THE BAPTISM AND TEMPTATION OF JESUS

HIS BAPTISM (Mt. 3:13-17; Lk. 3:21, 22)

The Summary	The significance
The appeal by the Son. Jesus asks a reluctant John to baptize Him	This is the clearest illustration of the Trinity in all the Bible
 The anointing by the Spirit. The Holy Spirit, like a dove comes upon Him 	It is the first of three occasions where the Father