt you; it can only make you hurt yourself. Don't forget the promise, "I'll be

with you in the shadow of death." You'll step into darkness, and come out in the light on the

other side. He'll be there with you because He's Jehovah Shammah. A shadow is the absence of

light. The city where you're going—the Eternal City—is constantly bright because God is its

light. There will be no night there, which means no shadows. Neither will there be sorrow or

death. To get there, you will step into the shadow of death, and come out on the other side with

the Lord.

"Lord, give me confidence to live for You on this side of death's shadow. Then help me

step confidently through the shadow with You to the other side. There I'll be with you,

and it'll be eternal light. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 21:9-27

Words: 249

Key Thought: The Lord will be with you in both death and Heaven.

A HIGH PRIEST – JESUS

"So also Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but it was He who

said to Him: 'You are My Son, today I have begotten You'" (Hebrews 5:5).

There were many priests in the Old Testament assigned to small groups of people. Each priest

was responsible to sacrifice for those under his care. Over all priests was the High Priest who

was responsible to sacrifice for the entire nation. On the Day of Atonement, the High Priest

offered a sacrifice for the whole nation. Jesus is our High Priest who sacrificed for the sins of

the world (1 John 2:1, 2). Human priests had to sacrifice first for their sins before they could

sacrifice for the nation. But Jesus was without sin. "We have a great High Priest . . . who was in

all points tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:14, 15). So Jesus, the perfect High Priest,

offered the perfect sacrifice for your sins.

Lord Jesus, I come to You for forgiveness. Thank You for the perfect sacrifice for my

sins."

Every time an Israelite sinned, he had to come back to sacrifice again because each sacrifice only

took care of past sins. But the sacrifice of Jesus the High Priest is different. He doesn't have to

make continual sacrifices for us (Heb. 9:24, 25); but "Once" Jesus died, "to put away sin by the

sacrifice of Himself" (Heb. 9:26). Now, "He is able to save to the uttermost those who come to

God through Him, since He ever lives" (Heb. 7:25).

"Lord Jesus, You are my High Priest who has taken away all my sins forever. Now You

live in Heaven for me. Amen."

Reading: Heb. 5:5-10

Words: 252

Key Thought: Jesus is a High Priest who has forgiven all our sins once and for all.

THE FINISHER OF OUR FAITH – JESUS

"Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the

right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2).

Jesus is The Finisher of Our Faith. If you are good at beginning new projects, but you are a poor

finisher, look to Jesus, The Finisher of Our Faith. He completed salvation. The blood of Jesus

completely forgave your sins; you now stand forgiven before God. Jesus finished everything

that you need for spiritual growth but you must take advantage of His completed work. All the

power you need to live the Christian life He supplied through the cross. Every advantage of

eternal life is supplied to you through the sacrifice of His life for you. All spiritual riches of the

heavenlies are now available to you.

"Jesus, thank You for finishing the work of Salvation."

Jesus is The Finisher of Our Faith; there's nothing more He needs to do for you to go to Heaven.

When He cried, "It is finished," the plan of salvation was complete. The work of Messiah that

was predicted in the Old Testament was ended. The task of satisfying God's wrath was done.

He has finished what was assigned to Him; there is nothing you can do to add to His work. But,

you must come boldly to His throne of Grace to get help to live the Christian life. You must run

with patience the race that is set before you (Heb. 12:2). He has finished His task; will you

finish yours?

"Jesus, You finished Your task, now help me finish my task. You have provided a

completed plan of salvation; help me to take advantage of spiritual power that is mine in

the cross. Amen."

Reading: Mark 15:7-24

Words: 263

Key Thought: Jesus has finished everything that you need for your salvation.

GOD OUR FATHER—FATHER

"To all who are in Rome, beloved of God, called to be saints: Grace to you and

peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 1:7).

God is Your Father; the One who knows you personally and cares for you. When Paul used the

phrase "God Our Father," he was telling his readers that God was not like the idols in the

temples of false religions. He was not callous and brittle, but had the warmth of a father. Just as

an earthly father has emotional feelings for his children, the heavenly Father has deeper feelings

because He has pure emotions of love, and He desires to do good things for His children. You

can never love Him with the same depth of feelings because you are finite and your heavenly

Father is infinite.

"O, God My Father, I love You with all my heart . . . my soul . . . my mind (Matt. 22:37).

I worship You in Your greatness and praise You for Your personal care for me."

He is both God and your Father. Being a Father makes Him no less God, than being the all-

powerful Creator makes Him less personal. He is both Creator God and your personal Father.

He is a Father who protects His children from evil. Will you let Him be your protector today?

He is a Father who provides for the needs of His children. Will you accept His provision today?

He is a Father who instructs and guides. Will you listen to His direction today?

"O God My Father, I have many needs; give me this day my daily bread. I will study

Your Word: teach me Your desires. Amen."

Reading: Romans 1:1-12

Words: 255

Key Thought: The powerful Creator is also your Father who cares for you.

THE SERPENT IN THE WILDERNESS-JESUS

"And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of

Man be lifted up" (John 3:14).

The Serpent in the Wilderness was a sign of the people's sin. It was a sculpture of a snake made

of brass that was placed on a pole so all could see. Israel rebelled, "And the people spoke

against God and against Moses" (Num. 21:5). The people were complaining, "There is no food

and no water, and our soul loathes this worthless bread" (Num. 21:5). Of all their sin, perhaps

ingratitude was the worst, for the Lord had given then manna—bread from Heaven—and Israel

called it "worthless bread." "So the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the

people; and many of the people of Israel died" (Num. 21:6). It was after the serpents began

killing the Jews that they repented, "We have sinned" (Num. 21:7). God instructed Moses to

make a brass serpent and put it on a pole. "... everyone who is bitten, when he looks at it, shall

live" (Num. 21:8). The snake was a sign of their sin, and looking at the serpent, was an outward

evidence of repentance. When Jesus was lifted up on the cross, Jesus became our sin (2 Cor.

6:21). Just as Israel was saved from physical death when they looked upon the sign of their sin,

so looking upon *Jesus* is looking on the sign of our sin.

"Jesus, I thank You for becoming my sin in Your death for me. Thank You that the poison

of my sin does not destroy me as it did the unbelieving Jews in the wilderness. I 'look and

live.' Amen."

Reading: Num. 21:1-9

Words: 263

Key Thought: Those who look on Jesus as their Sin-bearer will live.

THE CHILD JESUS – JESUS

"So he came by the Spirit into the temple. And when the parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for Him according to the custom of the law, when they had

finished the days, as they returned, the Boy Jesus lingered behind in Jerusalem.

And Joseph and His mother did not know it" (Luke 2:27, 43).

Jesus did not enter the world as a spirit, or did he appear instantly as an angel may appear. Jesus

was supernaturally conceived of a virgin and was born nine months later. His development

followed the growth pattern of other children, "And the Child grew and became strong in spirit,

filled with wisdom" (Luke 2:40). His parents had to teach Him to walk, talk, and develop motor

skills. His parents brought the *Child Jesus* to dedicate Him in the Temple. When 12-years-old,

the Boy Jesus was brought into the Temple for His Bar Mitzvah and Jesus became a "son of the

law." The parents of the Child Jesus raised Him according to Scriptures just as parents should

raise children today. Jesus, the Son of God, "(was) born under the law, to redeem those who

were under the law" (Gal. 4:4, 5).

"Lord Jesus, I marvel that You became a child and grew according to the growth pattern

of children. I praise You for becoming flesh to redeem us who were under the law."

God the Father sent the Son to become a child who would grow into manhood. God the Holy

Spirit guided the *Child Jesus*, "So he came by the Spirit into the temple" (Luke 2:27). Later, the

Man, "Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit" (Luke 4:14). Both the Father and the Holy

Spirit were active in bringing *Jesus* to maturity.

"Lord Jesus, You gave me a role model to follow, give me power to follow Your example.

You died for my sins; I worship You for salvation. Amen."

Reading: Luke 2:25-35

Words: 262

Key Thought: The Child Jesus was like us so He could redeem us.

THE HAND OF GOD —HOLY SPIRIT

"And I told them of the hand of my God which had been good upon me So

they said, 'Let us rise up and build.' Then they set their hands to this good work"

(Nehemiah 2:18).

The Holy Spirit is The Hand of God. Just as someone gives a hand when people need help, let

the Holy Spirit be The Hand of God that helps you today. He is nearby; all you need to do is ask

for His help. But the Holy Spirit can't help you unless you want Him, ask for Him, and allow

Him to work in your life.

"Holy Spirit, I need Your Hand in my life. I need Your help today. Come help me now."

The Hand of God works for you in two ways. First, the Holy Spirit works directly in your life.

When you pray for money, for a solution, or for a healing, *The Hand of God* may give it directly

to you. But, the *Holy Spirit* works *indirectly* when people don't realize He's working. Did you

notice in the text that the Holy Spirit's Hand was upon the work of building the wall in

Jerusalem? The *Holy Spirit* worked when the people "set their hands to do this good work"

(Neh. 2:12)? God's hands work through your hands. Look at your hands; what can your hands

do for God today? Yield your hands so the *Holy Spirit* can work through you this day.

"Holy Spirit, I yield my hands to You. I will work as hard as I can to accomplish Your

will. I will use all my intellect and energy to get all the jobs done that I have to do today.

Come use my hands as Your hands. Amen."

Reading: Nehemiah 1:1-2:20

Words: 254

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit can work directly or indirectly in your life.

THE DAYSMAN BETWEEN US -JESUS

"Neither is there any daysman betwixt us, that might lay his hand upon us both"

(Job 9:33, KJV).

Job was looking for a daysman to be a neutral arbitrator between him and God. A daysman is an

umpire, advocate, or an impartial judge. God had removed the hedge of protection from Job, and

Satan had stripped Job of all family, possessions, and his health. Job suggests that no matter how

hard he had tried to vindicate himself, nothing worked. He wanted someone who was neutral to

judge between him and God. Job wanted someone who was powerful enough to be separate

from God and stand against God. Of course, such a thing was impossible, unless the daysman is

equal to God, or in this case, is God Himself. Jesus is The Daysman who stands equal with the

Father, yet stands for Job. Jesus is our Daysman who takes our case and pleads it to the Father.

"Jesus, thank You for taking my side when I didn't deserve anything. Jesus, thank You

for being my arbitrator with the Father."

Jesus is the Daysman because He is equal with the Father, yet He came to Earth to take on flesh.

He lived in our shoes, so He understands our weaknesses. Because He died to forgive our sins,

Jesus now stands between the Father and us. He asks the Father to forgive us because Jesus has

paid the ransom for our sins. Jesus The Daysman asks the Father to receive us into Heaven and

make us His child.

"Jesus, thank You for being my mediator. Thank You for going to the Father to plead my

case. Amen."

Reading: Job 9:21-35

Words: 256

Key Thought: Jesus is the neutral umpire who gets the Heavenly Father to accept us.

PRINCE OF PEACE—JESUS

For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called . . . Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

Jesus is the *Prince of Peace*. A prince is one who anticipates becoming king who will rule

sovereignly. One day Jesus will be King of Kings (Rev. 19:16). But now Jesus is the Prince of

Peace who can secure your inner "peace with God" (Rom. 5:1). Jesus is the Prince of Peace

because He "made peace through the blood of His cross" (Col. 1:20). Jesus is the Prince of

Peace who can take away your fears and give you inner confidence. He can meet the deepest

needs of the human heart because He is peace and He gives peace. He is "the peace of God,

which surpasses all understanding." He can guard your hearts and minds so you won't lose the

peace you now have in Him.

"Lord, take away the strife in my life. Come fill my life with Your presence and let Your

peace flood my thinking. I claim peace and contentment for this day."

There are wars and rumors of wars among nations and there is strife among people because each

person is ruled by selfish interest. One day, Jesus will rule all people and they will want to

please Him, not themselves. He will bring what the angels promised at His birth: "Peace on

earth, goodwill toward men" (Luke 2:14).

"Lord, I pray Your Kingdom will come and You will rule on earth, as You now rule in

Heaven. But, until that day comes, may Your peace control my life and work. Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 11

Words: 247

Key Thought: We have peace when Jesus rules our hearts.

JEHOVAH-SABAOTH (THE LORD OF HOSTS)—TRINITY

"The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge" (Psalm 46:11).

The Lord of Host is Jehovah-Sabaoth. His title Sabaoth means a host ready to serve or ready to

fight. The Lord is ready to help you today; He knows about your problems. They do not catch

Him by surprise. He is Jehovah-Sabaoth, ready to come to your defense. Jehovah-Sabaoth can

be translated, "The God of the Fighting Angels." The Lord has a numberless company of

"ministering spirits (Heb. 1:14) who will defend you from the Evil One. He can dispatch them to

your assistance, "For he orders his angels to protect you wherever you go. They will hold you

with their hands" (Ps. 91:11, 12, NLT). However, you must ask for help and trust Him when He

comes alongside to fight for you.

"O Lord of Host, give me wisdom to know what to do, and give me courage to face my

troubles. Help me win over them. O Lord of Host, come quickly with Your "fighting

angels" to defend me. The enemy has almost overwhelmed me. I need You right here,

right now."

You have heavenly power available to you. Don't focus your eyes on the enemy, or on your

weakness. If you do that, you will get discouraged and fail. Look to the Lord of Hosts-

Jehovah-Sabaoth—for your strength. He can give you victory.

"Jehovah-Sabaoth, come with Your "fighting angels" to give me victory over the world,

the flesh, and the Devil. I believe in Your power and trust Your protection. Amen."

Reading: Ps. 24:1-10

Words: 245

Key Thought: The Lord is ready to help you win over your troubles.

RESURRECTION—JESUS

"Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me,

though he may die, he shall live" (John 11:25).

Jesus is your Resurrection, which means He gave new life to you when you were saved. Jesus

gave this eternal life to you when He came out of the grave, because He said, "I am the

resurrection." Now you are raised in Jesus; you will live forever. Your old body may die at

your death (if the rapture doesn't come first), but your soul goes to live with God. At the rapture,

your soul will be rejoined to your new glorious body. One day you'll have a new body like

Christ's.

"Lord of the Resurrection, thank You for saving me. Than You for the promise of raising

me in the future."

When Jesus died, your sin died with Him. When Jesus arose from the dead, you were in Him,

rising from the dead. Jesus is the Resurrection. Now you are "in Him and He is in you" (John

14:20, Author's paraphrase). You are seated in the heavenlies (Eph. 2:6). So, let your life on

earth, reflect your new heavenly position. Because Jesus is the Resurrection, His life-giving

power can indwell you and give you new desires to live godly. Because Jesus is the

Resurrection, "You can be strengthened in your inner person by His indwelling presence" (Eph.

3:17, 17, Author's Paraphrase). Because of *Jesus*' resurrection, He can give you spiritual victory

today.

"Lord, I marvel at your resurrection, and worship You for what you've done for me. I

claim Your resurrection power to help me live for You this day. Help me overcome my

problems and be victorious today." Amen.

Reading: John 11:1-41

Words: 260

Key Thought: You can be victorious because of Jesus' resurrection.

OUR PASSOVER —JESUS

"Therefore purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, since you truly are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed for us" (1

Corinthians 5:7).

Jesus is our Passover. Once each year, Jewish families celebrated their deliverance from Egypt

by eating a special Passover meal and by sacrificing a lamb to make atonement for the sins of the

family. The father would place his hands on the head of the lamb to confess the sins of the

family members. That was symbolic of transferring the family sins to the lamb; then the blood

of the lamb was shed, a prototype of *Jesus* becoming the Lamb of God to take away their sin.

Jesus became the fulfillment of the Passover. The lamb had to be perfect, without blemish, a

picture of the perfect life of Jesus. Because Jesus did not sin (1 Peter 2:22), He was qualified to

take away the sin of the world (John 1:29).

"Jesus, You are my Passover Lamb; You became sin for me (2 Cor. 5:21), Your blood is

the basis for my forgiveness. Jesus, I praise You for Your sacrificial death. Thank You

for dying for me and the world."

Jesus is your Passover. Just as each Jewish family looked back in gratitude for deliverance from

the death angel that passed over their home, you should look back in gratitude that judgment has

passed over you. Then you should look forward to the return of *Jesus* to take you home to live

with Him. His future coming is just as sure as His past sacrificial death. You can have faith in

both of them.

"Lord, I look back and remember Your death and I look forward, waiting for Your

return. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 12:1-13

Words: 261

Key Thought: The benefits of Passover are ours because of Jesus.

ONE GOD AND FATHER—FATHER

"One god and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all"

(Ephesians 4:6).

There is *One God and Father* of all people. Many people deny God's existence, reject His

invitation to salvation, or even refuse to recognize Him; but the God of the Bible is still the only

God powerful enough to create the Universe, yet loving to redeem fallen mankind. But God is

not just the Father of those who believe in Him; He is the Father of all. He created mankind and

gave life to all. As God and Father of all, He wants a relationship with those He created. He's a

Father who loves all and wants all to come to Him. He's a Father who loves to give things to

His children. He wants to protect them, guide them, teach them, and enjoy them. Let God be

your *Father* today.

"Father, I need Your presence in my life. Teach me how to be a good child."

God is the *Father* of all, even to those who refuse to recognize His ownership of the world and

His authority over their lives. Those who reject God's ownership of their lives will be punished

in the last day of judgment. It is then that all – saved and unsaved – will recognize He is the only

God and Father, but then it will be too late. So today, recognize His control over your life,

because the *One God* of the Universe is also your personal *Father*.

"O God, help me understand that You are the powerful creator of the Universe, yet You

are as intimate to me as a Father. Help me understand Your greatness, yet enjoy

intimacy with You."

Reading: Deut. 6:1-5

Words: 266

Key Thought: The Sovereign God of the Universe can be as intimate to you as a *Father*.

MY BELOVED SON—JESUS

"And suddenly a voice came from heaven, saying, 'This is My beloved Son, in

whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17).

Jesus is The Beloved Son of the Father. When Jesus was baptized, the Father spoke from

Heaven, "This is My beloved Son" (Matt. 3:17). The heavenly Father could have called Jesus

Mary's son or Joseph's son; because these descriptions would have been accurate. But Jesus is

the unique Son of the Father in Heaven, i.e., the Second Person of the Godhead. Just as *Jesus* is

the Beloved of the Father, so He should become your Beloved.

"Jesus, just as the Father said You belong to Him, I too claim You as my own. You are

my Savior and I am Your servant. Help me carry out Your purpose today."

The Father spoke audibly to the crowd when John baptized Jesus. That was the formal induction

of Jesus into ministry. The Father was telling the world that He approved of Jesus' baptism and

His ministry in the world. The Holy Spirit also came upon Jesus to show the total approval of

the Godhead. The heavenly Father called Jesus Beloved. The Father had always loved Jesus

throughout eternity, but the Father especially loved Jesus because He became flesh as the divine

representation to the world. Because the Father loves the world, He especially loved Jesus for

coming to redeem the world.

"Jesus, I accept You as The Beloved Son of the Father. Thank You for becoming flesh to

live among men and die for their sins. Today, live through my life so I can show

salvation to everyone I meet. Amen."

Reading: Mark 1:1-11

Words: 249

Key Thought: Jesus is the beloved Son of the Father.

THE SOWER – JESUS

"And as he sowed, some seed fell by the wayside; and the birds came and devoured them.' He answered and said to them: 'He who sows the good seed is

the Son of Man'" (Matthew 13:4, 37).

Jesus is The Sower of the seed of the Word of God into the hearts of people. Yet, The Sower in

the parable is an application of every Christian who spreads God's Word. There is no

contradiction, because Jesus sows the Gospel through His believers. Jesus loves all because He

sows the seed on all kinds of ground: He sows on the hard-hearted, wayside hearts. He sows on

the shallow, rocky soil heart. He sows on the thorn-infested, sinful hearts. And He sows into the

good ground of receptive hearts. How receptive is your heart?

"Jesus, give me a receptive heart to receive and believe Your Word. Forgive me when I

was not quick to seek Your presence, or when I was slow to believe."

The sower must choose seed to match the soil. Just as peanuts should be planted in soft, sandy

soil, not thick, clay soil, so Jesus sows a judgmental message against sin to break a hard heart.

Jesus sometimes sows a tender message of forgiveness to mend a broken heart. Just as seed

planted too close will choke out sunlight and seed planted too far apart will reduce profits, so

Jesus knows how often and how long the Gospel message must be presented. Jesus, The Sower,

knows how and when to plant, as well as knowing how and when to harvest.

"Jesus, I've tried to reach others, but have not been as successful as I could be. Teach

me how to sow the Gospel into others, and teach me how to harvest. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 13:1-23

Words: 257

Key Thought: Jesus sows the Gospel through us.

THE DOWN PAYMENT—THE HOLY SPIRIT

"The Holy Spirit of Promise is the down payment on our inheritance, until God redeems us as at the rapture as the possession He has purchased" (Ephesians 1:13-

14, Author's Translation).

The Holy Spirit is The Down Payment that guarantees you will one day be redeemed from

corruption. So, don't give up and don't get discouraged. Every time you feel the Holy Spirit

working in your life, realize you aren't forgotten. Your spiritual happiness is only a foretaste of

the joy to come. That's a promise of the *Holy Spirit*.

"Lord, I know I am Your child because You work in my life in so many ways. You

enlighten me, You guide me, You give me spiritual gifts, and You give me assurance.

Thank You for these "Down payments" that guarantees greater future blessings to me."

The Holy Spirit is The Down Payment of what you will experience once you get to Heaven.

Right now you get satisfaction from eating the Bread of Life and drinking the Water of Life.

Think of the unimaginable happiness you'll experience in Heaven. Your future experiences in

Heaven will be as real as your present experiences on this earth. The *Holy Spirit* is the earnest

money that guarantees a future delivery on what God has promised. If you ever doubt the

realities of Heaven, just look within your heart to the work of the Holy Spirit. He will do for you

in the future when you get to Heaven, what He has done for you in the past.

"Lord, help me look beyond the mundane issues of this life to see the spiritual realities

You have for me. Lord, help me live confidently because You are my guarantee for

blessings to come. Amen."

Reading: 2 Cor. 1:18-22

Words: 258

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is your guarantee of Heaven.

THE STONE WHICH THE BUILDERS REJECTED – JESUS

"The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone" (Psalm

118:22).

Jesus is the chief Cornerstone of God's plan, but He is also The Stone Which the Builders

Rejected. There are many reasons why the world rejects Jesus. Some are spiritually blinded (2)

Cor. 4:3, 4); they can't see who *Jesus* is. Some are hard-hearted, "They are willingly ignorant"

(2 Pet. 3:5). Some love their sin and won't give it up to receive *Jesus*. How will you choose?

"Lord, I receive You even though others reject You. I willingly believe in You when the

world rejects Your claims in their life."

Jesus came to His people—the Jews—but they rejected His claims of deity. They charged Jesus

with blasphemy at His trial. He offered them salvation (Matt. 3:17) but they charged Him with

treason (John 19:12), saying Jesus wanted to be king in place of Caesar. "He came to His own,

and His own did not receive Him" (John 1:11). But the unbelief of that day is no different than

those who reject Him today. The unbelieving heart will not receive Jesus, because "Men loved

darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil" (John 3:19). Jesus is The Stone Which

the Builders Rejected. Will you build your life on Him?

"Lord, I will not deny You, no matter how the world reacts. I will build on You, The

Stone. You are My Master and Lord. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 118:1-29

Words: 227

Key Thought: You must receive Jesus even though the world rejects Him.

THE SON OF DAVID—JESUS

"And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say,

'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!'" (Mark 10:47).

Jesus is the Son of David, His human ancestry and authority for ministry. God, the Father, had

promised David that his son would sit eternally on the throne. Jesus was born to fulfill that

prediction. Therefore, Jesus had authority that was originally given David. Blind Bartimaeus

recognized Jesus could help him, so he called Him first "Jesus of Nazareth" (Jesus' name and

address), and second, "Son of David" (Jesus' legal name). Jesus healed Bartimaeus because of

his faith. Do you have faith to call out to Him for your need today?

"Jesus, Son of David, I call out to You. I cannot make it through this day without You.

Come heal My spiritual blindness; help me see Your path for me this day."

Jesus is the Son of David; He can meet your need this day. But realize there will be opposition

to your faith, just as there were individuals who tried to quiet Bartimaeus when he cried out for

help. But Bartimaeus would not be quieted; he cried out even louder. Jesus was motivated by

the faith of Bartimaeus to give him help. Do you have that kind of faith to motivate God to help

you? If you do, Jesus will say to you what He said to Bartimaeus, "Your faith has made you

well" (Mark 10:52).

"Jesus, You are the Son of David. One day You will rule the world from David's throne.

Today, I need You to rule my life from the throne of my heart. Like Bartimaeus, I need

You, come help me today. Amen."

Reading: Mark 10:17-22

Words: 259

Key Thought: Jesus wants to rule your life.

THE FIRSTFRUITS—JESUS

"But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those

who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20).

The Jews brought an offering to God during the Feast of Firstfruits. It was the first they

harvested. Some even say they gave God the first (in quality) from their first harvest (in

sequence). God got the best of their lives and God was put first in their lives. They brought *The*

Firstfruits on Sunday, the first day of the week (Lev. 23:9, 10). There is a lesson to us; we ought

to give God the first of our time (Sunday), the first of our energy (early), the first of our money

(tithes) and make Him first in every part of our lives.

"Jesus, I give You first place in my schedule, in my strength, and in my love."

The Jewish nation was called a firstfruits offering to God out of all the nations of the earth (Jer.

2:3). The first converts in a new church were called firstfruits (Rom. 16:5). When the 144,000

arrived in Heaven, they were the firstfruits of martyrs to be offered to God. When Jesus was

raised from the dead on the first Easter Sunday morning, He was *The Firstfruits* of the dead (1

Cor. 15:20, 23). When the Jews brought a firstfruits offering to God, it was a promise there was

more to follow. When Jesus was raised as the Firstfruits for the dead, it was a promise that all

who were in Christ would also be raised.

"Lord, I don't offer You things, or money, or time; I give myself to You as a sacrifice of

Firstfruits. Be glorified in me. Amen."

Reading: Deut. 26:1-11

Words: 259

Key Thought: God always wants to be first in our lives.

THE BELOVED—JESUS

"To the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He made us accepted in the

Beloved" (Ephesians 1:6).

Jesus is The Beloved, the object of His Father's love. Throughout His life on the earth, Jesus

acknowledged His Father's love for Him (John 3:35; 5:20; 17:23). And in return His Father said,

"This is my beloved son" (Matt 3:17). Jesus could not have done what He did without the

Father's love and support. Now *Jesus* wants to teach you His love.

"You are my Beloved Lord Jesus, I love You. The most important relationship in my life

is to love You with all of my heart, and soul and strength. How can I love You more?"

Jesus is your Beloved, and because you are in Him, "You are accepted in the Beloved" (Eph.

1:6). When the Father loves Jesus, He also loves you because Jesus said, "You are in Me and I

in you" (John 14:20). Therefore, every benefit Jesus has with the Father is yours; so, let the

knowledge of His love deepen your love to Him. Because the heavenly Father and Jesus have a

love-relationship with each other, when we know someone loves us, we begin to conform to their

desires and do the things they want to do. When you begin to live in His love, you will get a

passion to love others as the Father and Jesus love you.

"O my Beloved, I accept Your love to me. I yield my life to be filled with Your presence.

THE HOPE OF ISRAEL—JESUS

"... because for the hope of Israel I am bound with this chain" (Acts 28:20).

Jesus is The Hope of Israel. God's people—the Jews—have suffered throughout history.

Because God has promised to bless Israel, the Evil One hates them, because he hates God. The

Jews have been targeted for persecution by many human enemies: Nebuchadnezzar, Haman,

Adolph Hitler, just to name a few. The Evil One has used human instruments against the Jews,

like King Herod who tried to destroy Jesus as a baby. But in spite of everything, Jesus is still the

Hope of Israel. He died to forgive the sins of the world, including the sins of the Jews.

"Lord Jesus, I marvel at the scope of history. You were born into this world to a Jewish

virgin, and grew up in a Jewish home and lived in Jewish culture. In spite of all Satan

has done, You are still the Hope of Israel."

Jesus will be The Hope of Israel in the future. There is coming a future tribulation aimed at the

Jews, but Jesus will return to save the nation of Israel and all those who believe in Him. In that

future day, He'll still be The Hope of Israel. Just as Jesus is the hope of the Jews, He is also

your hope. Look to Him today.

"Lord, not only are You the Hope of Israel, You are my hope. You have come to help me

through many trials in the past. I trust You for continual deliverance in the future.

Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus is both your hope and the hope of Israel.

THE WITNESS OF GOD – FATHER

"If we receive the witness of men, the witness of God is greater; for this is the

witness of God which He has testified of His Son" (1 John 5:9).

The Witness of the Father were the words He spoke at the baptism of Jesus, "This is my beloved

Son, in whom I am well pleased" (Matt. 3:17, 17:5, John 12:28). The Father wanted everyone to

know that He sent Jesus into the world and He approved what Jesus did. But, the Jewish leaders

wouldn't believe the Father actually spoke. They rejected His witness. While people today

don't hear the actual voice of the *Father*, they can read His words in Scripture. Still, they won't

believe His witness any more today than the Jewish leaders did while Jesus was on earth. Yet,

the witness of the *Father* is still true; the *Father* is pleased with all Jesus was and accomplished.

"Jesus, because I am pleased with all You've done for me, I worship You. I cry, 'Worthy

is the Lamb'" (Rev. 5:12).

The Father has witnessed to Jesus. Are you willing to do the same thing? Will you witness to

those around you about Jesus? The Bible commands, "You shall be witnesses to Me (Jesus)"

(Acts 1:8). Just as some would not believe the *Father's* actual voice, some will not listen to you.

But you must witness about Jesus anyway, because the message about Him is true. A witness

tells what they have seen, heard and experienced. That's what you must do; tell others how

Jesus has changed your life.

"Jesus, I will witness for You today. I will tell people how You saved me and how You

constantly guide me. Without You, I would not have a life worth living. Amen."

Reading: 1 John 5:1-13

Key Thought: You should witness to others about Jesus.

THE FOUNDATION WHICH IS LAID —JESUS

"For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus

Christ" (1 Corinthians 3:11).

Some young people ask today, WWJD?" (What Would Jesus Do?) There is no other foundation

on which anyone can build a life than on the example of Jesus' life. There is no other foundation

for salvation than Jesus' death. Now He stands in Heaven at the right hand of the Father as your

Intercessor. He pleads forgiveness for your sins, and asks for help against your temptations.

Jesus is The Foundation upon which you now relate to God the Father. Will you build your life

upon Him?

"Jesus, I build my life upon Your teaching for no one else gives me truth. I stake my

salvation upon Your death, for You are the only forgiveness of sin. I live my life in the

power of Your indwelling, for You are my only protection against evil."

Jesus is The Foundation Which Is Laid. He has done everything for you that needs to be done.

When He cried on the cross "It is finished," He completed salvation for you and for all who call

upon His name. Salvation has been completed, and The Foundation is now laid. Your

responsibility is to build your Christian life on that solid foundation. You can trust Him for The

Foundation is trustworthy.

"Jesus, I will look beyond my doubt and fears. I will stand securely upon The

Foundation which is laid; I rest securely in You. I will look to You as my example; I will

live for You as my Lord. Amen."

Reading: 1 Cor. 3:1-23

Words: 247

Key Thought: Jesus is the foundation for a successful life.

THE KING ETERNAL—JESUS

"Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor

and glory forever and ever. Amen" (1 Timothy 1:17).

Jesus is The King Eternal. Just as an earthly king rules his kingdom through His laws, so Jesus

rules the universe by His laws. He controls the natural world through natural laws. Jesus allows

earthly rulers to control the social and political life of people through their judicial laws. Jesus

recognizes earthly judicial laws and calls on all people to obey them (Rom. 13:1-7). Jesus

controls the spiritual world through spiritual laws; it is through these laws that He wants to direct

your life.

"Lord, be my King; I want You to direct my life. Come sit upon the throne of my heart to

rule it."

Jesus is The King Eternal. He has always ruled the universe. Look at His natural laws, such as

the law of gravity; break these laws and suffer consequences. Because He allows the Evil One to

act contrary to His spiritual laws does not mean Jesus is not in control. He wants all people to

serve Him out of love, not coercion. Those who choose to follow Jesus will be rewarded. Those

who reject His rule will be punished. Today, Jesus is Lord of those who yield to Him, but in the

future, "Every knee should bow . . . every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord" (Phil.

2:10, 11). Will you recognize Him today?

"Lord Jesus, I bow to worship You as my King. I accept Your rule upon this earth and

will serve You gladly. Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus wants to rule your life as your King.

THE BREATH OF THE LORD—HOLY SPIRIT

"The grass withers, the flower fades, because the breath of the LORD blows upon

it; surely the people are grass" (Isaiah 40:7).

The Holy Spirit is The Breath of the Lord; He breathes life into all living things. It is The

Breath of the Lord that determines how long each thing shall live. That means it is His Breath

that determines when things will die. Originally, He breathed a life cycle into every kind of

tree, plant and grass. And through intermediate forces—wind, cold, and nature's forces—it is

the Spirit's Breath that determines when it dies. The Spirit's Breath has breathed a life cycle of

70 years into the normal human body, and by reason of strength; some live into their eighties or

beyond (Ps. 90:10). The Spirit knows the length of the days of your life, but you'll not know

which is the last day. So, live this day to its fullest potential; live for God.

"Holy Spirit, I accept each day You give and I will live each one as though it is my last.

I'll live this day to the fullest. May I glorify You throughout this day."

The Holy Spirit is the Lord's Breath, so He gives you the Lord's life. Since the Lord lives

forever, He gives eternal life to those who believe in Christ. Since the Lord is holy, He helps

you live a holy life. Since the Lord is righteous, He gives you a spirit to do the right things.

"Holy Spirit, breathe on me. Renew Your life in me so I'll rise up to shake off the chains

that keep me from doing Your will. Amen."

Reading: Isa. 40:1-11

Words: 254

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit gives life to all living things.

THE JUDGE OF THE LIVING AND THE DEAD—JESUS

"And He commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that it is He who was ordained by God to be judge of the living and the dead" (Acts 10:42).

Jesus is The Judge of the Living and the Dead. This means He is the judge of believers and non-

believers, those who are living and those already dead. Those who believe in *Jesus* are saved;

they have eternal life and those who don't believe in Him are dead in trespasses and sins (Eph.

2:1). Jesus will judge believers to give them their rewards, and He will judge the unsaved to

determine their punishment (Rev. 20:11, 12). Jesus is the judge of all people; none can escape

His scrutiny. Because you believe in Him, your sins have been forgiven. Jesus will not punish

you in judgment, but you will have to give an account of your faithfulness and works (1 Cor.

3:12-17).

"Lord, thank You for eternal life. Help me to serve You faithfully so I can look forward

to seeing You in anger, but I look forward to receiving rewards."

Jesus is The Judge of the Living and the Dead; no one can escape His judgment throne. Some

think only those living when He returns will be judged. No, Jesus will raise all the dead to

appear before Him with the living. He is the judge of all souls in the universe; no one will be

exempt. Plead His mercy today, so you won't meet him in anger in the future.

"Lord, I know You have judged my sins on the cross; in appreciation I worship You. I

know You will judge all unsaved people; so in gratitude I thank You for salvation. I know

all people will appear before You; I am not perfect, so I will be judged. My only plea is

Your righteousness. Amen."

Reading: Acts 10:34-43

Words: 277

Key Thought: Jesus will judge all people, both saved and unsaved.

THE MAN CHRIST JESUS—JESUS

"For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ

Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5).

Jesus was human because He was born of the Virgin Mary. He is The Man Christ Jesus;

therefore He understands your desires and dreams, and He knows the weaknesses of the human

body. He knows what it means to be tired; He suffered on Calvary until He lost consciousness.

You do not have any natural human weakness that *Jesus* doesn't understand. Therefore, *The*

Man Christ Jesus can intercede to the Father for you. He can ask for help for your weaknesses.

Because Jesus is a man, He can be your Mediator.

"Christ Jesus, I come to You as my Mediator. You know my weaknesses and you

understand my failures; ask the Father to give me strength to stand against temptation.

You understand my dreams and ambitions; help me reach my life goals."

Jesus is The Man Christ Jesus. When the title "Christ" appears before the human name Jesus,

it's an emphasis on His work as Redeemer on the cross. When the name Jesus appears first, it

emphasizes the man who died on the cross. So in today's verse, The Man Christ Jesus stands at

the right hand of the Father as the "man in the glory" (Heb. 7:24, 25). Your Mediator is pleading

with the Father to forgive your sins. Confess all your sins now and ask for forgiveness because

The Man Christ Jesus is interceding to the Father for you.

"Christ Jesus, I come asking for forgiveness of sins. Be my Mediator with the Father for

me. Cleanse me and make me useable to serve You this day. Amen."

Reading: 1 Tim. 1:1-7

Words: 260

Key Thought: The man Christ Jesus is your effective Mediator to the Father.

EL EMUNAH (THE FAITHFUL GOD)—TRINITY

"Therefore know that the LORD your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy for a thousand generations with those who love Him and keep His

commandments" (Deuteronomy 7:9).

The Lord is *El Emunah*, the faithful God of the future. Some make gods with their hands and

worship them. But idols are not able to do anything that God can do. They can't think, feel or

act. But the Lord in Heaven knows all about you, thinks of you and loves you. The Lord has

promised to guide you, protect you and "work all things together for His own good" (Rom.

8:28). Because the Father is a faithful God, He will keep His promises. The Lord is *El Emunah*,

the faithful God of the past. He was faithful to bless His people when they kept past covenants

and He was faithful to punish them when they disobeyed His commandments. You can see His

faithfulness in judgment and you can see His faithfulness when He forgave them their sins. As

the Father has been faithful to Israel, so He will be faithful to you. "Because of Your mercies,

we are not destroyed, Your compassion is new every morning. Great is Thy faithfulness" (Lam.

3:22, 23, Author's Translation). The Lord is *El Emunah*, the faithful God of the present. Our

present is grounded in God's past, because God has faithfully kept His word in the past, He will

be faithful to you today.

"Lord, forgive me when I doubt Your Word and I don't believe Your promises. Thank

You for Your reminder that You're El Emunah—the faithful God. Help me to walk

confidently today, and serve You faithfully. Amen."

Reading: Deuteronomy 7

Words: 249

Key Thought: You can trust God today because He was faithful in the past.

THE LORD OF PEACE—JESUS

"Now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace always in every way" (2

Thessalonians 3:16).

Jesus is The Lord of Peace. As Lord He is Master, so Jesus is the Master of Peace. His nature

is peace, so when He awoke in a boat in the middle of a violent storm, Jesus commanded the

winds, "Peace be still" (Mark 4:39). When Jesus died on the cross for your sins, He made peace

between God and sinners. Now because of Jesus, you can have "peace with God" (Rom. 5:1).

Since you are a Christian, Jesus can calm your fears and soothe your anxieties. He can give you

the "peace of God" (Phil. 4:7). Do you need peace in our heart today?

"Lord, I come to You. Thank You for saving me and giving me the peace with God.

Thank You for living in my heart to give me the peace of God. Come be the Master of my

heart."

Jesus is The Lord of Peace. No other religious leader can give peace, as Jesus gives, because

"heart-peace" doesn't come from men, it comes from God. No activity can give peace of heart,

unless it has Jesus as its focus. Money, fame or earthly power cannot give you peace in this life

or the life to come. If you want contentment, satisfaction, and deep inner joy, come to Jesus. He

is The Lord of Peace.

"Lord Jesus, I need Your peace to settle my fears for this day. Take control of my

thinking and settle my mind. Help me look at life through Your perspective. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 2:11-22

Words: 249

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Key Thought: Jesus can give you peace because He is the Lord of Peace.

THE LORD OF GLORY—JESUS

"None of the rulers of this age knew; for had they known, they would not have

crucified the Lord of glory" (1 Corinthians 2:8).

Jesus is The Lord of Glory; He left Heaven and its glories to be born as a babe in Bethlehem.

Heaven was magnified by the presence of *Jesus*, but He gave up its luster and glory to be born in

a humble stable and to be part of a poor family. When He left the side of the Father to come to

earth, He was *The Lord From Glory*. He gave it all up because of His love for fallen humanity.

Jesus is The Lord of Glory who came to die for the world.

"Jesus, thank You for giving up Your heavenly home to come to earth for sinners. Thank

You for giving up Your glory to suffer the agonies of Calvary for me."

Jesus left the glories of Heaven, knowing He would return. The night before He died, Jesus

prayed, "Glorify thou me with thine own self, with the glory which I had with thee before the

world was" (John 17:5, KJV). Jesus was The Lord From Glory, but when He returned to

Heaven, He had more glory than when He left. Jesus had added His glorious victory over sin,

death and the Evil One. Now, Jesus is truly The Lord of Glory. Jesus has more glory now than

before He came to the world.

"Jesus, I want my life to add even more glory to You for all You've done for me. I can't

fully understand Your love, but I accept it. I glorify You because You alone are worthy of

glory. Amen."

Reading: Phil. 2:1-11

Words: 255

Key Thought: Jesus receives additional glory for His accomplishments on Calvary.

OUR FATHER IN HEAVEN—FATHER

"When you pray, say: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your

kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Luke 11:2).

You should pray, "Our Father who art in Heaven." This is the phrase Jesus used to teach you

how to pray. Notice, He didn't use the singular possessive pronoun "My Father." The plural

possessive "Our Father" includes Jesus and you. So when you pray, "Our Father," you are

coming to the Father with Jesus. That means the Father will hear and answer your prayers

because Jesus is your intercessor (Heb. 7:24, 25). It also means you are coming through the

blood of Jesus' cross (Heb. 4:14-16). Jesus is near to the *Father*'s heart, so when you pray with

Jesus, "Our Father," you get immediate intimacy with the Father. By coming to the Father with

Jesus, you can be as close to the Father as Jesus.

"Our Father, I come to You with Jesus, so I pray, "Our Father . . . may Your name be

holy in my life today, as Your name is revered in Heaven."

Because you were identified with Jesus in His death, burial, and resurrection, you can pray "Our

Father." Because you've invited Christ to live in your heart (Eph. 3:17), you can pray Our

Father. You can have confidence when you come to the Father with Jesus.

"Our Father in Heaven, rule Your Kingdom from the throne of my heart. May I obey

Your will in my life today on Earth, as Your will is obeyed in Heaven. Amen."

Reading: Luke 11:1-13

Words: 234

Key Thought: You must come with Jesus to the Father.

THE LION OF THE TRIBE OF JUDAH—JESUS

"One of the elders said to me, 'Do not weep. Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has prevailed to open the scroll and to loose its seven

seals" (Revelation 5:5).

Jesus is The Lion of the Tribe of Judah. He fulfilled the Old Testament prediction that the King-

Messiah (Gen. 49:8, 9) would come from the tribe of Judah. Just as the lion is called the ruler of

the jungle, so the lion symbol is used to describe earthly rulers. Jesus is pictured as a lion

because He will rule all mankind. Let Him rule your heart and lead you to a better life.

"Lord, come rule my heart, because I cannot rule it. Sometimes I don't do the things I

want to do, and sometimes I do the things I don't want to do (Rom. 7:15)."

Jesus is The Lion of the Tribe of Judah who will prevail in the future to open the book and loose

the seals (Rev. 5:5), so He can prevail against your unruly heart. He can rule your life and help

you control your desires. He can keep you from excesses and lawlessness. But you must yield

to Him for Jesus to control your life. Just as John wept because he couldn't open the book, so

you shouldn't despair because of your weaknesses. Jesus is The Lion of the Tribe of Judah; He

has strength to help control your life today.

"Lord, I surrender my rebellious spirit to You, but I also want You to give me the power

to do the will of God. When I lack inner strength and fortitude, I look to Your strength as

a lion. I yield to your rule for this day. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 5:1-5

Words: 254

Key Thought: Jesus can give you strength to control your weaknesses.

THE LIGHT OF THE KNOWLEDGE OF THE GLORY OF GOD—JESUS

"For it is the God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of

Jesus Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6).

Jesus is The Light of the Knowledge of the Glory Of God. Just as the Father shined out of

darkness to give the world physical light, so Jesus will shine into darkened hearts to give

spiritual light concerning Himself and His kingdom. Those who are blinded by sin live in a

darkened world; they can't find their way to Heaven, they live in a black, cold and threatening

world. Blinded people are shut up to their own limited experience, without hope and are lost.

But Jesus came to give them the Light of salvation. "He was the true Light which gives light to

every man coming into the world" (John 1:9).

"Lord, it feels good to live where there's spiritual light. I can see spiritual things

because of You. You have shown me how to live and what will happen to me when I die.

Your Light is warm and comfortable and I am confident of the future."

Jesus is The Light of the Knowledge of the Glory of God. He shines light on heathen cultures

that are lost in the darkness of self-worship and greed. Jesus helps spiritually blinded people see

the plan of salvation. He shines light on the pathway to guide His followers. He puts a fire in

their souls to give them hope for eternity.

"Lord, I love to walk in the Light, because I remember how awful I felt walking in

darkness. I will walk in Your Light for the rest of my life. Amen."

Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:1-18

Words: 250

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Key Thought: Jesus is the light that shows people where to walk.

THE FINGER OF GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"Then the magicians said to Pharaoh, 'This is the finger of God.' But Pharaoh's

heart grew hard, and he did not heed them" (Exodus 8:19).

The Holy Spirit is The Finger of God. He is the One used by the Father and Son to carry out

divine work in the world. The Holy Spirit was The Finger of God that wrote the Ten

Commandments on tablets of stone. He was the judgmental finger that brought 10 plagues upon

Egypt (Exod. 8:19). He is the weather finger that controls storms and drought. He can be *The*

Finger of God to touch your life today. The Holy Spirit wants to direct your actions and control

your destiny. With His finger, you can touch your world. Will you yield to the control of the

Holy Spirit today?

"Holy Spirit, touch me. Just as I touch things in this world, I want You to touch me

today. Use me. Give me new purpose and new energy."

The Finger of God can touch you with power so you can do the will of the Father. The Holy

Spirit is The Finger of God who can touch your circumstances to solve problems and put things

in order. The Finger of God can point you in the direction you should go. Look to the Holy

Spirit for direction, trust Him for spiritual power, and yield to His control.

"Holy Spirit, I need Your presence today. Come live in my body. I want to touch You

with my prayers, but most importantly, I want to touch You with my heart. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 8:16-19; Luke 11:14-23

Words: 238

Key Thought: God uses the Holy Spirit to get things done.

THE LIGHT OF THE GLORIOUS GOSPEL—JESUS

"The god of this world hath blinded (the unsaved) the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of

God, should shine unto them" (2 Corinthians 4:4, KJV).

Jesus is The Light of the Glorious Gospel. Did you see those two words, "Light" and

"Glorious"? He is both the Light of the Gospel and the Glory of the Gospel. In a world where

people are blinded by sin, and where people are lost in the blackness of eternal night, Jesus is the

Light of salvation; He is the *Light* of the Gospel.

"Lord Jesus, when I saw the Light, I believed. When the Light appeared in my life, I

followed it. Give me more illumination today so I'll know where to walk."

Jesus is The Glory of the Gospel. When the Shekinah Glory cloud rested on the Ark of the

Covenant, the priest had to leave the Holy of Holies (Exod. 40:35; 2 Chron. 5:14). Humans

couldn't remain in the presence of the glory of God. Just as the Lord Jesus came to dwell among

Israel, now He comes to live in the lives of His people. It is through His followers that He brings

The Light of the Gospel to the world. It is not just a dazzling light that God wants unsaved

people to see. He wants to bring the *Light* of His presence into the hearts of unsaved people, so

they can believe the glorious Gospel. Remember Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world" (John

8:12).

"Lord Jesus, thank You for living in my heart. Shine Light to the world through me. I

want to shine the Light of the Glorious Gospel of Christ to all people. Amen."

Reading: Cor. 4:1-6

Words: 255

Key Thought: Jesus is the light that gets people saved.

THE ONLY BEGOTTEN OF THE FATHER—JESUS

"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the

glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).

Jesus is the Only Begotten of the Father, which means He comes from the Father and is the

unique personification of the Father. To be begotten of the Father means Jesus is the expression

of the Father. This verse emphasizes the characteristics of Jesus as "the Word," which means the

message and meaning of the Word reflects the Father. When the Father wants to make an

utterance to the world, He does it through Jesus, the Word.

"Lord Jesus, I come asking You to teach me what the Father in Heaven is like. I want to

love the Father more than ever, but I must know Him better to love Him better."

Jesus is the Only Begotten of the Father, which means, "He is just like the Father." If you want

to see what the Father is like, look at Jesus in the Scriptures. If you want to know how the

Father relates to you, look at how *Jesus* related to people. If you want to approach the Father, go

to Him through His Son. To know the Father better, know Jesus.

"Lord Jesus, I look to You to see the Father. I know the father is loving because I see

how You loved people. I know the Father is powerful because I see Your awesome power

in creating the universe and Your transforming power of individuals. I know the Father

is kind and gentle because You are patient and forgiving to me. Amen."

Reading: John 1:14-28

Words: 244

Key Thought: To better know the Father, learn about Jesus.

EL SHADDAI (ALMIGHTY GOD)—TRINITY

"The LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, 'I am Almighty God-El

Shaddai—walk before Me and be blameless" (Genesis 17:1).

The name El Shaddai means the powerful One, but it also means the Tender One. The name

Almighty comes from Shad, i.e., the breast that is tender to nourish children. But remember the

chest is also the symbol of power and might. The Lord is Almighty God—El Shaddai—a name

that carries two opposite ideas; sympathy and power. El Shaddai is tender to those who are

hurting and needy. He tenderly listens to your problems, and will comfort you. But El Shaddai

also has awesome power to solve problems. El Shaddai comes to you as El Shaddai as He came

to Abraham, asking you to trust and obey Him. El Shaddai is both tender to forgive your sin and

powerful to deliver you from problems and sin oppression.

"El Shaddai, You are Almighty God. I confess and repent of my sins. Be powerful to

forgive them through the blood of Christ (1 John 1:7), but also be tender to fold me close

to Your amazing grace."

The name Almighty means "all sufficiency." El Shaddai will be everything you need; trust Him

and obey Him. Your needs or emergencies will not surprise Him. He has faced them before in

others. He will comfort you in your pain when you cry to Him. But *El Shaddai* is also powerful;

He can delivery you and give you victory. What do you need from Him today?

"El Shaddai, I will be close to You. Be my intimate companion to encourage me, and be

my powerful God to provide for me. Amen."

Reading: Genesis 17:1-8

Words: 258

Key Thought: Almighty God can comfort or deliver you.

THE RIGHTEOUS JUDGE—JESUS

"Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the

righteous judge, will give to me on that Day" (2 Timothy 4:8).

Jesus is The Righteous Judge. When you come into future judgment, He will not punish you for

your sins, because He died for your sins. Your sins were judged on the cross (John 12:31, 32;

16:11) and all your iniquities were covered by the blood. When you appear before *The*

Righteous Judge, He will reward you for your faithfulness and service. Every good thing you've

ever done will be evaluated by Him (1 Cor. 3:13, 2 Cor. 5:10). Then he'll give you your

rewards, also called crowns (James 1:12).

"Lord, You are The Righteous Judge. Thank You for forgiveness of sins. Thank You for

mercy and grace. I don't deserve it, but I accept it."

The Righteous Judge will not make mistakes when He judges people at the end of this age.

Because He is omnipotent with all power, He can bring every person and all facts into His

presence. Because He is omnipresent, and omniscient, He knows all things, He understands

everyone's actions and motivations. Because He is God, you can count on Him to be a

Righteous Judge. Whereas some corrupt judges can be bribed on this earth, Jesus will give the

right judgment in the right way. He will look at all the merits of your case when you appear

before Him. You will get the appropriate rewards from *The Righteous Judge*.

"Lord, I know You are righteous, so I rest securely in Your presence. I know You will

judge me rightly. Amen."

Reading: 2 Tim. 4:1-16

Words: 246

Key Thought: Jesus will give the right judgment in the right way.

THE PRINCE OF THE KINGS OF THE EARTH—JESUS

"And from Jesus Christ . . . the prince of the kings of the earth" (Revelation 1:5,

KJV).

Jesus is *The Prince of the Kings of the Earth*. A prince is one who is waiting for the throne that

he will formally assume in the future. Jesus is the *Prince* who will assume His throne at the

second return. Then, He'll be "King of Kings, and Lord of Lords" (Rev. 19:16). However, His

future reign doesn't deny His present rulership in the hearts of His followers, or His sovereignty

in Heaven. He wants to sit on the throne of your heart.

"Jesus, I pray, 'Your kingdom come' (Matt. 6:10), for the future millennium. But for

today, I want You to rule my heart."

Jesus is The Prince of the Kings of the Earth, but now in His sovereign plan, He allows each

earthly ruler to rule. Whereas many earthly leaders ignore Christ and violate His laws, still God

recognizes "the powers (rulers) that be are ordained of God" (Rom. 13:1). Those who rebel at

His authority will be punished when they stand before the judgment throne. Even when rulers

rebel against God, He works His plans through them. Many rulers think they are doing whatever

they want, but the Bible teaches, "The king's heart is in the hand of the LORD . . . He turns it

wherever He wishes" (Prov. 21:1).

"Jesus, You have all power in Heaven and earth. I marvel at Your patience and I praise

You for working 'all things together for good to us who love You' (Rom. 8:28, Author's

Paraphrase). Amen."

Reading: John 17:1-19

Words: 249

Key Thought: Let Jesus rule your heart today because one day He'll rule all things.

MY FATHER—FATHER

"My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to

snatch them out of My Father's hand. I and My Father are one" (John 10:29, 30).

The Father has a special relationship to Jesus Christ. Jesus is His Son and we can never

understand their relationship because we are human. But we can enjoy the results of that

relationship. Because Jesus and the Father are One, you can have access to the Father through

Jesus because You are in Christ (union) and He is in you (communion) (John 14:20; 15:3, 5).

You have great security because you are in Jesus; "I give them eternal life, and they will never

perish. No one will snatch them away from me" (John 10:28, NLT).

Jesus called the Father, "My Father," reflecting a unique relationship (John 5:16-18). Jesus was

closer to the Father's heart than anyone else because the Father and Son were One (John 17:11,

21). Yet, because you are in Christ, you can be as close as Jesus to the *Father*'s heart.

"I come to You, Father, because I am in Christ. I want to be as close to You as Jesus is.

Accept me and bless me because of Jesus."

Because Jesus referred to God as "My Father," so can you. God is your Father who protects His

children because they were given to Him by Christ. "I give them eternal life, and they will never

perish. No one will snatch them away from me, for my Father has given them to me, and he is

more powerful than anyone else. So no one can take them from me" (John 10:28, 29, NLT).

"Father, I rest confidently in Your presence, knowing Jesus gave me access to Your

heart. Thank You for this peace. Amen."

Reading: John 10:22-39

Words: 267

Key Thought: You can be as close as Jesus is to the Father.

THE ONLY WISE GOD—JESUS

"Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor

and glory forever and ever. Amen" (1 Timothy 1:17).

Jesus is The Only Wise God; idols can't speak and leaders of false religions don't know

anything. Because the Lord Jesus created people, He knows what people think; He even knows

their motives and desires. He knows everything about all people, so He knows all about you.

Jesus knows your temptations and your strengths. He knows your spiritual dreams and your

secret sin. He knows what is best for you for this day; will you let Jesus, The Only Wise God,

guide you?

"Lord Jesus, You know everything about me. You know I am not as strong as I want to

be. Stand by me and help me today. You know what is best for this day."

Jesus is The Only Wise God who knows everything that's ever happened. He knows things that

haven't yet happened and, "calleth those things which be not as though they were" (Rom. 4:17,

KJV). Jesus knows what will happen to you before it happens, and He knows the things that

could have happened to you, but didn't. Trust Him to guide you and protect you. Let Him help

you make good decisions to keep you from physical harm and spiritual danger.

"Lord Jesus, You know the future and I don't know what will happen to me. So, guide me

this day. You have kept me from making mistakes in the past, and You've protected me

from evil. You are the Only Wise God. I need Your wise guidance to keep me from

making mistakes. I will depend upon Your guidance this day. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 39

Words: 259

Key Thought: The wisdom of Jesus can help you make good decisions.

FAITHFUL AND TRUE—JESUS

"Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war"

(Revelation 19:11).

Jesus is called Faithful and True. These names were not given to Him until the end of the book

of Revelation. When John saw the second coming of Jesus in power, he called Him Faithful and

True. These compound names reflect His character, i.e., He is faithful to do all He promised, and

Jesus promised, "I will come again" (John 14:2). Jesus is True and consistent to all that is

established in the universe. Jesus' second coming is the appropriate climax to all He did since

Creation. Jesus will be Faithful and True throughout the great tribulation in Revelation, so He'll

be Faithful and True in your hour of trial. Right to the end, He'll be the same, regardless of

circumstances, regardless of pressures, regardless of other's disappointments; Jesus will prove

Himself, Faithful and True.

"Lord, how long will my troubles last? The Evil One is strong and it's been so long. It's

easy to get my eyes on tribulation and not on You. Help me look beyond my problem to

see Your victorious triumph. How long?"

Jesus will always be Faithful and True to the plan He established when He created all things. He

will allow sin to run its course, and He will allow the Evil One to do His work. But then He'll

return, just as He promised, to judge sin and evildoers and to reward those who obey Him.

"Lord, thank You for Your faithfulness to keep Your Word and for being truthful about

the reality of sin. Because I have trusted You in salvation, I will continue trusting You

today. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 19:11-21

Words: 266

Key Thought: Jesus will be Faithful and True to the end.

SHOWERS THAT WATER THE EARTH—HOLY SPIRIT

"He shall come down like rain upon the grass before mowing, like showers that

water the earth "(Psalm 72:6).

The Holy Spirit is like showers that water the earth. He will come upon His people like the

necessary showers that give life to things on the earth. Sometimes He is like a pouring rain that

drenches the earth and produces a flood. Sometimes He is like a gentle Shower—a mist—that

lightly sprinkles droplets upon the leaves and grass. Sometimes the ground doesn't need a

downpour; it's already saturated. Sometimes on a hot sweltering day, you need a few rain

showers to cool you off. You need a light drizzle to refresh your spirit. Let the Holy Spirit be

your Shower of refreshment today.

"Holy Spirit, I'm waiting for a rain Shower. Lately it's been hot and I'm exhausted.

Refresh me so I can continue walking by faith."

The Holy Spirit is like Showers that Water the Earth. Showers come when it's been too hot;

He'll come when you're tempted and tired. Most people stop working during showers; would

this be a good time for you to get some rest? When the rain is gently falling, it's a time to think

and enjoy the natural surroundings. Isn't this a good time to look around, take stock of your

work, and prepare for the next task?

"Holy Spirit, rain on me. I need Your gentle presence to refresh me. I've done a lot of

things and I'm tired. I've got some big tasks ahead of me and I need some rest. Holy

Spirit, refresh me today. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 72:1-19

Words: 248

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will refresh you like a rain Shower.

THE TRUSTWORTHY WITNESS—JESUS

"And from Jesus Christ, the trustworthy witness" (Revelation 1:5, Berkley

Version).

Jesus is the Trustworthy Witness; He came to witness the message of the Father. You can trust

Jesus for He perfectly witnessed to the world what the Father wanted said. When Jesus

identified Himself as One with the Father, "The Jews sought all the more to kill Him, because He

not only broke the Sabbath, but also said that God was His Father, making Himself equal with

God" (John 5:18). Jesus did what He was trusted to do and He said what needed to be said.

Jesus was a Trustworthy Witness in the face of death.

"Lord, thank You for faithfully witnessing about the Father while on earth. Thank You

for faithfully witnessing to my heart the love of the Father for me."

Remember the word "witness" is translated from the word for martyr. Those who are killed for

their faithful witness are called martyrs. The Jews accused Jesus of blasphemy because He

faithfully witnessed to them about the Father. He was killed for His witness, now He wants you

to be a faithful witness for Him to the world, "You shall be witnesses to Me" (Acts 1:8). How

will you witness for Him today?

"Lord, because You died for me, the least I can do is be a trustworthy witness for You.

Help me be worthy of the trust you placed in me. I will faithfully tell others what You

have done for me. You can trust me to be a witness to You and the Father who sent You.

Amen."

Reading: John 7:40-53

Words: 252

Key Thought: Jesus wants you to be a trustworthy witness for Him.

THE TRIUMPHANT SON OF MAN—JESUS

"Then I turned to see the voice that spoke with me. And having turned I saw . . . One like the Son of Man, clothed with a garment down to the feet and girded

about the chest with a golden band" (Revelation 1:12, 13).

Jesus is The Triumphant Son of Man who stood glorified and transfigured before John on the

Isle of Patmos. His hair was "as white as snow" (Rev. 1:14), a symbol of His purity. His eyes

"were as a flame of fire" (Rev. 1:14), symbolic of judgment to accurately discern the nature of

people. "His feet . . . as if refined in a furnace" (Rev. 1:15), were quick to burn away impurities

and sin. Jesus wants you to be pure and truthful in all you do.

"Lord Jesus, I bow before Your majesty; forgive my sin. Receive honor and glory from

my life. Guide me to do things that will bring praise to You today."

Jesus is The Triumphant Son of Man who stood before John in priestly garments. His voice

was compared to "the voice of many waters" (Rev. 1:15), emphasizing His authority. "Out of

His mouth went a sharp two-edged sword" (Rev. 1:16), symbolic of the Word of God that gives

life. The brilliance about His countenance was "like the sun shining in its strength" (Rev.

1:16), reflecting His glory and transforming power. Jesus can transform your life. He can help

you triumph over all your spiritual problems.

"Lord, when John saw You, he fell at Your feet. I follow his example to worship at Your

feet. As glorified Son of God in my life, I praise You for becoming all things for me.

Help me see perfectly Your glory so I can reflect it to the world. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 17:1-13

Words: 251

Key Thought: The Triumphant Son of God can make you victorious.

EL-ROI (YOU-ARE-THE-GOD-WHO-SEES)—TRINITY

"She called the name of the LORD that spake unto her, Thou God seest me

Wherefore the well was called Beerlahairoi" (Genesis 16:13, 14, KJV).

The Lord's name is *El-Roi*, the God who sees everything you do. Therefore, you cannot hide

anything from Him and He knows everything you are. Just as He saw Hagar running from her

master, He seems you struggling with problems. Just as He appeared to Hagar to encourage her,

He will come to support you. He seems your problems and knows your weaknesses. Just as He

sent Hagar back to raise her son Ishmael (Gen. 16:1-16), so He has a task for you to do.

"Lord, my sins are many; they can't be hidden from You. Forgive my sin, cleanse me so

I can walk before You in integrity. Thou God seest my struggles are great, they

discourage me. Come help me get through this day. Lord, look at my talents; they are

few. O God, see my ability; I am weak. How can I ever serve You?"

Because the Lord is *El-Roi*, His ever-seeing presence should give you encouragement. Just as

Hagar had to return to face conflict and problems, you can't run from your troubles and you can't

keep problems out of your life. But the good news is you can solve your problem. El Roi will

help you through them. You must face the difficulties from which you run, then you must call

upon the Lord *El-Roi* to help you and be with you in your difficulties.

"Lord, You see me and You know my weakness. Come to me and help me. Give me

strength to face my problems and wisdom to solve them. Let me get victory from Your

presence. Amen."

Readings: Genesis 16

Words: 265

Key Thought: The Lord sees your problems and will help you.

THE TESTIMONY OF GOD—JESUS

"And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with excellence of speech or

of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God. For I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:1,

2).

Jesus is The Testimony of God to the world. Do not look for deep truths elsewhere; Jesus is the

personification of truth. Do not look for mysterious wisdom; Jesus is the wisdom of God. Do

not look for sparkling speeches or cleverly written words; Jesus is The Testimony of God. You'll

not find anything deeper in understanding than Christ, nor will you find anything simpler to

understand than Jesus. Every thing God wants you to know, you'll find in Jesus.

"Jesus, I learn of You in the pages of Scripture. There is no grace greater than Your

grace; no one has more love than Your love. You walked humbly among men to show us

what God was like, now I bow at Your feet to exalt You in my life."

Jesus is The Testimony that God would have you know. Do not search for deep wisdom apart

from Him. Do not seek to understand spiritual things that are complicated or confusing apart

from Him. If you think you've found truth and Jesus is not there, you are lost in the jungle of

error. God has testified what you need to know. You'll find the answers to your questions in

Jesus for He is The Testimony of God.

"When I look into the crystal waters of a pond, I see the calm surface of a pool. Yet,

beneath the surface it is deep, so deep I'll never reach the bottom. Jesus is that pond. He

is easy to understand; yet so deep I'll never completely comprehend all He is and does.

Amen."

Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Words: 261

Key Thought: Jesus has told us what the Father wants us to know.

THE WORD OF LIFE—JESUS

"That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled,

concerning the Word of life" (1 John 1:1).

Jesus is The Word of Life; His words give eternal life to all who believe Him. Spokesmen for

false religions speak words of death and idols cannot speak at all. As the Word of Life, Jesus

communicates the life-giving message of the Father to the world. No one had seen the Father

until Jesus came as the Word of Life to express what the Father was like. He spoke the message

of salvation and in His death He provided life to all who would believe. The Word of Life is the

message of His death, burial and resurrection.

"Jesus, I know You have the words of life; sing them over again to me so I never forget

their message. Sing them often to me because I love to hear them."

Jesus is the Word of Life that you must hear and understand to know how to go to Heaven. Then

you must act on Word of Life to be saved. No other words have eternal life embedded in its

message. Peter asked a question that tells us only Jesus has life-giving words. "To whom can

we go, you have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68). Jesus only has the Word of Life that

gives you eternal life. He is the Word of Life; take Him into your life.

"Jesus, I will believe the Word of Life and will walk daily according to Your message. I

will love the Word of Life and cherish its message. I will share the Word of Life with

those who don't know You. Amen."

Reading: 1 John 1:1-4

Words: 260

Key Thought: The words of Jesus give life.

ONE FATHER—FATHER

"Then they (the Jews) said to Him (Jesus), 'We were not born of fornication; we

have one Father—God" (John 8:41).

There is *One Father—God* of the universe. No other god can compare to Him. He created all

things; idols cannot make anything. The Father sustains all life and order in the universe; false

gods have no power to do anything. The Father is the personal God in whose image the first

man was created; everyone who is born has His likeness. That's why He is also the Father of all

mankind—the Father-God of all. Because the Father has the power of personality, He knows

people, loves people, and wants to have fellowship with them. Will you seek Him today?

"You are my Father-God because You created me, but also because You saved me and

made me Your child. You are the only God in my life. You are the One Father-God to

whom I owe everything."

The One Father—God transcends high above all Heaven and Earth. He is the sovereign ruler of

everything. Yet, He is as close to you as a parent because He is your Father. Just as a child

owes its parents everything, so you must obey and honor Him. Just as a child must answer to its

parent for its disobedience, so He is the *One Father*-God who will judge all people. Come to

Him as a Father, so you won't have to answer to Him as the God of Judgment.

"I depend upon Your comparison as a Father to care for me and guide me. Help me to

glorify You today. Amen."

Key Thought: Knowing God is like knowing a Father.

THE SON WHO IS CONSECRATED FOREVERMORE—JESUS

"For the law maketh men high priests which have infirmity; but the word of the oath, which was since the law, maketh the Son, who is consecrated for evermore"

(Hebrews 7:28).

As an *Intercessor*, *Jesus* doesn't need to be consecrated every day, as the Old Testament priests

had to sacrifice daily for their sins. They had to be consecrated time and again because they

sinned. It was impossible for them to enter God's presence unless they were cleansed each time

they approached God. Jesus is The Son Who Is Consecrated Forevermore. He was eternally

consecrated—prepared—to continually enter God's presence for you. Jesus was perfect—

without sin—so He could be our Sin-bearer. So now Jesus is the constant Intercessor for our

sins. All day and every day, He stands ready to intercede to the Father for us.

"Jesus, I constantly need You to intercede for me because I constantly fail. I sin

innocently; intercede to the Father for me. I give into temptation; pray to strengthen

me."

Jesus has an "unchangeable priesthood" (Heb. 7:24). No matter what sin you commit, and no

matter why you sin, He will intercede to the Father for you. Remember, "The blood of Jesus

Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). Did you see that word "all"? He cleanses

you totally from sin; now confess it, repent, and ask Jesus to forgive it. Then seek His power to

overcome it. Jesus wants to give you victory. He stands in the Father's presence for you.

"Jesus, I am amazed at Your grace and forgiveness. Thank You for cleansing my sin.

Now make continued intercession for me. Amen."

Reading: Mark 14:32-42

Key Thought: Jesus makes constant intercession for your sin.

THE SON OF THE LIVING GOD—JESUS

"Simon Peter answered and said, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God"

(Matthew 16:16).

Jesus is The Son of the Living God; all false gods have no life in them. False gods don't think,

love, nor do the false gods answer the prayers offered to them. They are carved from wood or

stone; they can't communicate with you and they can't give life to those who worship them.

Jesus is The Son of the Living God; both Jesus and the Father are alive, and have always lived.

There was never a time when the *Living God* didn't exist. Perhaps the greatest creative act was

when the Father breathed into Adam's nostrils the breath of life. And in that creative act life was

given to Adam; and through generations of procreation, life was given to you.

"I come to You, Living God, thanking You for creating me in Your image. Because I

have a mind, I think about You. Because I have emotions, I love You. Because I have a

will, I choose to follow You."

Jesus is The Son of the Living God; He gave you spiritual life through His death, burial and

resurrection. "I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly"

(John 10:10). You have two kinds of life: (1) You got your eternal life by believing in Jesus,

and, (2) you can enjoy satisfying life more abundantly by magnifying *Jesus* in all you do.

"I cling to You, Son of the Living God, for without You I don't have life. But with You in

my heart, I have eternal life. Today, help me enjoy Your abundant life. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 16:13-16

Words: 264

Key Thought: Jesus gives you all types of life.

THE BREATH OF LIFE—HOLY SPIRIT

"The breath of life from God entered them, and they stood on their feet, and great

fear fell on those who saw them" (Revelation 11:11).

The Holy Spirit is The Breath of Life. When God breathed into the nostrils of Adam, the Holy

Spirit was The Breath of Life that gave him physical life. Through the continual miracles of

procreation, The Breath of Life has reached you and given you existence. "For in him we live

and move and exist" (Acts 17:28, NLT). When you were born again, the life of God entered you;

the Breath of Life gave you spiritual life. You have life—physically and spiritually—because of

the Holy Spirit. Now live for Him today. Because He is holy, He wants you to live a holy life.

Because He is Spirit, He wants you to live a spiritual life.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for life, both physically and spiritually. I will live for You

today."

The Holy Spirit is The Breath of Life that resurrected the two witnesses back to physical life

(Rev. 11:11). But more than a return to their old life, they had resurrected bodies, i.e., glorified

bodies. They will live forever in those renewed bodies that were transformed. Just as the two

witnesses were transformed because the Holy Spirit is The Breath of Life, so you will be

resurrected in the last days. You will receive a new resurrected body from the Spirit because He

is The Breath of Life.

"Holy Spirit, I know You will give me new life in the future, but today I need help. Blow

Your Spirit into me. Encourage me, strengthen me, guide me and help me accomplish all

I have to do. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 11:1-12

Words: 260

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit gives life to all you do.

THE SON OF THE FATHER—JESUS

"Grace, mercy, and peace will be with you from God the Father and from the

Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father, in truth and love" (2 John 3).

Jesus is The Son, sent by My Father to save a sinful world (John 5:19). The Son is the constant

object of the Father's love (John 5:20). The Father and *The Son* are One in nature (John 10:30),

but they are separate persons. They talk to each other, love each other and work together to save

the world.

"O Son of God, I magnify You for Your power and love. I know You can do all things; so

work in my life today."

The Son wants you to know Him and honor Him, as He honors the Father (John 5:23). Those

who do not honor *The Son*, offend the Father (John 5:23). Just as the Father raised the dead,

Jesus gives spiritual life to those who believe in Him (John 5:20). Those who are spiritually

dead in sin can have eternal life through "the words of the Son" (John 5:24), and believers who

have physically died will be raised to resurrection life in the future through "the words of the

Son" (John 5:25, 28). The Father has given *The Son* the power to give life to all who believe and

the Father has given *The Son* authority to judge sinners at the end of the age (John 5:27).

"Jesus, I want Your power in my life today. I want Your "words" to give me strength

and optimism to meet the challenges I face. I want Your indwelling presence to

encourage me for all I do. Amen."

Reading: 2 John 1-13

Words: 246

Key Thought: The Son of God can give energy to your Christian life.

THE SON OF GOD—JESUS

"But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of

God, and that believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:31).

Jesus is The Son of God, the Second Person of the Godhead. Because the description "Son" is

used of Jesus does not mean He is less than the Father. They are co-equal and co-eternal, and

share these attributes equally with the Holy Spirit. The phrase "Son" means Jesus has the same

nature as the Father, and that He is the personification of all the characterization of deity. Jesus

is God; can you trust Him?

"Jesus, I know You are God, for only God can forgive my sins and transform my life.

But, I am concerned when the world doubts who You are."

People have always doubted the deity of Christ. Even on the cross, unsaved people mocked His

claims of deity, "If You are the Son of God, come down from the cross" (Matt. 27:40). But

Jesus didn't respond to doubting criticism the way the world wants answers. He showed His

deity in miracles of compassion and by forgiving their sins. The Holy Spirit will work in their

hearts to show them who *Jesus* is (John 16:7-15). God expects them to respond to His love.

Jesus expects people to respond to His invitation to be saved. Jesus is The Son of God, Creator,

Lord, and in the final day, He'll be their Judge.

"Jesus, I bow at Your feet, recognizing You as God. You are the LORD of the Ages. I

recognize you as my Lord this day. I worship You as the Son of God. Amen."

Reading: John 20:24-31

Words: 247

Key Thought: You must recognize Jesus as the Son of God.

EL ELYON (MOST HIGH GOD)—TRINITY

"But Abram said to the king of Sodom, 'I have raised my hand to the LORD, God

Most High, the Possessor of heaven and earth" (Genesis 14:22).

The Lord is El Elyon, the Most High God, a name that means He owns Heaven and earth. He

invites you, "Make the Lord your Refuge, make the Most High your habitation, then no plan by

the Evil One shall overcome you" (Ps. 91:9, 10, Author's Translation). Then you can respond, "I

will dwell in the secret place with the Most High. I will abide under His almighty shadow" (Ps.

91:1, Author's Translation). The Lord is *El Elyon*, the Most High God who can take care of you

as He provided for His servants in the Scriptures. Look beyond your daily issues to heavenly

things. He knows what will happen today . . . and tomorrow . . . and in the future. When you

can't see what's happening—trust Him—His plans are much greater than your plans.

"Lord, I feel threatened and sometimes I'm scared to death. Evil seems so strong in the

world. Help me."

The Lord is El Elyon, the Possessor of Heaven and Earth; nothing happens without His

knowledge. No one can take away your life until His appointed time. While He allows evil to

run its course, the Most High God has a plan for your life. He's fashioning you according to His

purpose. Behind the scenes He works all things, together "for good to those who love Him, to

those who are the called according to His purpose" (Rom. 8:28).

"Most High God, I give my life to you; I yield to Your plans for this day. I look for Your

protection; help me today. Amen."

Reading: Genesis 14:17-24

Words: 264

Key Thought: The Most High God can take care of you.

MY FATHER AND YOUR FATHER-FATHER

"Jesus said to her, 'Do not cling to Me, for I have not yet ascended to My Father;

but go to My brethren and say to them, I am ascending to My Father and your

Father, and to My God and your God" (John 20:17).

Jesus called on *His Father* while He was on earth. Jesus said He would ascend back to Heaven

to His Father (John 20:17). But Mary Magdalene tried to hang onto Him with a view of keeping

Him on earth. If Mary kept Jesus on earth, He would not have been intimate with all believers,

nor with His heavenly Father. But Jesus ascended to Heaven so both He and the Father could

indwell all believers (John 14:21; Gal. 2:20).

"Father, I need Your presence in my life. It will be difficult to make it through this day if

I don't have Your help. Let me come close to talk with You before I go to meet the

world."

He is your intimate Father, just as He is intimate with all His children who come to Him through

Jesus Christ. Because the Father is God, He is omnipresent throughout His universe which

means He is equally present at all places at all times—present now, in the past, and in the future.

Because you have come to the Father through Jesus (John 14:6), He can be intimate with you and

with all other believers. Because you have been born again by the Holy Spirit (John 3:3-7), He is

your intimate Father. What do you need from Him today? He is here for you; go to Him.

"You are My own Father; I need You, I love You, and I worship You for all You've done

for me. I obey Your instructions and come to You. Amen."

Reading: John 20:17-18

Words: 254

Key Thought: You can be as intimate with the Father as Jesus.

UNDEFILED—JESUS

"For such a High Priest was fitting for us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens" (Hebrews 7:26).

Jesus is the perfect Son of God. Just as the sacrificial lamb had to be without blemish, so Jesus

was the sinless substitute who died for your sin. Satan tempted Jesus to sin, but He rejected the

enemy's temptation (Matt. 4:1-11), so He can help you overcome your temptation or bad habits.

The Jews accused *Jesus* of sin, but when He challenged them to name one sin, they were not able

to do it (John 8:46). In the same way, you should have a blameless reputation before your

enemies. On the night before Jesus died, He didn't want to drink the cup of punishment, but He

drank willingly, submitting to the suffering of the Cross (Matt. 26:39-42). Just as Jesus was

perfectly obedient to the Father, will you willingly become obedient to the will of God?

"Lord Jesus, You are my example for godly living; give me the power to resist sin. You

are my High Priest who prays for me in Heaven; intercede to the Father for me."

The idea of *undefiled* means the absence of sin. But *Jesus* is more than One who never sinned;

He has all the positive attributes of holiness. Jesus is as holy as the Father, so He can be your

perfect High Priest.

"Lord Jesus, I know You are my perfect High Priest, so I come asking You to help me in

my struggles. Keep me from sin, make me holy, and use me this day. Amen."

Reading: Heb. 10:26-39)

Words: 244

Key Thought: Jesus can be your Intercessor because He was undefiled.

YOUR FATHER IN HEAVEN—FATHER

"Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16); "your Father in heaven . . . makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:45); "Be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect" (Matthew 5:48).

Your Father in Heaven is more than a powerful Creator. Your Father in Heaven is Lord, but He's more than the sovereign ruler of the universe; He's your personal Father in Heaven. Just as a child has immediate access to the intimacies of his father, you have that relationship to Your heavenly Father. The Father gives you eternal life and no one is able to snatch you out of His hand (John 10:28, 29). He has prepared a home for you in Heaven, and will work all things in your life for good (Rom. 8:28). The Father will give you His grace and peace (1 Thess. 1:1).

"Father, I rest secure in Your presence. Thank You for receiving me and giving me a new position in the heavenlies."

Now you belong to *Your Father in Heaven*. You can call on Him for answers to prayer and He will give you illumination to learn the Word of God. Because the *Father* belongs to you, you are special. You are His child so you have access to Him at any time for any plea. Because you are the *Father*'s child, all of Heaven is ready to help you.

"Father, thank You for my special place near Your heart. I want to serve You with power so I can extend Your kingdom on earth. I want to know You intimately so I can be like You. I want to worship You so You will be glorified. Amen."

Reading: John 17:20-26

Words: 281

Key Thought: You received a special relationship to the Father when you became a Christian.

THE ZEAL FOR YOUR HOUSE—JESUS

"Then His disciples remembered that it was written, 'Zeal for Your house has eaten Me up" (John 2:17). "Because zeal for Your house has eaten me up, and

the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me" (Psalm 69:9).

The disciples remembered Jesus as One with Zeal for God's House. They observed how Jesus

went to the synagogue each Sabbath, ". . . as His custom was" (Luke 4:16). They remembered

how Jesus went up to Jerusalem and entered the Temple, as was required of a Jewish male. They

remembered how *Jesus* cleansed the Temple at the beginning (John 2:13-22) and the end of His

three-year ministry (Luke 19:45, 46). *Jesus* wanted God's house to be reverent and clean saying,

"My house is a house of prayer, but you have made it a 'den of thieves" (Luke 19:46). Jesus

"was teaching daily in the temple" (Luke 19:47). Why did Jesus have such extraordinary zeal

for the Temple? Because the Father was there.

"Jesus, I confess I don't treat my church as reverently as You treated God's house.

Forgive my shortcomings. Give me a holy zeal for God's house as You demonstrated on

earth."

When Jesus was on earth, The Zeal of the Father's House demanded His loyalty. That's what

the phrase "eaten up" means. Does the church you attend demand your loyalty? Do you attend

its meetings and do you give financially to its causes? Jesus felt an obligation to God's house;

He was "eaten up" with its demands. Why? Because God was present there on the day of

worship.

Lord, I renew my loyalty to my church. I will fulfill my obligations to You through my

church. Amen."

Reading: 1 Cor. 10:1-24

Words: 240

Key Thought: Christ would have You fulfill your obligations to your church.

THE FIRSTBORN—JESUS

"But when He again brings the firstborn into the world, He says: 'Let all the

angels of God worship Him" (Hebrews 1:6).

Jesus was The Firstborn child of Mary; she had no children before Him. She was a virgin when

Jesus was conceived in her of the Holy Spirit. She had not known a man (Lk. 1:34). It was the

Father's plan for Jesus to be her Firstborn because most mothers give more love and care to their

first child. Because of this care, "The Child grew and became strong in spirit, filled with

wisdom; and the grace of God was upon Him" (Luke 2:40). Jesus was the God-man, perfect to

be your Savior.

"Lord Jesus, I praise You for Your birth and growth to full manhood. Just as the angels

in Heaven worship You as the God-man, so do I."

Jesus was also "the firstborn of every creature" (Col. 1:15), which means He gave life to

everything in the world. Jesus is "the beginning of the creation of God" (Rev. 3:14). Not only

was Jesus the source of physical life, He is also The Firstborn from the dead, the first one to rise

from the dead. Now Jesus is the source of all your spiritual life. Because you're in Him, you

have resurrection life (Gal. 2:20). Because Jesus is The Firstborn, He gives you a hope of future

Heaven.

"Lord, thank You for being The Firstborn of the virgin Mary to live and die on the cross

for me. Thank You for being The Firstborn from the dead to give me resurrection life.

Thank You for a hope of future resurrection and Heaven. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 1:1-9; Colossians 1:13-19

Words: 253

Key Thought: Jesus is the Firstborn of the resurrection to give us life.

THE HOLY ONE—HOLY SPIRIT

"I have not concealed the words of the Holy One" (Job 6:10).

The Holy Spirit is the Holy One sent from the Father to help you live godly. He is called The

Holy One because His nature is holy. "Holy" is a word that means "separated to God" or "cut

off from sin or rebellion against God." Holy is a word that means "pure" or "pristine." The

Holy Spirit is sent to get sinful people ready to live with a holy God. He does that by convicting

people of the sin, leading them to live godly lives and living in them as the *The Holy* One. He

will sanctify you to "set you apart" from iniquity. What do you want from the Holy Spirit today?

"Lord, I recognize my sin; cleanse me from all iniquity. I want to be holy; come live

within my body to separate me from all that harms my Christian life."

The Holy Spirit is The Holy One. He will convict you of sin (John 16:7-11) and help you live

close to God. He will give you a deep desire to get rid of sin. He will guide your steps to walk

separated from sin. He will give you a passion to live for God (John 7:37, 38). He will help you

become holy when you have a deep desire to live for God.

"I come to You, Holy One; keep me from the temptations of the world, the flesh, and the

Devil. I want to be godly; help me become more holy. Draw me closer to You. Amen."

Reading: Romans 8:1-17

Words: 251

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is sent to make you holy.

THE FORERUNNER—JESUS

"Where the forerunner has entered for us, even Jesus, having become High Priest

forever according to the order of Melchizedek" (Hebrews 6:20).

Jesus is The Forerunner who has gone first to Heaven for us. Just as a delegation sends a runner

to a city to announce their coming before they arrive, Jesus is The Forerunner who went into

Heaven to announce the arrival of the church. He is your Forerunner who has announced your

coming to Heaven. Just as a forerunner allows the people of a city to get ready for a delegation,

so our *Forerunner* allows all of Heaven to prepare for our arrival. The Father has prepared a

mansion for you (John 14:1-3) and Jesus is interceding to the Father for you. The angels are

waiting for you. Everything is ready because Jesus is The Forerunner who prepared the way.

"Lord Jesus, I face death with more confidence knowing You've gone before me to

Heaven. My doubts fade when I realize You're waiting for me. I don't want to die, but at

least I can look beyond death to see You waiting for me."

Not only has Jesus gone to prepare Heaven, He is now your Intercessor standing at the right hand

of the Father, interceding for you to overcome temptation and make the trip triumphantly. So

live confidently this day, because Jesus is preparing Heaven for you. He is praying for you as

you journey homeward.

"Lord Jesus, I know You stand at the right hand of the Father making intercession for

me. Because You are in Heaven, I pray confidently and I live with assurance. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 6:1-20

Words: 248

Key Thought: Jesus is preparing Heaven for you.

THE FOUNTAIN OF LIFE—JESUS

"For with You is the fountain of life; in Your light we see light" (Psalm 36:9).

When you've been on a long hot walk, what you want is water. Sometimes the heat gets to be

too much and you're afraid of a heat stroke. You need some cool water on your tongue and

something wet on the back of your neck. If you're in really bad condition, you stick your whole

head in the water. When you need water to keep from fainting, Jesus is your Fountain of Life

who will give you a new presence of mind and a new focus. Do you need to cool down your

anger, frustration, or bitterness?

"Lord, I need some cool water before I leave home because it's pretty hot out there. And,

when I get home at the end of the day, I'll need more water to refresh my life for the

evening duties."

Sometimes at work you need a drink of water to refresh your work habits. Sometimes you need

a drink of water in the middle of the night because your mouth is dry and you can't sleep.

Sometimes a drink of water makes you think well, play better, talk better, or perform better. For

whatever you need, pause to drink of Jesus. Just as water energizes the body, so the renewed

presence of Jesus revitalizes your life. Remember, Jesus called Himself "a fountain of water

springing up in everlasting life" (John 4:14).

"Jesus, I come to drink of You. Ah . . . water is good when you're thirsty. I'll keep

coming back because I need You daily. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 36:1-12

Words: 254

Key Thought: Jesus is a fountain of work to refresh your life.

MIGHTY GOD (EL GIBBOR)—TRINITY

"For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality nor takes a bribe" (Deuteronomy 10:17).

The Lord is *El Gibbor*, the Mighty God of strength; He can give you endurance. He is *El*

Gibbor; He can protect you in danger. He is also El Gibbor the firm rock; He can give you

stability. Pray the words of the hymn, "Rock of Ages, cleft for me, let me hide myself in thee,"

because He gives you strength, protection and stability. Some people treat God's name like a

good-luck charm, holding to a crucifix or repeating the name "God" when they are in danger.

But they're taking His name in vain because they don't use it rightly. The mighty protection of

El Gibbor begins with an intimate relationship. You can't use His name as a rabbit's foot to

protect you from harm. You must know Him personally and rest in Him intimately.

"Mighty Lord, I want to know You personally. Rock of Ages, I will hide in You. El

Gibbor, let Your power and protection flow into my life."

El Gibbor can't protect what you don't give to Him, so you must trust El Gibbor. When you are

busy seeking your own glory and doing your own thing, how can He fit into your life? El

Gibbor can't be your strength if you don't use Him.

"Mighty God, I surrender everything to You. Mighty Lord, I yield my ambition and my

possessions; guide me this day and deliver me from the Evil One. Amen."

Reading: Deuteronomy 10

Words: 237

Key Thought: God can only protect what you give to Him.

THE SAVIOR OF THE WORLD – JESUS

"Then they said to the woman, 'Now we believe, not because of what you said,

for we ourselves have heard Him and we know that this is indeed the Christ, the Savior of the world" (John 4:42). "And we have seen and testify that the Father

has sent the Son as Savior of the world" (1 John 4:14).

Jesus is The Savior of the World, but He's also the Savior of one, i.e., the individual. Notice how

the circle begins large and gets smaller. Jesus is The Savior of the World (John 4:42) then Jesus

is the Savior of the Church (Eph. 5:23) and finally, Jesus is your Savior (1 Tim. 2:3). He is the

Savior of people one at a time. Jesus loves all the people in the world, but then it narrows to

you; Jesus loves you and died for you.

"Jesus, thank You for personal attention and for personal salvation. Thank You for

being my personal Savior."

Since Jesus is The Savior of the World, He died for all, all present living people, all past living

people, and all people who live in the future. Jesus is the Savior from past penalty of sin; have

you asked Him to forgive every past sin? Jesus is also our Savior from the power of this evil

world; has He delivered you? Jesus will be our Savior from the presence of sin at the coming

day with "the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Tim. 1:10). Are you ready to meet your

Savior?

"Jesus, You are my Savior; thank You for saving me from past sins. I claim Your daily

power to save me from daily sins. I look forward to Your personal coming to save me in

the future from the presence of sin. Amen."

Reading: Titus 3:1-8

Words: 239

Key Thought: The Savior of the world must also be your personal Savior.

THE SEED OF ABRAHAM—JESUS

"Now to Abraham and his Seed were the promises made. He does not say, 'And to seeds,' as of many, but as of one, 'And to your Seed,' who is Christ" (Galatians 3:16).

Jesus is The Seed of Abraham. The Heavenly Father promised a son to Abraham who would "bless all the families of the earth" (Gen. 12:3). Jesus was born the Messiah, the One who would "take away the sins of the world" (John 1:29) and bring in a Kingdom of righteousness (Luke 1:33). Because Abraham believed God's promise (Gen. 15:6), Isaac was born. Eventually, millions of Jews were born into the world; Jesus was one of those Jews. By faith, Abraham knew the Messiah would come from his seed, "Abraham rejoiced to see My (Jesus) day" (John 8:56). But Jesus didn't come to bring salvation just to the Jews, but to all the world. He brought salvation to you.

"Jesus, thank You for fulfilling prophecy. Thank You for coming to Earth as a Jew. Thank You for dying for my sins."

Because Abraham was a man of faith who believed the promises of God, he looked forward to the birth of *Jesus*. But you too can be a person of faith. How? You must first look back on the history of Abraham to believe that the Father's promises apply to you. Then, you must look back to the work of *Jesus* on the cross and apply salvation to your life. Finally, by faith you must study the Scriptures and apply all its promises to your life.

"Jesus, I believe what the Bible says about You. I trust my future to You. I know You will guide my life and bless me this day. Amen."

Reading: Gal. 3:13-18

Words: 253

Key Thought: God's promise of a Messiah to Abraham applies to me.

ABBA FATHER—FATHER

"For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the

Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, 'Abba, Father'" (Romans 8:15).

The Lord is your *Abba Father*. The title *Abba* means He is your intimate "Papa" in Heaven.

The unbeliever only knows the Lord through the greatness of His power and judgment. Some

believers only relate to the Lord as the Father of Heaven who answers their prayers. Other

believers worship the Father because Jesus said, "The Father is seeking such to worship Him"

(John 4:23). But you can know the Father personally by His intimate name Abba Father. Just

as an earthly father welcomes his child to his lap and hugs him, so you can go to your intimate

"Papa" for fellowship.

"O My Father, originally I loved You for forgiving my sin. Now I love You for Your

intimate love to me. Thank You for accepting me into Your family."

Because the Lord is your Abba Father, you don't relate to Him by just keeping commandments

or obeying orders. You were not just given an impersonal legal adoption. You are a member of

the Father's family; you belong to Him, and He belongs to you. As your heavenly Father's

child, you have all legal rights to His heavenly family. As your Father's child, you are hugged

by His arms. Don't worry, don't strive, just rest.

"Lord, it feels good to feel good in Your arms. I feel comfortable to have the security of

Your protection. But I don't want to know You just to feel good; I want to know You—

Abba—for Yourself. I want to love You and spend time with You. Amen."

Reading: Rom. 8:14-17

Words: 256

Key Thought: You can be intimate with the heavenly Father.

THE SENT ONE—JESUS

"I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work" (John 9:4).

Jesus is The Sent One. Jesus was sent by the Father from Heaven to earth for several reasons. First, Jesus was The Sent One by the Father to reveal to people what God was like. "No one has seen God at any time . . . (Jesus) has declared Him" (John 1:18); will you learn about Jesus to know God? Jesus was The Sent One to let us know what Heaven was like (John 19:1-3); will you learn what Jesus said about your future home? Jesus was The Sent One to demonstrate God's love to the world (John 3:16); will you accept the love of God in Christ? Jesus was The Sent One to redeem the world. "But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son . . . to redeem . . . " (Gal. 4:4-5). Will you receive the redemption *Jesus* offers?

"Lord Jesus, I know You were sent into the world to tell us about the Father. I worship the Father for sending You and I worship You for obeying His instructions."

Jesus is The Sent One; He obeyed the Father's directions. In the same way, Jesus is sending you into the world to tell people the Gospel; will you obey? Just as Jesus was sent as a true witness, will you be a witness for Him?

"Lord Jesus, send me into the world, just as the Father sent You. I will go to my friends and family to 'tell them what great things the Lord has done for (me)' (Mark 5:19). Amen."

Reading: John 9:1-41

Words: 260

Key Thought: Just as Jesus was sent into the world, He now sends you.

THE SUN OF RIGHTEOUSNESS—JESUS

"But to you who fear My name the Sun of Righteousness shall arise with healing in His wings; And you shall go out and grow fat like stall-fed calves" (Malachi

4:2).

The name Sun of Righteousness applies to Jesus in His Second Coming. Jesus is likened to the

sun that has two functions; the sun burns up things, but also the sun's warmth gives life and

healing. When Jesus comes, His judgment will be "burning like an oven all the proud, yes,

all who do wickedly . . . shall burn . . . up" (Mal. 4:1). Jesus is like the sun that sears and

scorches in judgment. But Jesus is also likened to the therapeutic sunlight that relieves pain, and

dispels sickness. It is the same Jesus, and it is the same sunlight, but with opposite affect. When

Jesus comes, how will He deal with you, in judgment or in healing fellowship?

"Lord Jesus, I look to You for some heat on my pain and troubles. In this life there are

accidents and sicknesses; shine some healing on me."

Jesus, The Sun of Righteousness, will return with healing for those martyrs who have died for the

faith. He'll completely restore those whose bodies are eaten with cancer, or dissipated with

disease. The blind will see, the lame will walk, and all sickness will be healed. Jesus is the

Righteous One, meaning He will do the right thing for us, and He will do it in the right way.

Jesus is the source of righteousness because He is *The Sun of Righteousness*.

"Lord Jesus, one day You will make all things right. Until that day, give us a little warm

therapy for the 'hurts' of this life. Amen."

Reading: Malachi 4:1-6

Words: 261

Key Thought: Jesus is the Sun of Righteousness who will heal our pains and diseases.

GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit " (2 Corinthians

3:18).

The Holy Spirit is a Gift to you. Jesus said, "I will pray the Father, and He will give you another

Helper" (John 14:16). The Holy Spirit was given to enter into the heart of every Christian.

Rather than giving you just forgiveness, or just eternal life, or just access into Heaven, the Father

gave you a person of the Godhead. The gift is the *Holy Spirit*. When this gift enters your heart,

He brings the spiritual riches of Heaven into your life. You have the gift, now unwrap the

present and take Him out of the box. When you receive an earthly gift from a friend, you either

"try it on" or "see how it works." Do the same with your gift of the Holy Spirit. Use Him to see

how He works.

"Holy Spirit, I don't seek spiritual things; I seek You. I don't seek spiritual power or

blessings. I need You in my life. I receive You as a free gift."

The Holy Spirit is the Helper promised by Jesus (John 15:26). He helps the Father carry out His

will on earth. He helps Jesus by delivering eternal life to all who believe in Him. He is the gift

to help every believer. Will you open the gift and try it out?

"Holy Spirit, come into my heart and help me live for You. I don't have spiritual power.

So come, "My Gift;" I receive You freely. Amen."

Reading: Acts 2:38-42

Words: 241

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is the Father's gift to you.

A SWEET-SMELLING AROMA—JESUS

"And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an

offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma" (Ephesians 5:2).

A sin offering in the Old Testament was a sweet-smelling aroma. It was not sweet just because it

was pleasing to the smell, as a person is pleased with the aroma of a cooking steak. The Father

was pleased because the sacrifice symbolized the repentant cry of a sinner to God. In death,

Jesus became that Sweet-Smelling Aroma. He made it possible for you to be saved. Just as the

sweet-smelling aroma of the altar of incense in the Tabernacle symbolized the continued prayers

going up to God, so the present day priesthood of *Jesus* is a symbol of His continual intercession

to the Father for you. Is the sacrifice of *Jesus* pleasing to you?

"Jesus, thank You for your sacrificial love for me. I have learned from Your example of

love. I have experienced Your love first-hand, so I will walk in love."

Jesus is A Sweet-Smelling Aroma; His death pleased the Father (Is. 53:10). Now Jesus wants

you to please the Father by your godly living. Yield your heart to Jesus and He will help you do

it. Jesus wants you to please the Father by yielding your time, talent, and treasure in service. He

will help you accomplish much in your service for the Kingdom. Jesus wants you to please the

Father with your worship, because "the Father seeks worshippers" (John 4:24). Magnify the

Father and Son today with praise, exaltation, and thanksgiving.

"Jesus, because You are my sweet-smelling aroma to the Father, I worship the Father

though Your intercession. Amen."

Reading: Mark 15:42-16:1

Key Thought: Jesus is our sweet-swelling aroma to God.

A TEACHER COME FROM GOD—JESUS

"This man (Nicodemus) came to Jesus by night and said to Him, 'Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that You do

unless God is with him" (John 3:2).

Nicodemus called Jesus A Teacher Come From God because he wanted to compliment Jesus.

Nicodemus was the most outstanding teacher in this day. When Jesus—who spoke accurately—

called Nicodemus "The Teacher of Israel" (John 3:10), the original language suggested that

Nicodemus was the most outstanding teacher in Israel. In our terminology, it means, "Teacher of

the Year." Yet, Nicodemus recognized Jesus was superior to Him, because Nicodemus said

Jesus was a *Teacher come from God*. What do you need to learn from *Jesus*?

"Jesus, teach me everything I need to know to be more godly and effective in service. I

will become Your student."

Jesus was often called Teacher. Just as a teacher gives you information you don't know, Jesus

will teach you what you don't know about the Father. Just as a teacher helps solve problems and

makes you more effective in life, Jesus can lead you out of your troubles and make you effective

in Christian service. Just as a teacher is a role model, so Jesus personifies the truth and lived a

perfect live on earth. Just as a teacher loves and helps students, Jesus loves you and will come to

help you in your hour of need. Jesus can meet your deepest need because He is A Teacher Come

From God.

"Jesus, there is so much I don't know; let me sit in Your classroom. I will listen to You

and learn from You. Teach me what I need to know. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 21:23-32

Words: 247

Key Thought: Jesus can teach you what you need to know.

JEHOVAH JIREH (THE LORD WILL PROVIDE)—TRINITY

"And Abraham called the name of the place (Jehovah-Jireh), The-LORD-Will-

Provide; as it is said to this day, 'In the Mount of the LORD it shall be provided'"

(Genesis 22:14).

The Lord is Jehovah Jireh, a name that means "The Lord will provide." The Lord asked

Abraham to do the most difficult thing in life, i.e., to sacrifice his son Isaac. Abraham was ready

to do it, but the Lord stopped him, explaining He was Jehovah Jireh. The Lord provided a ram

for Abraham to sacrifice, and He'll provide for you when you obey Him, just as the Lord did for

Abraham. Jehovah Jireh will provide for you when you step out in obedience, as did Abraham.

How can you can receive the same blessings as did Abraham? "So it is, all who put their faith in

Christ share the same blessing Abraham received" (Gal. 3:8, 9, NLT). Remember, begin every

task by asking for His blessings, and complete every task by claiming the promise of His help to

provide for you. The secret of spiritual prosperity is the name, Jehovah Jireh.

"Jehovah Jireh, give me spiritual victories today, as well as financial blessings. Help me

overcome my difficulties. Lord, provide for my needs today. Jehovah Jireh, step into my

life with Your presence and power."

Claim the power of *Jehovah Jireh* to help defeat your enemies, as did Joshua, David and Gideon.

Just as you claimed blessings, you must also claim victory for your life. He will provide for you

when you trust Him completely.

"Jehovah Jireh, I surrender to Your leadership and trust Your protection. I claim Your

provision and depend upon Your presence. Be near me today. Amen."

Reading: Genesis 22:1-18

Words: 251

Key Thought: Ask Jehovah-Jireh to provide for your needs.

THE BEARER OF SIN—JESUS

"So Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for Him He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation" (Hebrews

9:28).

Jesus carried the cross of Calvary until He was no longer physically able to do so. Another

carried the cross to Calvary for Him. But there, Jesus was nailed to the cross; Jesus bore the sins

of the world. No one else was able to take His place as The Bearer of Sin. Jesus had to do it

alone, totally, and until the end. He bore the sins of many until the sacrifice was accepted and

redemption was complete. Then Jesus cried, "It is finished." He has done it all for you, what

will you do for Him?

"Lord Jesus, as You died for me, I will live for You. My sacrifices are small compared to

Your great sacrifice, but I will bear my sacrifice for You."

Jesus didn't bear only part of your sin, but all of it. So you shouldn't walk in guilt nor live

tentatively. Be a bold Christian because there is no sin charged against you. Jesus bore your sin

with the right concern for others, for He said of His executioners, "Father, forgive them." Then,

He took time to welcome the repentant thief to Paradise. So, be positive when you suffer for

Him, and "be concerned for others," as you bear reproach for Him.

"Lord Jesus, in appreciation for all You've done for me, I will live joyfully this day. I

will not complain when things don't go my way, nor will I gripe over irritations. Any

suffering is a privilege, considering how much You suffered for me. Amen."

Reading: Luke 23:46-49

Words: 254

Key Thought: Endure suffering because Jesus suffered for you.

THE SALVATION OF GOD—JESUS

"For my eyes have seen Your salvation . . . And all flesh shall see the salvation of

God" (Luke 2:30; 3:6).

Jesus is called The Salvation of God, a title first given Him in Isaiah 52:10. Simeon, an old man

waiting in the Temple for the Messiah, also called the Baby Jesus The Salvation of God. Then

John the Baptist, when preaching in the wilderness, called Jesus The Salvation of God. Notice,

Jesus "had come from God" (John 13:3), which means God has salvation, but Jesus brings

salvation to Earth.

"Lord Jesus, I thank You for coming into this world with salvation from the Father. I

thank You for brining salvation to me."

Jesus is The Salvation of God from your past sins, they cannot be charged against you. Jesus is

The Salvation of God from your present sins, so don't be an addict to sin, nor let the power of sin

keep you in bondage. Jesus is The Salvation of God for your future sins. "The blood of Jesus

Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). You must deal with all sin—past, present,

and future—according to 1 John 1:9 . . . confession . . . forgiveness . . . cleansing. And finally,

Jesus is The Salvation of God who will remove us from the presence of sin in eternity. There is

coming a day when we'll live in Heaven, never to struggle with sin again.

"Jesus, You are my 'salvation of God.' I claim You for total salvation in every area of

my life. Save me now, and save me in the future. Amen."

Reading: Luke 3:2-6

Words: 251

Key Thought: Jesus comes from God for your complete salvation.

LIVING FATHER—FATHER

"As the living Father sent Me, and I live because of the Father, so he who feeds

on Me will live because of Me" (John 6:57).

The Lord is the *Living Father*. All idols are lifeless images carved from stone or wood; they

neither have life nor give life. Idols are nothing more than the desires of their maker. But, the

Father is in Heaven alive and has great desires for you today. Buddha, Mohammed, and all

creators of false religions have died, but the Living Father will exist forever to give you eternal

life. Will you receive it? The Lord is the Living Father; He did not have to create life, He is

life. He created every living thing in the Universe. The Living Father gives spiritual life to

those who call on Him and believe on Him.

"O Lord, I tend to take my life for granted, except when I get sick or am threatened.

Help me find meaning in my l life, and give me happiness."

The Lord is your *Living Father*, who gave life to Adam, and, through the continuous miracle of

birth, He gave life to you. He originally blew breath into Adam who became a living soul (Gen.

2:7), so He can breathe new spiritual life into you every day. The Living Father can make this a

wonderful day if you will let Him.

"O Living Father, I know both my physical and spiritual life comes from You. I am

grateful for another day to live for You. May my life glorify You today. Amen."

Reading: John 6:53-59

Words: 235

Key Thought: The Living Father can make your life meaningful.

A STRONG CONSOLATION—JESUS

"That by two immutable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we might have strong consolation . . . this hope we have as an anchor of the soul . . . where

our forerunner has entered (Heaven) for us" (Hebrews 6:18-20).

Jesus is your Strong Consolation to overcome doubts. Don't worry about your eternal destiny,

Jesus is your hope. Doubts come from the heart because believers still have an old sin nature (1

John 1:8-10). So, don't look within your heart when you have doubts, look to Jesus The Strong

Consolation. You can be sure of Heaven because He is already there for you. Just as a boat is

anchored in the harbor to keep from drifting with the tide out to sea, Jesus your anchor is already

securely grounded in Heaven; He'll keep you from drifting. Just as a royal delegation will send a

forerunner into a city so its citizens can prepare for the dignitaries, so Jesus is your forerunner

who has gone to prepare Heaven for you because He knows you are coming. Your doubts will

disappear when you look to Jesus standing in Heaven waiting for you.

"Lord Jesus, I have doubts when I rely on my ability to reason things out. But when I

look to You, my doubts go away; then I know Heaven is sure."

When you have *Jesus* in your heart, He is your *Strong Consolation* to take away doubts. He is

standing in Heaven waiting for you. So walk in this life with assurance, play with confidence,

serve without any doubts, and lay hold of the hope set before you.

"Lord Jesus, I know intellectually about Heaven, but I know You are in my heart, so I

know I am going to Heaven. You are my Strong Consolation . . . my anchor . . . my

forerunner. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 6:13-20

Words: 267

Key Thought: Looking to Jesus takes away doubts.

A STRONGHOLD IN THE DAY OF TROUBLE—JESUS

"The LORD is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble; and He knows those who

trust in Him" (Nahum 1:7).

Ever since Eve disobeyed the command of God, there has been trouble on earth. There have

been political troubles, financial troubles, family troubles, and inner troubles. Just as Eve didn't

have the power to say "No," so all people struggle with the power of self-discipline. Because we

can't say "No," we bring trouble upon ourselves, just as Eve brought it upon herself and all her

posterity. No one can escape trouble, "Man who is born of woman is of few days and full of

trouble" (Job 14:1). But God knows our trouble, so He promised to be A Stronghold In The Day

Of Trouble.

"Lord, You know the troubles I face; help me. You know the future troubles that are

coming . . . troubles I don't know about . . . prepare me."

The reference to "the days of trouble" has a two-fold application. It applies to the future day of

God's judgment. When you're in *Jesus*, He will be your *Stronghold* to protect you in the day of

judgment. The second application is to all kinds of present-day troubles. He will protect you

inwardly by giving you courage, patience, and hope. He will help you outwardly when you

follow the principles of Scripture. He will give you victory through prayer and His divine

sovereign work. Don't worry about getting lost and not finding the Stronghold. He knows

where you are and He'll come get you.

"Lord Jesus, teach me how to solve troubles when I can have victory. Teach me how to

live with trouble that I can't eliminate then. Amen."

Reading: Nahum 1:1-7

Words: 263

Key Thought: Jesus will help us with our troubles.

RIVERS OF LIVING WATER—HOLY SPIRIT

"If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the

Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water" (John 7:37,

38).

The Holy Spirit is Rivers of Living Water; He quenches your thirst. When you're almost thirsted

to death, He is Water who restores your life. When you're tempted to drink at a polluted

fountain of the world, He is the only *Water* that will give you health. When you've spent all

your energy working too hard, He is *Water* that will revive your spirit. When you've ignored the

Lord and gotten dirty from sin, He is the fountain of Living Water to wash away your filth.

Come to Him, get clean, and drink!

"Holy Spirit, thank You for the constant invitation to drink. I need Water . . . I want

Water . . . I like Water. Here I come!"

The Holy Spirit is the Rivers of Living Water. Because He is God, He is the eternal source of

spiritual refreshment and renewal that flows from the heart of God. When you have the Holy

Spirit in your heart, you have it all. The source of Living Water will flow from you out to others.

But He is more than one river of *Water*; He is multiple *Rivers of Water*. How many? As many

as you need, and more – enough for every person ever born again into the family of God. He is

enough *Water* to satisfy all people, and He is *Living Water* to satisfy all needs. Come and drink.

"Holy Spirit, I bow to worship You for spiritual satisfaction. I come to You to drink. Ah,

this Water is good! Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 12:1-6

Words: 254

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will satisfy your longings.

A RANSOM FOR MANY—JESUS

"Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to

give his life a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28, KJV).

A Ransom is the price paid to release someone who is captured or kidnapped. Satan tempted Eve

to eat the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil; she gave to Adam and they both ate.

In that act of disobedience, they were captured by Satan, both them and all their posterity. To

release these captives, a price was paid, "You were not redeemed with corruptible things . . . but

with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb" (1 Pet. 1:18, 19). Jesus gave His life's blood to

pay the ransom price; He was A Ransom For Many. Jesus is "the lamb of God who takes away

the sin of the world "(John 1:29). While the blood was the price for everyone in the world, it

only applied to those who believe in Him and receive Him as Savior. It was A Ransom For

Many but it only applied to those who received it.

"Jesus, I love You because You first loved me. I will serve You because You paid the

ransom for me."

Jesus is the perfect example of a servant who ministers to others. He did not think of Himself,

but thought of others. But He did more than think of us, He came and took the initiative. He

gave His time, His strength, and His life for our ransom.

"Jesus, I will give my life for others because You have given Your life for me. I will think

of others, give my time for others, and take the initiative for others. Amen."

Reading: Matt. 20:20-34

Words: 262

Key Thought: Give your life for others as Christ gave His life for you.

A REFINER'S FIRE—JESUS

"But who can endure the day of His coming? And who can stand when He

appears? For He is like a refiner's fire and like launderers' soap" (Malachi 3:2).

Jesus is The Refiner's Fire to judge those who call themselves God's children. Jesus will return

to separate true believers from those who only call themselves Christians. The silver ore was

crushed into small granules and then ground into powder. Water was poured over the powder to

wash away the dross. The remaining silver-like powder was melted in a crucible. The more heat

- Refiner's Fire - that was added, more lead dross came to the surface. By blowing hot air over

the melted surface, lead dross was blown away, leaving pure silver. When Jesus returns, He will

judge all to determine who are His true believers. His breath is the Word of God; it will blow

away the dross.

"Lord Jesus, I'm not perfect, but I believe in You with all my heart. I love You with all

my heart, soul, and strength."

There is much ore that looks like silver, but it's not. In the same way, there are many who look

like Christians, but are not. Sometimes, we are crushed by persecutions and ground to powder

by trials; even then, true believers are not always identified. The water of the Word of God is

poured over us in sermons and Bible readings, but even that doesn't single out true believers.

Only the Refiner's Fire of judgment will identify those who truly belong to Christ.

"Lord Jesus, I know in my head that You exist. I know in my experience that I've asked

You to come into my life. I know in my innate being that I'm Your child. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 20:11-15

Words: 260

Key Thoughts: Jesus will judge all those who call themselves Christians to determine those who

are real.

THE GOD OF FORGIVENESS—TRINITY

"But You are God ready to pardon, gracious and merciful, slow to anger,

abundant in kindness" (Nehemiah 9:17).

The Lord is Elohim-Selichot, The God of Forgiveness. When you look at God through the cross,

you hear Him say, "Forgive them, for they do not know what they do" (Luke 23:34). How could

God forgive those who crucified Jesus? Because they didn't understand who they were killing,

or because they were just carrying out orders. Being vicious was just their nature. God knows

all about us, and He knows all of us. If God didn't forgive any of us, none of us would be

forgiven. But, He forgave those who crucified Jesus, just as he'll forgive you. Just as the very

nature of people is to sin, so the very nature of God is to forgive.

"Lord, Your forgiving nature is just the opposite of my sin nature. Thank You for

forgiving my sin. I don't deserve it. Help me walk today as a forgiven person."

God has two sides to His nature. God is just—Elohim-Mishpat—which means He must punish

those who break His laws. But the other side of God is love; God forgives any and all who say,

"I'm sorry" and come to Him through Christ. The cross has two sides: the judgment side is

God's punishing sin, and the loving side is God forgiving your sins. Through the cross, you

obtained, "Redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins" (Eph. 1:7).

"Lord, I'm glad You don't kill me every time I sin. I will live today as a "forgiven

saint;" Thank You for forgiveness that daily changes my life. Amen."

Reading: Nehemiah 9:5-38

Words: 256

Key Thought: God's forgiveness will change you.

A RIGHTEOUS MAN—JESUS

"So when the centurion saw what had happened, he glorified God, saying,

'Certainly this was a righteous Man!'" (Luke 23:47).

Jesus was A Righteous Man, which means Jesus did right things, in the right way. A

Righteous Man is right in his desires, thoughts, in the things he does, and in the way he

does things. The centurion knew the trial and execution of Jesus was not fair. He saw

the Jewish leaders first accuse Jesus of blaspheme, and when Pilate wouldn't recognize

that as a legal indictment, the charge against Jesus was changed to treason. The

centurion heard Pilate say, "I find no fault in Jesus," yet the Jews crucified Him anyway.

Jesus forgave His executioners and then told the repentant thief, "Today you will be with

me in Paradise." When the centurion saw the integrity of Jesus in the face of lies and

dishonesty, he confessed, "This is a righteous man."

"Lord Jesus, I don't measure up to Your righteous standard. I don't always do

the right things; forgive me."

When the Jewish leaders and the Roman establishment schemed against Jesus, heaven

came to His defense. The bright noonday turned to darkness. When God couldn't look

on the unfolding tragedy, the heavens became dark. As Jesus died, an earthquake

rumbled over Jerusalem and the surrounding hills. God's earth was protesting the

despicable things done to God's Son. When the centurion had seen it all, he cried, "This

was a righteous man." Jesus was A Righteous Man because He was God incarnate in

human flesh.

"Lord Jesus, You always did the right things; I recognize You as a righteous man.

I worship at Your feet. Amen."

Reading: Luke 23:46-49

Words: 257

Key Thought: People recognized Jesus as a righteous man because He did all things right.

A STAR OUT OF JACOB—JESUS

"I see Him, but not now; I behold Him, but not near; a Star shall come out of

Jacob; a Scepter shall rise out of Israel" (Numbers 24:17).

Jesus is pictured as A Star Out of Jacob. Just as mariners plot their course by the stars, so the

Lord wants to direct your life by The Star Out of Jacob. Just as stars give light in the black

night, so Jesus, The Star of Jacob, gives light to a world darkened by sin. Just as stars tell us the

time and seasons (Gen. 1:14), so Jesus gives meaning to your appointment calendar. Just as stars

warn people that they have a limited amount of time left on this earth, so Jesus, The Star of

Jacob, gives hope. Look to Him for meaning in your life.

"Jesus, I look to You for direction this day. Guide me to make good choices and help me

shine Your light to those about me."

Those who walk in darkness hurt themselves; they need Jesus The Star of Jacob to show them

the way. Those who are lost in the black night are cold and disoriented; they need *The Star of*

Jacob to point them to the warmth of God's love. The Star of Jacob reminds people that the

Father loves them and has a wonderful plan for their life. Carry the light of Jesus to them (John

8:12; Acts 2:1-4); He wants to light the way of everyone coming into the world (John 1:4).

"Jesus, I want to be guided by Your star. Keep me warm near the fire and shine a

reading lamp in my heart so that I can learn. Light my path, and help me walk in the

light. Amen."

Reading: Numbers 25:1-25

Words: 261

Key Thought: Jesus gives light to help people find the right path.

HIS NAME IS FATHER—FATHER

"I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me; if another comes

in his own name, him you will receive" (John 5:43).

His Name is Father; that means "Father" is more than a title. Men on earth are called by the

title "Father" because that is a description of all who sire children. But throughout eternity past,

the First Person of the Trinity was known by His name Father. He was called Father by His

Son, Jesus Christ. Why is Father His name? The title reflects the intimacy of relationship He

had with Jesus and He can have with you. The most important aspect of God is not His awesome

power or His omniscient knowledge; the most important characteristic of God is His relationship

with people; He is *Father*.

"I worship You as My God because of Your almighty power. I magnify You as my LORD

because of all You've done for me. I follow You as my Master because of Your wisdom

and miracles. But I know You intimately because You are my Father."

People did not pray to God in the Old Testament using the name *Father*, so Jesus came to teach

them to pray, "Our heavenly Father . . . hallowed be Your name" (Matt. 6:9). As a child goes to

an earthly father with his needs, so you can take your requests and call Him by name—Father.

"My heavenly Father, hallowed be Your name in my thoughts, actions, and service. I

love Your name, Father. It cheers me when I am down. It gives me strength to serve

when I am weak. It guards me against evil when I'm tempted. Because I know You by

Your name, I come calling You Father. Amen."

Reading: John 12:27-50

Words: 266

Key Thought: Call Him by His name, Father.

A PROPHET MIGHTY IN DEED AND WORD—JESUS

"And He said to them, 'What things?' So they said to Him, 'The things

concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a Prophet mighty in deed and word before

God and all the people" (Luke 24:19).

God sent prophets to speak His message, but many times people wouldn't accept their message.

So some prophets predicted the future to give them credibility; other prophets did miracles to get

people to believe their message. The Bible describes these "prophets . . . who have . . . predicted

signs or miracles" (Deut. 13:1, 2, NLT). Just as God's prophets in the Old Testament came with

supernatural predictions and miracles, so Jesus came doing supernatural things as He preached to

the multitudes. Jesus was A Prophet Mighty in Deed and Word.

"Lord Jesus, I believe in the miracles recorded in the Bible. Lord Jesus, I believe the

truth You spoke in sermons. But I mostly believe because You came into my heart and

saved me."

Jesus did miracles for many reasons. He healed because He had compassion on those who

suffered. He did supernatural acts to demonstrate His deity. Jesus did signs and wonders

because the Old Testament predicted the Messiah would do them. Jesus worked miracles so His

disciples and others would believe in Him. Jesus did miracles because it's only natural for God

to do the supernatural. Today, let Jesus speak to you as A Prophet who has God's message for

you. Today, let *Jesus* do something supernatural for you.

"Jesus, thank You for doing miracles while on earth; they give credibility to Your

message. But, thank You for the miracles of my new nature and spiritual sight. Amen."

Reading: Luke 24:13-35

Words: 242

Key Thought: Jesus did miracles to give Him credibility to His sermons and claims of Deity.

THE JUST ONE—JESUS

"Which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? And they killed those who foretold the coming of the Just One, of whom you now have become the betrayers

and murderers" (Acts 7:52).

Stephen preached a convicting sermon (Acts 7:1-53) to those ready to kill him. The Jewish

leaders stoned Stephen just as they were previously responsible for the crucifixion of Jesus.

Stephen said the coming of Jesus, The Just One, was foretold in Scripture. Stephen was

suggesting Jesus was not guilty, but Jesus was crucified unjustly. Stephen was saying Jesus was

innocent. Jesus did not die because He broke a law, but His death was a substitute for everyone

who had broken the law. Jesus died on the Cross so people wouldn't have to die eternally in

Hell.

"Lord Jesus, You are The Just One who died for me. Thank You for taking my place."

The title Just comes from dikaios, a word also translated "righteous." Jesus was always right—

He never sinned—He was right in character and actions. "For the Father made Jesus who never

sinned to become our sin, so that we might have His righteousness" (2 Cor. 5:21, Author's

Translation). There is a double transfer in this verse. First our sins were transferred to a sinless

One, and second; His righteousness was transferred to us. It's not just enough to have your sins

forgiven to go to Heaven, You must be good, or in the words of this verse, you must be

righteous. In His substitution for us, Jesus did two things: He took away our sin (minus) and He

gave us His righteousness (added).

"Lord Jesus, You came into my heart to take away my sins and give me Your

righteousness. You made me 'good' enough for Heaven. Amen."

Reading: Acts 7:51-60

Words: 262

Key Thought: Jesus makes us good enough to go to Heaven.

THE BREATH OF THE ALMIGHTY—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of God has made me, and the breath of the Almighty gives me life"

(Job 33:4).

The Holy Spirit is The Breath of the Almighty; He gives life to all living things. When Adam

was originally created, God breathed into his physical lungs and that clay body came alive. That

was the Holy Spirit that entered into Adam's body. The Holy Spirit is life and gave Adam

human life. Through the continual miracle of procreation, physical life was passed on to you. In

the life of God, you live and move and have your being (Acts 17:28).

"Holy Spirit, I thank You for physical life. Help me bring glory to the Father, Son, and

Yourself this day. Keep my physical life strong so I can develop my spiritual life."

The Holy Spirit is The Breath of the Almighty who first gave you spiritual life. When you

became a Christian, He entered your life through the new birth—you were born again—now the

Holy Spirit indwells your life. "Unless one is born of . . . the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom

of God" (John 3:5). Now, the *Holy Spirit* is present in your physical body to accomplish all the

work that the Father and Son want to do through you. Will you yield to the Spirit's leading and

let Him guide you today? Will you yield to His power, and let Him work through you today?

"Holy Spirit, I am weak; I yield to Your power to overcome temptation. I rely on Your

power to live for You. Fill me with Your presence to accomplish Your will this day.

Amen."

Reading: Job 33:1-7; Genesis 2:1-7

Words: 256

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is God's Breath that gives me life.

THE IMAGE OF THE INVISIBLE GOD—JESUS

"He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation" (Colossians

1:15).

Jesus is The Image of the Invisible God you can't see. Throughout history people have asked to

see God, but God has protected them, "No man shall see Me, and live" (Exod. 33:20). But

there's another answer, "You can't see God because there's nothing to see." Jesus told the

Samaritan woman, "God is Spirit" (John 4:24), and a spirit has no flesh or material substance to

see. But still people want to see God. So they can see God by looking at *Jesus*. Read the pages

of Scripture to see Jesus' character and miracles. See His acts of kindness. When you see Jesus

in the Bible, you'll see God. You'll see how God in human flesh acted and reacted, for Jesus is

God. He's *The Image of the Invisible God*.

"Lord, in the pages of Scripture, I see kindness in Your face. I feel the forgiveness of

Your grace. When I can't see anything else, the image of God I trace."

An image is an exact reflection. The original object can't move without the same movement in

the image. Jesus is The Image of God; He is One with the Father, One in love, goodness and

grace. Jesus said, "He who has seen Me, has seen the Father" (John 14:9). To know the Father

more intimately, look at Jesus; He is The Image of the Invisible God.

"Jesus, I praise the Father in whose image You exist. One look at You satisfies my

curiosity about God. You are the matchless beauty of Deity. Amen."

Reading: Colossians 1:1-15

Words: 254

Key Thought: Jesus shows us how God would live and act in human flesh.

THE HOPE OF GLORY—JESUS

"To them God willed to make known what are the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles: which is Christ in you, the hope of glory"

(Colossians 1:27).

Jesus is Your Hope of Glory. All people will die, except those who meet Jesus in the rapture.

No one looks forward to death; for most, it's a painful departure from this life. But when you

walk through your personal valley of death, He'll be with you. When you step into death, you'll

come out on the other side in His presence. But you won't take that step alone, because when

you "walk through the valley of the shadow of death, you don't have to be scared because He is

with you" (Ps. 23:4, Author's Translation). Yet, some believers have difficulty believing there is

life beyond the grave. To prove that the Lord will be with them in their death, He reminds them

to look within their hearts at Christ's indwelling because Christ is their *Hope of Glory*.

"Lord, I'm grateful that You came into my heart. Now, I have confidence of my future

home in Heaven."

The indwelling of Jesus is your Hope of Glory. This assurance is your riches of glory. Don't

spend this wealth on doubt. The unsaved can't understand this assurance; it's a mystery to them.

Yet, they would spend their life's savings to live beyond the grave. But Heaven can't be bought

with money and confidence doesn't come from wealth. When you have Christ in your heart, you

have the riches and *Hope of Glory*.

"Lord, I know I'll live forever, but don't look forward to pain that is associated with

death. Help me look beyond death to the Hope of Glory. Amen."

Reading: Colossians 1:24-29

Words: 258

Key Thought: The indwelling Christ is your hope of enjoying the glories of Heaven.

FATHER OF THE FATHERLESS—TRINITY

"A father of the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in His holy habitation"

(Psalm 68:5).

God is the Father of the Fatherless; He cares for the poor and needy. The Father cares for those

who can't look after themselves, and for all people who belong to Him. The orphans who walk

with God can claim the Scripture, "When my father and my mother forsake me, then the LORD

will take care of me" (Ps. 27:10). Many times God uses the church to care for the needy through

homes, orphanage, hospitals, etc. At other times, God cares for the needy by individual

Christians. If you have plenty, let the *Father* use your resources to care for someone in need. If

you are in desperate conditions, call unto your heavenly *Father* for help.

"Father, I am happy in Your presence. Although I have needs in my life, I am satisfied

because You are my Father. You have taken care of me and I know You'll take care of

me in the future."

God is the Father of the Fatherless. Because He created the universe and mankind, He is the

sovereign Father of all. Because believers have come to God through Jesus Christ, He is their

personal heavenly Father. When God's children call unto Him, He is their intimate Father who

provides for them. What can the *Father* supply for you today?

"Father, I have no need when I look to You. But when I look at my schedule or I look out

my window, I see needs everywhere. Thank You for taking care of me. Use me to meet

the needs of the needy. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 27:9-15

Words: 258

Key Thought: The Father in Heaven cares for the needy.

THE HIDDEN MANNA—JESUS

"He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes I will give some of the hidden manna to eat. And I will give him a white stone, and on the stone a new name written which no one knows except

him who receives it" (Revelation 2:17).

The Rabbis taught that when the Messiah came, He would find the hidden Ark of the Covenant

and feed the people manna that was originally kept in the ark. Since God supplied manna for

Israel to eat in the wilderness, the people expected their Messiah to feed them the same way. But

Jesus corrected their false expectations, "... the bread of God is He who comes down from

heaven and gives life to the world" (John 6:33). Then, to make sure all understood, Jesus said, "I

am the bread of life" (John 6:35). He was not going to give them physical bread to keep their

bodies alive; He was spiritual bread. "If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever" (John

6:51).

"Lord Jesus, I have believed in You. I have eaten Your bread and You are good."

When Jesus spoke of giving "hidden manna," it was not some stale bread left over from the

wilderness wanderings. Jesus was not even talking about yesterday's bread; that's day-old

bread. The Jews were looking for a pot of old manna. They were like people looking for a huge

pile of bread to last them the rest of their lives. Who wants a warehouse full of old bread when

you have Jesus, the bread maker? He says, "Whoever eats (of Me) . . . I will raise him up at the

last day" (John 6:54).

"Jesus, I come daily to eat at Your table. Your bread is fresh and good. I feel strong

when I eat of You. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 16:1-36

Words: 260

Key Thought: Jesus is the manna that feeds.

THE HEAD OF THE BODY, THE CHURCH—JESUS

"And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn

from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence" (Colossians 1:18).

Jesus is The Head of the Body; the One who gives direction to the Church. Just as a head does

the thinking for the human body, let Jesus do your thinking today. Just as the head makes

choices, let Jesus guide your decision-making processes today. Just as the head sees the

surrounding world, and hears things, and appreciates the aroma of good things, so *Jesus* is your

contact with the spiritual world. He knows what has happened to you in the past and He knows

what will happen in the future. Let Jesus—your Head—guide you today. He knows that good

encounters and evil experiences are headed your way. Look to Him—your Head—for guidance

this day.

"Lord Jesus, I worship You for being the Head of the body—the Church. But I want

more than knowledge about You. Come be the Head of my life."

When the head is removed, the body dies; for it can't work, play, serve, or worship, without the

head. You need Christ for everything you do. You need Him more than once a week on

Sundays, and more than once a day for re-vitalization. You need Jesus every minute of every

hour. Jesus, The Head of the Body is the secret of living.

"Lord, be my eyes so I can see spiritual things. Be my ears so I can hear the Father's

voice; help me smell the sweet aroma of Your presence. I crown You as the Head of my

life. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 22:1-5

Words: 250

Key Thought: Jesus must be the head of your life.

THE FATHER OF SPIRITS—FATHER

"Furthermore, we have had human fathers who corrected us, and we paid them respect. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits

and live?" (Hebrews 12:9).

When you worship the *Father*, remember, "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must

worship in spirit and truth" (John 4:24). The Father is spirit, that means He doesn't have a

physical body, no one should make any images, idols or statues to Him. His nature is spirit, but

that doesn't mean He's like smoke or an illusion. The Father is a person with the power of

personality, i.e., intellect, emotion and will. He has existence and the Father is the powerful

Creator, Eternal Sustainer, and Infinite Judge of the universe. The Father is spirit and is the

Father of Spirits.

"Father, come visit here, let me feel your presence. I bow before you to worship You for

Your awesome greatness. I pray to receive Your personal care for me this day."

The Father is omniscient; He knows all things possible, so He knows all about you. The Father

is omnipotent; He has all power to do everything that is possible to do, so He can "work all

things together for good" for you. The Father is omnipresent; He is present everywhere at the

same time. So, He can be close to you and receive your worship. Therefore, worship Him in

spirit, and He will hear your prayers.

"Father, I know You are here near me. You know all about me and You know what I

should do today; guide me. You have all power; work out Your will in my life. Amen."

Reading: Heb. 12:6-15

Words: 244

Key Thought: The heavenly Father is near you to help you.

THE HEAD OF ALL PRINCIPALITY AND POWER—JESUS

"And you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power"

(Colossians 2:10).

Jesus is The Head of All Principalities and Power, which means laws and authority originally

came from Him. Because He is righteous, He wants you to live by His righteous principles.

These are the principles by which the Lord rules the world, whether it's the principles (laws) of

nature, the principles by which governments exist, or the ethical principles that guide human

conduct and human relationships. Also, the spiritual principles of peace and brotherly kindness

come from the Lord. Commit yourself to learning all you can about the laws of this world

(which come from God) so you can understand how the Lord guides and controls all things.

"Lord, teach me to live by Your principles so I can please You and be like You. But, I

know my weakness; give me power to live by Your principles."

Jesus is The Head of All Principality and Power. The power of laws and principles flowed into

the natural world when He created everything in the beginning. The principles by which people

live flowed into humanity when He created people in His image. The principles by which He

sovereignly guides all things come from His power, for Jesus is The Head of All Principalities

and Power.

"Lord, I want to live by Your principles because I don't know all things, teach me Your

laws. Because I am weak, I need Your strength. Because I am needy, I come to You for

help. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 119:1-16

Words: 241

Key Thought: Know the Lord's principles, because they are the secret to successful living.

THE LAMB SLAIN FROM THE FOUNDATION OF THE WORLD—JESUS

"All who dwell on the earth will worship him, whose names have not been written in the Book of Life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world"

(Revelation 13:8).

As Israel faced the first Passover, "Moses called all the elders . . . and said to them, 'Take lambs

for yourselves according to your family" (Ex. 12:21). Each father placed his hands on the head

of the lamb to confess the sins of each family member. Their sins were transferred to the lamb,

then it was killed; the lamb died instead of the family. Jesus was "the lamb of God who takes

away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). Since Jesus is called "God's Lamb," that suggests God

sent His Lamb—His Son—to die for the sin of the world.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for dying for the world, but thank You most of all for dying for

me."

There was a historical event when God's Son died on the cross. But God doesn't have a calendar

and He doesn't keep time as humans. God is eternal without time. He has always loved us and

always planned to give His son to die for our sins. Jesus is The Lamb Slain From the

Foundation of the World. At another place, the Bible reminds us, "You were not redeemed with

corruptible things, like silver or gold, . . . but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb . . .

foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you" (1

Pet. 1:18-20).

"Lord Jesus, thank You for planning my salvation from the foundation of the world."

Thank You for coming to die on a cross for me. Amen."

Reading: Isa. 53:1-7

Words: 260

Key Thought: The sacrifice of Jesus was planned in ages past, but was accomplished on the

cross.

THE BREATH OF YOUR NOSTRILS—HOLY SPIRIT

"The foundations of the world were uncovered at Your rebuke, O LORD, at the

blast of the breath of Your nostrils" (Psalm 18:15).

The Holy Spirit is The Breath of God's Nostrils. When God breathes judgment, the Holy Spirit

executes His punishment. Sometimes in Scripture God judged *directly*, such as striking a person

with leprosy (Num. 12:9-12), or striking a person dead (Acts 5:1-11). The Holy Spirit is God's

direct instrument to carry out that punishment. Sometimes, God judged indirectly, such as

shutting up Heaven that it did not rain, or sending a plague of locusts. Sometimes God used a

storm or other natural means. The *Holy Spirit* was God's indirect instrument behind the apparent

natural disaster. He was God's indirect instrument. He can work good in your life, directly or

indirectly. Or, He can be the force of God's punishment, directly or indirectly.

"Holy Spirit, if I'm doing anything that will lead to judgment, show me; I will repent and

change. Breathe good things upon me."

The Breath of God's Nostrils controls nature. Sometimes disasters come upon you, not because

you sin or are disobedient. You may think you're being punished for something you did, but

look behind the event. What you think is punishment, may be God's classroom to instruct you

about His grace. Remember, all things—including loss—will work together for good to those

who love God (Rom. 8:28). Examine your loss to find what God is teaching you. Learn what

He wants you to know, then pray for the *Breath* of good things to blow upon you.

"Holy Spirit, let me feel Your breath of good things. I don't pray for harmful

consequences, but help me learn from them when they come. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 18:15-50

Words: 265

Key Thought: God controls the circumstances that control your life.

THE LIFE—JESUS

"Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the

Father except through Me" (John 14:6).

Jesus is *The Life*; He is the source of life. He embedded the world with His life when He created

it (Col. 1:16). The smallest building block of the universe is the cell, made up of protons,

neutrons, and electrons, all held together by the enormous power of Jesus who "holds all creation

together" (Col. 1:17, NLT). Jesus is also the source of human life, for the first parents were

made in God's image when God's life was breathed into Adam, and he became "a living being"

(Gen. 2:7).

"Lord Jesus, I thank You for life in my physical body. I thank You for food to eat, water

to drink, and air to breathe. I thank You for mental and spiritual life."

Jesus is the source of spiritual life. Jesus, the life of God, was put to death, but arose on the third

day. He is "the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25). The Bible was referring to Jesus when it

states, "The life was manifested" (1 John 1:2). The apostle John said, ". . . we have seen, and

bear witness, and declare to you that eternal life which was with the Father and was manifested

to us" (1 John 1:2). Have you seen and received this life?

"Lord Jesus, I have received Your life—eternal life—when I was saved. I get enlightened

from reading the Scriptures. I experience renewed life when I fellowship with You in

prayer. I worship You for heavenly life. Amen."

Reading: John 3:22-36

Words: 247

Key Thought: You get the life of Jesus when you receive Him into your life.

THE LAWGIVER—JESUS

"There is one Lawgiver, who is able to save and to destroy. Who are you to judge

another?" (James 4:12)

The Lord is *The Lawgiver*; He runs the world through natural laws such as the law of gravity.

No one can break these laws without suffering consequences. He also runs the spiritual world

through moral laws. Because no one has perfectly kept all laws, no one can enter Heaven. Jesus

fulfilled the Law in His death; He nailed the law to His Cross. No longer will broken laws keep

you from going to Heaven (Col. 2:14, 15). Christianity is not about keeping rules or laws; it's

about knowing Jesus. When you please Him, you satisfy all the laws for Jesus created the laws;

He is *The Lawgiver*.

"Lord, it's sometimes hard to keep the laws because I have a rebellious streak in my

heart. Help me submit to You. Help me live by Your principles."

Don't be just a law-keeper; these people are called legalists. Look behind laws to see their

purpose because laws were given to point you to God. Jesus said the greatest law of all is to love

the Lord your God with all your heart, and the second is to love your neighbor as yourself (Matt.

22:38-39). When you live by the meaning of these laws, you will have a worthwhile life.

"Lord, forgive me for just keeping laws for legalistic purposes. Show me Your purpose

behind Your laws. I love You with all my heart, my soul, and my mind (Matt. 22:37-40).

Show me the real meaning behind Your laws and give me the right attitude to live by

them. Give me the power to keep them. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 27:35-40

Words: 263

Key Thought: Focus on Jesus, not impersonal laws.

A GOOD MAN—JESUS

"And there was much murmuring among the people concerning him: for some said, He is a good man: others said, Nay; but he deceiveth the people" (John 7:12).

As the Feast of Tabernacles approached, *Jesus* was the main topic of discussion. The people wondered if *Jesus* would come to the feast because there were rumors the Jewish leaders would arrest Him. *Jesus* had broken their Sabbath laws and He claimed to be God. Some said *Jesus* was a *Good Man*, others didn't think so. Some said *Jesus* was a Prophet (John 7:40); others knew He did miracles. Some thought *Jesus* was in fact their Messiah (John 7:41). During the life of *Jesus*, as in the world today, "There was a division among the people because of Him" (John 7:43). Liberals say the Bible is not authoritative, so *Jesus* is only a mere man. Some historians say *Jesus* was only a good man, so they won't be saved by Him. The problem is *Jesus* is the Lord God who demands our loyalty and total love.

"Lord Jesus, I recognize You are the Son of God, the Second Person of the Trinity. I bow to worship You as my Savior."

To say *Jesus* is a *Good Man* is only a first step, but not enough to save you. It doesn't take much to acknowledge *Jesus* is good, but it demands your total response to acknowledge *Jesus* is Lord. What must you do? "For if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9, *NLT*).

"Jesus, I confess that You are much more than a Good Man; You are the Lord of the universe; You are my Lord. Amen."

Reading: John 7:1-13

Words: 242

Key Thought: It's not enough to recognize Jesus as a good man; He must be your Lord.

THE CONSOLATION OF ISRAEL—JESUS

"And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon, and this man was just and devout, waiting for the Consolation of Israel, and the Holy

Spirit was upon him" (Luke 2:25).

Jesus was The Consolation of Israel. The word "consolation" means comfort; Israel was waiting

for God to send the Messiah to deliver them from oppression and suffering. They wanted the

Messiah to give them comfort. Many Jews in Jesus' day were looking for political deliverance

from Rome. They were oppressed financially, socially, and to some degree, spiritually. To those

Jews, the Messiah would free them from military bondage; then they would be comforted. Since

much of life is "expectation and perception," because the Jews expected the wrong kind of

deliverance, they wrongly perceived whom *Jesus* was and what He came to do.

"Lord Jesus, give me eyes to see You clearly, and give me a clear mind to understand

You properly, and give me a willing heart to follow You gladly."

Jesus did come the first time to sit on a military throne in Jerusalem. He came to sit on the

throne of the heart of his followers. His consolation is not outward, but inward. Jesus came to

rule people's thoughts, and dreams, and courage. When Jesus rules people's hearts, He conquers

people from within. He is the inner Consolation of Israel or the comforter of hearts. When He

comes a second time, *Jesus* will conquer outwardly and rule from Jerusalem.

Lord Jesus, come rule my heart. You are the fulfillment of my dreams; You are my

comfort from oppression and suffering. Amen."

Reading: Isa. 40:1-31

Words: 233

Key Thought: Jesus offers inner comfort to us.

THE DELIVERANCE OF ZION—JESUS

"And it shall come to pass that whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved. For in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there shall be deliverance, as the

LORD has said, among the remnant whom the LORD calls" (Joel 2:32).

The phrase Deliverance of Zion is a reference to Jesus with a twofold application. First, it is a

reference to the future physical deliverance of the nation Israel. Armies shall come against Israel

to destroy her, but when Israel calls upon the LORD Jesus, He will come to deliver the nation.

Even though it's only a remnant that calls on the Lord, He will be the *Deliverance of Zion*. If the

Lord has promised to deliver His people in the future, don't you think He can come to deliver

you in your present troubles?

"Lord, I know You are my Deliverer. I call on You today to help me in my difficulties."

The second application is to those who call upon the Lord today. On the Day of Pentecost, Peter

quoted this reference – Acts 2:17-21 – and applied it to those who were listening to him that day.

Your task is to call; the Lord's task is to deliver. Your call must be sincere; are you a seeking

believer? Your call must be toward the Lord, not to a church, religion, or any other cause. Have

you called to the Lord? When you call, it must be outward, because the Lord wants our outward

response. You don't have to shout; He can hear you if you whisper. The key is doing it, not

thinking about it or planning to do it in the future. Call to Him now.

"I call out Lord. I have thought about it, but now I do it. I need You, Lord; come deliver

me. Amen."

Reading: Joel 2:28-32

Words: 259

Key Thought: The Lord delivers those who call on Him.

THE ANCIENT OF DAYS—FATHER

"I was watching in the night visions, and behold, One like the Son of Man, coming with the clouds of heaven! He came to the Ancient of Days" (Daniel

7:13).

The Lord is called *The Ancient of Days*. He is eternal; He knows everything that is knowable.

Nothing has happened in the past that escaped His knowledge; so He knows everything you have

done in the past, and what you will do today. He knows what is best for you. Will you come to

Him for direction this day?

"Lord, You have all knowledge; I come seeking Your answers to the problems I face

today. I need Your direction."

The Lord is called *The Ancient of Days*, because He has always existed. He has great wisdom.

He knows that you are trying to connect all the pieces of your life. But remember, the only

"perfect" life is the one lived according to His will. The Lord is called *The Ancient of Days*. To

Him yesterday is like tomorrow. Because He is God, He knows all things potential, and "calleth

those things which be not as though they were" (Rom. 4:1, KJV). He knows what will happen to

you if you do evil, and He knows what will happen if you do right. He has a perfect plan for

you. Let Him guide you this day to do the right thing in the right way.

"Lord, I accept Your will as the best plan for my life. I will do the right things no matter

what consequences I suffer for doing right. I will do right; because it is your perfect plan

for my life. I will put You first in all things. Amen."

Reading: Daniel 7:1-27

Words: 253

Key Thought: Because God knows everything; He has a perfect plan for your life.

CLOUD—JESUS

"... what happened to our ancestors in the wilderness long ago. God guided all of them by sending a cloud that moved along ahead of them, and he brought them all safely through the waters of the sea" (1 Corinthians 10:1, *NLT*).

Jesus is a picture of the Cloud that led Israel through the wilderness. He knew what He was doing when Israel followed Him to a dead-end at the Red Sea. There were mountains on both sides, and Pharaoh's army was chasing them from behind. There was no way across the sea. Why did Jesus put them in such a dangerous position? So His people would look to Him. Have you ever been at a dead-end? Perhaps Jesus led you there to teach you the greatest lessons in life. You're never at a dead-end by yourself. Don't fear, for He is behind you, keeping the enemy away. Don't panic, He has a solution; you can leave a dead-end as a victor.

"Lord, too often I am problem focused, not victory focused. Teach me to look beyond my dead-end situations to see You at work in my life."

When you get to a dead-end, do what Israel did. First, wait on the Lord. Perhaps He's stopped your progress so you can learn about your finiteness and His almighty power. Just as Israel didn't expect the Lord to roll back the sea, maybe you don't know yet how He'll solve your problems. Just as Moses lifted his rod for Israel to go forward, so *Jesus* wants you to walk forward through your obstacles. If *Jesus* doesn't test your faith, you'll not trust His guidance.

"Lord, thank You for the dead-ends of my life that make me look to You. Today, I look to You and call on Your power to see me through my obstacles. It's good to get going again. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 14:18-21

Words: 269

Key Thought: Look for God's purpose when you come to a dead end.

THE COMMANDER OF THE HOSTS OF THE LORD—JESUS

"So He (Jesus) said, 'No, but as Commander of the army of the LORD I have now come.' And Joshua fell on his face to the earth and worshiped, and said to Him, 'What does my Lord say to His servant?' Then the Commander of the LORD's army said to Joshua, 'Take your sandal off your foot, for the place where you stand is holy.' And Joshua did so' (Joshua 5:14-15).

Jesus is The Commander of the Hosts of the Lord. When Joshua was surveying the apparently impregnable Jericho before attacking the city, the Lord appeared to Joshua. Originally, Joshua thought the Lord was a soldier, so he asked, "Are You for us or for our adversaries?" (Josh. 5:13). The Lord was not on either side. The Lord simply answered He was The Commander of the Hosts of the Lord. Joshua fell on his face, calling him, "my Lord" (Josh. 5:14). The answer to victory over Jericho was not getting the Lord on Joshua's side, but Joshua getting on the Lord's side. When Joshua submitted to the Lord, he was given a divine strategy to win the battle (Josh. 6:2-5).

"Lord, too often I beg You for help in my plans. Teach me to submit my plans to You. I want to be on Your side."

When the Lord appeared to Joshua, it was a Christophany, an appearance of Christ in the Old Testament. Because the *Commander* was called "Lord," victory comes when you yield to His plans. Because the *Commander* is over the angelic host, victory comes when you get heavenly power on your side. Because the *Commander* told Joshua to take off his shoes because he was on holy ground, you must worship to get victory.

"Lord, I realize I'm in a spiritual battle. I want to join Your army; show me what to do. I want spiritual victory. Send angelic hosts to help me. I want fellowship with You, so I worship You. Amen."

Reading: Joshua 5:13-21

Words: 256

Key Thoughts: Since Jesus is our Commander in battle, we must join His army.

THE FULLNESS OF GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"... to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled

with all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:19).

The Holy Spirit is The Fullness of God. He is sent into your life by the Father and Son to fill you

with all the things you need to live for God. The Holy Spirit will fill you with spiritual power to

withstand temptation, and fill you with wisdom so you can live godly. He will fill you with

spiritual understanding to interpret things in your life, and He will fill you with spiritual

knowledge so you will know what to do. What part of your life is empty? Let the Holy Spirit fill

you with *The Fullness of God*.

"Holy Spirit, I want to be more spiritual; fill me with Your Spirit. I want to be more

holy; fill me with Your holiness."

The Holy Spirit is The Fullness of God; when you have Him in your life, you are filled with the

Godhead. You have Christ dwelling in your heart to ground your life in divine purpose (Eph.

3:17). You have the Father to strengthen you (Eph. 3:14-16). You have the Holy Spirit to help

you comprehend the breadth, length, depth, and height of the love of God (Eph. 3:18). Call on

the Trinity today, they will fill your life with The Fullness of God.

"Holy Spirit, I have a lot to do today; I need Your enablement. I am not as godly as I

want to be; make me holy. Fill me up, I am empty and need Your presence. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 3:14-21

Words: 244

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit can fill your life with meaning.

I AM—JESUS

"Now when He said to them, 'I am He,' they drew back and fell to the ground" (John 18:6).

Jesus is the *I AM*, the eternal all powerful LORD. Moses asked the Lord what was His name. The Lord answered, "*I AM WHO I AM*... Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, *I AM* has sent me to you" (Ex. 3:14, KJV). The name LORD comes from the Hebrew verb "to be," first person, repeated twice. When you say LORD, you are pronouncing twice, *I AM I AM*. God exists in Himself and by Himself.

"Lord Jesus, You are the great I AM, You are without beginning, and without end . . . You exist by Yourself and of Yourself. YOU ARE THE LORD."

Jesus used metaphors to tell people what He was like. Jesus said I am Bread . . . Light . . . Door . . . Good Shepherd . . . Resurrection . . . True Vine . . . etc. But Jesus was saying more than comparing Himself to bread that satisfied or a way to Heaven, etc. Jesus was telling His listeners He was the LORD of the Old Testament. When the soldiers came to arrest Jesus, they asked, "Are you Jesus of Nazareth?" Jesus pulled aside His humanity and His glorious deity came bursting out. The soldiers fell backward to the ground in response. How will you respond to His awesome glory?

"Lord Jesus, I bow myself to the ground. You are the Lord God of glory. I worship You the great I AM. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 3:1-15

Words: 248

Key Thought: Jesus is the great I AM of the Old Testament.

IMMANUEL (GOD WITH US)—JESUS

"They shall call His name Immanuel, which is translated, 'God with us'"

(Matthew 1:23).

The angel told Joseph to name Him *Immanuel*, which means "God with us." When *Jesus* was

born, God visited humanity. He came to live with people and die for the sins of the people.

Jesus was God even though many did not recognize Him. Today, Jesus is still Immanuel even

when people don't feel His presence. Because Jesus is with us, you can get Him to help you face

your problems. He's with you, even when you don't realize He's near. However, you must call

on *Immanuel* to get His help. He is *Immanuel*, which means He'll be there when you need Him.

"Immanuel, there are many times I can't feel Your presence. I want to feel Your

nearness. I pray about my problems, but they're still here. I know You're by me.

Manifest Yourself; help me make it through my day."

Because He's Immanuel, you can win when you let Him direct your efforts. First, He will give

you hope when you feel like giving up. Then He will give you a courageous spirit to carry you

through the rough spots. Next, He will show you what to do and guide your steps. Finally, He'll

give you tenacity to press on to victory. Immanuel is with you, but you must call on Him to get

help.

"Immanuel, I know You are with me. Help me feel Your guiding presence this day.

Release Your indwelling power to do everything I'm supposed to do. I claim Your

presence for victory today. Amen."

Reading: Matt. 8:1-18

Words: 251

Key Thought: Jesus will be with you everywhere because he is God.

LEADER—TRINITY

"The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters . . . He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the

shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me" (Psalm 23:1-4).

The Lord is your Shepherd; He will lead you. Sometimes the Lord will lead you to still waters;

at other times he will lead you through right paths. Because He is God, He knows the best path

for you today. He knows the problems you will face today so follow Him closely. He knows

what troubles await you and may even lead you into some troubles to strengthen your faith. Just

as the Father didn't deliver Jesus out of suffering, so He may not take away your pain. But

remember, when He leads you through the valley of the shadow of death, He will be with you.

"Lord, I know You lead me, and I know suffering is inevitable in this life, but I don't like

pain. Help me accept pain and learn from it."

Follow the Lord closely today. He knows when to start walking and He knows when you should

stop. If you start walking when He says, "Stop," you may get into deeper trouble. If you obey

the Lord, He will give you peace in the shadows of your dark valley; stay close to Him and obey

Him. When the Lord says, "Stop" He may be keeping you from going deeper into more severe

trouble. But no matter what happens, He'll be with you.

"Lord, I'll walk when You tell me to "go," and I'll wait for You when You say, "stop."

I'll do what You tell me to do, because I want to be what You want me to be. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 103:1-14

Words: 255

Key Thought: Follow closely the Father's lead.

JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD—JESUS

"I thank God—through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, with the mind I myself

serve the law of God, but with the flesh the law of sin" (Romans 7:25).

His name was Jesus. That's the name given to Him by Mary and Joseph. Throughout the

gospels, He is called Jesus. His office is Christ, much like a man has the office of "minister" or

a woman has the office of "teacher." The office Christ in the Greek language is the word

Messiah in Hebrew, which comes from the root "to anoint." When you say Jesus Christ, you are

saying Jesus The Anointed One. People were inaugurated into office in the Old Testament by

anointing; they had oil poured over them, a symbol of riches, prosperity and the Holy Spirit.

"Jesus, I come to You through your earthly name. I thank You for coming to Earth for

me. Christ, I come to You through Your office; You are the One who died for me."

His title is Lord. Just as the executive leader of the United States has the title President, Jesus

has the eternal title Lord. With His title Lord goes ownership and control. Does Jesus have

control over your life? Also, this title gives Him authority to direct people under Him and punish

those who disobey His laws. Have you let Jesus direct your life? He is Jesus Christ our Lord,

but is He your personal Savior and Master?

Thank You, Jesus, for coming into my life to save me. Now I give you control of my life; I

make You my Master. Jesus Christ, You are my Lord. Amen."

Reading: Romans 10:1-17

Words: 242

Key Thought: Jesus wants to be your Lord and Savior.

JESUS OF GALILEE—JESUS

"Now Peter sat outside in the courtyard. And a servant girl came to him, saying,

'You also were with Jesus of Galilee'" (Matthew 26:69).

Jesus of Galilee was both His name and address, i.e., the area from which He came. The angel

told Mary to name Him Jesus. His name Yehosha (Hebrew) is a derivative of Joshua, and means

"Jehovah saves". Jesus, who came to save sinners, is from Galilee, so He was called Jesus of

Galilee. The Old Testament predicted the Messiah would come from Galilee "by the way of the

sea, beyond the Jordan, in Galilee of the Gentiles" (Isa. 9:1). Did you see that Jesus' home area

was called "Galilee of the Gentiles?" He was a Jew from the place where many Gentiles lived

because He is the Savior of all, both Jews and Gentiles.

"Jesus, I know You came to Your people, but You died for all. I thank You for dying for

me. "

The people of Jerusalem during Jesus' day were prejudice against anyone from any other place.

The servant girl sarcastically referred to Him as Jesus of Galilee. Once before, some had

questioned if their Messiah could come out of Galilee (John 7:41). Another even claimed, "No

prophet has arisen out of Galilee" (John 7:52). Yet, God has sovereignly arranged that His Son

would be born in Bethlehem, according to the prediction of Micah 5:2, the town of privilege.

Jesus grew up in the city of Nazareth in Galilee, fulfilling the prophecy, "He shall be called a

Nazarene" (Matt. 2:23).

"Jesus I know Your earthly home was in Galilee, but now I want You to make Your home

in my heart. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 2:13-23

Words: 254

Key Thought: God prepared a specific location for Jesus' birth and home.

THE FATHER—FATHER

"Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God! Therefore the world does not know us, because it did not

know Him" (1 John 3:1).

The Father in Heaven is likened to an earthly father who loves his children before they are born.

Your heavenly Father loved you long before you loved Him; He loved you before you were

born. Just as an earthly father fellowships with his children, so your heavenly Father offers you

His fellowship. Just as earthly children have access to their fathers, so you access Him through

Jesus Christ. Just as earthly fathers guide their children in life's accomplishments, your heavenly

Father wants to guide you today. And just as earthly fathers want their children to be like them,

so your heavenly *Father* wants to conform you into His image.

"Thank You, Father, for loving me. Help me learn about You, and become conformed to

Your image. Help me know Your will and walk according to it."

Your heavenly *Father* sometimes pushes you to walk, just as earthy fathers want their children to

walk. Sometimes your heavenly Father wants you to run fast when you are still growing. Why

does He seemingly put more on you than you can bear? So you'll grow stronger and accomplish

more. But learning is sometimes hard and discouraging. Sometimes we want to give up, but our

earthly father encourages us—just as our heavenly Father—so we'll grow stronger and

accomplish much with our life. Maybe the heavenly Father is allowing difficulties in your life

so you'll do more for Him.

"Father, thank You for difficulties that make me stronger. Thank You for your unending

encouragement. Help me reach the goals you set for me. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 2:1-6

Words: 261

Key Thought: The Father encourages us to grow beyond our comfort level.

JESUS OF NAZARETH—JESUS

"Philip found Nathanael and said to him, 'We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote--Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph" (John 1:45).

When you say *Jesus of Nazareth*, you are repeating His name and home address. *Jesus* came as a baby, so He had to be born somewhere—it was Bethlehem. *Jesus* was a child, so he had to grow up somewhere—it was Nazareth. He didn't grow up in Jerusalem near the Temple, even though *Jesus* called the Temple, "My Father's house" (John 2:16). The corrupt priest, who eventually bribed Judas to betray *Jesus*, might have tried to corrupt the boy *Jesus* if He grew up there. *Jesus* grew up in a small, out-of-the-way town in Galilee. His main influences were His father, mother, and the people of Nazareth. The word *Nazareth* comes from the Hebrew root *Noz-ar*, meaning, "separated." *Jesus* was separated from outside influences in this small town, as the town people separated themselves from others. Gentiles were living in the region because it was known as "Galilee of the Gentiles" (Isa. 9:1). Nazareth was a perfect place for a Jewish boy to grow up, yet have a heart for all people and become "the Savior of the world" (John 4:42).

"Lord, I praise You for perfectly guiding the childhood of Jesus so He could become my Savior."

Just as *Jesus* had a perfect childhood, commit yourself to give your children or grandchildren the best possible conditions for them to grow in nurture and admonition of the Lord (Eph. 6:1-4).

"Jesus, I know You love the children of the world. Help me to fulfill Your passion by loving all children, and teaching them Your truth, and leading them to salvation. Amen."

Reading: Deuteronomy 6:1-15

Words: 262

Key Thought: The boyhood of Jesus prepared Him to be your Savior.

THE KING OF PEACE—JESUS

"To whom also Abraham gave a tenth part of all, first being translated 'king of righteousness,' and then also king of Salem, meaning 'king of peace' (Hebrews

7:2).

Jesus is The King of Peace; no one can have peace apart from Him because He is the original

source of peace. While on earth, Jesus could calm tremendous storms, for He had power over

nature's violence. Jesus also calmed the disruptive demoniac of Gadera because He had power

over human nature. Jesus can give you peace when you're in the eye of a circumstantial

hurricane. He can give you self-control and an inner calm, when you receive His peace. When

you let Him sit on the throne of your heart, *The King of Peace* works all things together for good.

What do you need today?

"Jesus, I look to You for inner peace. While I may not be responsible for all the troubles

in my life, I am at least responsible for my reaction to them. Lord, help me react

properly way, the way You want me to react."

Satan is the author of confusion, strife, and violence, but Jesus brings peace and He rules by

peace. When you're anxious and upset, you're not in the center of His will. But when Jesus

controls your life, you'll experience self-control and you can enter the center of His will. Will

you invite *King Jesus* to sit on the throne of your heart today?

"Jesus, teach me to look at trouble through Your eyes. Show me how to react when

things around me are coming apart. I invite You to control my life and bring peace to my

heart. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 62:1-12

Words: 249

Key Thought: You'll get peace and self-control when Jesus controls your life.

THE GIFT OF GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water" (John

4:10).

The Holy Spirit is The Gift of God. He is the One who gave eternal life to you at salvation. He

is called *The Gift* because salvation is a gift (Eph. 2:8, 9). You cannot work for anything that He

gives; you must receive the gift freely from Him. When you let the Holy Spirit control your life,

you have peace . . . wisdom . . . understanding . . . courage . . . and a sound mind.

"Holy Spirit, I receive You into my life. I take the gifts You offer to me. Come into my

life to empower the gifts You've given me. Show me how to use the abilities I have."

The Holy Spirit is called The Gift of God because He will give you spiritual gifts or abilities for

your Christian service. He gives the spiritual gifts of evangelism, teaching, exhorting, managing,

serving, and mercy showing. The Holy Spirit gives you the enabling talents of faith and wisdom

for you to be effective. Every good gift comes from the Father (James 1:17), and is delivered to

believers by the *Holy Spirit*. Do you know what your dominant spiritual gift is? Do you know

how to use it? Ask the *Holy Spirit* to reveal your spiritual gifts to you, then ask Him to help you

use them in ministry.

"Holy Spirit, I ask for You to show me my spiritual gifts. Show me how to use them

properly. Give me power to use them. Amen."

Reading: Romans 12:1-8; Ephesians 4:7-16

Words: 250

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is The Gift of God to us.

A NAME FOR SALVATION—JESUS

"... that believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:31).

The angel commanded, "Call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins" (Matt.

1:21). The name Jesus was pronounced Yeshua, which meant "Jehovah Saves." In the Hebrews

language, His name was Joshua; Jesus was named after the general who conquered the Promised

Land for Israel. Many Jews were looking for their Messiah to be a soldier—general who would

drive the Romans out of their land. Jesus came to give personal redemption, not political

victory. He offered Himself as their Savior from sin, not deliverance from military tyranny.

Salvation was not in military triumph, salvation was inward, "You must be born again" (John

3:3).

"Just as the fishermen left their nets to follow You, I surrender all to You—Jesus. Just as

you said to "take up your cross daily," I repent today of my sins.

The name, Jesus, saves, "There is no other name under heaven given among men by which we

must be saved" (Acts 4:12). You are saved "Through faith in His name" (Acts 3:16). But

salvation's not merely repeating His name, outwardly. No! His name stands for the person of

Jesus, who came from God. His name stands for His death to forgive sins. His name stands for

His triumphant resurrections to give you new life. His name saves you because, "As many as

receive Him . . . became the children of God . . . who believe in His name" (John 1:12).

"Lord Jesus, I believe in Your name. I now ask You into my heart. Thank You for

salvation. Amen."

Reading: Matt. 12:15-21

Words: 261

Key Thought: The name of Jesus represents His divine person and His saving death.

THE HOLY ONE AND JUST—JESUS

"But you denied the Holy One and the Just, and asked for a murderer to be

granted to you" (Acts 3:14).

The Jewish leaders rejected Jesus, The Holy One and Just. They accused Jesus of being a

blasphemer of God and a traitor to His nation. They called Him a liar, a winebibber, a hypocrite,

and said He did miracles by the power of Satan. But Jesus is The Holy One, the Second Person

of the Trinity, the Son of God. Jesus was pure and separated from sin. He could do no sin for

He was God. When you sing three times, "Holy, holy," you correctly repeat the word

"Holy" for each member of the Godhead. Jesus is The Holy One, just as the Father and Spirit are

holy. Will you worship His holiness?

"Lord Jesus, I testify You are holy. You are holy in Your nature, Your works, and Your

dealings with all mankind."

Jesus is The Just One; He never did anything unjustly. He did not treat the Jews unjustly, even

though they lied about Him. He did not treat His Roman executers unjustly, even though they

nailed Him to a cross. Just as He treated everyone justly in His earthly life, so He will treat you

justly in all areas of your life. You can trust Him. Because His nature is just, Jesus will always

do the right thing.

"Lord Jesus, I have trusted You for eternal life. Now I trust You to guide and help me

live this day. Help me to be holy as You are holy. Help me treat all people justly as You

treat them. Amen."

Reading: Acts 3:1-16

Words: 253

Key Thought: Because Jesus is holy and just, He will always treat you fairly.

MY HELPER—TRINITY

"So we may boldly say: 'The LORD is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?" (Hebrews 13:6) "Hear, O LORD, and have mercy on me; LORD, be

my helper!" (Psalm 30:10).

The Lord is your *Helper*; He is the One who comes alongside to assist you do what you can't do.

In other cases the Lord assist you in doing what you should do, but you don't want to do. All

three persons of the *Trinity* are your *Helpers*: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. First, the Father is

your Helper. Psalm 30:8 describes, "I cried out to You, O Lord." The Lord did not ignore the

cry, nor did the Lord leave that person unfulfilled when he cried, "Lord, be my helper" (Ps.

30:10). Second, Jesus is your *Helper* in danger or trouble, He "will never leave you nor forsake

you" (Heb. 13:5). Since the Father and Son will help us, we should not fear what our enemies

can do.

"Lord, You are my Helper; I can't make it without You. Because You help me through

trouble and frustration, I will trust You."

Jesus promised us the Holy Spirit to help us (John 14:16, 25). He helps us find salvation,

regenerates us with the new birth, indwells us with His presence, baptizes us into the body of

Christ, seals us until the rapture, and guarantees our eternal life. The Holy Spirit will convict us

of sin, teach us what we need to know, guide us, give us gifts for service, and fill us with power

in our ministry.

"Lord, thank You for sending the Holy Spirit to help me find salvation. Thank You for

the Holy Spirit who helps me in Christian service and uses me in ministry. Amen."

Reading: Ps. 30:1-12

Words: 258

Key Thought: The three members of the Trinity each have a role in helping my Christian life.

HE WHO HAS THE BRIDE—JESUS

"He who has the bride is the bridegroom; but the friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly because of the bridegroom's voice" (John

3:29).

The bride is the church – born again believers – who have been saved. *Jesus* is the bridegroom;

it is He Who Has The Bride. In our society the man usually courts the woman, just as Jesus is

the One who seeks the lost. In our society, the man usually asks the marriage question, just as

Jesus calls us to salvation. In our society, the man usually pays the price for the engagement

ring, just as Jesus is the One who paid the ultimate price for our redemption. The man usually

takes the initiative, "just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her" (Eph. 5:25).

Because Jesus has done everything, it is He who has the Bride.

"Jesus, when I hang on to You, it's good to know that You are hanging on to me. I know

I belong to You."

Because the groom takes the initiative, the bride usually says "yes." Have you said "yes" to

Jesus? Because the groom first loves the bride, she usually follows his leadership. Have you

followed *Jesus*? Because the groom protects his bride and seeks her welfare, the bride will go

live with him. Have you let the Lord Jesus care and protect you? "For no one ever hated his

own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church. For we are members

of His body" (Eph. 5:29, 30).

"Jesus, I look to You for all my needs. I will obey You, love You, and live for You.

Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 5:22-33

Words: 252

Key Thought: Jesus is the Bridegroom who looks out for us, as well our needs.

ROCK OF SPIRITUAL REFRESHMENT—JESUS

"And by a miracle, God sent them food to eat and water to drink there in the desert; they drank the water that Christ gave them. He was there with them as a mighty

Rock of spiritual refreshment (1 Corinthians 10:4, LB).

The Lord was in the Shekinah cloud that led Israel to Meribah (Exod. 17:1-16), and when they

arrived, the oasis was dry. The Lord knew there was no water even before He led them to a dry

hole. He was not punishing them or frustrating them. He wanted Israel to do more than drink

physical water; He wanted them to drink spiritually from Himself. The dry hole of Meribah

revealed Israel's spiritually famished condition. Sometimes, He may lead you to a dry hole to

help you see your spiritual emptiness, and then the Lord wants you to call on Him. Perhaps

you'll be willing to drink of Him when He gives you water. Will you drink from the Rock

today?

"Lord, now I know why there are dry holes in my life. Help me look beyond my troubles

to see You in my life. I'm thirsty and need water. Quench my spiritual thirst."

Just as Israel had to repent and cry out for water, so you must turn to Jesus when you're

spiritually thirsty. Just as Moses had to strike the rock in faith, so you must come to Jesus

through Calvary, for it was there He was smitten for you. Just as the Lord wanted to help Israel

more than they sought Him, so He wants to give you a fresh drink of water today. When you

drink from Christ, He'll satisfy the longings of your heart.

"Lord, the dry holes in my life make me thirsty for nourishment and satisfaction. Ah,

Your water is good. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 17:1-16

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus allows me to get thirsty so I'll drink of Him.

OUR SPIRITUAL FATHER—FATHER

"Our earthly fathers correct us, and we still respect them. Isn't it even better to be

given true life by letting our spiritual Father correct us?" (Hebrews 12:9, CEV).

The Lord is called *Our Spiritual Father*. All spirits in the universe are subject to Him. Also, all

people have a spirit and they too are subject to the Father. Just as an earthly father loves and

directs his children, so Our Spiritual Father loves and directs His children on earth (Gen. 50:20;

Ps. 119:71; Rom. 8:28). Will you let Him teach you today? An earthly father provides

protection and provision for his children, just as the heavenly Father cares for you. Our Spiritual

Father wants to demonstrate His protection and care of you. Will you accept it today?

"O Spiritual Father, I come to fellowship with You this day. I recognize Your authority

over my life. I want to please You, serve You, and worship You."

Because He is Our Spiritual Father, He has the right to correct you. People reverence their

physical fathers who corrected them; will you not reverence the Lord when trials come?

Relationship is the key bond between a father and his child. It is a relationship of love. Because

a father loves his children, he corrects them to bring out the best in them. Sometimes a

momentary correction in the long run is for the child's good. Your heavenly Father corrects you

because He loves you.

"You are my Father; I submit to Your correction. I accept Your plan in my life. Help me

learn from my affliction and become godlier. Amen."

Reading: Matt. 7:25-29

Words: 238

Key Thought: Our Spiritual Father wants a relationship with you.

GOOD MASTER—JESUS

"Now behold, one came and said to Him, 'Good Master, what good thing shall I

do, that I may have eternal life?" (Matthew 19:16, KJV)

The rich young ruler went to Jesus asking, "Good Master, what good thing shall I do, that I may

have eternal life?" (Matt. 19:16, KJV) He wanted to go to Heaven, and thought he had to do

something to get there. He called Jesus GOOD MASTER, but Jesus turned away his

acknowledgement, "Why do you call Me good?" (Matt. 19:17) Jesus didn't deny He was Good,

for He was God who is Good. Jesus uses this question to impress upon the young man the

seriousness of his request. To paraphrase Jesus' meaning, "Are you sure you know what good

means?" What the young ruler didn't realize was that it took divine forgiveness to get to

Heaven. Jesus said to him, "If you want to enter . . ." (Matt. 19:17), which suggests he was still

on the outside of Heaven.

"Lord, You are Good, not because I said it, but because You are God."

Jesus told the young man to keep the commandments, which he claimed he had kept. So, Jesus

touched his besetting sin – money – when Jesus said, "Go, sell what you have . . . he went away

sorrowful" (Matt. 19:22). He didn't just have money; his money had him. He was guilty of

greed and financial lust. He had broken the 10th commandment, "You shall not covet . . ." (Ex.

20:17).

"Lord, I realize just being good is not enough, and calling You good will not get me to

Heaven. I call You my Savior; by grace, You have forgiven all my sin. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 19:16-26

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus must be more than a Good Master; He must be your Savior.

THE GOOD SHEPHERD—JESUS

"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep" (John

10:11).

Jesus called Himself The Good Shepherd because He does what good shepherds do; they give

their life for their sheep. They give up the pleasures of home to live outside in the pastures with

sheep, just as Jesus gave up the glories of Heaven to come to earth for His sheep. A good

shepherd gives up his freedom to watch sheep; Jesus gave up His eternal existence to take on the

limitations of human flesh. A good shepherd gives up his sleep to go searching for lost sheep;

Jesus came to earth searching for the lost (Luke 15:4-7). A good shepherd gives up his safety to

brave the storm or fight a predator; Jesus came to earth to be tempted, ridiculed, and persecuted.

A good shepherd will die protecting his sheep; Jesus gave His life on the cross for the world.

Jesus said, "Other sheep I have which are not of this fold; them also I must bring" (John 10:16).

"Jesus, You are the Good Shepherd who gave Your life for the world. You are my

Shepherd; I feel safe in Your presence."

Jesus is The Good Shepherd who asks you to become a shepherd for His sheep. He told Peter,

"Take care of my sheep" (John 21:16, NLT). Just as Jesus is your Shepherd, you must become a

shepherd to someone who needs your care. Peter wrote, "Care for the flock of God" (1 Pet. 5:2,

NLT).

"Lord Jesus, You are my Shepherd; thank You for caring for me. I will give shepherd

care to someone else. Amen."

Reading: 1 Peter 5:1-11

Key Thought: The Good Shepherd gives His life for you.

THE GLORY OF THE LORD—HOLY SPIRIT

"But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of

the Lord" (2 Corinthians 3:18).

The Holy Spirit is The Glory of the Lord. He brings honor and prestige to the Father and the

Son. When you look into the mirror to see God, you see the *Holy Spirit*. And the more you look

at His glory to learn about God, the more you are transformed to be more Godlike. When you

look at His Glory, you are elevated to a higher level of praising and exalting God. The Holy

Spirit is The Glory of the Lord that brings out your best worship. When you look into the mirror

of God, you will be elevated to a higher level of worship.

"Holy Spirit, when I see anew the Glory of the Lord, I begin worshipping. I want to see

more glory so I can have more intimacy in worship than ever before."

The Holy Spirit is The Glory of the Lord who wants to change your life so you will be more like

God. To be godlier, you must have a vision of what you want to be. Then you must aspire to

have it. When you see the Glory of the Holy Spirit, you will want to be more like God. So, look

to the Holy Spirit in Scripture, look to the Holy Spirit in prayer, and look to the Holy Spirit in

meditation.

"Holy Spirit, make me godly. I will study about You in Scripture to learn more how You

work in my life. When I see You in the mirror of Your glory, I stretch myself to be more

godly, and worship You. Amen."

Reading: 2 Corinthians 3:6-18

Words: 262

Key Thought: When you see the Holy Spirit, you will worship better.

THAT GREAT SHEPHERD OF THE SHEEP—JESUS

"Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant"

(Hebrews 13:20).

There are many roles for the Shepherd of the Sheep. Jesus is the Shepherd who takes care of us

(Ps. 23:1). All the sheep have to do is keep in good relationship with the *Shepherd* to receive His

care. Jesus is the good Shepherd who gives His life for the sheep (John 10:11). Just as a

shepherd sacrifices his family time and the comforts of home to be with his sheep, *Jesus* gave up

Heaven for us. Jesus is also The Good Shepherd who said, "I lay down my life" (John 10:17).

"Lord Jesus, You are my Shepherd who has died for my sins. You are my Shepherd who

leads me daily and takes care of me."

Jesus is also called the Great Shepherd because He safely delivers His sheep to Heaven. The

basis for the complete and final salvation of His sheep is first "the blood" that forgives the sheep,

and second, the resurrection of our "Lord Jesus for the dead" that gives eternal life to the sheep.

Because salvation is complete, the *Shepherd* can "make you complete in every good work to do

His will" (Heb. 13:21). That means you can complete the Father's will. How can that happen?

Because the *Great Shepherd* works "in you what is well pleasing in His (the Father) sight" (Heb.

13:21).

"Lord Jesus, I am complete in You. You have taken away all my sins, you have given me

eternal life, You have worked in my life to help me please the Father. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 13:1-24

Words: 252

Key Thought: The Great Shepherd is great because He delivers me to Heaven.

GREATER THAN JONAH—JESUS

"The men of Nineveh will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, because they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and indeed a greater

than Jonah is here" (Matthew 12:41).

Jonah was one of the greatest preachers because his preaching called the entire city of Nineveh to

repentance. Nineveh contained, "more than one hundred and twenty thousand persons" (Jonah

4:11). Jonah was also great because of the depth of their response. "So the people of Nineveh

believed God, proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least of them"

(Jonah 3:5). The king believed and published a command, "Let every one turn from his evil way

... Who can tell if God will turn ... so that we may not perish" (Jonah 3: 8, 9). Jonah began one

of the greatest revivals in the Old Testament, yet Jesus was a Greater preacher than Jonah

because the revival of Jesus broke out at Pentecost and influenced the world.

"Lord Jesus, I know You are a great preacher because of the influences of Your message

on others. But, Your greatest preaching changed my life."

At first, Jonah didn't want to preach to Gentiles, so he sailed the opposite way. That's where

God turned him around through a storm and great fish. Jonah instigated a great revival among

Gentiles – an act unthinkable to the Jews of his day. Jesus is like Jonah because Jesus' message

has reached beyond Jews to the Gentile world. But, Jesus is Greater than Jonah because He

loves the world and died for them.

"Lord Jesus, thank You that the Gospel was big enough for the Jews - God's chosen

people - and even for Gentiles, like me. Amen."

Reading: Jonah 1:1-17, 3:1-10

Words: 256

Key Thought: Jesus is Greater than Jonah because He died for Jews and Gentiles.

GOD OF MY PRAISE—TRINITY

"Don't stand by silently, O God of my praise, while wicked people slander me

and tell lies about me" (Ps. 109:1, Author's Translation).

David made it a habit to praise God all the time. David called THE Lord—The God of my

Praise—Elohim Tehilati—a title that came from his daily experience. But David couldn't

understand how God could let people criticize him and tell lies about him, especially since he

consistently praised God. Maybe that's your question. You wonder why some people criticize

you, especially when you have a good relationship with God. Even though you try to work hard

and do right, some people stab you in the back. Even though you put God first in your life, some

people seem to reject you.

"Lord, I try to serve You and I continually praise You, yet I have enemies. Why?"

The law of unintended consequences says your praise to God doesn't make people like you;

rather, they reject you because they reject God. Your goodness convicts them of their sins, and

in anger they turn against you. Whenever you praise God, they reject God for the same reasons

you serve Him. They don't want someone else—God—running their lives. They want to be the

center of their lives; they don't want to put God there. So, don't let their negative reactions ruin

your good positive life; praise God anyhow. He is your Lord and Savior; make Him continually

The God of Your Praise.

"Lord, I will praise You when those around me criticize You. I will also praise You when

those around me join in worship. I will not let anyone influence my worship of You.

Amen."

Reading: Psalms 109-1-31

Words: 258

Key Thought: Make Him the God of Your Praise, no matter the circumstances.

GREATER THAN OUR FATHER ABRAHAM—JESUS

"'Are You greater than our father Abraham, who is dead? And the prophets are dead. Who do You make Yourself out to be?' Then the Jews said to Him, 'You are not yet fifty years old, and have You seen Abraham?' Jesus said to them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM'" (John 8:53, 57-58).

Abraham was one of the greatest patriarchs in the Old Testament. He is the Father of Israel, for all Jews came from him. Abraham perhaps had the greatest faith in God of all Old Testament believers. He is known as the Friend of God (2 Chron. 20:7; James 2:23) and God called him, "my friend" (Is. 41:8). But *Jesus* was *Greater Than The Father Abraham* because *Jesus* was the great *I AM*; *Jesus* is God.

"Jesus, You are greater than the Old Testament fathers; You are greater than the angels, You are my Lord and Savior; You are the Lord God of the Universe."

The Jewish leaders rejected *Jesus* even though they witnessed His miracles. They refused to accept *Jesus*, even though He proved to them from Scriptures who He was (Matt. 21:23-22:46). The Jewish leaders called *Jesus* a sinner, accused Him of being born out of wedlock (John 8:41), attributed His miracles to Satan (Matt. 12:24), and said He had a devil (John 8:52). They sarcastically asked, "Are You greater than our father Abraham?" (John 8:53). *Jesus* replied, "Your father Abraham rejoiced to see My day" (John 8:56). They said, "You're not fifty years old, how could you see Abraham?" *Jesus* answered, "Before Abraham was, I AM" (John 8:58). To Jesus' response, they picked up stones to kill Him. What is your response? You must either pick up stones to cast at Him or fall at His feet to worship Him.

Jesus, I fall at Your feet to worship You. You are the great I AM, the eternal God of the ages. Amen."

Reading: John 8:37-59

Words: 264

Key Thought: Because Jesus is greater than Abraham, you must worship Him as the great I AM.

GREATER THAN OUR FATHER JACOB—JESUS

"Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it

himself, as well as his sons and his livestock?" (John 4:12).

The woman at the well asked Jesus, "Are You Greater than our Father Jacob?" She was being

sarcastic, assuming in her mind that Jesus was not greater. Little did she know at the time that

the answer to her question was, "Yes!" Even though Jesus came from the line of Jacob (Matt.

1:2), He was much greater because He was the Son of God. The woman learned that Jesus was

the "I Am" (John 4:26), and that He indeed is, "the Christ, the Savior of the world" (John 4:42).

What are your questions about *Jesus*?

"Jesus, I believe You lived a perfect life and died a cruel death as a substitute for my sin.

Jesus, I believe You are the Son of God, but most importantly, I believe You are my

personal Savior."

The woman at the well didn't understand the "living water" that Jesus offered to her. At first she

tried to tell Jesus that He didn't have a rope or bucket. When Jesus offered her water so that she

would "never thirst" (John 4:14), she again was wrong, thinking it was physical water (John

4:15). When she properly understood that Jesus was the Messiah, she ran to tell, "Come, see a

Man who told me all things that I ever did" (John 4:29). Have you met Jesus in a personal

experience, as did the woman at the well?

"Jesus, You have answered my questions, just as You answered the woman at the well. I

will go tell others about You, just as the woman at the well did. Amen."

Reading: John 4:12-29, 39-42

Words: 261

Key Thought: Because Jesus is Greater than our Father Jacob, He can meet our needs.

FATHER IN HEAVEN—FATHER

"Your Father knows the things you have need of before you ask Him. In this

manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven" (Matthew 6:8, 9).

Just as everyone on earth has a father, you also have a Father in Heaven. When you were born

again of the Spirit, you received your heavenly Father's nature. Let your new divine nature

control your life so you can live above the old life. Also, you received the heavenly Father's life

and now you have eternal life. Let your earthly life reflect your heavenly father's gift to you.

You were given a new standing in Heaven; the heavenly Father's infinite resources are at your

disposal. Since you are a child of the Father and a member of His family, you can call other

believers sister and brother, and receive their love as you love them.

"Father, I am humbled to be Your child. I come to You in prayer, just as a child comes

to an earthly father, asking for Your blessing on my life today."

You have a *Heavenly Father*; take time to fellowship with Him today. Enjoy your relationship

with the Father. Take time to learn what He can do for you, so you can walk in His will. Take

time to worship Him, remembering what Jesus said, "The Father seeks worship." When you

worship and magnify the Father in Heaven, He in turn will enrich your life and bless you

abundantly.

"O Father in Heaven, thank You for giving me entrance into Your family. I want to grow

in my relationship with You and become more like You. I will worship You today.

Amen."

Reading: Matthew 6:6-15

Words: 248

Key Thought: Take advantage of the things you get from the heavenly Father.

GREATER THAN SOLOMON—JESUS

"The queen of the South will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of

Solomon; and indeed a greater than Solomon is here" (Matthew 12:42).

Solomon was one of the wisest men to ever live; yet Jesus was Greater than Solomon, because

Jesus was the source of wisdom. Solomon was wise because He asked God for wisdom. At the

beginning of his reign, Solomon confessed, "I am a little child" (1 Kings 3:7). So Solomon

prayed, "Therefore give to Your servant an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). Like Solomon,

we can ask for wisdom; "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all . . .

and it will be given to him" (James 1:5). If you want to be wiser than you are, learn from Christ

in the Bible. The more you know of Him, the wiser you'll be.

"Jesus, I want to be wiser. I will master the Scriptures and will learn more about You.

Take away my spiritual blindness so I can see and learn."

Solomon wrote the book of Proverbs, Song of Solomon, Ecclesiastes, and some of the Psalms.

He had a reputation of being greater than the wise men of Egypt and of the East, and was an

expert in zoology and botany (1 Kings 4:32-39). His greatest achievement was building

Solomon's Temple, not because of its grandeur, but because God Himself came in a cloud to

dwell in the Temple (1 Kings 8:10). Solomon pointed us to Christ, who was greater than he was.

"Jesus, no one can be compared to You, for You are greater, wiser, and more glorious

than all humans, all angels, everything. Amen."

Reading: 1 Kings 3:5-28

Words: 254

Key Thought: We can get the wisdom of Solomon from Jesus.

HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD—JESUS

"Then the multitudes who went before and those who followed cried out, saying:

... 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!'" (Matthew 21:9).

On Palm Sunday *Jesus* rode victorious into Jerusalem on a donkey. The crowds spread palm

branches and their coats on the road. They cried out, "Hosanna," and called Jesus "Son of

David" which meant they recognized Jesus was heir to David's throne. The crowd recognized

Jesus as their Messiah-Deliverer. They wanted Jesus to proclaim Himself King of Israel, raise

an army and drive the Romans into the sea. They recognized Jesus as the One Who Comes In

The Name of the Lord. Palm Sunday had everything to do with rightful ownership. Jesus owned

the right to be their King. He had the royal rights to a kingdom on earth, but He would not

exercise His rights on Palm Sunday. Jesus would patiently wait until Good Friday to die for the

sins of the world. *Jesus* wanted to first rule them internally from within their hearts.

"Jesus, You are LORD; thank You for coming to established Your kingdom in my heart. I

yield to Your rule."

Jesus came peacefully the first time upon a donkey to establish His rule in the hearts of His

subjects. Jesus will come a second time in war, riding upon a white horse to conquer His

enemies. Then, He will come in the name of the Lord to establish His earthly kingdom. He will

institute social justice and set up world peace.

"Jesus, I look forward to Your coming to establish justice and peace in the world. Help

me live for You in this present world that has so little peace and justice. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 21:1-11

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus came the first time to rule the hearts of people.

HE—HOLY SPIRIT

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you"

(John 14:26).

The Holy Spirit is a person. He is not like smoke, fog, or a cloud, or any other false idea that

people have of Him. He is the Third Person of the Godhead. Use the pronoun He when you

pray to Him, because He is a person. The Holy Spirit is a person who has the ability to think

infinitely; therefore, He knows all about you. The Holy Spirit is a person who has the infinite

capacities of emotion; therefore, He feels deeply for you. The Holy Spirit is a person with the

divine power of will; therefore, He can choose to do wonderful things for you when you obey the

commands of Scripture. What would you like for the *Holy Spirit* to do for you today?

"Holy Spirit, I realize You know all about me, so forgive my shortcomings and errors. I

feel Your love for me; help me love You in return. I want You to strengthen my will to

live godly."

The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Trinity. He can be denied (2 Tim. 3:5), lied to (Acts

5:3), resisted (Gen. 6:3) and blasphemed (Matt. 12:31). Because He is a person, you can obey

Him (Heb. 3:7-11), desire Him (John 7:37, 38), and follow Him (Gal. 5:16, 25). Call on Him

today to help you glorify the Father.

"Holy Spirit, I need Your help today. Come show me how to live more godly. Come fill

me with power to overcome temptation. Enter my life to make me holy like You, and

make me spiritual like Your nature. Fill me today. Amen."

Reading: Galatians 5:16-28

Words: 267

Key Thought: I should pray to the Holy Spirit as a person.

HE THAT FILLS ALL IN ALL—JESUS

"Which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all" (Ephesians 1:23).

Jesus is the One Who Fills All in All. Think of all you want to do for God; you can do it if you

have faith to move mountains (1 Cor. 13:2). Think of all your dreams to pray . . . to worship . . .

to grow more godly; you can reach all your dreams if you pray properly . . . worship properly . . .

and learn properly. Jesus can help your dreams become a reality; He is the One who Fills All In

All. Think of all your heartaches . . . your failures . . . your disappointments; you must confess

them to Jesus. He can forgive your sins, make you forget your failures, and cover up your

mistakes. Will you let Jesus be All In All to you?

"Lord Jesus, I need You now more than ever. I'm human and I can't do it all; I can't be

all I want to be. Help me."

Jesus will be your All In All. In all problems, look to Him. In all relationships, look to Him. In

all endeavors, look to Him. In every area of your life, look to Him. When you focus completely

on Jesus, He changes your selfish dreams into spiritual dreams. When Jesus is the aim of living,

you get new goals and new desires. Then He Fills All In All.

"Lord Jesus, I need You to be present in all areas of my life. I need You to give me new

goals and new dreams. Be my All In All. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 1:15-23

Words: 261

Key Thought: Jesus gives you new goals and helps you reach them.

FULLER'S SOAP—JESUS

"But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap" (Malachi 3:2,

KJV).

Jesus is likened to Fuller's Soap, which was the best cleansing and whitening agent of its day.

Before dyeing, Fuller's Soap was used to completely clean woven cloth from oily or gummy

substances found on natural raw fiber. The cloth was soaked in water, then spread and sprinkled

with powdered ashes (alkali or lye), then wrung together and pounded so the soap would

penetrate every fiber. The cloth was rinsed continually in a running stream to wash away the

alkali or lye, then spread out to dry. Today's scripture is set in the Second Coming of Jesus

Christ when He judges His people. Jesus is compared to soap that will penetrate every fiber of

our being to determine the credibility of our faith.

"Lord Jesus, I know You are coming back to judge all people. I know You will judge

rightly and You will judge deeply. Cleanse me now so I will be ready for judgment in the

future."

Because Jesus will judge us like the process of Fuller's soap, make sure you are cleansed

through and through from sin. Only faith in Jesus will make us a Christian. Make sure you are

like those who appeared before God in Heaven, who have "washed their robes and made them

white in the blood of the Lamb" (Rev. 7:14). No one can gain perfection by their own works,

and no one can live without sin. But all can be perfectly clean by His blood.

"Lord Jesus, I know I have sinned and I am not perfect, but I have believed in You.

Cleanse me from every sin. Amen."

Reading: Malachi 3:1-6

Words: 267

Key Thought: Jesus will thoroughly examine you for sin.

THE JUDGE OF ALL THE EARTH—TRINITY

"Far be it from You (God) to do such a thing as this, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous should be as the wicked; far be it from You! Shall

not the Judge of all the earth do right?" (Genesis 18:25)

The Lord God is *The Judge of All the Earth*. Abraham asked, "Will the judge of all the earth do

right?" The answer is "yes." God will always do right, because He has a righteous nature. The

Lord has done everything possible for the salvation of all. The Father revealed their lost

condition to them through nature (Rom. 1:18-20), through the conscience (Rom. 2:14-16), and

through the existence of law (Rom. 2:1-3). Jesus died for their sins. The Holy Spirit spoke to

their hearts, drawing them to salvation (Gen. 6:3). The Lord God has done the right thing for

everyone to be saved.

"Yes Lord, I believe You are fair. Yes, Lord, I Believe You are the judge of all the earth

and everyone will appear before You. Yes, Lord, I know You will always do the right

thing."

The Lord God is *The Judge of All the Earth*. Jesus will judge all believers at the Judgment Seat

of Christ (Bema) to give His followers rewards (2 Cor. 5:10). The Father will judge all

unbelievers to find out if their names are written in the Lamb's Book of Life and will punish

them according to their works (Rev. 20:12-15). The Lord deals with all people fairly, but it's

grace we need; not judgment. The Lord can look on the death of Jesus and forgive us if we'll

repent and trust Christ.

"Lord, I fully trust You now and will trust You in the day of judgment. When You see my

sin, look at the blood of Jesus that forgives me. Look on me through grace. Amen."

Reading: Genesis 18:23-33

Key Thought: The judge of all the earth will always do the right thing.

ONLY POTENTATE—JESUS

"He will manifest in His own time, He who is the blessed and only Potentate, the

King of kings and Lord of lords," (1 Timothy 6:15).

There are different kinds of power that *Jesus* has as a leader. A judge has judicial power because

the entire police force backs up his decision. A policeman has physical power to wrestle a

suspect to the ground. A legislator has legal power to make laws to influence many. When

Jesus is called Potentate, it is describing Him as a soldier-King with omnipotent power to do

great feats. The title *Potentate* comes from *dunamai*, as in "the power of God to salvation"

(Rom 1:16). We got our word dynamite from the root for potentate.

Jesus is described as the Potentate, King of Kings, which means he is like a fighting king who

leads His army into battle. King Jesus is not like a weak old man who lets younger knights fight

for Him. He can wield a sword, as well as play out a winning strategy. As King of your life,

Jesus has a strategy to make you a winner; will you follow Him? As the mighty Potentate, Jesus

can give you a new "dynamic" to resist sin or win over addiction. Will you let Him do it? The

title Potentate is used to describe Jesus when He returns in power and glory. It is then He will

lead the armies of Heaven to defeat the armies of Satan.

"Lord Jesus, I know You have all authority, so I will follow Your commandments. I know

You have all mighty power, so I trust You to give me strength to overcome sin and live for

You. Amen."

Reading: 1 Timothy 6:1-15

Words: 256

Key Thought: You need the mighty power of Jesus to live for Him.

OUR PEACE—JESUS

"For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the

middle wall of separation" (Ephesians 2:14).

Most people think peace is the cessation of war, or peace is doing something enjoyable, such as

sitting by a lake or enjoying mountain scenery. These illustrations reflect only one kind of

idyllic peace, but the word peace means "to join two opposing forces." Jesus is Your Peace

because He joined you to the Father. When you were opposed to the Father in selfish rebellion,

Jesus joined you to Him. When the Father could not accept you because of your sin, Jesus was

Our Peace who turned the Father towards you, and you towards Him.

"Lord Jesus, You are my Peace. I've come to the Father through You. Now I need to

trust You to bring peace to my surroundings. Come give peace to my world."

Jesus is Your Peace who can give you an inner calm to deal with the pressures of this day.

When you let "the peace of God rule in your hearts" (Col. 3:15), you can adequately deal with

circumstances. Invite Jesus to come control your life; He knows your future and what will

happen. He can guide you, protect you, and give you victory in the future. When you let Jesus

control your life, He gives you inward peace; He calms your worries, and He gives you

meaningful direction.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for giving me peace with God so that I am saved. Also, thank

You for inner peace to control my thoughts and life. I yield to Your will for today.

Amen."

Reading: Philippians 4:1-8

Key Thought: Jesus gives you the peace of God.

GOD AND FATHER—FATHER

"We bless our God and Father . . . have been made in the similitude of God"

(James 3:9).

The Lord is both your God and Father. He's not just your God who is powerful and far off.

But, He is also your Father, who is close to help you. Just as Adam was created in the image

and likeness of the Lord, you are similar to your earthly father in physical nature,. You have the

image of both your physical father and heavenly Father through the miracle of procreation and

birth. But Adam marred the image of God through disobedience, and that image is marred in

you. Now you must take a journey back to God to become like God. Your journey is to become

godly like your heavenly Father.

"Father, I have a desire to be like You; help me conform myself into Your likeness."

The Lord is your *God and Father*; He created you with a rational mind to think. He put within

you the capacity for deep emotional feelings, just as He has love for that which is good and hate

for that which is evil. The Father gave you the power of will. Just as the Father has the ability

to choose, He allows you the opportunity to make choices in life. Your intellect, emotions and

will are the power of personality. You have the power of personhood, just as God. And what is

the purpose of that power? The Father created you with the ability to know Him, to love Him,

and to choose to worship Him. He is your God and Father; you belong to Him just as an earthly

child belongs to its human father.

"I worship You, my God and Father, for Your awesome creation power that formed me in

Your image. I want to be like You; I want to be godly. Amen."

Reading: James 3:1-12

Words: 294

Key Thought: You can become godly like God.

THE PRIEST OF THE MOST HIGH GOD—JESUS

"For this Melchizedek, king of Salem, priest of the Most High God, who met Abraham returning from the slaughter of the kings and blessed him" (Hebrews

7:1).

Melchizedek was The Priest of the Most High God, and because He was a type of Jesus,

Melchizedek was a foreshadow of His ministry. The title, *Most High God*, is El Elyon, "the God

who rules Heaven and Earth." When people don't know what to call the Father or how to

approach Him, at least they can come to Him as the Creator and Ruler of Heaven and earth.

Since no human can create the universe, all should recognize that there is only one Creator—

God. Melchizedek recognized the legitimate God who ruled the earth and prayed to Him.

Melchizedek's prayer was a prototype of Jesus' ministry; He intercedes to El Elyon because

Jesus is The Priest of the Most High God. Pray to the Father through Jesus today.

"Lord Jesus, I know You stand in Heaven before the Creator God. Remember me in Your

intercession. I'm only one small person out of six billion people on this planet; please

remember me."

Jesus is the priest for all, He is your Priest. He will not forget you. Just as Melchizedek

interceded for Abraham, so Jesus will intercede for you. Just as Melchizedek had bread and

wine to feed Abraham when he was exhausted and hungry, so Jesus will feed you on heavenly

things. Just as Melchizedek and Abraham fellowshipped together, so you can fellowship with

Jesus today.

"Lord Jesus, I look to You to intercede for me this day. Feed me spiritually and let me

fellowship with You today. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 7:1-3

Words: 250

Key Thought: Jesus is your Intercessor before the God of Heaven and earth.

PRINCE AND SAVIOR—JESUS

"Him God has exalted to His right hand to be Prince and Savior, to give

repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins" (Acts 5:31).

After being released from prison, Peter told the Jewish leaders that Jesus was the Prince of

Salvation and the Savior of Israel. Peter understood his audience—the Jewish leaders—who

were still looking for Messiah. They had rejected Jesus. So Peter called Jesus a Prince. A

prince is one scheduled to be king, but he is not yet ruling on the throne. That's a true picture of

Jesus, He is not yet ruling on the throne of Israel. When Jesus returns to earth in power and

glory, He will be called King of Kings, and He will rule on David's throne. When Jesus first

came to earth, He offered a kingdom of inward peace and inner righteousness. Jesus knew the

way to influence nations was to rule the hearts of individuals. Is Jesus your King?

"Jesus, You are my King and You rule my heart. I know one day You will rule the

outward affairs of all people."

Savior is the second title used by Peter to describe Jesus. By calling Jesus Savior, Peter was

pointing the Jewish leaders back to the accomplishments of the Cross. In His death, Jesus

became the Savior of the world (John 4:42). So in this quick description of Jesus, Peter gives the

Jewish leaders a backward and a forward look. In the past, Jesus is Savior; in the future Jesus

the *Prince* will become the King of Israel.

"Jesus, I praise You for past salvation, and I worship You as the coming King of All

Kings. Amen."

Reading: Zechariah 14:1-9

Words: 253

Key Thought: Jesus is the Savior and coming King.

HIS SEED—HOLY SPIRIT

"Whoever has been born of God does not sin, for His seed remains in him; and he

cannot sin, because he has been born of God" (1 John 3:9).

The Holy Spirit is the Seed who was planted in your life when you were born again. It was His

presence that delivered eternal life to you, as well as a new nature and new desires. Just as a

seed planted in the ground will grow and bring forth its fruit, so the Holy Spirit is the Seed

planted in your heart who will bring forth the fruit of righteousness and godliness. A seed has all

the ingredients of what it will be when fully grown, so the Holy Spirit has everything you need to

be completely godly and fully effective as a servant of God.

"Holy Spirit, I know You were planted in my heart. Thank You for the good things that

have grown there. I praise You for new desires and new character. Keep me growing to

be like Christ."

God's Seed planted in your heart cannot bring forth bad fruit. The Holy Spirit cannot sin, nor

can He tempt you to sin (James 1:13). You were given a new nature that is a divine creation; it

cannot sin. Listen to the urges of your new nature and follow it. Do not give into the desires of

your old nature, because it's the source of your temptation and problems. If you listen to the old

nature, it will lead you astray. Listen to the Holy Spirit and He will grow good fruit in your

heart.

"Holy Spirit, I want to be godly; grow the fruits of righteousness in my heart. I reject

temptation and the lust of the old nature. Amen."

Reading: 1 John 3:1-10

Words: 263

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is a Seed who grows good things in you.

THE PRINCE OF LIFE—JESUS

"And killed the Prince of life, whom God raised from the dead, of which we are

witnesses" (Acts 3:15).

Before His death, Jesus was also called The Prince of Life. Because a prince is one who is

waiting to ascend the throne, the name Prince of Life was a prediction of His coming

resurrection. Because He is Life, death could keep Him in the grave. When Jesus was raised

from the dead, He was given new resurrection life. The predicted *Prince of Life* becomes the

resurrection and life to all who would believe. After the resurrection, Jesus ascended to His

throne in Heaven and sat down at the right hand of God the Father. Now, Jesus is more than The

Prince of Life; He is the reigning King of Heaven. Today, He wants to enrich your life.

"Lord Jesus, when You died, my sins were nailed to the cross. When You arose from the

dead, I arose with you (Gal. 2:20). Now, let Your resurrection life flow through me."

Jesus gives eternal life to all who believe in Him, so they can live forever (1 John 5:12). He

gives them abiding life so they can be fruitful in (Jesus) the vine (John 15:1-5). He gives them

the power of resurrection life to overcome sin and temptation. He gives them satisfying life so

they can enjoy fellowship with Him. He gives them heavenly life so they can worship Him.

Will you do that now?

"Lord Jesus, I thank You for eternal life that I will live forever. I praise You for the

power of resurrection life and its victory over sin. Now I worship You for all you are."

Reading: Matthew 27:50-28:7

Key Thought: Jesus gives life to you.

THE MAN CHILD—JESUS

"And she brought forth a man child, who was to rule all nations with a rod of iron:

and her child was caught up unto God, and to his throne" (Revelation 12:5, KJV).

Jesus is called The Man Child because He was born to live as a man and die for the sins of the

world. When Mary and Joseph first saw Jesus, He was a baby in the manger, but the Heavenly

Father always saw Jesus as the fully-grown man hanging on the Cross, because Jesus was born

The Man Child to die for sins. But Jesus was more than one man who died; He was every man,

for all mankind was identified in Him on the Cross. Just as all died in Adam, so all were made

alive in Christ (1 Cor. 15:22). He was more than just one man hanging on the Cross; Jesus was

you, because He became your sin-bearer. Your sins were on Jesus when He died.

"Lord, I thank You for being born as a child, and growing to be a man, then dying for

me. Thank You for giving me eternal life."

Satan knew Jesus was the promised Man Child who would deliver the world, so throughout the

Old Testament, Satan tried to eliminate the Jews so *Jesus* wouldn't be born. In the life of *Jesus*,

Satan tried to prematurely kill Him so He wouldn't die on the Cross. But Jesus prevailed for

you, so today will you live for Him?

"Lord, You understand the pressures of life because You lived as a man. You were tried,

hurt, and disappointed. You know what it's like to be tempted, because You overcame

temptation. Help me overcome my temptations and limitations today. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 12:1-17

Words: 255

Key Thought: Because Jesus was a man, He understood your problems and is willing to help

you.

SONG—TRINITY

"The LORD is my strength and song, and He has become my salvation; He is my

God, and I will praise Him; My father's God, and I will exalt Him" (Exodus 15:2).

You will want to sing when you see what God is doing in your life, because He is your Song of

victory. Just as Israel recognized her helplessness in the face of an enemy, so you must realize

you will face opposition from the world, the flesh, and Satan. Just as Israel recognized that God

gave her a great victory (Exod. 15:1), so you will sing praises when you overcome your enemies.

Just as Israel exalted the Lord after a victory, so you must praise Him in song when your enemy

is defeated and when you win a great battle (Exod. 15:2).

"Lord, sometimes I sing triumphantly because You give me a great victory. Sometimes, I

sing reverently when I consider Your grace. Sometimes, I sing worshipfully when I

consider Your awesome presence."

If you have no song to sing, it's because you don't see the Lord working in your life. When you

are happy, the Lord is your Song of rejoicing. When sorrows break your heart, the Lord is your

Song of consolation. When you meet the Lord in prayer, He is your Song of worship and

adoration. There is no better theme to sing than to sing about the Lord. There is no better

purpose to sing than to sing to Him.

"Lord, my song exalts You for salvation, and my song blesses You for giving me victory."

Amen."

Reading: Exodus 15:1-21

Words: 231

Key Thought: Sing about the Lord and to the Lord.

THE MAN OF SORROWS—JESUS

"He is despised and rejected by men, a Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief."

And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not

esteem Him" (Isaiah 53:3).

Jesus is The Man of Sorrows. When the soldiers crushed a crown of thorns on His head, it left

gashes on His forehead and blood obscured His vision. When they scourged Jesus with a

whip—39 times—the beating left Him in agony. They mocked Him, stripped Him of all dignity,

and made Him carry His cross to Calvary. Beyond the physical torture, the disciples ran away,

Peter denied Him, and Judas betrayed Him. But Jesus suffered this all for you.

"Lord Jesus, You have endured suffering for me; help me be faithful when mocking and

persecution come."

When soldiers nailed Jesus to the cross, He knew it was only a matter of time before He would

die. He cried, "I thirst." They pierced His side with a spear. But that was just physical torture.

When Jesus took on the sins of the world, He suffered all the spiritual agonies of Hell, crying

out, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" The greatest suffering of all was for the

Son of God to be separated from the heavenly Father. There was nothing beautiful in the *Man of*

Sorrows on the Cross—except the beauty of salvation it secured. Nothing lovely, except the

salvation of countless souls. Nothing wonderful, except the praise of the ages to the Lamb slain

for the sin of the world.

"Lord Jesus, I worship You for being the lamb slain for the sin of the world. I praise You

for being my sin-bearer. Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 53:1-12

Words: 250

Key Thought: I must live for Jesus because of all He suffered for me.

THE MAN—JESUS

"Then Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. And

Pilate said to them, 'Behold the Man!'" (John 19:5).

Jesus is The Man that the Jewish leaders brought to the Roman governor Pilate to be tried. They

said Jesus claimed to be God, "He has spoken blasphemy!" (Matt. 26:65). Pilate interrogated

Jesus, but found no crime in Him. Still the Jews cried out for His blood. So Pilate had Jesus

flogged with whips and sticks. The Roman governor wrongly thought that a brutal beating

would satisfy the bloodthirsty Jews. Then Pilate presented Jesus to the crowd exclaiming,

"Behold the Man!" By calling *Jesus* a man, perhaps Pilate thought the Jews would go way when

they saw Him brutally beaten. But the crowd cried, "Crucify Him!" What do you cry when you

see Jesus The Man?

"Lord Jesus, I repent of my sins when I see Your sufferings. I cry out for forgiveness and

mercy. You are the Son of God."

Jesus is The Man who was tried by a Roman court. Jesus is The Man who died for your sins.

Jesus is The Man interceding for you at the right hand of the Father in Heaven. Jesus is The Man

who will return from Heaven to judge the world. *Jesus* is *The Man*, who also is God.

"Jesus, I worship You for Your great divine glory, because I don't understand why You

would become a man to die for me. I bow in human amazement at your greatness.

Amen."

Reading: John 19:1-6

Words: 230

Key Thought: The Son of God became a Man for us.

ONE SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body--and have all been made to

drink into one Spirit" (1 Corinthians 12:13).

The Holy Spirit is the One Spirit who baptized you into the body of Christ. He placed you into

Christ so that when Jesus died, you were identified in His death. When Jesus was buried, your

sins were buried with Him. When Jesus arose from the dead, you were in Jesus receiving new

life. The Third Person of the Trinity is the *One Spirit* who baptized you into the body of Christ

with all other believers.

"Holy Spirit, it is a privilege to be united with Jesus in His death, burial and

resurrection. Now I'm in Christ with all other believers.."

The Holy Spirit is the One Spirit who gives us love for others. When you meet other believers—

even for the first time—there's oneness because you both love the same Lord. No other spirit

can give you that feeling or common bond with other believers. You can pray with them, share

your testimony or worship together, all because you are one in the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the

One Spirit who gives unity to the body of Christ; "There is one body and one Spirit" (Eph. 4:4).

So realize, He works to give you and all other believers unity of heart and purpose. You should

fellowship together, pray together, serve together, and when difficulties come, sacrifice and

suffer together.

"Holy Spirit, help me get along with other believers, especially those I've had trouble

with. Help me love other Christians so the world can see Jesus in us. Amen."

Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:12-27

Words: 251

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit gives unity to the body of Christ.

JULY 30

THE MEDIATOR—JESUS

"For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ

Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5).

A *Mediator* is a middleman between two persons, or someone who acts on your behalf before an

organization or person of authority. Jesus is your Mediator to the Father. Just as a lawyer is a

mediator who represents you before a judge, so Jesus is your Mediator who gets your sins

forgiven. Just as a sales agent represents you in a business contract, so Jesus is your Mediator

who presents your prayers to the Father. How can *Jesus* represent you today?

"Jesus, I can't represent myself; I'm too imperfect to stand before the Father's throne to

present my prayers to Him. I will pray through You because the Father will listen to

You. "

A human mediator could never represent you to the Father. Another mediator would have to

intercede for his own sin. Also, a human mediator would have his own fleshly agenda, so he

wouldn't be concerned with your needs and problems. Because Jesus is God, He knows the

Father's heart; He can properly represent you to the throne. Because Jesus lived as a perfect

man, He knows your human inclination and He can be a Mediator for you. Go to the Father

through *The Mediator*.

"Jesus, I am left alone and lost if you are not my Mediator. Come to me, plead my case,

forgive my sins and deliver me to Heaven. Amen."

Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Words: 225

Key Thought: Jesus is the only One who can be your Mediator to the Father.

JULY 31

THE MIGHTY GOD—JESUS

"For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty

God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

Wonderful things happen to those who recognize Jesus as The Mighty God, and call upon Him.

When people refuse to recognize Jesus as their Mighty God, He cannot bless them for they have

shut the spiritual window of their life. But to those who have yielded their life to Jesus, He can

be their Mighty God. Everything promised in Scripture can happen to you because Jesus is

mighty to bless those who have faith to receive it. What is your greatest desire today? "Delight

thyself also in the LORD: and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart" (Ps. 37:4, KJV).

"Lord, I recognize Your might, but my problem is outward. I don't have enough faith to

trust You to do mighty things in my life. I believe in my head; overcome the unbelief of

my heart."

Jesus is The Mighty God to answer prayer. He is also The Mighty God to overcome bad habits,

or to give you strength to resist temptation. He is The Mighty God to give you peace in the

middle of a storm. He can take you off your wayward path and give you purpose in life. He

transforms from the inside out. If you need a spiritual "make over," call on Jesus, your Mighty

God.

"Jesus, be mighty to discipline my thoughts. Be mighty to focus my emotions in worship

to You. Be mighty to strengthen my will against temptation. Be mighty to strengthen my

will against temptation. Be mighty to use my body as Your temple. Amen."

Reading: Mark 9:2-13

Words: 247

Key Thought: Jesus can change you from the inside out.

YOUR EXCEEDINGLY GREAT REWARD—TRINITY

"After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, saying, 'Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your exceedingly great reward" (Genesis

15:1).

The Lord God is Your Exceedingly Great Reward; because when you get to Heaven, He will

give you spiritual treasures that He is holding for you. But, it's not money or jewels you'll get;

the Lord is your treasure. "In Your presence is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures

forevermore" (Ps. 16:11). Abraham fought a battle for righteousness sake (Gen. 14:1-16), yet he

refused to take the earthly treasures that were rightfully his (Gen. 14:17-24). Abraham received

a reward greater than gold or silver. He enjoyed the happiness of Divine presence; the Lord was

his reward. People on earth strive for gold to make them happy, but they don't realize that the

greatest happiness of all is found in the presence of God. If your life is empty, let the Lord fill it

with His presence.

"Lord, I confess I am empty. Fill me with Your presence. Let me experience Your

goodness today."

The Lord God is Your Exceedingly Great Reward. Once you fix your love on Him, your money

will have new meaning. You will get joy donating to many righteous causes. All your work for

the Lord will bring you greater pleasures because you'll glorify Him in all you do. You won't

use all your energy pursuing pleasures; but you'll do the Lord's will, which will bring you the

greatest happiness of all.

"Lord, show me the path of life and give me fullness of joy in Your presence. Let me find

pleasures forevermore at Your right hand (Ps. 16:11, Amplified). Amen."

Reading: Gen. 15:1-7

Words: 257

Key Thought: The Lord God is the greatest source of reward and happiness in life.

THE MINISTER OF THE HEAVENLY SANCTUARY—JESUS

"We have such a High Priest, who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens, a Minister of the sanctuary and of the true tabernacle . . ."

(Hebrews 8:1).

Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father to be your Minister in the Heavenly Sanctuary.

Jesus is there to help you. Because you are in Christ, and He indwells you (John 14:20), you are

as close to the Father as is Jesus. So don't worry about judgment, for Jesus has taken your

punishment. Now your concern is to please the Father and worship Him. Do that through Jesus,

for He will present your request to the Father. Because the Father loves Jesus and accepts Him,

you have immediate access through the Son; He is your *Minister of the Heavenly Sanctuary*.

"Father, I am not worthy to enter Your presence, but in Jesus I stand perfect before You.

My words are inadequate, but in Jesus my speech is perfect. My prayers are filled with

doubts, but in Jesus I pray boldly."

You have instant access to the Father through Jesus who is your Minister of the Heavenly

Sanctuary. Jesus is glorified when you pray through Him, for this is the fulfillment of His

sacrifice. The Father is glorified by your worship, for that is the reason He sent Jesus to die for

you.

"Jesus, some of my prayers are selfish and some are surrounded with fears. Search my

true heart and present those prayers to the Father that He should hear. Present my

prayers in the way they should be offered. Because You are my Minister in the Heavenly

Sanctuary, I pray with confidence. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 8:1-6

Words: 247

Key Thought: Jesus makes my prayers effective.

THE FRIEND OF PUBLICANS AND SINNERS—JESUS

"The Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look, a glutton and

a winebibber, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!" (Luke 7:34).

Jesus was called The Friend of Publicans and Sinners; not a complimentary term in His day.

Jews especially hated Publicans because they "sold out" to the enemy, i.e., Rome. Roman

officials "sold" the right to Jewish citizens who collected taxes for Rome. These Publicans

bought the right to collect taxes, and then added their profits or wages. If the unwilling Jewish

taxpayer refused to pay his taxes, Roman soldiers were used to reinforce the Publican demands.

Publicans were religiously unclean because they fellowshipped with Gentiles, and morally

unclean for taking advantage of the poor and innocent. Because the common people hated

Publicans, when Jesus went to eat with them, some observers questioned Jesus' motives, or at

least His judgment. Jesus responded to this criticism, "Those who are well have no need of a

physician, but those who are sick. I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance"

(Mark 2:17).

"Lord Jesus, You did not come just for good people, but You came to save all kinds of

sinners, including me."

The Jewish people also criticized Jesus for eating with sinners. There were people of Jewish

blood who refused to keep the Jewish law, attend the Sabbath observance, or honor God. The

average Jew considered a "sinner" lost. But Jesus wanted everyone to know He came into the

world—to save one and all—no matter if they were morally upright or outwardly sinful.

"Jesus, You were The Friend of Publicans and Sinners while on Earth. Now You

welcome all people to salvation."

Reading: Luke 5:27-32

Words: 256

Key Thought: Jesus loves and accepts any and all, no matter if they are morally upright or

outward sinners.

THE ANOINTING—HOLY SPIRIT

"But the anointing which you have received from Him abides in you, and you do not need that anyone teach you; but as the same anointing teaches you concerning

all things, and is true, and is not a lie, and just as it has taught you, you will abide

in Him" (1 John 2:27).

The Holy Spirit is The Anointing who comes to give you spiritual insight. When you don't

understand the Scripture, let Him anoint your spiritual eyes to see what the passage says. When

you don't know where to go, let Him anoint your understanding so you can choose the right

paths. When you can't see Jesus working in your life, let Him anoint your spiritual perception.

Remember Jesus promised that He would come to help believers glorify the Son (John 16:14).

Let the *Holy Spirit* magnify Jesus in your life today.

"Holy Spirit, I want to glorify Jesus. Come anoint me with Your presence so I can see

the work of Jesus in my life and glorify Him with my praise. I need Your anointing

today."

The Holy Spirit is The Anointing who comes to enlighten the Scriptures in your heart. But He

doesn't work in a vacuum; you must read and memorize the Bible. You must study the Bible,

comparing Scripture to Scripture. You must use commentaries and dictionaries. You must give

time meditating on the Word of God. Then you must ask for Him to come help you understand

spiritual things. When you seek enlightenment of the Holy Spirit, you are asking for The

Anointing of the Holy Spirit. He will come shine light on your darkened understanding.

"Holy Spirit, come shine Your light in my mind. Help me to see everything You want me

to know, then help me do all You want me to accomplish. Come anoint me to know the

Scripture. Amen."

Reading: 1 John 2:20-28

Words: 256

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit anoints you to understand the Bible.

MY ANOINTED—JESUS

"Then I will raise up for Myself a faithful priest who shall do according to what is in My heart and in My mind. I will build him a sure house, and he shall walk

before My anointed forever" (1 Samuel 2:35).

The title Anointed in Hebrew is Messiah; in Greek it is Christ. Jesus Christ is the Anointed

One. He is Messiah. The heavenly Father calls Jesus "My Anointed," that's because Jesus

fulfilled the prophecy of the three-fold anointed office. Just as a priest was anointed with oil to

sacrifice for sins, so Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit to offer a sacrifice for our sins.

Just as a prophet was anointed to speak for God, Jesus was the Father's prophet who brought

the message of grace. Just as the king was inaugurated into office by an anointing oil, so Jesus

was the Father's *Anointed* One to rule the hearts of all people.

"Jesus, I thank You for being the Anointed Priest to bring me salvation. I thank You for

being the Anointed Prophet to deliver the word of God to me. I thank You for being the

Anointed King to rule my heart. Anoint me for service today."

The anointing is for cleansing; let Jesus deal with your sin. The anointing is for victory; let

Jesus deliver you from temptation and trouble. The anointing is for power; let Jesus use you

today. The anointing is for joy: let Jesus give you happiness today. Do you need a fresh

anointing to face this day?

"Jesus, it's hard to stay fresh; sometimes my daily life gets boring. Anoint my waiting

soul. I'm walking through a hot barren world. Let the oil of Your presence flow into

every crack and crevice of my heart. Ah! Your oil feels good. Amen."

Reading: 1 Samuel 2:12-36; 4:10-22

Key Thought: The anointing of Jesus gives you a fresh start for a new day.

MY DELIVERER—JESUS

"But I am poor and needy; yet the LORD thinks upon me. You are my help and

my deliverer; do not delay, O my God" (Psalm 40:17).

There were many deliverers in the history of God's people: Noah delivered the human race from

a judgmental flood; Moses delivered Israel from Egypt; Deborah delivered God's people from

the Canaanites, Gideon from the Midianites, and David from the Philistines. But each time a

human leader delivered God's people; eventually they drifted back into sin. The greatest

Deliverer is Jesus. His past death delivered us from sin's penalty; He "forgives all your

iniquities" (Ps. 103:3). His present indwelling delivers us from the power of sin; "Surely He

shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the perilous pestilence" (Ps. 91:3). His

future coming will deliver you from the presence of sin; "Who delivers us from the wrath to

come" (1 Thess. 1:10).

"Lord Jesus, I praise You for delivering Your people in the past. But most of all, I praise

You for delivering me."

Jesus is your Deliverer. He saved you, "He has delivered us from so great a death" (2 Cor.

1:10). You can have victory over addiction and habits; "He has delivered us from the power of

darkness" (Col. 1:13). He delivers from persecution (2 Tim. 3:11), and in the final day, He will

deliver you to Heaven; "Jesus . . . delivers us from the wrath to come" (1 Thess. 1:10).

Lord Jesus, I praise You because You saved me when I was in sin. You brought me close

when I was far away and You delivered me when I was in trouble. Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus will deliver you in many ways.

THE LORD MIGHTY IN BATTLE—TRINITY

"Who is this King of glory? The LORD strong and mighty, the LORD mighty in

battle" (Psalm 24:8).

Look to *The Lord Mighty in Battle* to give you victory in life. Battles are not easy; they're tough,

threatening and tiring. Jesus went through many sufferings on earth. His disciples left Him,

Peter denied Him, and the Roman soldiers beat Him and finally they crucified Him on a cross.

When the enemy thought they won the battle in killing *Jesus*, it was in His death that the victory

was won. Since the world hated Him, the world will oppose you. You will always have to fight

the world, the flesh, and Satan. Your enemies will be too strong for you, so you must look to

The Lord Mighty in Battle. He will come to your rescue when you call upon Him.

"Lord, help me see my enemies through Your eyes. You defeated them on the cross, give

me faith to claim victory today."

When you think sin will defeat you, remember victory begins in your mind. You must want to

win and look to His strength for victory. When you plan to win, remember victory comes when

you stand by the Lord. He will help you defeat the enemy. When you're near Him, you can be

victorious in His strength.

"Lord, I'll not look at the strength of the enemy; I'll look to Your might. I know You

defeated the enemy on the cross, so I'll trust You to win the victory today. Amen."

Key Thought: Claim the victory of Jesus to win battles over sin.

THE MYSTERY OF GOD—JESUS

"That their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, and attaining to all riches of the full assurance of understanding, to the knowledge of the mystery

of God, both of the Father and of Christ" (Colossians 2:2).

Jesus wants you to have full assurance of your salvation. You can know that you are saved, and

you can know how to please the Father. You can know these things because Jesus lives in your

life and gives complete confidence to you. The world doesn't understand this mystery, but the

Father and Jesus have taken the mystery out of your relationship with Them. The fact that the

Son indwells you is a mystery to the world, but you understand it because you originally asked

Jesus into your heart when you were saved. The Mystery of God is the fact that Jesus indwells

you to give you full assurance of sins forgiven and a future home in Heaven.

"Lord, I want to know everything about my salvation. Sometimes, I just don't understand

some things You are doing in my life. Sometimes things puzzle me."

Jesus is The Mystery of God; in Him are all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge (Col. 2:3).

When you don't understand what's happening in your life, learn more about Jesus to find

answers for your questions. When you are not sure what to do, come to Jesus for guidance. He

can help you learn things about The Mystery of God.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for teaching me how to live the Christian life. Thank You for new

life and a future hope of Heaven. Help me learn more about how to live for You. Amen."

Key Thought: Knowing Jesus is the key to understanding the mysteries of God.

A REPROACH OF MEN—JESUS

"But I am a worm, and no man; a reproach of men, and despised by the people"

(Psalm 22:6).

Today, the name of Jesus is revered and respected by His followers. But, there was a brief

window of time when the followers of Jesus fled and hid themselves. The name Jesus was a

reproach to them. When Jesus was arrested, "all the disciples forsook Him and fled" (Matt.

25:56). What would you have done? Peter ran away, but not too far because he got entrance

into the High Priest courtyard. A servant girl—the gatekeeper—recognized Peter and said, "You

also were with Jesus of Nazareth" (Mark 14:67). Peter denied it three times in rapid succession,

and the third time, "he began to curse and swear" (Mark 14:71). Why? Because Jesus had been

a reproach to him. Has Jesus ever become a reproach to you? Have you ever denied Him?

"Lord Jesus, I am not perfect. I do not always speak up as a Christian, but You are not a

reproach to me. I will speak boldly in Your name in the future."

When Peter denied Jesus, he fulfilled the Old Testament prediction that Jesus would be A

Reproach of Men. Hanging on the cross, Jesus was cursed, mocked, spat upon, and rejected by

the multitudes. But even in His rejection, a thief believed in Him, His mother and John were

commissioned by Him, and at His death, the Centurion recognized *Jesus* as a righteous man.

"Lord Jesus, there are many who reject You in this world, but You are not a reproach to

me. I take the name Christ; I am glad to be a Christian. Amen."

Reading: Mark 14:66-72

Words: 259

Key Thought: Jesus is either a reproach to you or He is your Savior.

THE BLESSING—HOLY SPIRIT

"I will pour My Spirit on your descendants, and My blessing on your offspring"

(Isaiah 44:3).

The Holy Spirit is The Blessing you need. It's not help you need, it's the Holy Spirit. It's not

money you need; it's the Holy Spirit. He is The Blessing you must have to fill up that hole in

your life. Don't seek money or happiness, or success; seek the Holy Spirit. It's not an

ambiguous blessing you need; the Holy Spirit is the blessing you need.

"Holy Spirit, I will seek You so I can have spiritual blessings in my life. I have

occasional emergencies, but most of the time I just have pressures. Bless me with Your

presence this day. Be with me in all that I do today. Bless my testimony to expand Your

kingdom."

The Blessing you seek is the Holy Spirit. He will add value to all that you are and all that you

do. He is *The Blessing*. "He can bless you and keep you; He can make His face shine upon you,

and be gracious to you; He can give you peace" (Num. 6:24-25, author's paraphrase). The Holy

Spirit is The Blessing. You must yield to His control so He can bless your workplace and the

work of your hands. The Holy Spirit is financial blessing; you must yield the use of your

checkbook to Him, so He can add financial value in your life.

"Lord, You are my Blessing. I look to You and not to money, position, or things. Add

value to all I do and help me be a blessing to others as You have blessed me. Amen."

Reading: Mark 4:14-29

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Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is The Blessing you need.

THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD came upon him (Othniel), and he judged Israel. He went out to war, and the LORD delivered Cushan-Rishathaim king of

Mesopotamia into his hand" (Judges 3:10).

When The Spirit of the Lord came upon Othniel, it was the Holy Spirit—the Third Person of the

Trinity—who empowered him for service. When The Spirit of the Lord comes upon you, He

will help you live a godly life and serve with power. Just as The Spirit of the Lord came upon

Othniel to give him victory over a profane enemy, so He can fill every corner of your life with

renewed energy. But He can't fill the empty parts of your life if you don't yield them to Him.

Right now stop your self-efforts. Cry out for the strength of *The Spirit of the Lord* to empower

you.

"Holy Spirit, I come to You for victory. Help me overcome outward temptations. Give

me the courage to overcome inner doubts. Give me discipline to overcome my

rebellion."

Just as The Spirit of the Lord strengthened Othniel to overcome a Syrian king, so the Holy Spirit

can fill you with power that you've never experienced. But He will not fill a dirty vessel. Sin

keeps the Holy Spirit from filling every crevice and cranny of your life. Deal with your

rebellious attitude in a spiritual way, so the *Spirit* can be poured out in full power.

"Lord, I repent of my sin and turn to You. I confess my sin and ask forgiveness. Holy

Spirit, let Your power flow into my life. Come, flow quickly into my life to fill every

empty corner with Your power. Flow, Spirit, flow. Amen."

Reading: Judges 3:1-12

Words: 252

Key Thought: You must prepare for the Holy Spirit before He will flow into your life.

THE LORD GOD ALMIGHTY—JESUS

"... Even so, Lord God Almighty, true and righteous are Your judgments" (Revelation 16:7).

When Jesus comes in judgment, He will come as The Lord God Almighty. Jesus will come as the Lord, the One who control all things. Today, the Lord allows evil rulers to make war, innocent victims are killed, disease runs rampant in many places, and crime seems unstoppable. While it seems Jesus is not in outward control, He is working inwardly to control the inner life of His followers. Will you let Him control your life? Jesus is The God who created all things; that means He has "the eternal power" (Rom. 1:20) to do all God wills to do. But it seems God is holding back His power because Christians suffer, the church is persecuted and evil thrives. But that is not true. God's power is not measured by what evil does or doesn't do. God allows evil in the world to test the obedience of His servants to determine if they will love Him more. Are you loving Him more? Jesus is also The Almighty, the One who exercises divine will, the One who works His plan in your life. Is He working His purpose in your life? In today's world, The Lord God Almighty is exercising divine patience until evil runs its course. At the Second Coming, Jesus will manifest Himself as The Lord God Almighty. He will directly control all things, and He will accomplish His Almighty will.

"Lord Jesus, come! I wait for Your return to earth to rule everything. I wait for Your power to accomplish Your will. But until You return, come rule my life with Your power. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 16:1-21

Key Thought: Jesus has the power to control everything when He returns.

THE WINDOW OPENER—TRINITY

"Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and try Me now in this," says the LORD of hosts, "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing that there will not be room

enough to receive it" (Malachi 3:10).

The Lord will *Open the Windows of Heaven* and pour out a blessing on all who bring the tithe to

Him. It's not just money the Lord wants from people; it's their worship and obedience. When a

person gives ten percent of "all thine increase" (Deut. 26:12), then the Lord responds by giving

him the best of life, the provision for his needs, and the Lord will manifest His presence to them.

Notice, the Lord does not give everything a person wants, but He provides spiritual blessings for

those who put Him first in their life. People spend their money for happiness, or on provisions

for their needs. When we "spend" our money on God, we get the benefits for which others spend

their money. God in Heaven sees what we do and gives us the "blessings" we seek in life.

"Lord, I acknowledge Your ownership over my life, including my time, talents, and

treasures. I will give You ten percent of all I have, knowing You will take care of my

needs."

Heaven is stored with blessings and goodness for God's people. However, you can have them

now by total obedience to God. When you do God's will and call upon Him, He will open the

windows of heaven and pour out a blessing for you in this life.

"Lord, forgive me when I've not obeyed You. I commit myself now to giving financially

to Your cause. I look forward to receiving Your blessings from the open windows of

heaven. Amen."

Reading: Malachi 3:7-11

Key Thought: God opens windows when you obey Him.

THE LORD GOD OMNIPOTENT—JESUS

"And I heard, as it were, the voice of a great multitude, as the sound of many waters and as the sound of mighty thunderings, saying, 'Alleluia! For the Lord

God Omnipotent reigns!" (Revelation 19:6).

Jesus is The Lord God Omnipotent. Because Jesus is God who created all things (John 1:3); He

has all power. What power do you need from Him today? Because Jesus is the Lord who

controls all things by His laws and sovereignty, will you let Him control your life today?

Because Jesus is Omnipotent, He has the potential ability to do everything that is possible to do.

Obviously, He will not make yesterday not happen because that would mean God would have to

deny He existed. Nor will God not make 2 x 2 equal 3 for that denies truth. An *Omnipotent God*

can do anything He wills to do, but He will not go against what He has previously done. When

Jesus comes to finally judge the world, He has power to judge exactly as He wills. Therefore,

you want to be in the center of God's will when He comes.

"Lord Jesus, be the Lord who controls my life. Be The Omnipotent One whose will I do.

Be the God who gives me power to accomplish Your will."

Jesus will manifest Himself fully as the Lord God Omnipotent when He returns to earth. Today,

Jesus allows individuals to rebel against His control, deny His power, and reject His will. But

what about you, will you yield to His control? Will you claim His power? Will you do His will?

"Lord Jesus, I want to glorify You with my life. I submit to Your control, and I claim

Your power; help me do Your will. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 19:1-10

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Key Thought: Jesus is the Lord God Omnipotent who wants to control your life.

LORD JESUS CHRIST—JESUS

"My brethren, do not hold the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory,

with partiality" (James 2:1).

We usually think of Jesus as having three names: Lord, Jesus, and Christ. But He's entirely

different from people today who have a first, middle and last name. When you call Him Lord,

that's His title. You are referring to His deity. No one gave Him the title Lord, for He has

eternally been Lord. When you call Him Jesus, you are referring to His humanity. The angel

Gabriel told Mary to call Him Jesus, a Greek name that means "Jehovah Saves." When you call

Him Christ, you are referring to His anointed office. Just as prophets, priests, and kings were

anointed into their office, Jesus came as Prophet to give the message of God, as Priest to bring

salvation, and as King to rule the hearts of His followers.

"I worship You as Christ who brought me salvation, as Jesus the virgin-born Son of

Mary, and as my King, who sits on the throne of my heart."

Why does Jesus have so many names, titles, and descriptive metaphors? Men who do many

things have many titles (dad, husband, uncle, boss, deacon, etc.), so Jesus has over 700 names

because He is and does a vast number of things. The names you call Him are not as important as

your response to Him. He wants your love and obedience.

"Jesus, You are my Redeemer, Intercessor, Guide, Protector, and Friend. You came to

me as light, water, bread, shepherd, vine, and resurrection. But most of all, You are my

Lord and You are My Savior. Amen."

Reading: 1 Tim. 1:1-2, 12-17

Words: 255

Key Thought: Jesus has many names to elicit many responses.

THE BREATH OF GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"As long as my breath is in me, and the breath of God in my nostrils" (Job 27:3).

The Holy Spirit is The Breath of God. When the Father wants to give life to anything, the Holy

Spirit is breathed into all things. The Holy Spirit was the Breath that God blew into the nostrils

of Adam and he lived. The Holy Spirit was the Breath of God hovering over the waters when

life was given during Creation (Gen. 1:2). The Breath of God blows like the wind over hills and

oceans to give life to nature. The Holy Spirit is the Breath of God—the wind that blows where it

wishes—to bring eternal life to those who believe in Jesus (John 3:7, 8). Let the Holy Spirit

breathe new life in you today.

"Holy Spirit, I need new enthusiasm to worship and serve You. Breathe new excitement

and anticipation into me. Blow Your new life in me today."

The Holy Spirit is God's Breath. Just as you must breathe air to exist, so you must have the Holy

Spirit to have eternal life. Breathe the Holy Spirit for illumination when You're spiritually blind.

Breathe the Holy Spirit for guidance when you don't know what to do. Breathe the Holy Spirit

for strength when you think you can't go on. Breathe the Holy Spirit for encouragement when

things fall apart. Let the *Holy Spirit* be the air you breathe.

"Holy Spirit, I breathe You into my cluttered lungs. Clean out my selfish ways and make

me holy. Get rid of junk in my schedule and make me spiritual. Holy Spirit, make me

'holy' and make me 'spiritual.' Amen."

Reading: Job 27:1-24

Words: 261

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit breathes new enthusiasm into you.

LORD—*KURIOS*—JESUS

"You call Me Teacher and Lord, and you say well, for so I am" (John 13:13).

Jesus is the Lord of Heaven, the Lord of the universe, the Lord of the church, but most of all He

should be your personal Lord. Just as a human can be lord of a manor because he owns the

house, and directs its activities, so Jesus should be Lord of your body—His Temple—because

He provides for your needs and directs your activities. Jesus wants to be more than a guest in

your home; He wants the title deed so that you belong to Him.

"Jesus, enter my life as you might enter a home. Make my heart Your home. Live in my

body."

If Jesus is your Lord, He should rest in the "living room" of your life. Jesus should feel

comfortable in the recreation room where you play and entertain yourself. Jesus should be

invited into your dining room when you eat and satisfy your appetite. He won't be happy if you

eat the garbage of this world. Would Jesus rest comfortably in the bedroom of your life? Do

you have a besetting sin hidden in the basement? When you invite Jesus into your home, He

doesn't enter as a decoration or a "celebrity" to give your home status. He doesn't come as a

vacation guest or as a friend who "pops in" on the weekends. Jesus comes to be the Lord of your

house.

"Jesus I give every room in the house to You. Enter each room, cleanse it and make it

Your own. I will make You Lord of my life. Amen."

Reading: John 13:1-17

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus will not be Lord at all, unless He is the Lord of all.

LORD OF LORDS—JESUS

"He will manifest in His own time, He who is the blessed and only Potentate, the

King of kings and Lord of lords" (1 Timothy 6:15).

Many in the world call Jesus "lord," but He is more, Jesus is Lord of Lords. A lord holds vast

properties and assets. Jesus is Lord because He owns the world and rules the universe. A lord

directs those under his rule. Jesus is Lord because He holds the destiny of all people in His

hand. A Lord is the absolute owner of all he surveys. Jesus is the Lord of everything because

He created all things. Because He died for all people, all will one day bow to His rule. Because

He will come in the future to judge all, you must be accountable to Him for how you live.

"Lord, there are many who will not recognize Your rule in their lives, but I acknowledge

You as my Lord. Teach me to adjust to Your rules. Let my submission be a testimony to

others."

There are many lords in this world who are called presidents, prime ministers, governors,

mayors, and billionaires. They rule empires. While they will not recognize the Lord's rule on

earth, nor will they rule according to His "righteous laws," one day they will acknowledge Jesus

is "King of Kings and Lord of Lords." Then every knee will bow, including theirs (Phil. 2:11,

12).

"Jesus, I know You will rule everything in the future, but I am concerned about this day."

Come take control of my heart, be my Lord. Be glorified in all I do and say. Amen."

Reading: 1 Tim. 6:15-21

Words: 244

Key Thought: Jesus will rule all things one day, so submit to Him today.

THE PILLAR OF FIRE—TRINITY

"And the LORD went before them by day in a pillar of cloud to lead the way, and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, so as to go by day and night. He did not take away the pillar of cloud by day or the pillar of fire by night from before

the people" (Exodus 13:21, 22).

The Lord is a picture of *The Pillar of Fire* that led Israel through the wilderness. But it was more

than a flame; it was His presence with His people. Jesus is a light to guide, protect, and comfort

His people. When Isaiah went into the Temple, he saw the smoke from the sacrificial altar

drifting up into Heaven. That was the Shekinah glory cloud that symbolized God's presence.

Then Isaiah cried out, "I saw the Lord" (Is. 6:1-3). Because the Lord is light, He will give

illumination, wisdom, and guidance.

"Lord, thank You for light in my life. Let me experience Your presence today. I want to

see You."

The Lord manifested Himself in a *Pillar of Fire*, but if you took away the smoke and the clouds,

you wouldn't see anything, for there's nothing to see. No one can see God because God is Spirit

(John 4:23). But in order for people to know where God was located, He appeared in a column

of smoke, or fire, or a thick cloud (Ex. 40:34, 35). God is invisible, so He can be everywhere

present at the same time. God is Spirit, so He can be near you and indwell you. Just as the Lord

led Israel by a *Pillar of Fire*, let Him lead you today.

"Lord, I feel comfortable in the fire of Your presence. Thank You for light and direction.

Lead me today. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 13:20-14:20

Words: 237

Key Thought: The Lord can lead you today as He led Israel in the wilderness.

A MALEFACTOR—JESUS

"They answered and said unto him, 'If he were not a malefactor, we would not

have delivered him up unto thee" (John 18:30, KJV).

To the Jews who arrested Jesus, He was a Malefactor, a name that means "evildoer." They knew

Jesus was not a Malefactor because their witnesses disagreed in their testimony against Him, and

the Jews bribed them to lie. But still, they accused Jesus of being a Malefactor, even though

Jesus was perfect and without sin. He could say to the Jews, "Which of you can truthfully

accuse me of sin?" (John 8:46, NLT). Pilate would testify, "I find no fault in Him" (John 19:6).

Yet, in the irony of this situation, the Jews accused an innocent man of being an evildoer when in

actuality, their lie made them the guilty ones. "Jesus did not sin, but He was made sin for us" (2

Cor. 5:21, Author's Translation). Jesus took on the sin of the Jews, the sin of the world, your

sin.

"Lord Jesus, I know You are the perfect Son of God. I also know You became sin for me.

Thank You for Your death for my sins."

The names that were given to Jesus reflect the roles that people projected on to Him. Jesus was

a Malefactor in the eyes of those who hated Him. They hated Him because He attacked their

dead religious rituals. Jesus was a rival "religious" leader because Jesus gave the multitude

hope, something they couldn't do. Jesus taught the truth, lived a perfect life, and established a

kingdom of peace and righteousness.

"Lord Jesus, the world has called You a Malefactor, but I call You my Savior. The world

calls You an evildoer, but I call You my Redeemer. Amen."

Reading: John 18:30-38

Words: 267

Key Thought: The world calls Jesus a Malefactor, but He is the Savior.

MASTER—*EPISTATES*—JESUS

"And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net" (Luke 5:5,

KJV).

Jesus sat in Peter's boat preaching to a large crowd. When Jesus finished, He told Peter,

"Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch" (Luke 5:4). Because Jesus knew

all things, He knew Peter had fished all night but didn't catch anything. Peter called Jesus

Master, a title of respect that a worker would call a boss. Peter was respectful but replied, "I will

let down the net" (Luke 5:5). Did you see what Peter said? He would cast only one net, not all

of the nets that Jesus originally commanded. Don't we do the same thing? Aren't we guilty of

partial obedience to Jesus?

"Jesus, forgive me for the times I have not completely obeyed You. Teach me to

completely obey Your commands."

Notice what happened when Peter let down only one net. "They caught a great number of fish,

and their net was breaking" (Luke 5:6). Perhaps the singular net would not have been broken if

Peter had let down all the nets? Isn't partial obedience, full disobedience? When Peter saw his

net breaking and the boat filled with fish, he fell at *Jesus*' feet, crying out, "O Lord" (Luke 5:8).

Notice the change in titles. Jesus is no longer just respected as a boss; Jesus is now revered as

Lord. Do you just respect *Jesus* as your boss, or do you revere Him as your Lord?

"Lord Jesus, I revere your miracle-working powers, but I bow in worship because You

are the Lord of the Universe; You are my personal Lord. Amen."

Reading: Luke 5:1-11

Key Thought: Jesus is more than a Master; He wants to be Your Lord.

A NEW SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"Then I will give them one heart, and I will put a new spirit within them, and take

the stony heart out of their flesh, and give them a heart of flesh" (Ezekiel 11:19).

The Holy Spirit is the New Spirit that enters a person's heart at salvation. He enters a hard heart

with the love of God to soften it. When people realize how much the Father loves them, and

how much Jesus suffered for them on the cross, they'll soften in repentance and faith. The New

Spirit will give them a new view of their sins, a new view of the Gospel, and a new view of

salvation. But most of all, the New Spirit will give them a new heart to call upon God. Let the

Holy Spirit give you a new life. Let the Holy Spirit show you what new things He can do for

your today.

"Holy Spirit, I need a new perspective on life. Give me a new focus on my possibilities."

Use me in a new way today."

The New Spirit is sent into your life to show you all the new things you get at salvation. You get

peace (John 14:27), guidance (Gal. 5:25), assurance (Eph. 4:30), illumination (1 Peter 1:12) and

you are filled with the presence of the *Holy Spirit* for new service (Eph. 5:18). When you get the

fullness of the *Holy Spirit*, many new possibilities open up to you.

"Holy Spirit, come touch me in a new way. I want all the new things You have for me.

Make this a wonderful day. Amen."

Reading: Ezekiel 36:25-36

Key Thought: Holy Spirit gives new things to believers.

MEEK—JESUS

"Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and

ye shall find rest unto your souls" (Matthew 11:29).

Jesus called Himself Meek, because He personified meekness. He calls us to a life of meekness,

instead of living arrogantly and boastfully. Because Jesus is humble, He calls us not to serve

ourselves, nor live for selfish advancement. Because Jesus was submissive to the Roman

authorities and those over Him, His example calls us to meekness and yieldedness. We are to

obey the rules, because God has put them over us. Jesus did not seek His own will; He testified,

"I do always these things that please the Father" (John 17:4-6). But we are the opposite of *Jesus*;

we seek our own fulfillment, "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, every one, to

his own way; and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all" (Isa. 53:6).

"Lord, I am human and I follow my impulse to live for selfish purposes. Teach me to be

meek like Jesus. Teach me to live for You."

Jesus is called Meek because He left His lofty position in Heaven, laid aside His glory, and

accepted a humble birth in a stable. He prayed when facing suffering, "O My Father, if it is

possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will" (Matt. 26:39);

Yes, Jesus meekly accepted the cross for you; what will you give up for Him?

"Lord Jesus, thank You for Your sacrifice. Help me learn from Your meekness; help me

to be like You. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 11:28-30, 26:36-46

Words: 248

Key Thought: You can learn meekness from Jesus.

MERCY SEAT—JESUS

"And above it [the Ark of the Covenant] were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat" (Hebrews 9:5). "And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world (1

John 2:2).

The Lord has a throne in Heaven, but He did not let His people build Him a throne on earth.

Rather, He instructed Moses to build an Ark of the Covenant (the word ark meant box) (Exod.

25:17) where He would be present. The lid of the box was called the mercy seat because that's

where the Lord came to sit. It's much like a human father sitting on a cedar chest (the

approximate dimensions of the ark) to change his shoes; so God came to sit on His box—Ark of

the Covenant. It's ironic that the God of Heaven had to sit on a box and not a throne. Blood was

sprinkled on the mercy seat once each year, symbolic of God's covering their sin. God wanted

to sit where the blood was sprinkled. The mercy seat was symbolic of forgiven sins.

"Lord Jesus, You are my Mercy Seat, for it was Your blood that redeemed me. I worship

You for salvation completed."

The Shekinah cloud sat on the mercy seat. The glory of God—His presence—was in that cloud

as it filled the Holy of Holies. That's as close as anyone could see God sitting on anything on

this earth. Just as God's glory came to sit on the mercy seat in the Old Testament, invite Jesus'

presence to fill your world and influence you today.

"Jesus, You are the propitiation—satisfaction-- for my sins. When You died for me, it

was Your blood that was sprinkled on the mercy seat. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 9:1-11

Words: 256

Key Thought: God sits on the Mercy Seat to forgive my sins.

EL OLAM (EVERLASTING GOD)—TRINITY

"Then Abraham planted a tamarisk (oak) tree in Beersheba, and there called on

the name of the LORD, the Everlasting God" (Genesis 21:33).

The Lord is El Olam, the God of mystery that is unknown to you. His name Olam means secret

or hidden. There are many things about God that are hidden in the clouds of eternity. You'll not

be held accountable for the things you don't know about God, but for the things you know.

These are the difficult challenges in life. The Lord is *El Olam*—the God of mystery. One day

you'll understand the events of today when you look back to see God's good plan for you. He is

directing all things, even when you can't see what's happening.

"El Olam, You made me human and finite. Teach me to trust You even when my path is

cloudy. Teach me to follow You when I don't understand the events around me."

Abraham planted a grove of trees that would outlive his normal life in Beersheba, thereby

symbolizing a relationship with God that would extend beyond his earthly life. El Olam is the

God beyond this life. Even when you can't understand what's happening in your life, look

beyond your circumstances to see His everlasting nature. Call on Him—the Everlasting God—

to extend your influence into the future. And when you think your life is a mystery, remember

God has a plan for you; and one day it'll be crystal clear to you.

"O, Everlasting God, accomplish Your plan in my life. Help me trust You when I don't

know what You're doing. Help me follow You when I can't see where I'm going.

Amen."

Reading: Genesis 20, 21

Words: 257

Key Thought: Trust the Everlasting God who has a plan bigger than this life.

MESSIAH—JESUS

"And after the sixty-two weeks Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself; and the people of the prince who is to come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary.

The end of it shall be with a flood, and till the end of the war desolations are

determined" (Daniel 9:26).

In the Old Testament, the people of God looked forward to Messiah, i.e., their Deliverer. The

title Messiah meant "Anointed One." Just as David was anointed king and drove the heathen out

of the Promised Land, the Jews looked forward to their coming Messiah to drive the Romans

into the sea. Just as prophets were anointed to speak God's message, so the Jews looked for their

Messiah's coming with God's Word. Just as the priests were anointed to make sacrifice for sins,

so the Jews looked for their Messiah to bring in universal peace and forgiveness of sins. Jesus

was the Messiah, i.e., God's Anointed One. He came fulfilling the three-fold anointed office of

Prophet, Priest and King.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for Your priesthood to forgive my sins. Thank You for being a

prophet to bring the message of love. Thank You for being a king to rule in my heart."

Jesus is the Messiah, the Anointed One. He wants to anoint your mind to understand the

Scriptures, so study the Word daily. He wants to anoint your prayer life for effective

intercession, so bring your requests to God. He wants to anoint your quiet time with His

presence, so seek *Jesus* now.

"Lord Jesus, my life is empty; I need a fresh filling today. Pour Your presence into my

life. Anoint me with Your power to live above temptations and trouble. Anoint me with

peace and confidence to live for You this day. Amen."

Reading: Dan. 9:24-27

Words: 246

Key Thought: Jesus can anoint your life so you can live above temptations and troubles.

THE LORD AND SAVIOR—JESUS

"For so an entrance will be supplied to you abundantly into the everlasting

kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 1:11).

Jesus is both The Lord and Savior. He is the Lord of the universe because He created

everything. He is the Lord of the nations because He created the first humans. He is the Lord of

nature because He holds everything together by His power. Jesus could have forced the first

parents to be obedient, but untested obedience doesn't glorify the Father. He had to give Adam

and Eve a free choice whether they would love God or rebel against Him. When the first parents

sinned, nature was cursed and humanity spun out of control. Death reigned over all people. It

was then that Jesus, the Lord of all, had to become Savior of all. Jesus came to die so you could

live. Now Jesus is The Lord and Savior of the world.

"Jesus, You are Lord and Savior, but everyone doesn't follow You. However, You are my

Savior and You are my Lord."

Jesus has provided salvation to all, but many will not accept it. He is neither their Savior from

sin, nor is He the *Lord* of their life. Some have been saved, but will not obey Him; *Jesus* is only

their Savior, not their Lord. Today, Jesus wants to be both your Savior and your Lord. Will you

let Him direct your life? When yielded to Jesus, He'll be both your Savior and Lord.

"Jesus, I want You to be both my Lord and Savior. I praise You for forgiving my sins and

I give You the control of my life. Amen."

Reading: 2 Peter 1:1-18

Words: 255

Key Thought: Jesus wants to be both your Lord and Savior.

DIVIDED TONGUES AS OF FIRE—HOLY SPIRIT

"Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of

them" (Acts 2:3).

The Holy Spirit is Divided Tongues as of Fire that came upon the disciples in the upper room on

the day of Pentecost. They had been praying for 40 days when the *Holy Spirit* came upon them.

The sign of tongues in the air was not illusionary; it was real. The Holy Spirit entered their life

and spoke through them with different languages. Since Jesus told them to peach the Gospel to

all people, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations (ethnic groups)" (Matt. 28:19), the

Holy Spirit gave them different languages to speak to all people. That means He can give you

the ability to speak your language to those who are not Christians. But more than knowledge of

a foreign language, the Holy Spirit was in their words, convicting of sin, exalting Jesus through

their lives, drawing people to salvation. Let the *Holy Spirit* speak through you today.

"Holy Spirit, come fill my life with Your presence. Speak through my words to my

unsaved friends and associates."

The Divided Tongues of Fire can purify you just as fire burns away impurities. The Holy Spirit

can cleanse your tongues, and clean up your thoughts. You can speak the pure Word of God

from a clean heart. And just as fire burns everything it touches, the Holy Spirit can cause the

message to burn in the hearts of those who listen to you.

"Holy Spirit, I will testify to some unsaved people today. When I speak, fill my words

with fire. Help me bring my friends to faith in Christ. Amen."

Reading: Acts 10:44-48

Words: 265

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit wants to use your words today.

THE LIGHT OF MEN—JESUS

"In Him was life, and the life was the light of men" (John 1:4).

There are all kinds of light—sunlight, moonlight, and light from a fire or candle. Satan is an

"angel of light" (2 Cor. 11:14), who attracts people to sin and death. The original source of all

light is Jesus the Light (John 8:12), who is The Light of Men. When people are lost in darkness,

Jesus is the Light of Salvation that directs people to Heaven. Just as light illuminates the right

path so people won't get lost, Jesus is the right path to Heaven. Just as a light will keep away

dangerous predators, Jesus is the Light that protects us on our journey. Just as a light makes it

possible to read and explore things, Jesus helps us learn and grow as Christians. Just as light

makes us comfortable in the night, Jesus gives us "the light of life.

There are several ways to walk in the light. We should hold it high to illuminate our

surroundings, just as we must hold *Jesus* high for all to see us as Christians. We must hold the

light in front of us to direct our steps, just as we must let Jesus guide our attitudes, thoughts, and

actions. We must hold the light near so we can read and learn, just as we must let Jesus into our

hearts and minds through Bible reading, meditation, and prayer.

"Lord Jesus, You are the Light of my life. Keep me from getting lost. Keep me from

getting hurt. Keep me from the dangers of sin. I will follow Your light. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 27:1-8

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus is my Light to guide me safely to God.

KING OF THE JEWS—JESUS

"Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in

the East and have come to worship Him" (Matthew 2:2).

Julius Caesar had put King Herod on the throne, so when Caesar was killed, Herod was

threatened and ran quickly to Rome to have the Senate appoint him as "king of the Jews." That

not only put Herod over Jerusalem and the surrounding territories, but it gave Herod authority

over Jews everywhere. No wonder Herod was "troubled" when wise men came looking for a

baby, born King of the Jews. No wonder Herod sent soldiers to Bethlehem to kill all babies two

years and under. Rome recognized Herod as the earthly king of the Jews, but the heavenly

Father recognized *Jesus* as the eternal *King of the Jews*.

"Lord Jesus, not only do I recognize You as the Jews and the King of my life, but I also

recognize You as King of the universe and King of heaven."

Some are made king because of their superior powers; other men wait until a father dies before

becoming king. Jesus was always King, and long before He will ascend the throne of Israel in

the coming millennium, He is King of the Jews. Jesus was born with that title, lived with that

title, and when He returns, all will recognize His title as King—King of the Jews. Jesus is King

of Kings and Lord of Lords. Is He the reigning King on the throne of your heart?

"Even so, come Lord Jesus; rule my life today. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 89:1-10

Words: 237

Key Thought: The King of the Jews wants to sit on the throne of your heart.

FLOODS UPON DRY GROUND—HOLY SPIRIT

"For I will pour water upon him who is thirsty, and floods upon dry ground: I will pour my spirit upon thy seed, and my blessings upon thine offspring" (Isaiah

44:3, KJV).

The Holy Spirit is Floods Upon Dry Ground. He pours out Himself on you to give refreshment.

Is your heart dry like cracked ground? Do you need water? Just as water draws the nutrients of

the soil into the plant to produce leaves and fruit, so the Holy Spirit is water who brings new life

to your life. Just as life-giving water upon dry ground gives fruit, the Holy Spirit can make you

grow spiritually.

"Holy Spirit, I need rejuvenation today. I feel like I'm drying up. The heat of temptation

has sapped my strength. The hot sun of opposition has threatened my life. Pour life-

giving water on me."

The Holy Spirit is Floods Upon Dry Ground. Just as ground with life-giving nutrients is useless

without water, so all the good things in your life are useless without the *Holy Spirit's* presence.

Just as ground without water will crack allowing the wind to blow it away, so your life without

the Holy Spirit will deteriorate and you'll begin losing precious values and relationships. But

water changes everything. It makes the ground soft. Let the *Holy Spirit* pour Himself into every

empty crevice of your life. Let Him soften you. Let Him fill you. Let Him refresh you, and

make you grow. Ask for the Holy Spirit then wait for rain.

"Holy Spirit, I am dry and needy. Pour Your presence into my life. Fill every crevice

with life-giving liquid. Help me grow and help me bear fruit. Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 44:1-8

Words: 263

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit brings life to dry ground.

SEPTEMBER 1

THE KING OF RIGHTEOUSNESS—JESUS

"To whom also Abraham gave a tenth part of all, first being translated 'king of righteousness,' and then also king of Salem, meaning 'king of peace'" (Hebrews

7:2).

Melchizedek had the title King of Righteousness and Jesus is the prototype of Melchizedek;

Jesus is The King of Righteousness for three reasons. First, Jesus is The King of Righteousness

because He is the source of holiness and righteousness. Both doing the right things and doing

them rightly come from Him. Second, Jesus will rule in a righteous way, which means He will

always do things right; yield to Jesus so He can direct your heart to do things right. Third,

Jesus will rule over a righteous kingdom. That hasn't happened yet but after His Second

Coming, Jesus will rule over a righteous kingdom on earth. You should live every day—

including this day—in preparation for His return and the coming of His righteous kingdom.

"Lord Jesus, in the past I have put You upon the throne of my heart. But for this new

day, I again crown You King of my life. Help me live a righteous life."

If Jesus is your King, He wants you to live a righteous life today, which means you'll think

right, decide right and act right. Jesus knows you're not perfect (1 John 1:8-10), but if you

intend to always do the right thing, He'll forgive your sins (1 John 1:7) and you'll grow in

grace. He'll bless you and use you.

"Lord Jesus, I purpose to do the right thing this day. Help me think right and understand

Your plan for my life. Help me make the right decisions, and give me strength to do the

right thing in the right way. Amen."

Reading: Heb. 7:4-10

Words: 262

Key Thought: You must give Jesus control to have a righteous life.

SEPTEMBER 2

A STONE OF STUMBLING—JESUS

"Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, the stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone, and a

stone of stumbling and a rock of offense" (1 Peter 2:7, 8).

Jesus is A Stone of Stumbling to the unsaved. They reject Christ because He demands they live

by His principles of Light, but they love darkness. They reject Christ because He demands they

walk the narrow way and enter Heaven by the straight gate (Matt. 7:13, 14), but they love the

broad way. They reject Jesus, the only Cornerstone, because they don't want to build their lives

on Him. Are you building your life on Jesus?

"Lord Jesus, I know You were rejected, but I accept You. I realize the world doesn't

want to build their lives and families on You, but You are my Cornerstone."

Jesus is A Stone of Stumbling. The unsaved are blinded by their sin, and blind people stumble in

the darkness. They treat Christ as if He never lived, but they can't ignore the truth. All creation

points to a Creator, the existence of laws points to a Lawgiver, and the offended conscience

points to the existence of right and wrong. Jesus is the Stone on which to build a life; but those

who ignore Him, will stumble over Him into Hell. Will you stumble over Him?

"Lord Jesus, You are the Cornerstone of the universe; everything is built on You. You

are the Cornerstone of a good marriage; strong families are built on You. You are the

Cornerstone of personal integrity. I will not stumble over Your demands; I will build my

life on You. Amen."

Reading: 1 Peter 2:7-8

Words: 242

Key Thought: Build your lives on Jesus, the Cornerstone.

SEPTEMBER 3

A DEPOSIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"God, who sealed us has also given us the Spirit in our hearts as a deposit that there are more good things coming" (2 Corinthians 1:21, 22, Author's

Translation).

The Holy Spirit is the Deposit in your life when you became a Christian to guarantee there are

more good things coming. You could not understand all God wanted to know when you got

saved. So, the *Holy Spirit* was placed into your life as a *Deposit—a down payment*—to let you

experience some of the spiritual blessings that you will eventually receive. As a *Deposit*, the

Holy Spirit wants you to be holy now; because you will be perfect in Heaven. As a Deposit, the

Holy Spirit wants to give you spiritual understanding now, promising that you will know much

more in Heaven. As a Deposit, the Holy Spirit wants to enrich your present life to give you a

foretaste of blessings to come in Heaven.

"Holy Spirit, I know You have come into my life as a foretaste of the good things to

follow. I like the taste of it, but I want more."

The Holy Spirit is the Deposit to let you know some of the wonderful things that await you in

Heaven. "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things

which God has prepared for those who love Him" (1 Cor. 2:9). But, don't get your eyes so fixed

on the future that you forget today. Remember what He'll do fully in the future, He'll begin to

do for you today.

"Lord, I want to know You better today because it'll help me know You more fully in the

future. Get me started now! Amen."

Reading: 2 Cor. 1:18-24

Words: 259

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will give you some experiences now that you'll get in Heaven.

BRIGHT AND MORNING STAR—JESUS

"I am . . . the Bright and Morning Star" (Revelation 22:16).

Jesus is the Bright and Morning Star; He shines in darkness to give all people hope. Just before the dawn, a bright star appears on the horizon where the sun will be coming over the horizon. That last star of the night and the first star of the day is called the morning star. Jesus is the Bright and Morning Star who promises the dark night of anxiety is almost over. The Morning Star announces the coming of the sun and a new day with new exciting possibilities.

"Lord, my heart is cold; I need the warmth of Your light. You are a bright star to my otherwise dark world; you are the morning star of hope. Help me forget my failures and troubles."

Jesus is the Bright and Morning Star. He brightens the dark morning sky after a long period of a black frustrating night. When you are tired of blindness, look to the eastern horizon; He will come. His light will kindle optimism for a new day. Look to His light and forget the cold night. Jesus is the Bright and Morning Star who is already there in the sky long before you can see Him. He's been there waiting for you. Now the sun is coming; a new day approaches. Don't fear this day; Jesus is here to help you. Get up and go meet your challenges.

"Morning Star, be even brighter for me this day; point me in the right direction. Star of hope, shine some light over here to give me hope. Amen."

Reading: John 7:14-36

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus is the Bright and Morning Star to give you optimism.

SON OF MAN—JESUS

"No one has ascended to heaven but He who came down from heaven, that is, the Son of Man who is in heaven. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up" (John 3:13, 14).

Jesus is The Son of Man. On earth, Jesus called Himself by this title more than any other name or title. Why? Because Jesus had never been a human. He was eternal God and had always been Deity, but when He was born of a virgin, He became flesh (John 1:14) to live among people and to die for their sins. He became fully God and fully man, both at the same time, all the time. Jesus originally formed Adam of the dust of the ground (Col. 1:16), the highest expression of all God created. After Adam and Eve sinned, Jesus had to come to redeem mankind. Just as Jesus created Adam in the image of God (Gen. 1:27), Jesus then had to become flesh after their pattern. Now Jesus indwells those who believe in Him, so they can become like Him.

"Thank You, Son of Man, for coming to give me an example of how to live. Thank You for dying on the cross for me; I worship You for Your purity and holiness."

Jesus The Son of Man will come again. His second coming is described in terms of humanity, "When the Son of Man comes" (Luke 18:8). Jesus was the first human to enter Heaven as He "led captivity captive" (Eph. 4:8), making it possible for redeemed humanity to live with God. Jesus will return as The Son of Man with "authority to execute judgment . . . because (He is) the Son of Man" (John 5:27).

"Lord, Jesus, I thank You for Your life, death, and I look forward to Your return for me. Amen."

Reading: John 5:26-32

Words: 269

Key Thought: Jesus can help us because He became the perfect man.

THE SPIRIT OF SUPPLICATION—HOLY SPIRIT

"And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the

Spirit of grace and supplication; then they will look on Me whom they pierced"

(Zechariah 12:10).

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Supplication. He receives your prayers and present them to the

Father. Many Christians "don't know how to pray as they ought to pray" or "they don't properly

phrase their prayers." The *Holy Spirit* helps them pray because "the Holy Spirit prays for [you]

with groanings that cannot be expressed in words" (Rom. 8:26). He makes intercession for you,

and the Father hears Him because He prays "according to the will of God" (Rom. 8:27). So,

pour out your heart to the Father; the Holy Spirit will be right beside you as the Spirit of

Supplication.

"Holy Spirit, I know You make intercession for believers, and you'll give people the

Spirit of Intercession. Make my prayers effective. Come teach me to pray and then pray

through me."

In the future, the Holy Spirit will cause Israel to see Jesus as the Messiah they've rejected, so

today He can help you see Jesus working in your life. The Holy Spirit can give you a greater

desire for prayer and actually help you pray. He can give you prayer requests and teach you the

proper attitude of prayer. He can help you pray in Jesus' name (John 14:13, 14). The Spirit of

Intercession can make your prayers effective. Claim His help today.

"Holy Spirit, I want to learn how to be more effective in prayer. When I pray wrongly,

convict me of my failures. When I pray rightly, confirm the way I should pray. Teach me

the Spirit of Supplication. Amen."

Reading: Zechariah 12:1-14

Words: 255

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will help you pray.

THE AMEN—JESUS

"And to the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write, 'These things says the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God'"

(Revelation 3:14).

Jesus is *The Amen*, the final Word on everything that is done by God. *The Amen* witness told the

Laodiceans, "I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot . . . so then, because you are

lukewarm . . . I will vomit you out of My mouth" (Rev. 3:15, 16). Compromise seems so

innocent and so easy; all one has to do is do nothing. These Laodiceans were doing nothing

good and nothing bad. Jesus told the Laodicean church—the compromising church—that He

had the final Word on their wayward life. They thought they were rich, but didn't know they

were "wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked" (Rev. 3:17).

"Lord, it's so easy to compromise. All I have to do is please myself, but I don't want to

be a compromising Christian. Forgive my lukewarm heart; I don't want to be rejected by

You. "

Jesus is *The Amen*, the final Word for your Christian life and success. "I counsel you to buy

from Me gold refined in the fire" (Rev. 3:18). Jesus wants nothing but the best for you.

However, the best is costly. The price is still total commitment to Him. "And he said to them

all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow

me" (Luke 9:23). Are you willing to give Him all?

"Lord, I will do what You want me to do; I will go where You want me to go; I will be

what You want me to be. I will pay the price. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 3:14-22

Key Thought: Jesus must have the final word in our life.

THE ALMIGHTY—JESUS

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End,' says the Lord, 'who

is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty" (Revelation 1:8).

Jesus' name Almighty comes from El Shaddai which means the One who satisfies all the

yearnings of the heart. This name comes from "Shad," i.e., "breast," the place where a crying

baby comes for comfort. The breast of Jesus is the place for comfort and nourishment. If you

are hurting or your spirit is crushed, The Almighty will comfort you. Come honestly to Him and

let His sufficiency become your satisfaction. The name Almighty also stands for the chest, the

symbol of strength. Jesus is The Almighty, the One who has power to look after Your needs and

give You protection. Do you need His power today?

"Jesus, I rest securely on Your strong breast, the place of comfort and protection. It's

good to know you care for me and it's good to know You can protect me. It's good to be

in Your presence; I don't want to leave."

Jesus is The Almighty, which means He is the strength-giver, the One who knows your

weaknesses. Look away from your weaknesses to Jesus; for when you want to give up, He can

give you strength to keep on living and working. What do you need from the *Almighty* today?

"Jesus, You are The Almighty One; take control of my fitful heart and give it peace.

Lord Jesus, sit upon the throne of my heart to give it direction this day. I completely

yield my will to Your almighty sufficiency. Amen."

Reading: Mark 4:35-41

Words: 240

Key Thought: Jesus has strength to comfort and protect you.

THE SPIRIT OF JEHOVAH—HOLY SPIRIT

"The spirit of Jehovah came mightily upon him, and the ropes that were upon his arms became as flax that was burnt with fire, and his bands dropped from off his

hands" (Judg. 15:14, ASV).

The Spirit of Jehovah is an Old Testament phrase that describes the Holy Spirit. Whereas the

name God tends to describe His absolute power in relationship to creation, the name Jehovah or

Lord tends to describe His sovereign power in relationship to people. Just as The Spirit of

Jehovah came upon Samson to loose him from the chains that bound him, He can come upon

you to give you victory over habits and addictions. Just as The Spirit of Jehovah came upon

Jephthah and Othniel to give them victory in battle; He can give you victory over temptations

and trials (Judg. 6:34; 11:29). Just as The Spirit of Jehovah enabled Gideon to call a courageous

army together, He can call all the forces of Heaven to your side (Judg. 6:34). Call upon Him

now.

"Holy Spirit, when I read the stories of great men and women, I realize how little I do for

You. Help me do more."

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Jehovah who gave strength to the judges. He raised them up for

leadership positions and gave them victory in battle. The judges were mere mortals like you; but

The Spirit of Jehovah made the difference in their lives. What He has done for them, He can do

for you.

"Holy Spirit, I know You are powerful. Flow Your power through me. I know You have

greatly used men and women in the past; use me today. Flow Your power through me.

Amen."

Reading: Judges 15:1-20

Words: 247

Key Thought: The issue is not doing more for the Holy Spirit, but letting the Holy Spirit do

more through you.

THE ADVOCATE—JESUS

"My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world" (1 John 2:1-2).

Jesus is the *Advocate*, the defense lawyer who will defend you against any accusations by Satan, "the accuser of our brethren" (Rev. 12:10). Let be your *Advocate*. Every time the enemy points out a sin in you, *Jesus* will defend you. Because, "The blood of Jesus Christ . . . cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). Let your *Lawyer* handle your sin.

"Jesus, thank You for being my Advocate. Satan discourages me. I admit that I am not perfect (1 John 1:2) and I confess my sin. Jesus, defend me against the enemy. I claim Your promise, 'There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus'" (Rom 8:1).

You can't plead ignorance or that you did not sin. "If you say that you have not sinned, you make Him a liar" (1 John 1:10, Author's Translation). Tell your *Advocate* what you've done. He is your defense lawyer. Let Him put together your defense and plead it to the Father. The *Advocate* will know how to defend your case. He will plead the blood, which satisfies all legal claims against you. Don't try to go it alone; you can get forgiveness for all your sin (1 John 1:7).

"Lord, sometimes my biggest problem is myself; I am guilt-ridden, or I get discouraged, or I want to just give up. Come, Advocate, defend me from my doubts and self-incrimination. Help me to be victorious in life. Amen."

Reading: 1 John 2:1-6

Key Thought: Jesus can defend you from the attacks of the enemy.

THE SACRIFICE FOR SINS—JESUS

"But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the

right hand of God" (Hebrews 10:12).

Jesus is The Sacrifice for Sins; you don't have to worry about sins again. When Jesus gave

Himself for your sins, God completely forgave you. Why? Because Jesus was the perfect

sacrifice. Because God demanded a life for each transgression, Jesus gave His life for you. He

took your punishment and was your substitute. Because God will not let us in Heaven with sin,

Jesus wiped the slate clean. Today you stand forgiven before God. Why don't you thank Him

for *The Sacrifice For Sins*?

"Thank You, Jesus, for Your life that has been given for me. Thank You for forgiveness

of sins. Help me please You in all I do today."

Jesus is your Sacrifice for Sins; you please the Father when you approach Him through the blood

of Jesus. All your sins of the past have been forgiven. All your present imperfections and

failures are forgiven. All your future transgressions are forgiven. Why? Because "the blood of

Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). ALL means all past sins, all present

sins, and all future sins. Remember, Jesus "offered one sacrifice for sins forever" (Heb. 10:12).

Come to the Father through Him, because *Jesus* is your Intercessor at the Father's right hand.

"Jesus, I stand confidently before the Father in Your accomplishments of Calvary. You

are my priest who stands at the Father's right hand. I pray boldly to the Father through

You. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 10:1-13

Words: 241

Key Thought: You come confidently to the Father through Jesus' sacrifice for sins.

THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH—HOLY SPIRIT

"And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever—the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you" (John 14:16, 17).

The *Holy Spirit* is *The Spirit of Truth*. Jesus sent Him to indwell all believers to witness to them what is truth. There is much error in the world today in advertising, business and human relationships. Jesus sent the *Holy Spirit* into your life to reveal divine truth to you. People who refuse to believe in Jesus do not know the truth. They think they're right about spiritual things, yet because they deny Jesus, they don't know the truth. They may try to lead you astray, telling you they have the truth; but if they deny the Bible, they don't have the truth (John 17:17). Some will mislead you intentionally about spiritual things, while others do it ignorantly. If they do not agree with Jesus, they don't have the truth. Jesus said, "I am . . . the truth" (John 14:6). When you are yielded to *The Spirit of Truth*, He will communicate truth to you. Will you let Him control your thoughts?

"Holy Spirit, be my guide; I seek truth in the Bible (John 17:17) and I seek truth in Jesus (John 14:6)."

The Spirit of Truth is sent to live in you forever. He was not sent to help you occasionally, nor intermittently. Rely on *The Spirit of Truth* to guide you at any time, and all the time, no matter what issues you face. The Spirit of Truth will help you understand the Bible and Jesus.

"Holy Spirit, come guide my thought processes. Guide my reading and listening so I can know the truth. I yield to Your instruction. Amen."

Reading: Mark 9:14-29

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will lead you into truth.

A PROPHET WITHOUT HONOR—JESUS

"So they were offended at Him. But Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is not without

honor except in his own country and in his own house" (Matthew 13:57).

When Jesus returned to His hometowns, the people did not receive Him; He was the Prophet

Without Honor. The people of Nazareth knew Him as a boy growing up among them. As a

young carpenter, Jesus worked among them. But, when Jesus first returned to announce He was

fulfilling Scripture (Luke 4:21), they rejected Him and, "were filled with wrath" (Luke 4:28).

They ran Jesus out of town, and some tried to throw Him off a cliff (Luke 4:24). As a result,

Jesus said, "A prophet is honored everywhere except in his own hometown and among his own

family" (Matt. 13:57, NLT).

"Jesus, I accept You, no matter who won't recognize You. I honor You, even though

many reject You. You are my Lord and Savior."

How could those closest to the Child Jesus, end up rejecting Him? Some were spiritually

blinded because of unbelief; they couldn't see the Child who didn't sin. Some were spiritually

prejudiced; they were looking for a political Messiah to deliver them. Some were sinfully

blinded; they looked at everything through their sinful lusts. As a result, "He did not do many

mighty works there because of their unbelief" (Matt. 13:58).

"Lord Jesus, I know You as my Savior from sin; come into my life. I know You as my

guide and protector; come lead me today. I know You as my friend and helper; come

dwell in my heart. I know You as my coming King; come, Lord Jesus, in power and

glory. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 13:54-58; Luke 4:16-30

Key Thought: You must honor Jesus even when some will not.

THE SEED OF THE WOMAN—JESUS

"And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel" (Genesis

3:15).

Jesus is The Seed of the Woman who judged Satan. After Adam and Eve sinned, God promised

them a seed (child) who would judge the serpent who tempted them to disobedience. Their first

child Cain was not the one who would crush the serpent's head. After many centuries, Jesus was

born to the Virgin Mary, i.e., the Seed of the Woman. Jesus was the promised head-crusher. If

you are tempted to sin, as were Adam and Eve, don't give into the Evil One. Call on Jesus for

help. Because He crushed the head of the serpent at the cross, Jesus can save you in your hour of

temptation.

"Lord, Jesus, thank You for Your victory on Calvary over Satan. I need Your help today."

I trust Your power to overcome temptation. Give me victory."

Jesus is The Seed of the Woman who crushed Satan's domain on the cross (John 12:37). This is

a past accomplishment. Look to Him for victory. Now, He lives in your heart to give you daily

victory over temptation and the power of sin (Col. 2:14, 15). Yield to His power. In the future,

Jesus will completely rid the earth of Satan's presence among mankind (Rev. 20:1-3). Pray for

that day to come.

"Lord, Jesus, thank You for Your past victory over Satan on the cross. Thank You for

Your present deliverance over temptation. I look forward to the day when I will never be

tempted again. May Your kingdom rule on earth as You rule in Heaven. Amen."

Reading: Genesis 3:1-24

Words: 253

Key Thought: Jesus—the seed of the woman—has crushed the serpent's head so we can have

victory.

THE WISDOM OF HIS SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"I pray that the great God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ may give you the wisdom of His Spirit. Then you will be able to understand the secrets about Him

as you know Him better" (Ephesians 1:17, NLV).

The Wisdom of His Spirit is the Holy Spirit. He gives believers insight into the Word of God.

Because some believers don't understand God's will, He helps them see and understand spiritual

truths (2 Cor. 4:3, 4). Because unsaved people will not believe the Word of God, He convicts

them of their sin (John 16:9). Because some reject the Scriptures, He uses their conscience to

enlighten them (Rom. 2:14-15). It is the task of the *Holy Spirit* to give all people the wisdom of

God.

"Holy Spirit, I realize that I know very little about spiritual things. Show me what I need

to know and help me remember to use what You show me."

The theme of the Book of Proverbs is "get knowledge so you can gain wisdom." Therefore, you

learn the Word of God by acquiring facts or knowledge about God. The more facts you know

about Scripture, the wiser you can become. Knowledge is learning Bible information; wisdom is

understanding the meaning of the Bible and applying it to your life. That's where the *Holy Spirit*

comes in. The Wisdom of His Spirit helps you understand the Bible and apply it to your life.

The Holy Spirit gives you Wisdom of His Spirit as you study the Bible. When you yield to the

Holy Spirit, He helps you understand the will of God.

"Holy Spirit, I will study the Scriptures to master them. I want to know everything You

want me to know, so I can have wisdom. Enter my mind, Wisdom of Spirit, so I can grow

spiritually. Amen."

Reading: 1 Cor. 2:6-8

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit gives you wisdom as you learn the Scriptures.

THE SON OF THE BLESSED—JESUS

"But He kept silent and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked Him,

saying to Him, 'Are You the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?'" (Mark 14:61).

During the trial of Jesus, the High Priest asked Him, "Are You . . . the Son of the Blessed?"

(Mark 14:61). The rabbis used the title *The Blessed* as a substitute for the name Jehovah; they

didn't want to blaspheme the Lord's name by carnal speech. The sarcastic High Priest didn't

realize Jesus was actually The Son of the Blessed; therefore, he didn't receive blessings from

Jesus. The High Priest didn't realize Jesus was the Christ—the Messiah—therefore he didn't

believe in Him or worship *Jesus*.

"Jesus, I recognize who You are. I accept You as Christ who died for my sins. I realize

You are the Son of God, so I worship You."

The High Priest knew all about the doctrine of Messiah in his head, but rejected the person of

Messiah who stood before him. The Jewish leaders knew in their heads all the names of God,

but when their Messiah stood before them, they were blinded by their unbelief. Doubt begins in

the heart when we feed our appetites on sin. Corrupted belief comes from corrupted living.

Keep yourself from outward evil so you won't deny the Lord, as did the High Priest.

"Jesus, I recognize You are The Son of the Blessed. Be honored in my life. Amen."

Reading: Mark 14:53-65

Words: 214

Key Thought: Jesus is the Son of God who blessed us.

THE BEGINNING AND THE END—JESUS

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End, "says the Lord,

"Who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty" (Revelation 1:8).

Jesus is the Beginning and the End; He was the Creator of all things, because nothing existed

before Him, not the earth, not the throne, not even Heaven itself. "For by Him all things were

created" (Col. 1:16). He is the Beginning of time, of space, of matter, of human beings. Jesus

initiated everything. Since Jesus began it all, He's in control.

"Lord, I know You're the Creator, but the world is filled with chaos. I want to see Your

plan unfolding in my life. Help me see Your purpose in the small details of my life."

Jesus is the Beginning and the End. What Jesus began, He will also finish. He will finish His

plan and purpose on this earth. Nothing will keep Him from completing His perfect will, no

dictator, terrorist, nuclear explosion, or war. So don't worry what will happen in your life today.

Just because you can't see Jesus' overall plan for your life, doesn't mean there is no plan. Just

because you don't understand events around you, doesn't mean Jesus doesn't know about them.

Because Jesus is the Beginning and the End, He has absolute sovereignty over the broad sweep

of history as well as in the small details of your life. Jesus began history and He will end history,

so He can control everything in between.

"Lord, open my eyes to see Your big picture. I am so small; help me see how I fit into

Your big plan. Lord, I want to complete Your purpose for my life. Amen."

Reading: Acts 7:1-50

Words: 256

Key Thought: Jesus has a plan for your life.

THE SPIRIT OF MIGHT—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD" (Isaiah 11:2).

The *Holy Spirit* is *The Spirit of Might*; He exercised great power in creation, resurrection, judgment, and the supernatural miracles of the Bible. He can forgive your sins, fix your life, guide you this day and keep you from the Evil One. He can accomplish God's perfect plan in your life. Will you let *The Spirit of Might* do it?

"O Spirit of Might, teach me Your power. Give me the necessary ability to carry out the decisions You lead me to make. I need greater faith in You."

The secret of the Christian life is not to have "great faith in God." Did not Jesus recognize the smallness of belief when He said, "O you of little faith" (Matt. 14:31)? The secret is to "have faith in a great God." The *Holy Spirit* is *The Spirit of Might;* when you realize His great strength and the great things He can do for you, your faith will be strengthened to believe in far greater things. Don't just pray for greater faith, pray for understanding of God, then you can have greater faith. The One who can give you that greater estimation of God is *The Spirit of Might* who already dwells in your heart. Ask Him now for the faith you need for this day.

"O Spirit of Might, I pray with the disciples, "Increase our faith" (Luke 17:5). I recognize You can do all You promise in Scriptures; now I claim that work in my heart today. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 4:1-16

Key Thought: You don't need greater faith, you need a greater understanding of God.

OUR HOPE—JESUS

"... by the commandment of God our Savior and the Lord Jesus Christ, our hope" (1 Timothy 1:1).

Jesus is your Hope when things go wrong; He can change circumstances when you pray. Jesus is your Hope when you're in a hole and it seems you can't get out. He can transform you in the hole or He can get you out. When your hole has you boxed in with no escape, Jesus can make a way of escape (1 Cor. 10:13). Sometimes God lets you stay in your hole to learn lessons. And your hole becomes a classroom to teach you the perfect will of God. But even when you're laboring in difficulty, Jesus is your Hope because He can change your attitude and outlook on life. He can teach you what you need to learn. Jesus can give you purpose and make the hole worthwhile.

"Jesus, You are my hope; I put all my trust in You to work all things together for good (Rom. 8:28). Teach me what I must learn from my circumstances. When I don't understand what's happening around me, give me hope for the future."

Jesus is the *Hope* of future life for all believers, because all must die. But after death, He will return to resurrect all the bodies who believe in Him. You can have hope beyond the grave, for *Jesus* promises you will live after death. You will live with Him forever in Heaven (John 14:1-3).

"Jesus, how can I be hopeless when 'I abide in You and You abide in me' (John 15:5, Author's Paraphrase). You give me hope in this life and give me confidence beyond the grave. You are the only hope I have. Amen."

Reading: 1 Tim. 1:15-20

Words: 269

Key Thought: You have hope when you have Jesus.

PRAYING IN HIS NAME—JESUS

"If you ask anything in My (Jesus) name, I will do it" (John 14:14).

Jesus is the name through whom you get your prayers answered. God created humans so they

would have daily needs, that way they will depend on God and cry out daily to Him. "Your

Father knows the things you have need of before you ask Him" (Matt. 6:8). Through prayer,

God will provide your needs, but you must ask in Jesus' name; "Whatever you ask in My name,

that I will do" (John 14:13).

"In Jesus' name, I ask for strength to make it through this day. In Jesus' name, I ask for

wisdom to make good decisions. In Jesus' name, I ask for guidance through my

problems."

Why must you pray in Jesus' name? First, Jesus told you to ask in His name. Next, you come to

the Father through Jesus' cleansing blood. Finally, Jesus is your intercessor at the right hand of

the Father; in Him you have "a new and living way . . . through the veil" (Heb. 10:20).

Therefore, ask in Jesus' name because "There is one . . . Mediator between God and men, the

Man Christ Jesus" (1 Tim. 2:15). Ask in Jesus' name because no one is closer to the Father than

Jesus Christ, and you are as close to the heart of God as His Son when you come in Jesus' name.

"In the name of Jesus, I ask for forgiveness of sins so I can intercede to the Father.

Through the intercession of the Son, I ask that You would hear me. Amen."

Reading: John 14:13-15

Words: 253

Key Thought: You must pray in Jesus' name to get answers to your prayers.

THE SPIRIT OF THE FEAR OF THE LORD—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and

understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD" (Isaiah 11:2).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of the Fear of the Lord. He works in the hearts of people to

reverence the Father. When people take the Father's name in vain, or sin against the Son, He

convicts them of their transgressions and shows them where they fall short. He is the *Holy Spirit*

who convicts people of sin. He gives people a spirit of reverence to approach the Father.

"O Spirit of Reverence, I am blinded by my own good works. Many times I don't realize

when I sin. Remind me any time I step out of line. Give me a sensitive spirit of obedience

to the Father."

The Spirit of Fear will shine light on your sinful habits to make you aware of them and help you

abstain from them. He will then change your attitudes that are offensive to the Father. He can

give you a reverential heart. A Spirit of Reverence will keep you from evil and give you a thirst

for godliness. The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Reverence who will show you when and how to

pray.

"Lord, I know You punish sin in the lives of Your children and You judge the

transgressions of the unsaved. Teach me godly fear when I sin. Fill me with Your

presence so I won't sin again. I receive Your love, I stand in awe of Your power, and I

receive Your Spirit of Reverence. Amen."

Reading: Exodus 33:1-34:9

Words: 240

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit teaches us to reverence the Father.

THE SPIRIT WHOM HE HAS GIVEN US—HOLY SPIRIT

"Now he who keeps His commandments abides in Him, and He in him. And by this we know that He abides in us, by the Spirit whom He has given us." (1 John

3:24).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit Whom the Father Has Given Us. He is the One that Jesus promised

to give you (John 14:17). There are no good works you can do to receive the *Holy Spirit*; He is a

gift. Just as a gift is given without obligation, so the *Holy Spirit* is given freely to you. All you

did was "believe on the name of His Son Jesus Christ" (1 John 3:23), and the Holy Spirit came

into your heart to give you assurance of salvation. Because you have the Holy Spirit living in

your life, you can know—have the assurance—that you are a child of God.

"Holy Spirit, I receive You gratefully as I would receive any gift. Thank You for entering

my life. Thank You for assurance of salvation."

The Holy Spirit is a gift to all believers. When He was sent on the Day of Pentecost, He

appeared as the sound of a mighty rushing wind and as cloven tongues of fire (Acts 2:1-4). He

was manifested with mighty symbols to tell all believers that He will do a mighty work when He

enters their hearts. Just as the *Holy Spirit* came upon all believers in the upper room (Acts 2:4),

so the He enters all who are saved. As a matter of fact, Paul says, "If anyone does not have the

Spirit of Christ, he is not His" (Rom. 8:9).

"Holy Spirit, thank You for indwelling my heart. Thank You for the spirit of confidence

that is greater than the spirit of anxiety. Thank You for giving me the assurance of

eternal life. Amen."

Reading: 1 John 3:16-4:11

Key Thought: Everyone who is a Christian has the Holy Spirit.

HE WHO IS HOLY AND TRUE—JESUS

"These things says He who is holy, He who is true" (Revelation 3:7).

Jesus is called He Who Is Holy. Great revivals in past centuries began when believers saw God's

holiness. It was then that believers saw their sinfulness, crying out in repentance and seeking

God's forgiveness. Revival is when God visits His people. It happens because God said, "I will

pour out My Spirit on all flesh" (Acts 2:17). Revival starts with God's holiness and grows when

people experience His presence in their lives. Do you want revival?

"Lord, I yearn for Your presence in my life. I want to feel Your atmospheric presence in

the church. Do for me what you did in the early church."

Jesus is also called He That Is True. True revival begins when you look at your life through

God's truthfulness. No one is holy compared to God; everything pales in comparison to His

truth. Jesus is He That Is Both Holy and True. Jesus said to the church, "See, I have set before

you an open door, and no one can shut it" (Rev. 3:8). The door of opportunity is always open to

God's people. We must look through the door to see the Lord's holiness, which is the first step

of revival. Then we must act on the truthfulness of His promise. That's when His presence is

poured out on us.

"Lord, I want true godliness in my life; keep me from false spirituality. I want to serve

You effectively; don't let my ignorant sin hold back Your blessings. Lord, send revival to

Your church and start with me. Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus wants us to be holy and truthful.

THE SPIRIT WHO DWELLS IN YOU—HOLY SPIRIT

"But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His

Spirit who dwells in you" (Romans 8:11).

The Spirit Who Dwells in You is the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Godhead. Long before

the Holy Spirit indwelt you, He indwelt Jesus Christ. At the beginning of His ministry, Jesus

was "filled with the Holy Spirit" (Luke 4:1). After Jesus preached, He "returned in the power of

the Spirit to Galilee" (Luke 4:14). Jesus said, "The Spirit of the LORD is upon Me" (Luke 4:18).

When Jesus faced death, the indwelling Spirit helped sustain His sufferings. When He died, the

Holy Spirit was with Him in the tomb. When Jesus was raised on the third day, the Holy Spirit

brought Him from the dead. Just as He was with Jesus, so He'll be with you in your hour of

suffering and death.

"Holy Spirit, I can face problems when You are with me. I can even face death because I

have both You and Christ dwelling in my life."

Christianity is much more than creeds, rituals, and religious practices. Christianity is having the

Holy Spirit dwell within you (John 14:17). The Holy Spirit has many ministries in your life, but

one of the most important is to raise you up in the day of resurrection, just as He raised up Jesus.

You can live triumphantly and die confidently because the *Holy Spirit* indwells you.

"Holy Spirit, You give me great confidence to live on this earth because I know what will

happen at death. I submit to Your will and ask that You guide me through this life.

Amen."

Reading: Romans 8:1-11

Words: 253

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit can give you resurrected life just as he gave to Jesus.

I AM HE WHO LIVES—JESUS

"I am He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen"

(Revelation 1:18).

Jesus said, "I Am He Who Lives" for in His death He overcame sin and death. Even

though you are a sinner (Rom. 3:23), and you will die, you can overcome sin and death

when you live in Jesus. He went to the grave and testifies, "I Am He Who Was Dead."

Jesus died for your sin that you might not die. Now Jesus testifies, "I Am Alive

Forevermore." When you live in Christ, you too will live forevermore. Jesus breathes

eternal life into the soul of those who trust Him for salvation. They will live as long as He lives.

That will be forever because He says, "I Am Alive Forevermore."

"Lord, I know You are alive forevermore, but I have a difficult time thinking about

eternal life. I am a captive in this physical body and all I can think about is here and

now. Help me understand my life. Help me find satisfaction and meaning in this world."

Not only does Jesus give duration of life—eternal life—but He also gives abundant life (John

10:10). He can give you joy, fulfillment and fruitfulness. He can use you in His service and

your life can make a difference in the world. You can be happy and satisfied when you let Him

live His life through you. But you must ask for it and claim it.

"Lord, I will yield my life to You. Fill me today with Your presence. Give me "life and

life more abundantly" to live for You. Amen."

Reading: Psalms 1

Words: 254

Key Thought: Jesus wants to put His abundant life in you.

INTERCESSOR—JESUS

"But He, because He continues forever, has an unchangeable priesthood.

Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through

Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them" (Hebrews 7:24-25).

Jesus is your Intercessor. When He was raised from the dead, He ascended into Heaven to sit at

the right hand of God the Father. As your Intercessor, Jesus can present your prayer to the

Father; as a lawyer presents a case to the judge. Just as the lawyer speaks on the behalf of

another, Jesus will present your case to the heavenly Father. So you come to the Father through

Jesus.

"I need an Intercessor because I feel so unworthy to pray. Jesus be my Intercessor; ask

the Father to forgive my sin and cleanse me by Your blood."

Maybe you've not gotten answers to your prayers because you've asked for the wrong thing, or

you've asked with the wrong attitude, or you've asked at the wrong time. Come to the Father

through Jesus, He will be your Intercessor to communicate your prayers to the Father. He will

pray the right request, at the right time with the right attitude. Jesus can be your Intercessor,

because He became flesh (John 1:14) and lived among us as a man. As your High Priest, He

understands your weaknesses for He faced the same temptations that you face, yet He did not sin.

Now you can come boldly to the throne to the heavenly Father through *Jesus*" (Heb. 4:15-16).

"Thank You for understanding me and forgiving me. Thank You for correctly presenting

my prayers to the Father. I feel confident when You plead my case for me. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 7:14-28

Words: 246

Key Thought: As your Intercessor, Jesus can plead your case to the Father.

THE SPIRIT OF KNOWLEDGE—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the

fear of the LORD" (Isaiah 11:2).

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Knowledge; it is His presence in the words of Scripture that helps

you to see what is true. It is His presence that inspires the accuracy of human authors as they

wrote the Scriptures so you can trust what you read in the Bible. It is His presence that fills each

word in the Bible so your "heart will burn within you" (Luke 24:32), as you read the words of

Scripture.

"O Spirit of Knowledge, I have head knowledge of the Scriptures, but I want my heart

warmed with the Bible. I want the Word of God to capture me and compel me to live for

You today."

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Knowledge; He can do much for you that you do not yet realize;

"Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God

has prepared for those who love Him" (1 Cor. 2:9). To fully understand, you must let the Holy

Spirit teach you because "God (the Father) has revealed them to us through His Spirit" (1 Cor.

2:10). Ask for the Spirit's indwelling presence to enter your understanding, then yield to His

guidance.

"O Spirit of Knowledge, I will study the Word of God to learn more of You. I will apply

the principles of Scripture to my life so I can obey You. I will obey the commands of

Scripture to follow You. I will meditate on the words of Scripture to grow in Christ.

Amen."

Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-16

Words: 259

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit can give you correct knowledge.

HIM WHO IS AND WHO WAS AND WHO IS TO COME—JESUS

"Grace to you and peace from Him who is and who was and who is to come"

(Revelation 1:4).

Jesus is the one called "Him Who Is." He is alive and because He lives, you can enjoy His

life. Are you afraid of something that might happen today? Don't look at your problems,

look to Jesus. Jesus lives in the present tense, He is called, "Him Who Is." He can take care

of you today because He knows the past and the future; but He also knows today. Jesus also

lives in the past tense. He is called, "Him Who Was;" the past is the same to Jesus as the

present. He knows what you did in the past, but remember "the blood of Jesus Christ His

Son cleanses us from all sin" (I John 1:7). If He can cleanse the past, why can't you forget

it?

"Lord, I face my guilt from my past. I did some things I'd like to forget. Come forgive

me, cleanse me, and help me forget."

Jesus is also called "He Who Is To Come." He lives in the future tense. He knows what will

happen tomorrow and everyday thereafter, because Jesus is eternal. You don't need to know

the future; all you need to know is Him. Jesus is "He Who Is To Come." Jesus will be with

you when you walk through the dark valley of the shadow of death. But perhaps you'll be

part of that generation that'll not die. Perhaps you'll meet Jesus in the rapture. You'll meet

"He Who Is To Come."

"Lord, help me look beyond my small world. Lord, help me see 'You Who Lives, Who

Was, and Who Is To Come.' Amen."

Reading: Psalms 90

Words: 267

Key Thought: Jesus knows your past, your present conditions and your future.

A LIFE-GIVING SPIRIT—JESUS

"The first man Adam became a living being. The last Adam became a life-giving

spirit" (1 Corinthians 15:45).

Jesus is A Life-Giving Spirit because He was victorious over death and the grave; He now has

power to give life to everyone who believes in Him. Jesus submitted to the death of a cross and

allowed them to bury Him in a tomb. On the third day He overcame the power of the grave and

arose victorious. Because Jesus lives, now He can give life to His followers. You have received

the Life-Giving Spirit from Jesus; will you let it flow through you today?

"Jesus, I believe in You. When You died, my sin died with You. When You were buried, I

was identified with You in the grave. When You arose from the death; I was in You so

now I have access to resurrection power. Give me power to serve You."

Because Jesus is a Life-Giving Spirit, you now have life—eternal life. You'll never die. And

your new life is victorious life; you can overcome temptation and sin. You can have an

enlightened life; you can know the will of God and understand spiritual things. You can have a

ministering life; Jesus can use your spiritual gifts to minister to others. Will you let Jesus live

through you? Will you let His life flow through you?

"Jesus, I want to live this day in the power of Your life. I want a victorious life over

temptation, an enlightened life to experience Your leadership in my life, and a

ministering life to serve You. Amen."

Reading: 1 Cor. 15:45-58

Words: 248

Key Thought: Jesus gives life because of His death.

THE SPIRIT OF COUNSEL—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the

fear of the LORD" (Isaiah 11:2).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Counsel; He can guide you in decision-making and show you

where you must go. He can help you solve problems, so you will choose right paths for today.

"O Spirit of Counsel, I don't trust my ability to discern what I see. Come help me make

good choices today."

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Counsel; He will help you understand the principles of Scripture

upon which you make decisions, but you must study carefully the Word to know what He wants

you to do. He is The Spirit of Counsel to give you wisdom through the insights of other

believers, but you must weigh carefully their motives and grasp of the situation before making

decisions. He is *The Spirit of Counsel* who speaks to you through your common sense to make

correct choices, but you must be yielded to His control. He can even guide you as you examine

the lessons you've learned from past experiences, as you guide your life; but in the final analysis,

you must do what the *Holy Spirit* wants you to do.

"O Spirit of Counsel, I will study carefully the Scriptures to know your principles; help

me see Your specific plan for my life. I will listen to the counsel of mature believers; help

me determine the best action for my life. I will use the common sense You've given me;

help me remember what You've taught me in the past. I will apply my mind to acquire as

many facts as possible about my decisions, so You can guide me to choose what is best.

Amen."

Reading: Proverbs 1

Words: 272

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will help you make right decisions.

THE BRIDEGROOM—JESUS

"He who has the bride is the bridegroom; but the friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly because of the bridegroom's voice" (John

3:29).

Jesus is The Bridegroom. When you received Jesus Christ as Savior, you became His bride.

Just as a wife looks to a husband for protection, you should trust Him because He will guard you

from the Evil One. He is *Bridegroom* to keep you from sin. Just as a husband provides for the

needs of his wife, Jesus will provide for your needs. Look to Him when you lack anything. He

will supply. If you have any needs, why don't you ask Him now?

"Lord, I accept Your protection; keep me safe. I rest securely in Your presence, keep my

mind focused on all You do for me. I need to love You more and I need to feel Your love.

You are my Bridegroom so I know You will provide for me."

Jesus is The Bridegroom and He'll always be there for you. You don't have to worry that God

has forgotten you or doesn't love you. Just as a husband is commanded to love his wife, so Jesus

loves you and cherishes you. You belong to Him and He belongs to you. Nothing can take you

away from the oneness you have with Jesus. Why don't you tell Him about your love now.

"Lord, I love You for all You've done for me. But most of all, I love You for Yourself.

You are the perfection of beauty and grace. You are my Bridegroom and I am yours.

Amen."

Reading: Song of Solomon 2:4-3:5

Words: 241

Key Thought: Jesus will take care of you because He loves you.

THE DESIRE OF ALL NATIONS—JESUS

"I will shake all nations, and they shall come to the Desire of All Nations, and I

will fill this temple with glory,' says the LORD of hosts" (Haggai 2:7).

Jesus is The Desire of all Nations. At the present time the nations do not look for Jesus, nor is

He in their thinking. They do not desire Him. But there is coming a time in the future when the

nations will desire Him. The prophet Haggai told the Jews who returned from Babylonian

captivity to rebuild the Temple. The Jewish people felt defeated because their present

circumstances were not as glorious or spiritual as in the past. Haggai promised them that The

Desire of all Nations would come into the Temple that they would build. That prophecy was

first fulfilled when Jesus came into the Temple as a twelve-year-old boy. But the Jewish nation

didn't know Jesus was their Messiah, they had no desire to accept Him. The Jewish leaders

desired political peace but they refused the inner peace He offered. They desired a Jewish

kingdom, but they refused His rule. Jesus was what they desired, but they were blind to His

presence. Jesus will come at the end of time. His presence will come into the millennial Temple

to fulfill what Haggai said, "I will fill this house with glory" (Hag 2:7). One day Jesus, The

Desire of all Nations, will come. Then every nation will desire to come worship Him. The glory

that *Jesus* will give to the future Temple, He can bring to your heart today.

"Come, Desire of Nations, come into my heart and fill me with the glorious experience of

what You can do today. Come, Desire of Nations, come in your glorious appearing.

Amen."

Reading: Haggai 1, 2

Words: 261

Key Thought: One day every nation will desire to worship Jesus.

THE SPIRIT OF ADOPTION—HOLY SPIRIT

"For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the

Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, 'Abba, Father'" (Romans 8:15).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Adoption Who placed you in the family of God. The Spirit of

Adoption facilitated your legal adoption by God the Father. Now that you have all the "rights" of

God's children, you can call Him Abba, Father. Just as children are legal heirs of all the

Father's possessions, so you can inherit all the riches and benefits of Heaven. Because none of

us is worthy to be God's children, our adoption is a gift of grace. It was through the death of

Christ that our sins were forgiven, giving us a basis to become God's children.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for making me a legal child of God, thank You for my adoption."

Now, help me please my Father and serve Him."

The Spirit of Adoption makes all the Father's wealth available to you. The Holy Spirit gives you

a new nature (Eph. 5:22-24) and intercedes to the Father for you (Rom. 8:26, 27). The Holy

Spirit can show you all the glories of heaven (Eph. 2:7) and give you Christian character (Gal.

5:22, 23). All that the Father wants to do for you, the *Holy Spirit* will deliver to you. But you

must desire these benefits and claim them.

"Holy Spirit, I was an alien from God, without hope and without promise (Eph. 2:12),

but You drew me to salvation. You made it possible for me to be adopted into Your

family. Thank You for this new relationship to the Father. Now, help me live as a child

of God should live. Amen."

Reading: 2 Samuel 9:1-13

Words: 261

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit adopted you into God's family.

PROPHET—JESUS

"The LORD your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your midst,

from your brethren. Him you shall hear" (Deuteronomy 18:15).

Jesus is called a *Prophet*; this was a title given to Him by Moses who predicted Jesus' coming

into the world. Just as Moses gave the people God's Law, he predicted Jesus would be a prophet

to give them God's message. Jesus came with a message of hope and forgiveness for all. But

He also has a message for you today. Will you listen to His message?

"Lord, I need to hear from You today. I need some hope in my life because the world

seems hopeless. I need continual forgiveness of sins."

Jesus is the *Prophet* who predicted the future. He can "fore-tell" God's message because He is

eternal. Jesus knows what will happen to you in the future because Jesus is God. He wants to

guide your life because He knows what is best for you. Will you follow Him? Jesus is the

Prophet who also "forth-tells" the message of God. Just as prophets aggressively "told-forth"

God's message in the Old Testament, Jesus boldly gave God's message while on earth. The

message of Jesus the Prophet has already been written in the pages of Scripture. If you want His

message, you must study carefully the Scriptures; pray diligently and apply the Word of God to

your life.

"O Lord, my Prophet, tell me from the Scriptures what You want me to know. I look to

You to lead me today. I accept Your message and will do it. Amen."

Reading: Deut. 18:15-23

Words: 241

Key Thought: Jesus has a message for you.

HIS SON FROM HEAVEN—JESUS

"... and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, even

Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come" (I Thessalonians 1:10).

Jesus is God's Son Who Will Come From Heaven. Therefore, you should live a godly life

anticipating His return. Look at the example of the Thessalonicans; they turned to God from

idols to serve the living and true God and to anticipate the return of the Son of God from Heaven.

Because Jesus is God's Son Who Will Come From Heaven, don't just spend your time waiting as

if there is nothing to do. Serve Him as if He'll not come in your lifetime. He hasn't returned for

approximately 2000 years. Yet look to Heaven as if He'll come at any minute. If you think He

may come at any moment, you will work longer, and harder and smarter. You will adjust all of

your life in light of His return.

"Lord Jesus, I know in my heart You can come in the next minute, but since You didn't

come in the past, it's hard to keep on expecting Your second return at any minute. How

can I keep my anticipation sharp?"

The key is *relationship*; if you love *Jesus* and are dedicated to serving Him, then you will keep

warm your relationship to Him. You will want to develop a deeper fellowship with Christ each

day. When He comes, you'll finally meet Him face-to-face and that will "consummate" all the

fellowship you've had on this earth.

"Lord, I will look for Your return today, and I'll live as though You'll come in the next

minute. But, I'll also fellowship with You and plan my work as if You're not coming in

my lifetime. Amen."

Reading: 1 Thess. 1:1-10

Words: 265

Key Thought: Live as though Jesus could come at any minute.

THE SAME SPIRIT OF FAITH—HOLY SPIRIT

"And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, 'I

believed and therefore I spoke,' we also believe and therefore speak" (2

Corinthians 4:13).

The Holy Spirit gave you the "gift of faith" (Eph. 2:8, 9) when you believed in Christ for

salvation. The Holy Spirit is the Same Spirit of Faith who now builds up your daily faith to live

the Christian life. The Scriptures direct you, "The just shall live by faith" (Rom. 1:17). So, He

will give you strength and character to live by faith. If you want more faith, ask Him now

because He is *The Same Spirit of Faith*.

"Holy Spirit, I want to walk daily by faith. Help me not rely on the flesh, but to depend on

Your power. Pick me up when I fall, prod me when I slow down; and when I stray, pull

me back into the straight and narrow path."

The Holy Spirit is The Same Spirit of Faith as He has always been. As He helped Abraham live

by faith, so He can help you live above your temptations. As He helped Moses lead the

multitude by faith, He can help you follow the Lord today. As He helped David rule the

kingdom by faith, He can help you manage your life and tasks today. As He helped Paul

evangelize, He can help you share your testimony today. What is your greatest need? He is *The*

Same Spirit that has worked in the past; He can give you faith to live today.

"Holy Spirit, I am only average. Help me live above average today. Help me do things

above average today. Help me live by faith and not by sight. Amen."

Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:7-5:7

Words: 259

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will help you live by faith.

HE THAT HOLDS THE SEVEN STARS IN HIS RIGHT HAND—JESUS

"These things says He who holds the seven stars in His right hand, who walks in

the midst of the seven golden lampstands" (Revelation 2:1).

Jesus is He That Holds the Seven Stars in His Right Hand. These stars were the seven

messengers/pastors of the seven churches in Asia Minor (Rev. 2-3). Just as Jesus protected and

cared for these seven church leaders, He will take care of you. You may think you're alone in

the world, but you're not. You may think that Jesus has forgotten you in your troubles; but

you're really in His hands. Trust Him.

"Lord, I will do more. I will be victorious over sin and do exploits. Because I know

You're hanging on to me, I have more confidence to do more for You."

These seven churches/leaders were weak and struggling. Some had even lost their first love for

Christ. Some churches had sin in their midst and some churches were enticed by false doctrine.

Yet, Jesus still held all of them in His hand, and He walked in the middle of them. Since He

hung on to those struggling early churches, He can keep you safely in your struggles. Remember

if you fall, you are not destroyed, nor are you permanently lost. Jesus has you in His hands. He

will hold you safely in His hand and will give you power to overcome (Rev. 2:7).

"Lord, give me a listening ear to hear Your instructions (Rev. 2:7), and give me a ready

will to obey Your voice. I will turn my back on sin (Rev. 2:6) and will serve You (Rev.

2:3). Amen."

Reading: Revelation 2:1-7

Words: 245

Key Thought: Hang on to Jesus because He's holding on to you.

HE WHO WAS DEAD AND IS ALIVE—JESUS

"These things says the First and the Last, who was dead, and came to life"

(Revelation 2:8).

Jesus is He Who Was Dead and Is Now Alive; He will be with you in persecution because He

understands suffering. He took the bitter drink of death for you. If you suffer, remember He is

suffering with you. Now you don't have to be afraid of death because He has been there and was

dead, but now is alive. If they kill you, He will raise you up just as He came back from the dead.

"Lord, why have godly people had to suffer? I want everyone to like me. Why do I have

tribulation and difficulties?"

Because the enemy has persecuted Jesus, they will also attack you. Since they killed Him, they

may even attempt to kill you. The world loves darkness, rather than light because their deeds are

evil (John 3:19). But "He who overcomes shall not be hurt by the second death" (Rev. 2:11).

Jesus will be with you in persecution and trials because He was persecuted and killed. He Was

Dead and came back to life. Jesus says, "I know your works, tribulation and poverty" (Rev.

2:9). Do not fear any of those things that you are about to suffer. He promises, "Be faithful until

death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Rev. 2:10). Because He has overcome death, He

will crown you with eternal life.

"Lord, be first in my life and help me live for You until the last of my life. Because You

have overcome death and are alive, I want You to live through me today. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 2:8-11

Words: 259

Key Thought: Because Jesus suffered, He knows your sufferings.

THE POWER OF THE HIGHEST—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will

overshadow you" (Luke 1:35).

The Holy Spirit is The Power of the Highest, the One responsible for the virgin birth of Jesus.

The *Holy Spirit* who is the active agent for the Father and the Son to accomplish the work of the

Godhead in your world. Since the *Holy Spirit* generated the birth of Christ, He can do a mighty

work in your life. He can give you new purpose, new desires, new attitudes and a new

perspective. What do you want the *Holy Spirit* to do for you?

"Holy Spirit, I am weak and limited. There is so much I can't do. You are The Power of

the Highest; work in my life today."

The Father is the *Highest* and the *Holy Spirit* is His *Power* in the world. He can transform selfish

people so they put Christ at the center of their life. He can open the eyes of spiritually blinded

people so they can understand the Scriptures. He can transform mean people into good people.

He can break sin addiction in the lives of those trapped in a bad habit. He can solve problems in

your life, unlock shut doors, and work circumstances for the best. He can help you worship and

glorify the Father. What would you like for the *Holy Spirit* to do for you today?

"Holy Spirit, help me do the things required of me this day. Help me do everything

appropriately and efficiently and on time. Help me to do them to the glory of the Father.

Amen."

Reading: Luke 1:46-56

Words: 251

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is the power of God to help you.

HE WHO HAS THE SHARP SWORD WITH TWO EDGES—JESUS

"These things says He who has the sharp two-edged sword" (Revelation 2:12).

Jesus is He Who Has The Sharp Sword with Two Edges. The Sword is the Word of God that cuts

two ways, with ministry to both believers and unbelievers. Jesus will use the Sword to help

believers stand fast, even "where Satan's seat is" (Rev. 2:13, Author's Paraphrase). He will use

the Sword to defend those who never deny their faith even to martyrdom. Jesus says He will

help us "hold fast to My name" (Rev. 2:13). The Two-Edged Sword also cuts to the heart of a

matter to reward truth and faithfulness. The Word of God is truth (John 17:17) so it helps Jesus

see accurately what His followers have done. "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit

says" (Rev. 2:17). Those who are overcomers will eat daily the hidden manna of the Word.

Jesus will have a new name for them when they reach Heaven (Rev. 2:17).

"Lord, what about those Christians who compromise with the world; they hold false

doctrines? What about some Christians who sin, or worship idols or commit

fornication?"

The Sharp Two-Edged Sword of Jesus cuts the unsaved in judgment. It punishes the rebellious

and disobedient. Those who compromise should, "Repent, or else I will come to you quickly

and will fight against them with the sword of My mouth" (Rev. 2:16).

"Lord, forgive me for looking at the enemy, or for looking at the sins of other Christians."

Lord, I will look to You for truth in judgment. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 2:12-17

Words: 248

Key Thought: The Lord uses the Bible to help Christians and punish non-believers.

A STUMBLING BLOCK—JESUS

"But we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks

foolishness" (1 Corinthians 1:23).

Jesus is A Stumbling Block to the Jews. They should not have rejected Jesus because He was

born a Jew, the seed of Abraham and the Son of David. They were looking for military

deliverance from Rome; Jesus came to deliver them from their bondage to sin. They wanted

political peace; Jesus came to give them spiritual peace. They wanted financial prosperity; Jesus

came to give them the riches of Heaven. They rejected Jesus because they were looking for the

wrong kind of Messiah. Do you know people who are looking for the wrong things from God?

How about you? When you seek God, are you looking for the right thing?

"Jesus, I accept Your offer of spiritual liberty and forgiveness. You came into the world

for sinners like me. I will not stumble over the good things You offer."

Jesus is A Stumbling Block to the unsaved. They don't expect a humble Savior who submitted to

They don't expect a suffering servant who was tortured, and finally died an crucifixion.

ignominious death. They stumble over the idea of "Christ crucified." But God's principle is

always seen in its opposite expression. To be strong, you must yield. To get, you must give.

Christ died that you might live.

"Jesus, the world thinks Your crucifixion was terrible, but I know it was a triumph over

the Evil One. They reject Your death as a defeat, but it was victory over sin. The world

will reject Your crucifixion, but Your death led to my eternal life. Amen."

Reading: Luke 23:27-38

Key Thought: The Jews were looking for the wrong kind of Messiah.

THE OIL OF GLADNESS—HOLY SPIRIT

"You love righteousness and hate wickedness; therefore God, Your God, has anointed You with the oil of gladness more than Your companions "(Psalm

45:7).

The Holy Spirit is The Oil of Gladness. When He is rubbed into your wounds, He will take away

pain and hurt. Just as oil cleanses a wound and washes away impurities, the Holy Spirit comes to

deal with your sin and wash away all remembrances of your iniquities. Do you remember how

good it feels when an ache quits hurting? When the Holy Spirit comes to wash away your

transgressions, you'll feel good. The Holy Spirit is The Oil of Gladness to make you rejoice.

"Holy Spirit, I need some laughter in my life. Thank You for reminding me how much I

used to hurt. Now it feels good to feel good! Thank You for putting a smile on my face."

The Holy Spirit is The Oil of Gladness to make Christians rejoice. When He convicts of sin, He

makes people agonize; but when He brings forgiveness, they rejoice. When people walk into

dark shadows of death, they are terrified; but they are glad when they realize the Holy Spirit is

with them. When Satan has tempted people to sin, the *Holy Spirit* gives them victory. He is the

Holy Spirit of Gladness that pours the Oil of Happiness on your wounds.

"Holy Spirit, come pour Your Oil of Gladness into my wounds to heal me. Take away my

hurt and sadness. Flow into my life. I have been happy in the past and I want to feel that

way again. Make today a wonderful day. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 45:1-17

Words: 248

Key Thoughts: The Holy Spirit gives happiness.

ALPHA OMEGA—JESUS

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord,

"who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty" (Revelation 1:8).

Jesus is the Alpha and Omega, the completeness of your salvation from the beginning of your

salvation on the cross until His second return to take you to glory. Because Jesus is Alpha and

Omega, you don't have to worry about anything; He will take care of you.

"Lord, there are so many little details in my life that I can't think about them all. When I

give too much attention to prayer, I overlook Bible reading. When I give too much

attention to family time, I neglect witnessing."

Just as Alpha is the beginning of the Greek alphabet, Jesus helps all believers start their Christian

life properly. And as *Omega* is the last letter in the Greek language, *Jesus* will carry you safely

through to completion; "He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of

Jesus Christ" (Phil. 1:6). Jesus is Alpha and Omega, the completeness of your daily

sanctification; trust Him to work out all things. Jesus is not only the Beginning and the End; He

is everything in between. He is Alpha and Omega, the entirety of your salvation. When you

have Him, you have everything you need.

"Lord, I rest in Your completed work for me; it's comfortable knowing You've done

everything that needs to be done. I not only trust You for the big things, I also trust You

for the little things in every day life. Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus begins salvation and will finish it.

ANOTHER KING—JESUS

"... there is another king—Jesus" (Acts 17:7).

Jesus is a King, not like any king of this world; He is another kind of King. He never came to

rule an earthly kingdom. Why should He want outward obedience as given to the kings of this

earth when He can rule inwardly the hearts of people? Earthly kings rule by laws and force;

Jesus rules inwardly by love. Earthly kings want their subjects to do things for them; Jesus first

loved us and died for our salvation, then He gave us all the blessings of Heaven and has given us

the privilege of serving Him out of love and obedience.

"Lord, You are my King; I love You because You first loved me. I come to worship You,

because You first came to me."

Jesus is not like any other king on Earth; some rule for ego or vanity, and some rule for greed or

wealth. Others rule because they carry on the family heritage into which they were born. Jesus

rules what He created because He is God. Jesus rules those whom He redeems because He is the

Savior. Jesus rules what is yielded to Him because He is the Lord. What will you let Him rule

today?

"Jesus, You are my LORD, unlike the lords of this world; come take my life. You are my

King, unlike the rulers of this world; I will gladly let You rule my life. Come sit upon the

throne of my heart and rule my life today. Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus rules His subjects, unlike any other king.

THE HOLY SPIRIT OF PROMISE—HOLY SPIRIT

"... having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise"

(Ephesians 1:13).

The Third Person of the Trinity is *The Holy Spirit of Promise*. Jesus promised to send Him to the

disciples, "When the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father" (John 15:26). Just

as Jesus kept His promise and sent the *Holy Spirit*, so He (Jesus) will keep every promise He's

made to you. Jesus promised to take away your sin (John 1:29), give you peace (John 14:27),

guide you through dark places (John 8:12), and give you assurance of salvation (John 5:24).

Jesus has a track record of keeping His promises, so rest assured the *Holy Spirit* will also keep

His promises to you.

"Holy Spirit, Your presence gives me confidence to keep on trying. I know Jesus has

begun to do a good work in me; I know He will complete it (Phil. 1:6)."

The Holy Spirit has promised to bring power to your life so you can witness to the unsaved (Acts

1:8). Also, the *Holy Spirit* promised to give you victory in the hour of your temptation (2 Cor.

3:17), to keep the Evil One from you (Matt. 6:13), to guide your life (Gal. 5:22), to give you

spiritual ability for Christian service (1 Cor. 12:1-7) and to produce Christian character in you

(Gal. 5:22-23). All these things the *Holy Spirit* has done for others. What He has done for

others, He can do for you.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for reminding me that these promises are mine. I believe them

and will claim them. Thank You for keeping Your promise to believers. Amen."

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will keep the promises He made.

AUTHOR OF ETERNAL SALVATION—JESUS

"He became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him" (Hebrews 5:9).

Jesus is the Author of Eternal Salvation; He is writing a story plot for your future. Just as an

earthly author will know the content before writing, Jesus knows what He wants to accomplish

in your life. Just as an earthly author develops characters in the story, Jesus knows what He

wants you to become and how He wants you to live. He is the Author of Salvation; He has put

the whole story of salvation together – from ages past to future eternity – so He is able to guide

your life.

"Lord, thank You for writing the great story of salvation. I have read Your book and love

its ending. I accept Your plot and I will attempt to live my part of Your story. Come give

me power to live for You today."

Jesus is the Author of Eternal Salvation. Just as an earthly author personifies his/her writings,

Jesus personifies salvation (Luke 3:6). He wrote salvation's plan. Jesus came to bring salvation,

and when we call upon Him (Rom. 10:13), He gives us salvation, not partially or temporarily.

Jesus has the ability to completely save those who come to Him, and He has the power to

permanently keep them because He gives them eternal salvation. Will you let Jesus finish

writing the story of your life?

"'Lord, I am confident of this very thing; that You have begun a good work in me will

complete it until the day You return' (Phil. 1:6, Author's Translation). Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 5:1-9

Key Thought: Jesus is writing the story of your life.

BRANCH—JESUS

"I am bringing forth My Servant the BRANCH" (Zechariah 3:8).

Jesus is the Branch, an Old Testament title given to Messiah. The name comes from (Tsemach),

a green shoot or a new sprout growing out of an old stump. When Nebuchadnezzar "chopped"

down the kingdom of Israel in 587 B.C., the stump of the tree died—the kingdom ceased—but

the roots did not die. The kingdom was renewed when Jesus was born King of the Jews (Matt.

2:2). Jesus is the Branch—the new sprout from Jewish roots—demonstrating God's kingdom

will live again. When a fire devastates a forest, it looks like the end to beautiful green woods.

But wait! Look below the charred stumps to see life in the roots. Just as a "burned over" area

can become green again, so a new "branch" can spring from your blackened past. Jesus, the

Branch, can give new opportunities to your life.

"I come to You, Branch; sprout new life in me. Give me another new opportunity to

serve You today."

Jesus is "the man whose name is BRANCH" (Zech. 6:12), so He can identify with your needs.

He is the "righteous branch" (Jer. 23:5) to help you do things right. Just as "the Branch of the

LORD shall be beautiful" (Isa. 4:2), so Jesus can make your life beautiful. And, Jesus is the

"Servant the BRANCH" (Zech. 3:8) to serve you. Let Jesus, the Branch, bring new

opportunities into your life.

"Lord, give me a new opportunity to live for You, and give me a new attitude towards

life. Come grow new life in me. Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 4:1-6

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus offers another new beginning.

THE PROMISE—HOLY SPIRIT

"... you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to

your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call"

(Acts 2:38, 39).

Peter on the day of Pentecost promised the Holy Spirit would come on those who believed on

Christ. The fulfillment of that promise was the coming of the *Holy Spirit* on his listeners, just as

He came on the disciples. Peter promised the Holy Spirit would come to do the work of the

Father and Son in the lives of all Christians. He has come into the world and when you believed,

He came into your heart (John 15:26). Will you let the *Holy Spirit* work in your life today?

"Holy Spirit, I have many spiritual needs; I yield my life to you, meet my needs. Fill me

today; I need Your presence in my life" (Eph. 5:18).

The Holy Spirit is the fulfillment of The Promise of the Father and Son. He has regenerated you

(John 3:5), He has given you eternal life (John 3:36), He has given you a new nature (2 Peter

1:4), and guaranteed your home in Heaven (Eph. 4:30). Look at what the *Holy Spirit* can do in

the future. He can give you peace (John 14:27), Christian character (Gal. 5:22-23), guidance

(Gal. 5:25) and spiritual gifts (1 Cor. 12:7, 11). These promises have been made to you, now

you must claim them, and act on them.

"Holy Spirit, forgive my forgetful memory. I have forgotten the things you can do for me.

Help me remember everything You can do for me. Please help me claim them all.

Amen."

Reading: Acts 1:1

Words: 244

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is the fulfillment of the promises made by Jesus.

BREAD—JESUS

"And Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never

hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst" (John 6:35).

Jesus is Bread who gives eternal life to those who believe in Him; you must believe in Him to

get it. He is satisfying *Bread* who gives inner happiness; you must enjoy Him to get it. He is

also strength-giving Bread to build you up and give you energy to serve God; you must learn of

Him to get it. Jesus is resurrection Bread who gives you life now, and life in the future.

"Whoever eats My flesh . . . I will raise him up at the last day" (John 6:54). So, eat the *Bread* of

Jesus; It will give you confidence, and in the future, you'll rise in the resurrection. Eating of

Jesus is a picture of learning about Jesus in Scriptures and believing what you read.

"Lord, I'm weak; I need Bread to give me strength for today. Lord, when I get my eyes

off You, I hunger for the "things" of this life. My unfilled desire makes me miserable.

Teach me to eat the Bread of Life so I can experience spiritual satisfaction of the soul."

Jesus is supernatural Bread. Those who eat the Bread of Jesus are strengthened to run, work,

and to wrestle (Phil. 4:13). When you eat the Bread of Jesus, you have new purpose in your life

to overcome obstacles and limitations. When you eat the Bread of Jesus, you have a

supernatural life because He will live in you and you'll live in Him. Are you hungry for Him

today?

"Bread of Life, I am hungry; fill me. I am weak; strengthen me. Come fulfill Your life

through me. Amen."

Reading: John 6:1-14

Words: 269

Key Thought: Jesus is Bread to give you life.

A NAME NO MAN KNEW—JESUS

"He had a name written that no one knew except Himself" (Revelation 19:12).

Jesus has a Name which No Man Knew. That means no one knows this hidden name, not even

you. Even though you may want to know His secret name, you can't know it because He has not

told anyone; some things only God knows. At His return, there will still be a mystery about

Jesus' nature that you cannot understand. Why? Because no finite human can comprehend the

infinite God. So, don't worry about what you don't know; rather, respond quickly to what you

do know about Jesus' names. His name is "Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting

Father, Prince of Peace" (Isa. 9:6), and those are only a few of His names found in only one

verse in the Bible.

"Jesus, I realize I can't know all about You, nor will I ever know; but, I know I worship

You as KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS (Rev. 19:16)."

Jesus has a name that No Man can Know. That means there could be more than one name you

don't know. Just as His name(s) that you know reveal the unique characteristics of Jesus, His

unknowable names reflect things about Him that you can never know. That's because Jesus is

God and you are human. But trust what you know about Jesus and obey what He wants you to

do.

"Jesus, I don't know everything about You; but what I know, I love . . . I trust . . . I

worship . . . I will obey You as my Master. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 19:11, 12

Words: 254

Key Thought: Focus on what the names of Jesus tells us about Him.

THE LORD OF THE HARVEST—HOLY SPIRIT

"The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray the Lord

of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest" (Matthew 9:37, 38).

The Holy Spirit is The Lord of the Harvest, it is His harvest. Too often we think it is our

ministry and our harvest. The *Holy Spirit* wants you to work for Him in the harvest of lost souls.

Because there are many lost people, the fields are white for harvest (John 4:35). When you tell

lost people the good news of Jesus, the Holy Spirit will work in their hearts to convict them of

sin. Then He will open their spiritually blinded eyes to see the Gospel and will draw them to

salvation. Will you work in the harvest today and let the Holy Spirit work through you? You

can do that by sharing the Gospel with a lost person.

"Holy Spirit, I feel Your urging in my heart to be more active in evangelism. I will

witness to someone today. Help me to communicate the Gospel to someone. Work in the

heart of those to whom I witness."

The Holy Spirit is The Lord of the Harvest. When someone believes in Jesus, He regenerates

their heart (John 3:5) and places eternal life in them. But most importantly, since it is His

harvest, He preserves the fruit by indwelling the new believer with His presence to guarantee that

they receive all the blessings that the Father has promised to them.

"Holy Spirit, You are Lord of the Harvest! I cannot accomplish anything without Your

working through me. I yield to Your leading. When I testify to others of my salvation,

use me today. Amen."

Reading: Matt. 9:35-10:26

Words: 255

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit works through you to win lost people to salvation.

A PRICE —JESUS

"For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your

spirit, which are God's" (1 Corinthians 6:20).

Jesus is the complete Price that was paid to redeem you from sin. Salvation was not free; He

paid A Price. His death was the Price that gave you life. Salvation was not cheap; Jesus was

humiliated, tortured, and He suffered for your sins. Your sin – and the sin of all others – had

violated the perfection of God the Father. Sin had to be punished, so Jesus was punished for

your violations. Instead of you paying the *Price*, He paid it for you.

"Jesus, thank You for paying the Price for my sin. Now I am free from the debt of sin."

Help me to live in gratitude for what You've done."

Jesus is the Price big enough to cover all the sins of all people. He is the ultimate Price,

enduring enough to cover all the sins committed in the future. He paid the *Price* once for all. He

forgave all sin – all past and all future sin. Now, "If you walk in the light . . . the blood of Jesus

Christ, God's Son cleanseth from all sin" (1 John 1:7, KJV). You don't have to feel guilty over

your sin; instead, confess it and get cleansing (1 John 1:9). Don't walk around in the darkness;

rather, walk in the Light of *Jesus*.

"Jesus, it's easy to walk when there's light on the path. Keep me from dark roads of sin

and the valley of the shadow of death. Shine some Light over here; guide me today.

Amen."

Reading: 1 Peter 1:18-25

Words: 250

Key Thought: Jesus paid the Price to free you from sin.

A SON OVER HIS OWN HOUSE—JESUS

"... but Christ as a Son over His own house, whose house we are if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm to the end" (Hebrews 3:6).

Jesus is the Son Over His Own House. Just as Levi was the first priest in Israel's genealogy,

Jesus is the first in New Testament salvation. Just as Aaron was the first priest who interceded

for Israel in the Tabernacle, Jesus is the High Priest who will intercede for you in Heaven. All

believers are members of Jesus' house and He will intercede to the Father for them. How can He

intercede for you today?

"Jesus, be my intercessor to the Father. Every time I slip into sin, intercede to the Father

for forgiveness. Every time the Evil One comes to tempt me, protect me by Your

intercession."

Jesus is the Son Over His Own House; "He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come

to God by Him, seeing He ever lives to make intercession for them" (Heb. 7:25). So, take your

problems to Jesus . . . trust Him . . . let Him be your Intercessor. Because Jesus is your

Intercessor, "(He) does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices" (Heb. 7:27).

He doesn't need to offer daily for His sin (Heb. 7:27), because He is "holy, harmless, undefiled,

separate from sinners" (Heb. 7:26). He is the Son forevermore (Heb. 7:27), so come into His

house for help to solve your problems. Let *Jesus* be your intercessor.

"Lord, I know 'the blood of Jesus Christ . . . cleanses us from all sin' (1 John 1:7), so I

rest calmly in Your house. I know You will intercede to the Father for me. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 3:1-19

Words: 264

Key Thought: Jesus intercedes for all those who belong to Him.

THE HOLY SPIRIT OF GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day

of redemption" (Ephesians 4:30).

The Holy Spirit of God comes to you from God because the Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the

Trinity. The Father sent Him to help you become godlier like God. He wants you to be more

holy like His nature for He is the Holy Spirit. He wants to help you become more spiritual for

He is *Spirit of God*. Will you yield to His work today?

"Holy Spirit, I come asking for an inward change. I want to live a pure life, but I need

help because I am weak. I want to be holy, but I need Your strength. Sanctify me and

make me pure. Help me live a godly life. Come live Your holy nature in my life."

Don't grieve *The Holy Spirit of God* by allowing temptation or sin to settle down in your heart.

Confess quickly and repent, then begin immediately living a pure life. Because He lives in your

life, don't even think about sin. Because He is holy, He is grieved when you allow sin to settle

down in your mind. Because the Holy Spirit is God, He demands holiness in your life and

thoughts. But He is also the *Helper*; ask Him to help you overcome temptation and distractions.

Ask Him to make you holy and spiritual.

"Holy Spirit, come into my life. I want Your holiness to control my thoughts and desires.

I cannot separate myself from sin for I am weak. You are God; let Your holiness flow

through me. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 4:17-32

Words: 253

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit is sent to make you godly.

YOUR HOLY ONE—JESUS

"For You will not leave my soul in Hades, nor will You allow Your Holy One to

see corruption" (Acts 2:27).

Jesus is the Holy One of God. He was the Father's representative sent to earth to redeem the

sinful race. When Adam sinned, all humanity was lost. Because the Father loves the people He

created, He wanted to save them. How could the Father punish their sin, yet allow people to go

free? Since God the Father can't change His nature, He had to punish their rebellion and

disobedience. So, He sent Jesus to earth to live a perfect life, He was the Holy One. Jesus was

the Sinless One who was punished for the sins of the human race. He was the Father's

representative to give eternal life to those who would believe in Him.

"Lord Jesus, I praise You for coming to earth to die for my sins. I know You are the Holy

One of God; thank You for Your sacrifice. Help me live a godly life as a testimony for

You."

Because Jesus was your representative on the cross, He now wants you to be His representative

to your non-Christian friends and relatives. He wants you to live a holy life before them. He

wants you to share with them the plan of salvation. As He has died for you, He wants you to live

for Him.

"Lord Jesus, I will be Your representative today. I will try to live a holy life; but I need

help. Come live in me and manifest Yourself through me to others. Help me be a good

example to both saved and unsaved people. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 16:1-11

Words: 255

Key Thought: Jesus was the Holy One.

THE FIRSTBORN FROM THE DEAD—JESUS

"And from Jesus Christ . . . the firstborn from the dead" (Rev. 1:5).

Jesus is The Firstborn From the Dead, which means He was the first to be generated—or given

life—from the dead. Jesus was a dead corpse, but was given life by the Father; His body lived

again. Also, Jesus was The Firstborn From the Dead in resurrection. He was taken from among

the dead, or from the location where the dead existed, and was taken to Heaven. Jesus can make

life real to you today because He lives in you. Do you want it?

"Lord Jesus, You arose from the dead so that You can come into my heart with eternal

life. Now You abide in me. I praise You for giving life to me. Strengthen me for today's

tasks. I worship You as The Firstborn From the Dead."

Jesus is The Firstborn From the Dead and first in importance because He became "a life-giving

spirit" (1 Cor. 15:45). That means Jesus gave life to all. But Jesus was also the first in

sequence; no one was raised from the dead before Him: Adam, Moses and David all the Old

Testament saints, "He captured and led them captive into heaven" (Eph. 4:8, Author's

Translation). Jesus is The Firstborn From the Dead so that now all who believe in Him are

"born again" from their spiritual death. All who believe in Him have His new life, they have

eternal life. Why don't you thank Him.

"Lord, You arose from the dead to fill my empty life with Your presence. Give me

happiness and meaning to live for You today. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 28:1-10

Words: 260

Key Thought: Jesus can give you life because He was raised from the dead.

THE ETERNAL SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offer Himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscious from dead works to serve

the living God?" (Hebrews 9:14).

The Holy Spirit is The Eternal Spirit. He has always existed. He is the Third Person of the

Trinity who was active in creation (Gen. 1:2) and He worked throughout the Old Testament.

Some mistakenly thought He didn't come until Jesus promised to send Him into the world (John

15:26). But He is the Eternal Spirit. Now during the Church Age, the Holy Spirit has a special

relationship to believers. He will indwell you, guide you, teach you, protect you, and when you

are weak, He will fill you with divine power. Do you want the *Holy Spirit* in your life?

"Come Eternal Spirit, fill my life with Your presence. I need to be holy; set me apart

from sin. I need strength to obey Scriptures; fill me with Your power."

The Holy Spirit is The Eternal Spirit. He has always been the Spirit of Holiness so He can make

you holy. He's eternally been the Spirit, so He can make you spiritual. The Father and Son have

sent the Holy Spirit to help you do what you're supposed to do. When The Eternal Spirit fills

your life, you'll sense God's purpose and you'll realize that your life is bigger than your

everyday world. The Eternal Spirit will make you realize you're part of God's eternal plan.

"Holy Spirit, I want more than what I have in this world. Come, Eternal Spirit, I want a

touch of eternity in my life. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 9:12-22

Words: 242

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will make you realize you're part of an eternal plan.

THE FAITHFUL WITNESS—JESUS

"Grace to you and peace from Him who is and who was and who is to come, and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness" (Revelation 1:4, 5).

Jesus is The Faithful Witness; He will give a faithful testimony to build you up. When you have doubts, He will come to build up your faith. When you are discouraged, He will come to give you divine confidence. Jesus can be a faithful witness to you, every time you need it. But you must ask for His help.

"I'm ashamed of my doubts because my questions impugn your integrity. Remind me again of Your faithfulness. Give me confidence in the promises You made."

Jesus is the Faithful Witness who came as a witness to the world that the heavenly Father loves them. But the world did not receive the testimony of Jesus. Even though He was a Faithful Witness and He demonstrated it with signs and wonders, the world wouldn't believe Him. Jesus told Pilate, "I bear witness to the truth" (John 18:37), but Pilate rejected Him. Jesus faithfully declared the truth, but He was crucified because of what He said and did. Just as Jesus was faithful to the end, He wants you to always be faithful; even if it costs your life.

"Jesus, You are my Faithful Witness; I receive you into my life as a sure evidence of truth. I believe what You said in Scriptures. I praise You for Your miracles and acts of kindness. I accept Your death as forgiveness for my sins. Thank You for Your faithful witness that gives me confidence and assurance. Amen."

Reading: John 19:7-15

Key Thought: Jesus will be faithful to tell you the truth.

THE ROOT AND OFFSPRING OF DAVID—JESUS

"I am the Root and the Offspring of David" (Revelation 22:16).

Jesus is The Root and Offspring of David; the greatest king of Israel. Just as a tree gets its

strength and life from its roots, so David's accomplishments and strength came from Jesus. Just

as David derived everything from Jesus, so your spiritual vitality comes from Him. You were

born again when Christ came into your heart, so your spiritual life comes from Him.

"Lord, I know my spiritual life comes from You; help me never to forget where my

strength lies."

Jesus is The Root and Offspring of David. Jesus was not only David's source of strength, but He

also was born into his line. Jesus has the legitimate title to David's throne. Because of His

family's birth, Jesus is qualified to fulfill all the Messianic prophecies for the salvation of every

Israelite and for the nation. Look to Him for all your needs. Jesus is The Root and Offspring of

David, which means He was The Son of David (Matt. 1:1). When David wrote the Psalms, he

called the coming Messiah—Jesus—"The Lord" (Ps. 110). Just as Jesus was the Lord of David,

He wants to be your *Lord*. Will you submit to Him today?

"Lord, You are the Root from which I get my life; I am Your offspring. But more

importantly, You are my Lord; I will serve You this day. Amen."

Reading: Revelations 22:12-21

Key Thought: Will you submit to the Lordship of Jesus, as did David?

THE SPIRIT OF REVELATION—HOLY SPIRIT

"... that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you

the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him" (Ephesians 1:17).

Revelations are the things you can't know until God reveals them to you. The Holy Spirit is The

Spirit of Revelation who showed the writers of Scripture what to write and guided them to write

accurately the revelation of God. But the Bible is more than an accurate book; it is inspired (2

Tim. 3:16). Inspiration means the *Holy Spirit* breathed His presence into the words of the Bible.

When people read the Scriptures, the *Holy Spirit* is embedded in the words to minister to them.

So, when you let the Word of God enter your life, the Holy Spirit enters your heart to influence

you. Will you let The Spirit of Revelation show you from the Bible what God wants you to

know?

"Holy Spirit, I love the Word of God because it contains Your words. Speak to me

through its pages so I can know You better and do Your will."

You don't know what the future holds, but the Holy Spirit knows both the coming joys and

pains. Study the Bible to learn His instruction; He'll prepare you for all future eventualities.

You don't know where you may go today, but the Holy Spirit knows God's will for you. Let

Him guide you today. The Spirit of Revelation knows what is best for you; let Him help you find

God's will for your life in the Bible.

"Holy Spirit, I trust my future with You. I'll learn what You reveal to me from Scripture.

I'll go where You lead me. Amen."

Reading: 2 Tim. 3:14-17

Words: 254

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit can reveal God's will to you.

THE KING INVISIBLE—JESUS

"Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor

and glory forever and ever. Amen" (1 Timothy 1:17).

Jesus is the King Invisible; you can't see Him, but He's there with you all day, every day. Just

because He's invisible doesn't mean He's not with you. While His body is sitting at the right

hand of the Father in Heaven, His presence indwells our hearts. Because Jesus is God, the spirit

of Jesus is everywhere present at the same time. To be invisible means He exists everywhere in

spirit. Ask Him to help and protect you this day because He's with you.

"Jesus, thank You for being with me. Protect me today from dangers I don't see, and

help me through problems I haven't yet faced. Minister to me in ways I don't know

about. Help me be a godly person."

Jesus is the King who is Invisible; He rules the entire universe. He can be at all places at all

times because He is omnipresent. As Lord, Jesus rules the universe; but more importantly, He

dwells in your heart (Col. 1:27). But, He wants more than His presence living in your heart. As

King, He wants to sit on the throne of your heart to rule your life today. Will you let Him do it?

"Jesus, I want You to be Lord of my life and rule me today. May every word I speak

glorify You. May every action I do further Your kingdom. May every step I take be

guided by You. Be with me to protect me and help me grow spiritually. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 14:22-36

Words: 248

Key Thought: Jesus is with you even when you can't see Him.

THE KING IMMORTAL—JESUS

"Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor

and glory forever and ever. Amen" (1 Timothy 1:17).

Jesus is The King Immortal. The word immortal means there is no corruption in the King or His

rule. His laws are righteous; they were not made on selfish principles, nor were they enacted out

of sinful purposes. Because He is King Immortal, all His judgments are correct. Jesus has never

made a mistake in enforcing His laws. Because Jesus is an immortal King, you can trust Him.

He will not be corrupted; neither will His kingdom fall apart. Those under His rule cannot

corrupt His standards. While some may corrupt themselves, none can tarnish His laws.

"Jesus, You are my Immortal King. I bow to worship You because You have always

lived in the past, You will always live in the future, and You are alive today. Come sit

upon the throne of my heart; rule my life."

Jesus is The King Immortal. While on Earth, He did not sin and Pilate found no fault in Him.

Jesus died as the perfect Lamb who was the substitute for your sin. He was raised again on the

third day to live forever. Death could not corrupt His perfect body. Jesus is the eternal King,

which means all people, of all ages, from all ethnic groups, must submit to His rulership or be

judged by His laws. He is *The King Immortal* whose rule will not fail, nor can it be overthrown.

"Jesus, You are a righteous King. Everything You do is right. I worship You for Your

trustworthiness. I serve You because You are my Savior. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 24:1-10

Words: 257

Key Thought: Jesus will not make any mistakes in your life.

THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the

fear of the LORD" (Isaiah 11:2).

The Spirit of the Lord is the Holy Spirit who does the actual work in your heart for God the

Father and God the Son. The Spirit of the Lord is a primary name of the Holy Spirit to reveal His

character, i.e., who He is. When you think of the eternal nature of God, do not project onto Him

human representation, i.e., a physical being. Remember, "God is Spirit" (John 4:24), so the Holy

Spirit is not limited. He can come minister to you anywhere, any place and at any time.

"O Spirit of the Lord, come make this day wonderful. Help me bring glory to the Father,

Son and You, Holy Spirit."

The Spirit of the Lord is with all believers, so He will be with you. He will fulfill what Jesus

promised, "I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper . . . the Spirit of truth . . .

He dwells with you and will be in you" (John 14:16, 17). You must believe the promise of Jesus

and act on it. You must receive The Spirit of the Lord if you want Him to work in your life; but

He can energize only what You give Him, so yield to Him today what You want Him to use.

"O Spirit of the Lord, I give myself to You. Come fill me with a new zeal to be holy. Give

me a new desire to serve You. O Spirit of the Lord, fill me completely and use me.

Amen."

Reading: John 14:16-26

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit does God's work everywhere in all people.

THE LAST ADAM—JESUS

"The first man Adam became a living being. The last Adam became a life-giving

spirit" (1 Corinthians 15:45).

Jesus is the Last Adam. Just as Adam was the head of the human race, Jesus is the head of those

He has redeemed. The First Adam, as head of the human race, disobeyed God resulting in all

becoming sinners. "Through one man sin entered the world" (Rom. 5:12). Jesus the Last Adam

made a decision to redeem the human race. He died for all. Jesus is the head of a new race of all

who are born again by the Spirit of God. Jesus arose the third day to give life to all who follow

Him.

"Lord Jesus, I come to you as my ruler and head, acknowledging Your leadership over

my life. As I pray for others to let You rule their lives, I now surrender the control of my

life to You."

The First Adam was the first to sin and by his disobedience, plunged all mankind into eternal

death. The death of Jesus—The Last Adam—delivered all who would believe in Him. In the

resurrection of Jesus, He received the "headship" of a new race of believers. Now Jesus wants

the "headship" of every area of your life—home, business, leisure, hobbies, vacations,

amusements, etc. He wants you to serve Him with your time, talent and treasure. What will you

give to Him?

"Lord, I know You are the Last Adam, the Head of the body. Come, be head of my life

and all my activities. I give my life to You. Amen."

Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:35-45

Key Thought: Jesus as the head of a new race, He wants to be head of your life.

THE ONLY BEGOTTEN SON—JESUS

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever

believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

Jesus is The Only Begotten Son, an Old Testament title that declares He was eternally generated

from the Father. "The Lord (Father) said to him (Jesus), 'You are my Son, begotten throughout

eternity" (Ps. 2:7, Author's Translation). This does not mean the Son was begotten at an event

in eternity past, but describes the eternal relationship of the Son to the Father. Both the Father

and Jesus are equally eternal and equally God, but they have separate personalities. They are

equal in nature. Jesus was not begotten at a time in the past because that would mean the Son is

not eternal. The Father has eternally loved Jesus, and because the Father loved you and the

world; He sent Jesus to die for your sins. When you receive Jesus as The Only Begotten Son,

you have also believed in the Father.

"Jesus, I worship You just as I worship the Father. You are both God, and I come into

Your presence with thanksgiving for all you've done for me."

When you receive *Jesus* as Savior, you become a "son of God" (Rom. 8:14-16). The Father has

only One Son who could die for the world, and because of that sacrificial death, the Father now

has many "sons." You are a member of the family.

"Jesus, I worship You as The Only Begotten Son. I praise You as the Second Person of

the Godhead. I thank You for coming into the world to die for my sins. Amen."

Reading: John 3:9-20

Words: 247

Key Thought: Jesus is The Only Begotten Son of the Father.

THE SPIRIT OF UNDERSTANDING—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the

fear of the LORD" (Isaiah 11:2).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Understanding; He can distinguish between the counterfeit and

the real. Even though people use Christian words, gestures and claim to know God, He knows

what is genuine and what is fake. He will help you take inventory of your spiritual life and show

when you are sincere and when you are just being outwardly religious.

"O Spirit of Understanding, expose any counterfeit motive in my life and help me be

genuine in character and service. Help me worship the Father authentically. I want to

be like Christ. Give me real spiritual power to live the Christian life."

The Spirit of Understanding recognizes a sincere heart in worshippers; that's why He gives them

self-understanding. He encourages all those who want to be conformed to the image of Christ;

that's why He gives them self-evaluation. He values all those who want to live an authentic

Christian life; that's why He gives them self-direction for their daily walk. When *The Spirit of*

Understanding rests upon you, then you can have self-assurance that you are doing the will of

God. Then, "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are the children of God"

(Rom. 8:16).

"O Spirit of truth, come show me my failures so I can correct them; show me my

hypocrisy so I can humbly walk with You; show me Your will for my life and help me do

it. O Spirit of Understanding, come give me assurance today. Amen."

Reading: Genesis 24

Words: 248

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will show you what is real and what is fake.

GOD MANIFESTED IN THE FLESH—JESUS

"God was manifested in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen by angels, preached among the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up in glory" (1 Timothy

3:16).

Jesus was God Manifested In The Flesh. If you want to see what God is like, look at Jesus. You

can see His life story in the pages of 'Scripture. As you study His life, you can see how God

would react to situations. If you want to see how God would have you life, Jesus is your

example. Will you follow His steps? Jesus is God Manifested In The Flesh. He was born in a

stable in Bethlehem because people rejected Him at His arrival; there was no room in the inn.

How will you react to rejection? Because He was born "King of the Jews," Herod was

threatened and tried to kill Him. How will you handle persecution? The unsaved mind doesn't

know what to make of Christ because He was God Manifested In The Flesh.

"Jesus, You are my Lord and God. I worship You for giving up the glories of Heaven to

come to earth to live in human flesh. I receive you even though others reject You. I

crown You King of my life, even though some tried to kill You. Thank You for becoming

flesh for me."

The greatest event in history was when God became flesh. The shepherds recognized what

happened and worshipped Jesus as He lay in a manger. The wise men worshipped Him with

gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Throughout history, believers have worshipped Him with

the gift of their heart. What will you bring to Him today?

"Jesus, I acknowledge that You are God, manifested in the flesh. Jesus, I worship You

with the gift of my heart; I have nothing greater to give You than myself. Amen."

Reading: 1 Timothy 3:14-16

Words: 279

Key Thought: You must worship Jesus because He became flesh.

WELL OF WATER—HOLY SPIRIT

"But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into

everlasting life" (John 4:14, KJV).

The Holy Spirit is a Well of Water to hot thirsty travelers. Jesus said, "Come to me and drink!"

(John 7:37). He promised, "Out of (your) heart will flow rivers of living water" (John 7:38). He

said this water is the *Holy Spirit*. "This He spoke concerning the Spirit" (John 7:39). That well

of water—living water—is within you, so you'll never again have to search anywhere else for

satisfaction. You'll never have to seek pleasure in sinful activities. You'll not find thirst-relief

in the world, the flesh, or the Devil. That nagging thirst in your mouth is the *Holy Spirit's* own

way of getting your attention. Look within your heart to find peace in Him. The Holy Spirit is

there when you're ready to drink.

"Holy Spirit, I know You entered my heart when I was saved. Keep me thirsty so I'll turn

to You when I need refreshing."

The Holy Spirit is a Well of Water to renew your strength. When you're too tired to go on, drink

of Him. When you're out of spiritual energy, let Him be your strength. Maybe you need some

cool shade and a little rest. Drink some water. Then you'll be ready to get back to the job you

have to do.

"Holy Spirit, I need You today. The road is long and I'm weary. The sun is draining my

energy; I drink! Ah, Your water tastes good. Amen."

Reading: John 4:1-14

Words: 238

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit refreshes you.

HE THAT HAS THE SEVEN SPIRITS OF GOD AND THE SEVEN STARS—JESUS

"These things says He who has the seven Spirits of God and the seven stars"

(Revelation 3:1).

Jesus is He That Has the Seven Spirits of God. This is not a reference to seven different "spirits"

sent by God, but rather this is a reference to the One Spirit of God who will minister to you and

to the church in various ways. Jesus can send the Holy Spirit to do many things in your life. The

Spirit can convict of sin, regenerate, indwell, baptize, seal, guide, and give you spiritual gifts.

Jesus can send the Holy Spirit to make you holy and to make you spiritual; receive what He

sends.

"Lord, I receive all the various ministries of the Holy Spirit into my heart. Work in my

life today."

Jesus is He That Hath the Seven (Churches) Stars. These stars are churches (Rev. 2:1). All

churches are dear to Him, as are all the believers in them. However, there were some problems

in this church, ". . . you have a name that you are alive, but you are dead" (Rev. 3:1).

"Remember therefore what you have received and heard; hold fast and repent" (Rev. 3:3). No

matter how spiritual—or carnal—a church, Jesus knows, and He works in that church to make

them godlier. Jesus is "He that is coming as a thief in the night, in an hour when you do not

expect me" (Rev. 3:3, Author's Translation). Walk faithfully before Him in love because "He

that is an overcomer will be clothed in white and his name will not be blotted out of the book of

life" (Rev. 3:5, Author's Translation).

"Lord, send the Holy Spirit to make me more godly. You are the Coming One; I wait for

Your appearance. Amen."

Reading: Revelation 3:1-6

Words: 280

Key Thought: Jesus knows us and works in us.

THE RIGHTEOUS—JESUS

"My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (1

John 2:1).

Jesus is The Righteous One; no one can claim to be righteous because the Bible says, "There is

none righteous, no, not one" (Rom. 3:10). A righteous person always does the right thing in

actions, always has right thoughts and is right in his attitude. When John baptized Jesus, it was

"to fulfill all righteousness" (Matt. 3:15), that means they did the right thing in the right way.

Jesus is the only righteous person to ever live, for He always did the right thing and His

character was perfect righteousness.

"Lord Jesus, I know You are perfect and You never sinned (1 Peter 2:22), but what about

me? How can I become righteous?"

Jesus is The Righteous One; when you enter the exchanged life, you identify with Jesus' position

in Heaven and He indwells you on earth. "Jesus said, 'You in Me and I in you" (John 14:20).

"Because Jesus was perfect, the Father made Him to be your sin, and the Father gave His

righteousness" (2 Cor. 5:21, Author's paraphrase). The secret of the Christian life is that Jesus

comes to live in you when you are saved. You are still a sinner—a forgiven sinner—but the

righteousness of Jesus is accounted to you when you are saved. Now what you need is power to

overcome sin. That happens when Jesus lives His life through you. Let His righteous life shine

through your life today.

"Lord, fill my imperfect life with Your righteousness. Live through me so others can see

Your perfection. Amen."

Reading: 2 Cor. 5:14-21

Words: 255

Key Thought: The righteousness of Christ was applied to you when you were saved.

YOUR GOOD SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"You also gave Your good Spirit to instruct them, and did not withhold Your manna from their mouth, and gave them water for their thirst" (Nehemiah 9:20).

The Holy Spirit is the Good Spirit of God. He is called "good" because that's His nature.

Goodness is the absolute personification of all positive attributes. All that's good in the world

comes from God. Creating the world was a good thing to do, and when each aspect was

completed, "God saw . . . that it was good" (Gen. 1:4). The first parents spoiled the good world

through their sin, but God constantly came back to do good things for the human race. That

means when you mess up, He can come back to do good things for you. Ask God to fill you

with good things and use you this day.

"God, You are great and You are good. Forgive me of my sins and come do good things

for me today."

The Holy Spirit is the Good Spirit. God is not made good by any good thing in the world; but

things become good by Him. He will breathe goodness upon the world when people allow Him

to do so. He will touch your life with goodness when you seek Him. Your good works will not

save you (Eph. 2:8, 9), nor will they make you good. You become good when you live in the

Holy Spirit and let His goodness make you good.

"Holy Spirit, I choose goodness. I want the perfection of Your divine nature to fill my

heart and make me good. I want to do the highest good today. Amen."

Reading: Neh. 9:20-27

Words: 247

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will do good things for you.

THE SON OF GOD WITH FLAMING EYES AND FEET LIKE BRASS—JESUS

"And to the angel of the church in Thyatira write, 'These things says the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and His feet like fine brass'" (Revelation

2:18).

Jesus is The Son of God who is the judge of all humanity, both believers and unbelievers. He

judges all sin the same. Your sin was judged in the past at Calvary; the unsaved will be judged

in the future. No one can hide from His flaming eyes of judgment; no one can run from His

brass feet of judgment. The Son of God gave Himself for sin, but the unsaved won't come to

Him for forgiveness, so they will meet Him in judgment. Also, the saved that keep on sinning

will be judged by the One with Flaming Eyes.

"O Son of God, I know I am forgiven, but sometimes I sin ignorantly. Forgive me now by

Your blood (1 John 1:9)."

The Son of God With Flaming Eyes and Feet of Brass will see and understand the motives of all

believers. You cannot hide from Him the fleshly sin of fornication or the doctrinal sin of heresy.

He has all-seeing eyes, so He knows all about the iniquity in your life. Jesus has feet that run

quickly to judge sin; you cannot get away with anything. You must deal with your sin before

Jesus judges it.

"Lord, I come daily searching my heart for hidden sin, I confess them—forgive me. I

repent of sin and commit myself to live a godly life—cleanse me. I want to live a

blameless life—help me. Give me wisdom to recognize temptation in my life, and give me

strength to overcome it. I want to please You. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 2:18-29

Words: 258

Key Thought: Deal with your sin because Jesus knows about it.

THE SON OF ABRAHAM—JESUS

"The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the Son of David, the Son of

Abraham" (Matthew 1:1).

Jesus is The Son of Abraham. Just as every Jew is a son of Abraham because Abraham was the

first Hebrew, the father of all, so Jesus was a Son of Abraham. The Father in Heaven made great

promises to Abraham; i.e., that He would bless him financially and make his name great. The

Father in Heaven promised to bless those who blessed Abraham and curse those who cursed

Abraham. Then the Father in Heaven gave the greatest promise: that all the world would be

blessed because a Jewish Messiah would come through His seed who would deliver the world.

That's the promise to Abraham concerning *Jesus Christ*.

"Lord Jesus, I know your birth was predicted, and that "in the fullness of time the Father

sent (You) His Son—made of a woman—to redeem all those who are lost" (Gal. 4:4, 5,

Author's Translation)."

Jesus is The Son of Abraham, yet the Eternal Son of God. Jesus was born 2,000 years after

Abraham, yet lived during Abraham's life. "Abraham rejoiced to see My (Jesus) day and he saw

it" (John 8:56). That happened when Abraham prayed to the Lord to save Sodom and Gomorrah

(Gen. 18:23-33), he was interceding to the One who would be his Seed in the future. Now, you

can pray to Jesus, just as Abraham did. Your prayers will be answered just as were Abraham's

prayers.

"Lord Jesus, You answered the request of Abraham, so I know You can answer my

prayers. Teach me persistence in prayer so that I will not quit praying while You're still

answering. Amen."

Reading: Matt. 1:1-17

Words: 264

Key Thought: You can get your prayers answered just as Abraham.

MY WITNESS—HOLY SPIRIT

"Surely even now my witness is in heaven, and my evidence is on high" (Job

16:19). "But the Holy Spirit also witnesses to us" (Hebrews 10:15).

The Holy Spirit is the Father's Witness to your heart. When you don't know what to do, the

Holy Spirit will let you know the Father's will and He will tell you how to do it. When you have

doubts, the Holy Spirit will give you assurance. Just as a witness must give an accurate

testimony, the *Holy Spirit* will tell you what the Father expects from you.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for speaking to my heart. Make me wise enough to follow Your

direction, strong enough to do Your will, and courageous enough to turn from the

allurement of the flesh and the world. Speak; I'm listening.

The *Holy Spirit* is the *Witness* to the Father in Heaven. Just as a witness tells what he has heard,

the Holy Spirit will tell all of Heaven that He heard you pray to receive Christ. Just as a witness

tells the court what he has seen, the *Holy Spirit* will be your witness to tell the Father that He saw

your faithfulness and good works on earth. Just as a witness must not add his opinion to his

testimony, the Holy Spirit will accurately tell everyone all about you. Don't worry about being

forgotten or overlooked in Heaven. The Holy Spirit is your Witness who will testify for you in

glory.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for living in my life. Thank You for the witness from the Father

of what I should do on earth. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 10:14-25

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit tells everyone in Heaven about your faithfulness.

A FLAG—JESUS

"In that day the offspring of Jessie (Jesus) will be a flag to which the people will

rally" (Isa. 11:10, Author's Translation.

Jesus is your Flag; rally to Him. The King James Bible called Jesus an Ensign; newer versions

call Him a Banner. In battle, when warriors are separated from their fellow soldiers, they rally to

their "colors." There's strength and protection in numbers. When you're in a battle against the

world, the flesh, and the Devil, don't fight your brethren; just rally to Jesus for spiritual victory.

Jesus is your Flag.

"Lord, with so many Christians fighting each other, it's hard to keep my perspective.

Help me look to You. Lord, I need eyes to see clearly the issues."

Jesus is A Flag, hold Him high so people can see Him. Remember Jesus said, "I will draw all

peoples to Myself" (John 12:32). You don't have to argue doctrine, baptism, or anything else;

just hold high the Jesus flag and He'll draw them to Himself. When the unsaved attack you or

Christianity, Jesus is your Flag; lift Him up. His followers will rally with you to Jesus. He is

the rallying point of Christianity, just as in a battle you must defend your flag because you're

defending your family, your home and your country; carry your flag into battle because Jesus is

you Flag. But sometimes wounded warriors need our help. Hold high the Flag so they can rally

to Jesus and together you can win the battle. Those closest to the Flag can see it best, so stay

close to Jesus.

"Lord, I will rally to You. I will defend You and the cause of Christianity. I will try to

get others to join me and your flag. Amen."

CAPTAIN—JESUS

"For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect

through sufferings" (Hebrews 2:10, KJV).

Jesus is the Captain of your Salvation. This title, archegos, is also translated "author" and

"prince," suggesting Jesus is your leader. He is the One who takes the lead in salvation; He died

for you. He is the One who first provided the complete forgiveness of sin. One Bible translation

calls Him "Pioneer." As a Pioneer, He went where no one else could go; He went into the grave

of death for you, and did what no one else could do – He returned alive. Call on your Captain

today.

"Lord Jesus, You are the Captain of My Salvation; I owe everything to You. Thank You

for taking the initiative to obtain my salvation, and for making eternal life possible."

Jesus is the Captain of your Salvation; He left Heaven to become flesh and live among us. He

took the initiative to show you the Father's love. He originally came to you, before you could

respond to His love. Now as the Captain of your Salvation, let Him work out His plan in your

life. Just as His salvation is perfect, so He can guide you daily according to the "good and

acceptable and perfect will of God" (Rom. 12:2). Jesus knows the future and He knows the

plans God has for you (Jer. 29:11). Will you follow your *Captain*?

"Lord, I trust You as my Captain; lead my life today. Help me understand Your will for

my life, then give me strength to do it. I will obey You today. Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus has taken the initiative as the Captain of your Salvation.

THE SPIRIT OF CHRIST—HOLY SPIRIT

"Searching what, or what manner of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the

glories that would follow" (1 Peter 1:11).

The Holy Spirit is sent to "glorify Christ" (John 16:14). As such, the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of

Christ speaking in the Old Testament to explain how "the Christ" would come to suffer for sins

and enter His glory. In the New Testament times, the Holy Spirit brings people to Christ for

salvation. He is the Spirit that makes Christ real to you?

"Holy Spirit, help me see all Christ has done for me, and help me magnify Christ in a

new and greater way."

The Holy Spirit is the One who is characterized as the Spirit of Christ because He delivers

Christ's work on the cross to the hearts of people. It is the task of the *Holy Spirit* to bring people

to salvation. In doing this, the *Holy Spirit* glorifies Christ (John 16:14, 15). Christ and the *Holy*

Spirit are equal members of the Trinity – equal in power, authority, holiness, and love. But they

are separate persons in the godhead. The Spirit of Christ wants to magnify Jesus through all you

do in your life. You allow the Holy Spirit to make you like Christ when you yield to Him.

Because the *Holy Spirit* is "holy", He will make you "holy". Because the *Holy Spirit* is "Spirit",

He will make you spiritual.

"Spirit of Christ, work in my life to bring glory to Jesus through all I do. My prayer is

'For to me, to live is Christ' (Phil. 1:21) and 'not I but Christ' (Gal. 2:20). Amen."

Reading: 1 Peter 1:1-16

Words: 251

Key Thought: The task of the Holy Spirit is to apply the work of Christ to your life.

CHRIST CRUCIFIED—JESUS

"... but we preach Christ crucified" (1 Corinthians 1:23).

Jesus is Christ Crucified, the Jewish Messiah who was executed by the Romans on a cross.

God's people—the Jews—rejected Christ. The Jewish leaders sent Him to be tried in a Roman

court. When Pilate wanted to release Jesus, the Jews cried out, "Crucify Him." It was then the

Roman soldiers nailed Him to a cross, crucifying Jesus. Six hours later, He died. Because the

Jews allowed Rome to crucify Jesus, they actively rejected Him as their Messiah, yet He died for

them and the world.

"Jesus, Your pain was my gain. You died for my sin that I might be forgiven. While I'm

horrified by the thought of crucifixion, I worship You for being my Sin-bearer."

Being *crucified* did not catch *Jesus* by surprise. He came into the world to die for the world.

The Old Testament predicted His crucifixion, "Cursed is everyone that hangeth on a tree" (Gal.

3:13, KJV). Jesus' death was necessary for Him to be "made a curse" for our sin. When the

curse was lifted from us, we were forgiven . . . we were free from punishment . . . we were

acceptable to the Father. Christ was crucified for us.

"Jesus, thank You for the ultimate sacrifice. I will live because You died. I will escape

the judgment of Hell because You suffered my judgment for all who believe on You. I will

live forever with the Father in Heaven because You left the Father to come to earth to

suffer rejection and crucifixion for me. Amen."

Reading: John 19:16-30

Key Thought: Christ was crucified for me.

CHRIST, THE POWER OF GOD—JESUS

"But to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and

the wisdom of God" (1 Corinthians 1:24).

Christ is The Power Of God to break the chains of iniquity, to forgive sin, and to deliver souls

from Hell. He is *The Power of God* to bind Satan, open the doors of Hell, and take His followers

to Heaven. What greater Power is there in the world than The Power Christ has over the Evil

One? Don't be concerned with those who have the power of money or position, for they can

only do things in this life; you should fear God who has Power over the spiritual realm and over

the next life.

"Jesus, I bow in Your presence. I recognize Your eternal power in the heavenlies.

Forgive me for being so concerned with man's power that I didn't see Your power."

Jesus is the Christ, The Power of God, who gives you great wisdom and insight into God's will

for your life. He can give you victory over temptation, and liberty over besetting sin. He can

work all things together for your good (Rom. 8:28). He can use you in His service and give you

spiritual ability to lead unsaved people to salvation. You need His Power in your life. You can

release His *Power* into your life today by seeking His presence and yielding to *Christ* when He

comes to you.

"Christ, I acknowledge Your presence in my life; it is the only power that has eternal

implications. Thank You for making Yourself available to me; I claim the power of Your

presence today. Amen."

Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:17-31

Key Thought: You must claim The Power of Christ if you want it.

THE SPIRIT OF GLORY—HOLY SPIRIT

"If you are reproached for the name of Christ, blessed are you, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. On their part He is blasphemed, but on your

part He is glorified" (1 Peter 4:14).

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Glory who rests on you when you suffer for your faith.

Remember the Holy Spirit enters your life when you are saved, and helps you in Christian

service. But the *Holy Spirit* has a special ministry when you are persecuted for your faith. He is

the Spirit of Glory who helps you get through pain to experience God's glory. The Spirit of

Glory will help you see God's purpose for suffering. And when you endure affliction with a

victorious attitude, you bring glory to God.

"O Spirit of God, I am not suffering right now as I have in the past. Thank You for a

good life. Help me endure persecution when suffering comes. Bring glory to the Father

when I go through the valley of the shadow of death."

The Holy Spirit will glorify the Father when you successfully overcome trials and temptations.

He is The Spirit of Glory who will minister to you in your darkest hour. He is the Spirit of God

who rests upon all you do. Invite Him to direct your life today so you will be ready when the

storms come. Yield to *The Spirit of Glory* so you can worship today.

"Holy Spirit, guide me to the 'good things' of life. When storms come, keep me rejoicing

and trusting You. Bring glory to the Father through me, Spirit of Glory. Amen."

Reading: 1 Peter 5:12-19

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will give special help to you when you are persecuted for your

faith.

COUNSELOR—JESUS

"For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called . . . Counselor" (Isaiah 9:6).

Jesus is Counselor; it is a birth name that Isaiah predicted of Him. It is Jesus' nature to give

counsel to those who follow Him, because He knows all things. He can counsel you because He

knows what is best for you today. Jesus does not need to ask anyone what you had, because He

is described as "wonderful in counsel and excellent in guidance" (Isa. 28:29). He can show you

what to do if you will listen, and He can guide if you will obey.

"Lord, I need Your direction today; "Guide me with Your counsel (Ps. 73:24). You know

all about me; I trust Your guidance."

Jesus is the Counselor who will guide you from the Scriptures. Study them well to find direction

for your life. His solutions are not "cookie cutter" answers because He personally knows you

and will apply the Scriptures to your life. Jesus has a plan for you individually, but to find it you

must know Him individually. Next, you can find His counsel through prayer; talk to Jesus

about your day. Third, Jesus may use wise counselors to guide you (Pro. 11:14). Then, Jesus

may verify His counsel through the circumstances of your life. Jesus is your Counselor; what

ways will He use to guide you today?

"Lord, I will follow these guidelines to discover and follow Your counsel for my life."

Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus can help us through His counsel.

DAY STAR—JESUS

"Ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the

day dawn, and the day star arises in your hearts" (2 Peter 1:19, KJV).

Jesus is the Day Star. Just as the Day Star is first seen after as night is ending, so Jesus was first

seen after the long dark night between the Old and the New Testament. Jesus is the Light of the

World who brought salvation to all. When the dark night is filled with fear and discouragement,

people lose their way in the dark; they stumble and fall. But the Day Star gives them optimism

and hope. When hurting people see the first star of the morning, they fight their way through

pain because of the promise of a new day. Jesus is the Day Star who promises new opportunities

for you this coming day.

"Jesus, You are my Day Star of promise. I will not look back on the darkness of my

failure. I will not give up in the blackness of despair. I know help is coming; I will hang

on."

Jesus is your Day Star who announces the pain of the night is over. He comes to help you

overcome your hurts and forget your defeats. He can forgive the sin of all your failure. He is the

Day Star who introduces a new future. He can give you strength to be victorious in the day of

new challenges.

"Jesus, when I see You shining in the morning sky, I know the night is almost over. I feel

optimism from Your presence. Guide me, Day Star, to a better day. Amen."

Reading: 2 Peter 1:19-21

Words: 244

Key Thought: Jesus gives us optimism after a fearful night.

THE SPIRIT OF GRACE—HOLY SPIRIT

"Of how much worse punishment, do you suppose, will he be thought worthy who has trampled the Son of God underfoot, counted the blood of the covenant by which he was

sanctified a common thing, and insulted the Spirit of grace?" (Hebrews 10:29)

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Grace who gives people the opposite of what they deserve.

People deserve Hell because they have rejected the Father and the Son, but The Spirit of Grace

offers them Heaven. People deserve misery and oppression because they chose sin, but The

Spirit of Grace offers them the peaceful will of God. People deserve to be cut off from the

Father because they turn their backs on Him, but The Spirit of Grace offers to fill them with

God's presence and enrich their lives. Grace is getting the good things of God, not His

judgment. The *Holy Spirit* wants people to be saved by grace and then live by grace.

"Holy Spirit, I don't deserve the good things of Heaven, but I accept them. I don't

deserve grace, but I'm grateful for it."

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Grace who comes to give you assurance of salvation so you can

live confidently. He gives you gifts to serve the Father, and He will guide your every step. The

Holy Spirit gives you spiritual light to understand the Scripture and He will use you as you share

the gospel with unsaved people. The Holy Spirit gives hope for life beyond the grave. What

good thing do you want from Him?

"Holy Spirit, I surrender to Your will; guide me this day. I accept all the good gifts You

offer. Use me as I serve You this day. I like grace much more than legalism. Grace is a

good way to live. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 10:26-39

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will give you much more than you deserve.

DAYSPRING—JESUS

"The Dayspring from on high has visited us" (Luke 1:78).

The Dayspring is like the point on the horizon where the sun will first shines. Jesus is the

Dayspring who shines the light of salvation to your darkened heart. He is the first hope that help

is on the way. Jesus is the Dayspring who brought you hope for a new life. Now Jesus can

shine in your life to show you where to walk this day.

"Lord, I need light on my path. If I knew what to do, I would do it. It's hard to have

hope when the night is so scary. Shine Light on my path today."

Jesus is the Dayspring. Just as the early morning sun shines over the earth's perimeter, so His

light comes to dispel darkness. Don't be afraid of last night's darkness that breeds ignorance,

doubt, and despair. Look for the Dayspring on the horizon; you'll find the rising sun

compelling. Don't complain about darkness, look to the Dayspring, the beginning of light.

When you originally looked to Christ, He gave you new hope. Just as the morning sun helps you

understand your world, He can enlighten this day's activities. And what the Dayspring can do

today, He can do tomorrow, and the next day. "The path of the just is like the shining sun, that

shines ever brighter unto the perfect day" (Prov. 4:18).

"Dayspring, be the sunrise of my life. There are so many paths; I need Light to help me

choose the right path for today. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 84; John 8

Key Thought: Jesus is the beginning of your optimism.

DOOR—JESUS

"I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out

and find pasture" (John 10:9).

Jesus is the Door, which means individuals must go through Him to enter Heaven. But a door is

also a barrier; it keeps intruders out. Those who reject Jesus cannot enter Heaven. He is the

Door to keep hypocrites out of the Father's presence. "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord,

Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 7:21).

"Lord, You are my Door; I have experienced salvation through You. Today, I have many

choices to make. How can I know which decisions—like doors—to take?"

Jesus is the Door to salvation; those who come to Him have salvation because, "He who has the

Son has life" (1 John 5:12). Some refuse to come to Jesus, thinking all religions are good, but

"wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and there are many who go in by

it" (Matt. 7:13). Not every door goes to Heaven, and not every door opens to eternal life. Jesus

is the only Door to Heaven. He is a narrow Door; sometimes it's difficult to follow Jesus

because "narrow is the gate . . . which leads to life, and there are few who find it" (Matt. 7:14).

But when you choose according to the Scriptures, you have chosen the right path; you have

chosen *Jesus*, the *Door* of countless opportunities.

"Lord, I walk through the Doors You open today. I will not lag behind or run ahead of

You. I will go where You lead. You are my Door to life. Amen."

Reading: Luke 9:23-26

Key Thought: Jesus is your Door of opportunity.

THE SPIRIT OF HOLINESS – HOLY SPIRIT

"... and declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by

the resurrection from the dead" (Romans 1:4).

The Third Person of the Trinity is *The Spirit of Holiness*. His nature is pure and holy. He is

separated from any fault or sin. The *Holy Spirit* is holy, just as the Father and Son are holy. No

sinner can come before the Trinity because Their holiness means They also are a consuming fire

that judges any sin in Their presence. But because Jesus died to forgive your sin, you can live

with Them forever. You can confess your sins and come into Their presence with your prayers

for this day.

"I come to You, Spirit of Holiness, asking that You give me holy thoughts and holy

motives. I am only human and can't become godly in myself."

The Spirit of Holiness entered your life when you became a Christian. Because you are a finite

human, you cannot be holy in yourself, but the presence of the *Holy Spirit* in your life makes you

holy. Invite Him into your body today. When you yield to His control, you will develop holy

values and attitudes. When you put the *Holy Spirit* first in your life, you can have holy thoughts.

When you follow the leading of the *Holy Spirit*, you can have His power to live a holy life. Let

the Holy Spirit fill your life with The Spirit of Holiness.

"Holy Spirit, I want You to make me more godly. Fill me with Your holiness and make

me spiritual. Amen."

Reading: Romans 7:23; 8:11

Words: 241

Key Thought: Only the Holy Spirit can make you holy.

WISDOM—JESUS

"Christ . . . the wisdom of God" (1 Corinthians 1:24).

Jesus is Wisdom, the fountainhead of all truth. All knowledge began with Jesus, and any

knowledge you have flows from Him into the world. As Wisdom flows into your life, will you

share it with the world? Jesus is Wisdom; can He guide you because He knows what is best for

you?

"Lord, I need wisdom in my family relationship, there's so much I don't know. I need

wisdom in my work, there's so much I have to do. I need wisdom just to keep my life on

an even keel."

Jesus is Wisdom. He understands how people should relate to one another and treat others. As

Wisdom, He knows how you can perform the tasks you face this day; let Him help you. As

Wisdom, He knows where the bumps are located in your road; follow His direction.

As Wisdom, Jesus knows how the Enemy will tempt you; let Him protect you. Jesus is Wisdom,

let Him show you the needs of this day, and let His wisdom solve your problems (James 1:5).

"Lord, I need wisdom to stand against the adversary, I face subtle temptations. I need

wisdom to apply Your Word to my life. I confess my foolish pride that thinks I am

smarter than Your way. I ask forgiveness for my stubborn will when I refuse to learn

from You. I ask for wise guidance throughout this day. Be Wisdom to me. Amen."

Reading: Matthew 7:21-29

Words: 237

Key Thought: Let Jesus teach you what He wants you to know.

A SURETY OF A BETTER COVENANT—JESUS

"By so much more Jesus has become a surety of a better covenant" (Hebrews

7:22).

When two people make a contract or sign an agreement, the purchaser puts up a down payment,

or surety, to guarantee there's more money to follow. Jesus is the down payment of the Father's

agreement to redeem you; He is A Surety of the New Covenant. Under the Old Testament

covenant, the blood of a lamb or another substitute animal was the surety. The New Covenant

was sealed with His blood; Jesus is A Surety of a Better Covenant. Because Jesus is the Son of

God, His guarantee of salvation is much better than in the Old Testament. Also, because Jesus

lives in your heart and He stands before the Father for you, you can be sure of Heaven when you

die.

"Lord Jesus, I see You standing at the right hand of the Father for me. I praise You for

Your death on the Cross that guaranteed my salvation."

The death of Jesus means much more than the Old Testament sacrifice of a lamb. The blood of

lambs was an atonement (Kaphar), which means to cover. In the Old Testament, sins were only

covered. "For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sin" (Heb.

10:4). The death of *Jesus* took away your sin and nothing can be charged against you—ever.

Jesus is A Surety of a Better Covenant.

"Lord Jesus, I walk confidently because You are my surety. I pray with bold faith

because You have guaranteed my salvation. I know when I die, I'll go to see You in

Heaven. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 4:14-16

Words: 261

Key Thought: Jesus guarantees my salvation.

THE SPIRIT OF JUDGMENT—HOLY SPIRIT

"When the Lord has washed away the filth of the daughters of Zion, and purged the blood of Jerusalem from her midst, by the spirit of judgment and by the spirit of burning"

(Isaiah 4:4).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Judgment who convicts believers of sin (John 16:9-11), and

shows them the error of their ways. Because He is the Holy Spirit, His holiness is grieved when

Christians allow sin to exist in their lives (Eph. 4:30). If they continue sinning, the Holy Spirit

brings judgment and the consequences of sin. The Holy Spirit would rather do good things for

the child of God, but as *The Spirit of Judgment*, He must deal with sin. So keep yourself from

sin.

"Holy Spirit, I want to obey You and become more godly. But, temptation is so subtle

and I am weak. Give me strength to live godly."

The Holy Spirit does not warn you about judgment to terrify you or make you feel guilty. You

don't grow as a believer by legalistically abstaining from sin. The Holy Spirit tells of sin to

protect you from harm and help you live a good life. You grow in the Spirit as you love the

Father and obey the Scriptures. But, The Spirit of Judgment will punish when you sin. He is

also the Spirit of mercy, who forgives you when you cry out for mercy. Don't look to others to

learn how the Spirit has judged sin; rather, look to Him alone for grace and mercy.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for both Your positive and negative work in my heart. I look to

You alone for Your grace and love. Amen."

Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:14-28

Words: 245

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will judge sin He finds in the lives of Christians.

BLAMELESS—JESUS

"He is the kind of high priest we need because he is holy and blameless, unstained by sin. He has now been set apart from sinners, and he has been given the highest

place of honor in heaven "(Hebrews 7:26).

Jesus lived a blameless life. No one is able to point a finger to accuse Him of saying anything

that was not true, nor did He do anything to hurt anyone. Jesus "knew no sins" (2 Cor. 5:21) and

He "was without sin" (Heb. 4:15). Jesus lived a perfect life so He could become a sacrifice

without blemish for the sins of all (1 Pet. 1:19). Now look to His life as a pattern for your life.

The young people ask, "WWJD?" (What Would Jesus Do?) You couldn't find a better example

for your life. Let Him be your pattern for living.

"Lord Jesus, I love You for first loving me. Thank You for Your perfect life and

sacrificial death. Help me to follow Your example and live blamelessly."

Some might think Jesus was harsh because He accused the Pharisees of being hypocrites, graves,

and snakes (Matt. 23:13-33), but what He said was true. Some might think Jesus was cruel

because He drove the moneychangers out of the Temple, but He did what was right. He was

blameless in both speech and actions. But Jesus wants to be more than an example to you of a

blameless life, He wants to live in you and make His home in your heart. Jesus wants to give

you power to live a blameless life. Begin each day by yielding to His guidance and when you

feel resentful and angry, yield to His control.

"Lord, I will learn about You and follow Your example. Help me live a blameless life

today. Amen."

Reading: Mark 14:10-11; 43-46

Words: 259

Key Thought: Jesus' perfect life is our example.

YOUR HOLY SERVANT—JESUS

"For truly against Your holy Servant Jesus, whom You anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, with the Gentiles and the people of Israel, were gathered together"

(Acts 4:27).

Jesus is The Holy Servant whom the Father has anointed. Jesus assumed the threefold office of

Prophet, Priest and King. Just as an Old Testament prophet was anointed before ministering the

Word of the Lord, so the Father anointed *Jesus* to deliver the message of salvation to the world.

Likewise as a Temple priest was anointed to make an offering for sin, so the heavenly Father

anointed Jesus to make an offering for the sins of the world. Just as a king was anointed to rule

the kingdom, so the Father anointed *Jesus* to enter the hearts of believers and rule their lives.

Did you know the title Christ comes from the Hebrew root "anointed"? So Jesus' title is Christ,

the Anointed One.

"Lord Jesus, You are my prophet, priest, and King. Come with the message of salvation,

to sit upon the throne of my life to rule my thoughts and actions."

Jesus is The Holy Servant of the Father; the Father sent Jesus to do His will. The Father sent

Jesus to live without sin among people. The Father sent Jesus to do mighty miracles and

demonstrate His love. The Father sent Jesus to die for all and rise from the dead that they might

have life. *Jesus* was the *Servant* of the Father for you.

"Lord Jesus, just as You were the Holy Servant of the Father, I want to be Your servant.

Just as You were anointed by the Father to do Your work, I want Your anointing in my

life. Come use me today."

Reading: Acts 4:23-31

Words: 258

Key Thought: Jesus was the Servant of the Father.

THE SPIRIT OF LIFE—THE HOLY SPIRIT

"For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of

sin and death." (Romans 8:2).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit of Life who gives eternal life to all who believe in Jesus Christ.

Unsaved people will follow the law of sin because they are born with a sin nature (Rom. 3:23).

But all those who are born again can be free from the law of sin. The *Holy Spirit* gives them this

freedom when they claim His victory. All who put their trust in Christ Jesus should live by the

new law of The Spirit of Life. Also, because law comes from God, The Spirit of Life gives you a

new nature that has new laws and desires to control your life. Don't follow the old laws of sin,

but follow the new laws of the Holy Spirit.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for being The Spirit of Life in me. Thank you for giving me new

me new desires to live above the law of sin and death."

The Spirit of Life has delivered you from the law of sin and death so you don't automatically

have to surrender your old nature. Sin doesn't have to control your life. The Spirit of Life can

give you power to overcome temptation. Also, the forces of sin and death cannot dictate your

future. The Spirit of Life will deliver your soul to God at the moment of your death. You may

die physically, but your body will be raised in the future because of the life within you.

"Holy Spirit, I yield to Your control of my life; live freely in me. Give me Your power to

overcome temptation and live godly for You. Amen."

Reading: Job 19:23-29

Words: 269

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit gives you life to overcome the law of sin and death.

A MERCIFUL AND FAITHFUL HIGH PRIEST—JESUS

"Therefore, in all things He had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation

for the sins of the people" (Hebrews 2:17).

In order to forgive our sins, Jesus was made flesh so He could identify with us. The Bible says,

"He had to be made like His brethren" Heb. 2:17), so that He could be A Merciful and Faithful

High Priest. Jesus didn't just arbitrarily forgive our sins without feeling or empathy. If He had

done that, salvation would be impersonal and antiseptic. But when Jesus became human, He

understood our temptations because, "He was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin"

(Heb. 4:15). Therefore, Jesus feels for us. He is merciful; not vindictive or judgmental.

Because Jesus is A Merciful High Priest, you can go to Him for help.

"Lord Jesus, I come to You for forgiveness. Thank You for understanding my weakness."

Jesus did more than a human High Priest; He is faithful even when we are not faithful. Just as

there are stories of priests in the Old Testament who were not faithful to their office, so the

Scriptures describe Him as a Faithful High Priest. He was human as we are, so He understood

human weaknesses. Even though we may disappoint Him in our lifetime, He never once was a

disappointment to Himself, or to the Father. Because He is faithful, He was able to make

propitiation (satisfaction) for our sins.

Lord Jesus, You have never disappointed me, even though I have disappointed You. Even

in my weakness, You forgive my sins. I'm thankful for Your mercy and faithfulness.

Amen."

Reading: Heb. 2:17-18

Words: 246

Key Thought: Jesus became flesh so He could be a merciful and faithful High Priest for my sins.

THE SAME SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one

individually as He wills "(1 Corinthians 12:11).

The Holy Spirit is the Same Spirit who delivered salvation to you, and He is also The Same Spirit

who gave you spiritual gifts. There's only one Holy Spirit (Eph. 4:4), and He is The Same Spirit

who works in your heart, but also *The Same Spirit* who works in the heart of every believer all

over the world. How can He be everywhere—equally—at the same time? Because He is God,

He is omnipresent. He is *The Same Spirit* who's ministering in Heaven right now and *The Same*

Spirit who wants to minister to you. Yield to His control.

"Holy Spirit, forgive my limited view of who You are. Come, stretch my faith today.

Teach me greater faith to see all you do."

The Holy Spirit is The Same Spirit who created the world (Gen. 1:2) and The Same Spirit who

formed you in the womb (Ps. 139:13-16). He is *The Same Spirit* who gives the gift of faith to

one, and *The Same Spirit* who gives the gift of healing to another (1 Cor. 12:9). He is "the same

spirit that works these things" (1 Cor. 12:11). Look to Him for every spiritual need in your life.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for reminding me of Your larger work in the world and Your

specific work in my life. Help me re-focus my thoughts on Your power so I can do things

I have to do today. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 139:7-16

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit does all the work of God.

THE SAVIOR OF THE BODY—JESUS

"For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He

is the Savior of the body" (Ephesians 5:23).

Salvation is a double identification and transference. At conversion Jesus came into your heart

to become a part of your life. At the same time, you were placed into His body (the church) to

become a part of Christ. "You in Me, and I in you" (John 14:20). All those in Christ are saved;

He is The Savior of the Body. If you are in His body, then you are saved. Have you invited

Christ into your life?

"Lord, I have asked You into my heart and You saved me. Thank You for coming into my

heart to become a part of my life. Also, I thank You for placing me into Your body to be a

part of Your life."

Jesus is The Savior of the Body. When you were placed into His body, you were saved from

your past penalty of sin, and from the future punishment in Hell. And today, you are being saved

from servitude to sin. Jesus has a wonderful plan for each one in His body. He wants you love

Him, serve Him, and worship Him. Think about it! Jesus has a great and wonderful purpose for

your life.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for a new purposeful life. Because I am in You, i.e., in Your

body, I will try to do Your will today. Because You are in Me, give me strength to do

Your purpose. I need Your power today. Amen."

Reading: Isa. 53:8-12

Words: 239

Key Thought: You are in Jesus and He is in you.

THE SPIRIT OF YOUR FATHER—HOLY SPIRIT

"But when they deliver you up, do not worry about how or what you should speak. For it will be given to you in that hour what you should speak; For it is not you who speak, but

the Spirit of your Father who speaks in you" (Matthew 10:19, 20).

Just as you have a spirit that is the intrinsic nature of who you are, so The Spirit of Your Father

in Heaven has the same nature as the Heavenly Father, yet He is a separate person from the

Father. The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Godhead, who is The Spirit of the Father. The

Father sends the Holy Spirit to do His work. When you are persecuted, the Holy Spirit will

indwell you to help you. When you don't know what to say to your oppressors, the Holy Spirit

will speak through you. The Spirit of Your Father will give you 'in that hour what you should

speak' (Matt. 10:19).

"Holy Spirit, I trust You to help me in my hour of trial. But today is an average day, so

help me in all that I say to glorify the Father."

The Holy Spirit was sent by the Father to give you boldness to speak when people reject your

testimony. He will give you wisdom to know what to say, and when to speak. He will give you

"soft words that turn away wrath," or He will give stinging words to convict of sin. But most of

all, He will give you convincing words that will sink deep in the hearts of your listeners. The

Holy Spirit "He will not speak of Himself . . . He will glorify Christ" (John 16:13, author's

translation).

"Holy Spirit, fill my life with Your presence. Put words in my mouth that I need to speak

and use my testimony for Your glory. Amen."

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will give you what to say when you are persecuted for your faith.

THE LORD STRONG AND MIGHTY—JESUS

"Who is this King of glory? The LORD strong and mighty, the LORD mighty in

battle" (Psalm 24:8).

Jesus is The Lord, Strong and Mighty. Come to Him when you're afraid and losing the battle.

Lean on Him when you're weak. He knows the battle is fierce, because they mocked Him, beat

Him, and finally crucified Him. So He knows how you feel in opposition, so come to the Lord

for help. Let His wisdom guide you and let His strength protect you. Don't give in to the enemy

and don't give up. Draw energy from the Lord for Jesus is The Lord, Strong and Mighty. What

do you need from Him?

"Lord Jesus, I feel comforted when You are near. I get energy from You each day to face

my problems. I feel secure in Your presence. Come help me face my problems today."

The world expects Christians to be weak and soft. That's because they've only seen one side of

Jesus' personality. They've only heard about His gentleness to those who suffer and His mercy

to forgive. But Jesus has another side. He is The Lord, Strong and Mighty. He will defeat the

armies of Satan in the last battle. He will judge and condemn those who reject Him. So today,

He will fight for you. When you are attacked, He will defend you. When the battle gets fierce,

get close to Him. Jesus is The Lord, Strong and Mighty in battle, call on Him for help right now.

"Lord, I will not let the enemy scare me, nor will I be afraid in battle. I look to You to

fight my battles. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 7:1-17

Words: 258

Key Thought: Trust God's strength in your battles.

THE HELPER—HOLY SPIRIT

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you"

(John 14:26).

The Holy Spirit is The Helper sent by Jesus for your assistance. Because Jesus couldn't remain

in His physical body on Earth, He sent the Holy Spirit to indwell you. He can help you

overcome sin and live godly. He can help you understand Scripture and give you power to live

by its principles (John 14:26). He can help you intercede to the Father so you can get your

prayers answered (Rom. 8:26, 27). He can guide your daily life and help you walk in righteous

paths (Gal. 5:16). If you need help in your Christian life, call on *The Helper* today.

"Holy Spirit, I need You this day. I am weak; strengthen my will to follow You. I am

limited; help me live above my weaknesses. I need Your help in every area of my life."

The Holy Spirit is your Helper. Even though He has many titles, this was Jesus' favorite name

for Him because it reflects what He does for us. The Holy Spirit helps people become a

Christian, then He helps them live godly lives. He helps them in Christian service. No matter

what your need, call on the *Holy Spirit* today. He will help you.

"Holy Spirit, I bow humbly, asking You for help. I need Your power to overcome

temptation. I need Your light to understand Scriptures. I need Your guidance to walk the

straight and narrow path. I need Your wisdom to solve my problems. I need Your

presence to enrich my life and give me new purpose to live for today. Amen."

Reading: Romans 8:26, 27

Words: 260

Key Thought: Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to help you live the Christian life.

A MAN APPROVED BY GOD—JESUS

"Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the

midst of you, as ye yourselves also know" (Acts 2:22, KJV).

Jesus is A Man Approved by God. He was born of a virgin without a sin nature. He lived a

perfect life without committing sin (1 Peter 2:22). But that doesn't mean He didn't have

difficulties, He was tempted in all points as you are (Heb. 4:15) yet He didn't give in to

temptation. Just as a sacrificial lamb had to be perfect to offer for sin, so Jesus lived a perfect

life so He could be a substitute for your sin. As the perfect man, Jesus was approved by God to

take your punishment and guilt.

"Lord Jesus, I know You became flesh for me. Thank You for Your human perfection. I

worship You and cry out with other worshippers, 'You are worthy, O Lord, to receive

glory and honor and power' (Rev. 4:11). Yes, I say, 'Worthy is the lamb' (Rev. 5:12)."

Jesus is the Man Approved by God. Because God so loved the world, He sent Jesus to redeem

all people. Because Jesus is both eternal God and perfect man, He qualified to be the sin bearer

for all. Because He died, was buried, and on the third day arose from the dead, the Father

attested His work and accepted all who believed on Him (John 20:31).

"Lord Jesus, I bow before You, thanking You for salvation. You were the only One who

could have redeemed the sinful race. You are the One who redeemed me. Amen."

Reading: Acts 2:22-36

Words: 240

Key Thought: The Father approved the human life of Jesus.

YOUR GENEROUS SPIRIT—HOLY SPIRIT

"Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me by Your generous spirit"

(Psalm 51:12).

The Holy Spirit is the Generous Spirit of God. He gives freely to you because it's His nature to

give. He gives eternal life because Jesus died so you can live forever. He gives abundantly,

because the Scriptures promise "life and life more abundantly" (John 10:10). He gives richly,

because the riches of Heaven are His to give to you. He gives generously because you have need

of the generous blessings from Heaven. What do you want Him to give you today?

"Holy Spirit, I am human flesh. I have earthly needs, but I also have spiritual needs. I

have multiple problems, so I need Your power and guidance. Give me your generous

blessings today."

The Holy Spirit is the Generous Spirit. Some think the Holy Spirit has a warehouse filled with

blessing for Christians. But that is a wrong picture, because the *Holy Spirit* is not like a place

where people put things. A warehouse can give out and become empty, but the *Holy Spirit* is the

source of blessing; He can never become empty or run out of blessings. He is the Generous

Spirit who gives eternally because He is the unlimited source of God's supply. He is the

Generous Spirit who gives Himself freely to all believers. What more do you need than the Holy

Spirit?

"Holy Spirit, I need You more than the blessings I seek. I need You more than anything

else. Fill my life with Your presence. Be generous; give me everything I can contain.

Amen."

Reading: Psalm 51:1-19

Words: 252

Key Thoughts: The Holy Spirit is the blessing you need.

A STONE CUT OUT OF THE MOUNTAIN—JESUS

"Inasmuch as you saw that the stone was cut out of the mountain without hands,

and that it broke in pieces the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver, and the gold . .

. the great God has made known to the king what will come to pass after this. The

dream is certain, and its interpretation is sure" (Daniel 2:45).

When Nebuchadnezzar saw the great image in a dream, he saw four coming world-ruling

empires, i.e., Babylon, Media-Persia, Greece, and Rome. In the end times, the Roman empire

will be revived briefly. Then a stone will be cut out of the mountain to smash the revived Roman

world empire. Jesus is that Stone who will crush the kingdoms that oppose God and then Jesus

will rule the earth. Where earthly things look discouraging and you think governments are out of

control, remember one day Jesus will rule the earth. But now, His influence is exercised through

individuals as He rules the hearts of people. Let *Jesus* influence your world by ruling your heart.

"Lord Jesus, I want Your influence to flow through me today. Help me feel Your

presence and help me experience Your power."

Until Jesus returns as—A Stone Cut Out of the Mountain—He will not directly rule the world but

will influence the world through secular rulers. "The hearts of the rulers are in the Lord's hands

and He influences them concerning His will" (Prov. 21:1, Author's translation). Most of the

rulers of government do not recognize the Lord's authority over them, but without Him they

could do nothing. Pray for the rulers over you so the Lord can rule their lives and influence your

nation for righteousness (1 Tim. 2:1-5). Your prayer for the rulers over you is your contribution

to better government and a better life.

"Lord Jesus, pray for those who rule my nation; help them follow principles of

righteousness and justice. Amen."

Reading: Daniel 2:1-49

Words: 260

Key Thought: Now Jesus rules through the hearts of people, but one day He will rule directly.

HIS VOICE—HOLY SPIRIT

"For He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand" (Psalm 95:7). "Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says: 'Today, if you will hear

His voice, harden not your heart" (Hebrews 3:7, 8).

The Holy Spirit is the Voice of God. No matter how far your wander, He will call out to you. No

matter how hard your heart, you can't block out His Voice. He could speak audibly, but He

usually speaks directly from His heart to yours. The Holy Spirit doesn't want you to miss His

Voice or misunderstand what He is saying. His message is simple, "The Father loves you, and

the Son died for you; now the *Holy Spirit* is calling you back into fellowship with them."

"Lord, You are my shepherd, and I am Your sheep. You make me lie down in green

pastures; You lead me beside still waters. You restore my soul. When I begin to stray,

You call me back into Your fold. When I've wandered out of sight, I heard Your voice

calling out for me. I strayed into the valley of death and I fell into a rocky pit. I thought I

would die and You would never know what happened to me. Then in the night, I heard

Your voice calling through the darkness. Forgive my hard heart; come rescue me and

bring me back into your fold."

The Holy Spirit is the Voice of God. He will prepare a table full of food for you and He will pour

oil into your wounds for healing. He will take you where you can dwell in the house of the Lord

forever.

"Holy Spirit, I hear Your voice; I want to come home to You. My pit is deep, come lift me

up, free me from the control of sin. I read that the shepherd put the straying lamb on His

shoulder and returned home rejoicing. Lord, bring me home. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 29:1-11

Words: 288

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit calls you back to God.

A RULER—JESUS

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel, whose

goings forth are from of old, from everlasting" (Micah 5:2).

Jesus is The Ruler in Israel. As such, He has ownership of Israel, which means He has authority

and control over the nation. In His first coming to earth, "He came to his own (the Jews), and his

own received him not" (John 1:11). The leaders rejected Jesus telling Pilate, "We have no king

but Caesar" (John 19:15). Jesus had the biological right to be King because of His birth. Jesus

had the divine right because He was sent from Heaven. Because the Jews only wanted outward

peace, and outward prosperity, they rejected Jesus' offer of inner peace and inward blessing.

They did not want Jesus to rule their hearts.

"Lord Jesus, even though the Jewish leaders rejected You, I accept Your rule in my life."

Even though many still reject Your authority over them, come rule my heart. I accept

Your authority and control."

Jesus was born A Ruler, but He can't rule corporately unless He rules each one individually.

And, Jesus can't rule individuals unless His authority starts within the heart of each one. Jesus

doesn't force outward conformity; He wants each one to give joyful obedience from the heart.

Since Jesus' kingdom is peace and righteousness, He gives peace to those who willingly obey

Him. He gives power to live righteously to those who love Him. Will you let Jesus be your

ruler today?

"Jesus, I choose You as my ruler; come give me power to live a righteous life. I serve

You out of love; give me inner peace and assurance. Amen."

Reading: Micah 4:1-5:4

Words: 256

Key Thought: Jesus must first rule inwardly before He will rule outwardly.

THE SPIRIT OF WISDOM—HOLY SPIRIT

"The Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the

fear of the LORD" (Isaiah 11:2).

The Holy Spirit is Spirit of Wisdom; He knows all things actual and potential. He knows

everything you do and the thoughts you think. Nothing is hidden from Him. Let the Holy Spirit

speak to your heart. He can help you discern the true nature of things in your life. The Spirit of

Wisdom can teach you more about yourself. You can learn about truth and you can get wisdom

to understand things as they are. As you learn more about the Holy Spirit in the Scriptures, He'll

take away your blindness.

"O Spirit of Truth, I need Your presence to help me sort out the motives of people around

me. People take advantage of me and hurt me. I need to look beneath the appearance of

things for a better understanding of what's happening in my world. I don't want to be

deceived, but rather I want to be an efficient servant for You."

The Spirit of Wisdom cannot be fooled by the images that people portray, nor can you hide

anything from Him. He looks behind the mask that people use to cover their motives. He sees

the real person. Let Him show you what He sees, and let Him transform your life to be like

Christ.

"O Spirit of Wisdom, help me be honest in all things. When You show me my real self,

don't overwhelm me with my weaknesses, and sin. Give me wisdom to accept myself.

Give me wisdom to overcome weaknesses to be like Christ. Give me wisdom to live this

day. Amen."

Reading: Proverbs 2, 3

Words: 260

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit will help you to honestly understand yourself.

A SACRIFICE TO GOD—JESUS

"And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an

offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma" (Ephesians 5:2).

Jesus is A Sacrifice to God for the sins of the world. When He sacrificed His life for the entire

world, it was the greatest gift that could be given. Jesus is the Son of the Father, but He

sacrificed His position for you. Jesus is the Second Person of the Trinity, but He sacrificed His

rights for you. Jesus is the eternal Lord of the Universe, but He sacrificed the riches of Heaven

for you. Because of what He's sacrificed for you, He wants you to sacrifice your life to Him.

He wants you to demonstrate your love to Him, just as He demonstrated His love for you.

"Jesus, You gave up the royal palaces of Heaven to be born in a stable. You gave up

every thing for me; I will not give You anything less than my heart."

Jesus is A Sacrifice and Sweet Smelling Aroma that pleased the Father (Is. 53:10). He has given

you the example of sacrificial when He said, "I lay down My life No one takes it from Me"

(John 10:17, 18). Jesus sacrificed Himself because He loved you; now He wants you to walk in

love. "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you" (John

13:34).

"Jesus, my love for You is shallow in comparison to Your love for me. Forgive my weak

love and stir me to more sacrifices for You this day. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 5:1-8

Words: 247

Key Thoughts: Jesus sacrificed Himself for us because He loved us.

THE HOLY SPIRIT SENT FROM HEAVEN—HOLY SPIRIT

"Those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven"

(1 Peter 1:12).

The Third Person of the Trinity The Holy Spirit Sent From Heaven. He came upon the believers

in the Upper Room on the day of Pentecost. They had been praying for ten days. When He

came upon them in power, they witnessed to unsaved people and over 3,000 people believed in

Jesus Christ and were baptized (Acts 2:44). If you need power to witness, seek the Holy Spirit.

He can fill you with divine presence so that people will be saved through your influence.

"Holy Spirit, come upon me today. Show me what I must do to win my unsaved friends to

Christ. Use my testimony to draw people to Jesus Christ. Use my words to motivate

people to salvation."

You need the power of *The Holy Spirit Sent From Heaven*. Just as He used the witness of the

disciples on Pentecost, so He can use you. But just as they were faithful in prayer, you must

intercede for your lost friends. Just as they searched their hearts to repent of secret sin to be

effective vessels, so you must be clean and useable. The Holy Spirit was sent from Heaven to

convict people of sin and draw them to salvation. Let Him use you today as a witness.

"Holy Spirit, show me anything that hinders my witness and I will repent and cleanse it

by the blood of Jesus. I want to be used by You to bring people to Jesus. Amen."

Reading: John 15:26-27

Words: 243

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit was sent to use you in soul winning.

THE LAMB—JESUS

"These will make war with the Lamb, and the Lamb will overcome them, for He is Lord of lords and King of kings; and those who are with Him are called,

chosen, and faithful" (Revelation 17:14).

The *Lamb* provided three basic contributions to Jewish life. First, it gave wool for clothing;

second, food to eat; and third the lamb was the primary animal to sacrifice as a symbolic

substitution for their sins. Jesus was the ultimate sacrifice, "The Lamb of God who takes away

the sin of the world!" (John 1:29). The lamb was gentle; it didn't attack or hurt other animals,

just as Jesus The Lamb was gentle to all. The lamb had no natural defense as some animals have

teeth; other animals have claws, every other animal was given some form of protection. But

Jesus is a picture of the defenseless Lamb who had no one to defend Him at His trials, nor any

warrior to protect Him from crucifixion. A lamb is meek, just as Jesus willingly submitted to

death. Jesus said, "If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight" (John 18:36).

"Lord, You are the meek Lamb slain for me. You are my gentle Savior."

Jesus, the meek Lamb, shall return a second time to destroy the evil works of Satan. He is called

Lamb 27 times in the Book of Revelation to remind the readers that even though Jesus was

gentle, He will return to judge evil. He will condemn those who rejected His salvation. The

defenseless *Jesus* will return to rule the world.

"Lord Jesus, You are the Lamb who died for the world. You will return as the Lamb to

judge the world. Amen."

Reading: Rev. 7:9-17

Words: 248

Key Thought: Jesus the meek Lamb shall return to judge the world.

THE VOICE OF THE LORD—HOLY SPIRIT

"The voice of the LORD is over the waters; the God of glory thunders; the LORD is over many waters. The voice of the LORD is powerful; the voice of the LORD is full of majesty. The voice of the LORD breaks the cedars, yes, the LORD splinters the cedars of Lebanon. The voice of the LORD divides the flames of fire. The voice of the LORD shakes the wilderness And in His temple everyone says, 'Glory!'" (Psalm 29:3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9).

The *Holy Spirit* speaks to people many ways; He speaks in an audible voice through inner urges, He speaks through prophets, and through miracle workers. The *Holy Spirit* speaks through the Scriptures. But constantly He speaks through the natural world, because the heavens and stars speak for Him (Ps. 19:1-6). The powerful hurricane may be His voice of physical punishment or powerful storm may be God's classroom to teach you spiritual lessons. You may be facing financial storms, vocational storms, family storms, or the storms of temptation. When the *Holy Spirit* allows troubling storms in your life, they can be *The Voice of the Lord*.

"Holy Spirit, make me listen to Your voice in the rain, and storms of life. Help me become sensitive to Your message, then help me do what You command."

The *Holy Spirit* speaks to you through an intermediate agency of tornadoes and floods. You don't know what trouble is heading your way, but the *Spirit* knows. You need to stay close to Him. He can prepare you for the coming storms, just as He can take care of you in the storms, and He can lead you out of the storms. He can make you victorious in spite of the storms. So, when the winds begin to blow, don't struggle; listen for the voice of the *Holy Spirit*.

"Holy Spirit, I don't want storms in my life, but if they must come; I'd rather have storms with You, than a calm day without You. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 29:1-11

Words: 250

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit can speak to you through storms.

LORD—DESPOTES—JESUS

"But there were also false prophets among the people, even as there will be false teachers among you, who will secretly bring in destructive heresies, even denying

the Lord who bought them, and bring on themselves swift destruction" (2 Peter

2:1).

Jesus is the Lord (Kurios) who rules the hearts of those who willingly learn of Him. But Jesus is

also the Lord (Despotes) who will force submission on those who reject and deny Him. There

are people who claim to know Jesus, but hold false teachings about Him. Jesus is the Lord

(Kurios) who gave them the freedom to believe, but He is also the Lord (Despotes) who will

punish those who reject the truth of Scripture. That's because they have chosen to reject Him.

The Bible describes their rebellion, "... they are willingly ignorant" (2 Pet. 3:5). Today, you

have the Scriptures; read its pages, learn of Him, obey its truth, and know the Lord (Kurios)

intimately.

"Jesus, I will open the pages of Scripture and will learn its teachings. I will obey its

truth and I will submit to Your rule."

Jesus will be the Lord (Kurios) to you and He will bless you because you have yielded to His

rule. Pray for those who reject the truth that their hearts will be turned to righteousness. To

those who reject Jesus, He will be the Lord (Despotes) to judge them in the final day. Those

who reject the rule of Jesus today, they will be forced to submit to His decisions and judgment in

the future.

"Jesus, I want to know doctrine as accurately as possible so I'll have Your blessing. I

want to know You as intimately as possible so I can be close as possible to the heart of

God. Amen."

Reading: 2 Peter 2:1-22

Words: 257

Key Thought: You must recognize the lordship of Christ.

THE WIND—HOLY SPIRIT

"The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit"

(John 3:8).

Just as the Holy Spirit originally blew breath into the lifeless clay body of Adam to give him

physical life, so the Holy Spirit breathed eternal life into you at salvation. Just as the body

without breath is dead, so those without the breath of the Holy Spirit are spiritually dead.

Because a person must be born again to see the Kingdom of God (John 3:7), the Holy Spirit

breathed His life into them so they will have a spiritual re-birth. The Holy Spirit is The Wind that

blows new life into those who believe in Jesus Christ. Let the *Holy Spirit*—the breath of God—

blow new life into you.

"Breathe on me, Wind of God. I'm hot and tired; a gentle refreshing wind would feel

good right now. The fire of opposition and the hot sands of this world have worn me

out."

The Holy Spirit is The Wind of God who constantly renews believers. When you think you've

walked too far and you feel too tired to go on, let Him refresh you. For those out of breath, He is

spiritual oxygen. You can't see the Holy Spirit working in your life, just like you can't see the

blowing wind. But, you can feel the results of an invigorating breeze, just as you can feel the

results of the Holy Spirit. Let Him renew your life.

"Holy Spirit, You are the breath of God that I need today. I can't make it spiritually

without Your wind in my sails. Breathe on me, breath of God. Amen."

Reading: John 3:1-8

Words: 259

Key Thought: The wind of the Holy Spirit can renew your life.

THE CHIEF CORNERSTONE—JESUS

"Therefore it is also contained in the Scripture, 'Behold, I lay in Zion a chief

cornerstone, elect, precious, and he who believes on Him will by no means be put to shame" (1 Peter 2:6). "Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone"

(Ephesians 2:20).

Jesus is The Chief Cornerstone, the foundation to Christianity and the church. He is the Chief

Cornerstone for your life. Just as a foundation is laid at the corner of a building and the

superstructure is built upon it, so Jesus is the spiritual foundation upon whom you must build

your life. He will give you direction how to live. Rest on Him; He can hold you up. He can

give you a secure future. Don't worry; He can hold you steady in the storm. When pressures

come, Jesus is a firm foundation. Do you need stability in your life today?

"Jesus, thank You for stability. I know I have weaknesses, and I know where I fail.

Thank You for never changing, for never failing. I will rest on You today."

Just as a cornerstone gives direction where the building will be built, Jesus is The Chief

Cornerstone who will give direction how to build your life. He has forgiven your sins, but the

Christian life is much more than salvation. You must live for Christ and serve Christ. You must

build every part of your life on Christ. He will direct how you should live and grow. Are you

building on His foundation?

"Jesus, I need Your direction in my life. I try to follow You, but sometimes I get

sidetracked in the details of life. Direct me what to do today and what to say. I need

help. Amen."

Reading: 1 Peter 2:1-10

Words: 241

Key Thought: Jesus will give stability to your life.

WATER—HOLY SPIRIT

"For I will pour water on him who is thirsty, and floods on the dry ground; I will

pour My Spirit on your descendants, and My blessing on your offspring" (Isaiah

44:3).

The Holy Spirit is Water for thirsty people. Some people thirst because they have worked too

hard. If that's you, drink of the Spirit. Some people need water because they're going through

hot difficult troubles. If that's you, drink of the Spirit. Still, others have dry parched throats

because they don't take time to stop for water. Their minds are on other things – good things –

so they forget to drink water. They forget spiritual water is necessary, so they don't take time for

the Holy Spirit, or for the Scriptures, prayer, or worship. But, your human body can only go so

long without water; then you lose strength and faint, or die. Only then do some realize how

important it is to drink regularly. Have you drunk spiritual *Water* today?

"Holy Spirit, You are good Water; I need You daily. Remind me to heed my thirst and

come drink of You daily."

The Holy Spirit's Water is more than life sustaining; His Water is satisfying. Many people seek

happiness through the lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, or pride of life; but pandering to the flesh

or ego will not bring ultimate happiness. While some of these things will give momentary

pleasure, there is nothing more satisfying than fellowshipping with your Creator. Come spend

time with the Lord; drink deeply for the greatest experience in life. Aren't you thirsty?

"Holy Spirit, I come for refreshing Water; fill me. I come because I'll die if I don't

drink; revive me. I come because I'm thirsty. Ah, how good Your Water is! Amen."

Reading: Isaiah 12:1-6

Words: 263

Key Thought: The Water of the Holy Spirit is refreshing.

THE ANOINTED OF GOD—JESUS

"Then I will raise up for Myself a faithful priest who shall do according to what is in My heart and in My mind. I will build him a sure house, and he shall walk

before My anointed forever" (1 Samuel 2:35). "The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against

His Anointed" (Psalm 2:2).

Jesus is The Anointed of God. The world anointed means "Messiah." When Jesus was born,

Israel was looking for their Messiah-Deliverer to drive their enemies into the sea. They longed

for a messiah to sit upon the throne of Israel and rule them in peace and righteousness. But Jesus

didn't come the first time as a soldier-messiah for political deliverance. He came to rule the

hearts of people and to give them principles by which they could experience inner peace and

righteousness. Any sensible king would rather rule by inner compulsion of his subjects, rather

than outward coercion. Let Jesus be your personal Messiah and let Him be your personal

Deliverer. Let Jesus anoint you this day for the task before you. Let Jesus rule your life.

"Lord Jesus, anoint me with Your strength to live this day; deliver me from selfishness

and temptations. Come sit upon the throne of my heart to rule my thoughts, feelings, and

actions."

Jesus is The Anointed of God who can anoint you with a fresh focus and renewed strength. He

can anoint you with confidence and a renewed determination to live righteously. He can anoint

you His presence so you can enjoy His peace. Know Jesus more intimately this day; that's your

key to personal deliverance.

"Lord, I wait for Your anointing. Let the oil of Your presence flow into my life. Heal me

when I hurt, renew me when I'm exhausted, strengthen me when I'm faint, and revive me

when I've lost my vision. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 2:1-5

Words: 253

Key Thought: The Lord's anointing can enrich your life.

THE VOICE OF YOUR THUNDER—HOLY SPIRIT

"The voice of Your thunder was in the whirlwind; The lightnings lit up the world;

The earth trembled and shook" (Psalm 77:18).

The Holy Spirit speaks in The Voice of Thunder to warn of approaching storms. When the

lightning flashes, people in the distance see it and know that bad weather is coming. People who

don't see lightning can hear the thunder warning and seek shelter. Thunder is not loud to scare

people, but the opposite, i.e., to warn people to seek safety and comfort during a storm. The

Holy Spirit is The Voice of Thunder, telling you that storms are coming to your life. There will

be different kinds of storms for different people, i.e., financial storms, family storms, legal

storms; and to others, storms of physical pain, religious persecution, and job stress. Life will not

always be easy, so listen to the Spirit's warnings. Prepare for difficulties by seeking the

protection of His presence.

"Lord, I will listen for Your voice that warns me of coming problems. I will be ready for

all things, both the good days and the bad. I will hide in Your presence."

The Voice of Thunder tells of storms far off when you don't see lightning on the far distant

horizon. These storms may take a long time to reach you, or they may go around you. So, praise

God for both *sending* the storms to teach and praise God for *keeping* away other storms.

"Lord, I will hide in Your presence when the windstorm tears up my outer life and I will

praise You when You keep them away. Amen."

Reading: Psalm 77:1-20

Words: 246

Key Thought: The Holy Spirit warns us of coming danger so we can prepare.

HORN OF SALVATION—JESUS

"And has raised up a horn of salvation for us In the house of His servant David"

(Luke 1:69).

The title for Jesus, Horn of Salvation, was a Hebraism that meant a son or heir. When King

Hezekiah had no male heir, there was no Horn Of Salvation until God gave him 15 additional

years and his first son was born in those years. Zechariah praised God for the coming Messiah—

the Horn of Salvation—who would be the son and heir to David's throne. Zechariah's son—

John the Baptist—would introduce Jesus the Messiah to the world. Therefore Zechariah rejoiced

and "was filled with the Holy Spirit" (Luke 1:67).

"Lord God, I praise You for sending Jesus who was the Son of David. I praise You for

sending Jesus who is my Savior."

The reference to horn comes from the utensils of that day. They didn't have water bottles or

canteens as we have. They carried liquid in the horn of an animal with the end plugged with soft

wood like a cork. In calling Jesus The Horn of Salvation, it is probably a reference to oil that

was kept in a horn. Jesus was the oil of fruitfulness, i.e., the son and heir to David that all Israel

expected. In application, Jesus pours the oil of fruitfulness upon our lives, giving us spirituality

and blessings.

"Lord Jesus, I wait for You, just as Israel was waiting for her Messiah. Pour Your oil on

my life. I need to experience Your presence and prosperity today. Amen."

Reading: Luke 1:57-80

Words: 238

Key Thought: Jesus is the son and heir to David's throne who pours spiritual blessings on us.

THE BABE—JESUS

"And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling

cloths, lying in a manger" (Luke 2:12).

Jesus is The Babe; born in Bethlehem, the One born to a virgin. He did not come in a spaceship,

nor by some aberrant or bizarre entrance into the world. Jesus existed throughout eternity past,

but "was made flesh" (John 1:14), and came as a little baby into the world. He needed a mother

to care and love Him, just as any other child. He played with other children and learned lessons

at Mary's knee. Because Jesus is human, He knows your problems. Will you talk to Him about

them?

"Lord, because You became human, You know how weak I am. I need strength to stand

as a Christian in a non-Christian world. I need strength to keep on living for You."

Jesus was The Babe, who grew in "wisdom and stature and in favor with God and men" (Luke

2:52), so He knows how you must grow both physically and spiritually. Because Jesus was The

Babe of Bethlehem, He can identify with your weaknesses and help you overcome them. "He

learned obedience by the things which He suffered" (Heb. 5:8), therefore, He can help you

through your pain and problems. Look to Jesus for help.

"Lord, I have never been spat upon for being a Christian, nor have they beaten me or

nailed me to a cross. But I face many hardships. Life is difficult, can You help me? I

look to Your human example; I'm trusting Your inner strength. Amen."

Reading: Luke 1:1-20

Words: 242

Key Thought: Jesus understands my problems because He was human.

HE WHO SANCTIFIES—JESUS

"For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one, for

which reason He is not ashamed to call them brethren" (Hebrews 2:11).

Jesus is He Who Sanctifies you. Will you let Him do it in your life? The moment you get saved,

Jesus begins sanctifying you because He said, "You in Me (communion), and I in you (union)"

(John 14:20). When you were saved, Jesus entered your life (communion) and He indwells your

life. But also, you were identified with *Jesus* in Heaven (union). This happened so you might be

sanctified, which means to be "set apart" from the world, the flesh, and the Devil. When you are

"set apart" to God, you are holy. He has already sanctified you in Heaven, now you must work it

out on earth in your daily life. You must set yourself apart from sin to live for Him.

"Lord Jesus, I want to live a holy life, but it's hard. Help me! I want to experience Your

presence daily, but I get distracted. Keep working Your sanctification in my life."

Jesus began a good work in you at conversion (Phil. 1:6), and He will continue to work in your

heart. Listen to His voice, heed His guidance, and let His indwelling presence work itself out in

your daily activities. No one will reach perfection in their earthly life, but you can grow toward

perfection when you let *Jesus* strengthen all you do.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for sanctifying me in Heaven. I want my earthly life to reflect my

heavenly position. Work today in my life to make me like You life. Amen."

Reading: Hebrews 2:5-12

Words: 248

Key Thought: I can grow to be like Christ.

THE SPIRIT WHO IS FROM GOD—HOLY SPIRIT

"Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God." (1

Corinthians 2:12).

The Holy Spirit is The Spirit Who Is From God. On the day of Pentecost, He was sent to

believers who were praying. He came with the sound of a mighty rushing wind and He appeared

as divided tongues, like as fire (Acts 2:2,3). Just as He came in outward powerful manifestation

on Pentecost, so He comes today in powerful inner workings of the heart. The world doesn't

think He's powerful, but who else can give great spiritual insight? Who else can transform a

loser into a winner? Who else can break compulsive, addictive habits? Who else can restore

harmony to ruptured homes? Who else can call a self-serving young person so that they give up

everything to minister among the heathen tribes? Don't just look for outward manifestations, but

look for the Holy Spirit to manifest Himself powerfully in your inner person. What He's done

for others, He can do for you.

"Holy Spirit, I know You've come from God into the world. Do a supernatural work in

my life; come manifest Yourself in me."

The Holy Spirit is sent from God. Today, He comes to let you "know the things that have been

freely given to us by God" (1 Cor. 2:12). Examine all the Holy Spirit can do for you and claim

His work today.

"Holy Spirit, come teach me about the blessings that are mine. I want to walk and serve

in the life-changing power that is available to me. Amen."

Reading: Acts 18:24-28

Words: 245

Key Thought: God sends the Holy Spirit to transform us.

THE FRUIT OF YOUR WOMB—JESUS

"Then she spoke out with a loud voice and said, 'Blessed are you among women,

and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" (Luke 1:42).

Jesus is The Fruit of Mary's Womb. The Holy Spirit supernaturally conceived Jesus in the

Virgin Mary and nine months later He was born in Bethlehem. Jesus was eternal, "In the

beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1).

"Jesus came forth from the Father" (John 16:28). While Jesus' Spirit and personality came from

Heaven, His physical body came from Mary. Jesus can rightly be called The Fruit of Mary's

Womb. When Mary watched Jesus grow, she saw her physical son developing. The Bible calls

Jesus "her firstborn Son" (Matt. 1:25).

"Lord Jesus, thank You for becoming flesh to live as a man. Thank You for limiting

Yourself to be like finite people, so You could die for them."

Jesus the Eternal God became fully man. Jesus the Man was fully God. He was the God-Man,

always fully God and always fully Man. While we humans can't understand it, we read these

apparent contradictions in the Bible, and accept them both. They harmonize perfectly in *Jesus*.

As a human, Jesus got tired, slept, hungered and was thirsty. He didn't know who touched Him

(Mark 5:31), and didn't know the date of the Second Coming (Matt. 24:36), but Jesus knew He

was coming back. As God, Jesus raised the dead, calmed a storm, and could read people's

thoughts (Mark 2:8).

"Lord Jesus, thank You for coming to earth to be born of Mary; I will try to follow Your

example as man; I will worship You as God. Amen."

Reading: Luke 1:36-45

Words: 257

Key Thought: Jesus received His body from Mary through which He fulfilled His task on earth.

THE SPIRIT OF HIM WHO RAISED UP JESUS - HOLY SPIRIT

"But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His

Spirit who dwells in you" (Romans 8:11).

Did you see the Trinity in today's verse? First, The Spirit Who Raised Up Jesus is the Holy

Spirit. Second, the prepositional phrase of Him refers to the Father. When the Father decreed

Jesus' resurrection, the Holy Spirit was the One who did it. And obviously, Jesus is the third

person of the Godhead. All three persons of the Trinity were active in the resurrection of Jesus

that provided new life for you.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, for it demonstrates

that my sins were forgiven. Let my new Christian life be a testimony for You today."

You get many other benefits from Jesus' resurrection. You were raised with Jesus to a new

position in the heavenlies (Eph. 2:5, 6). You can claim God's blessings, for you are spiritually

seated with Christ in glory. You are also indwelt with divine power to live a godly life (Rom.

1:4). Now you can call on the power of Christ for victory over sin. Finally, in the last day, the

Father will raise our human bodies through the *Holy Spirit*, just as the *Spirit* gave life to the body

of Jesus. Let the *Holy Spirit* work through you today.

"Holy Spirit, thank You for the new resurrected life that is available to me. I want

resurrection power to overcome temptation and adversity. I want my earthly life to

reflect my new position in the heavenlies. Thank You for the promise that my mortal

body will be raised with resurrection power in the last day. Amen."

Reading: Ephesians 2:1-10

Words: 259

Key Thought: The power of the Holy Spirit that raised up Jesus is available to you.

HE WHO COMES DOWN FROM HEAVEN—JESUS

"For the bread of God is He who comes down from heaven and gives life to the

world" (John 6:33).

Jesus is the only One Who Comes Down From Heaven, therefore He is the only person to ever

have pre-existence. He lived in Heaven before He was born. "I came forth from the Father and

have come into the world. Again, I leave the world and go to the Father" (John 16:28). What

does that mean to you? Because Jesus came from Heaven—the Eternal City—He can give you

heavenly life, i.e., eternal life. But, Jesus knows all about Heaven because He lived there, so He

can tell us how we will live in our future home. Also, Jesus lived with the Father, so He can tell

us about going to live with the Father. Because Jesus came from Heaven, He can give us a little

bit of Heaven on Earth. He promised, "Those who love and obey Me, the Father and I will come

live in them" (John 14:23, Author's Translation).

"Lord Jesus, I worship You, the Eternal One. You live from eternity past to eternity

future. I thank You for coming to Earth to show us the Father, and to die for our sins."

Jesus is He Who Comes Down From Heaven to tell us there's life and glory beyond the grave. If

Jesus had not come, we'd live and die like the animals. We'd be without hope for this life and

without hope of life after death.

"Lord Jesus, thank You for giving me reason to live, and thank You for hope in the next

life. Thank You for living in my life and giving me a little taste of Heaven on Earth.

Amen."

Reading: Revelation 22:1-21

Words: 268

Key Thought: Jesus came from Heaven to give us the assurance of going there.

HEIR OF ALL THINGS – JESUS

"(God) Has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed

heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds" (Hebrews 1:2).

Jesus is the *Heir of All Things*, because at the end of this age, all things will be given to Him.

But right now, Satan is the god of this world (2 Cor. 4:3). Right now people are driven by their

lust of the flesh, lust of their eyes, and pride of life (1 John 2:15). The curse has hidden the

ultimate beauty of nature (Rom. 8:20, 21), and the Jews—God's people—are blinded to the

gospel (2 Cor. 3:14). But one day, the Father will reclaim all; He will control all things

absolutely. Then the Father will give everything to Jesus because He is the appointed Heir of all

things. Then Jesus will share it all with you because you are His servants. Right now, His

servants may suffer physical problems, and some are persecuted and martyred. Right now it

seems Christians lose one battle for every one they win. Right now, Satan seems to have a

strong hand, but one day Christians will enjoy all things with their Lord.

"Lord Jesus, I pray, 'Your Kingdom come in my life.' I want You to rule my heart today."

You may not receive your rewards in this life; although you will enjoy many spiritual blessings.

And you will not receive every thing the moment you die. When Jesus receives all things at the

end of the age, then you'll receive your proper reward.

"Lord Jesus, I don't serve You for a reward. I serve You for the ultimate experience of

knowing and enjoying Your presence. Amen."

Key Thought: Jesus will receive all spiritual blessings at the end of the age and will share them

with you.
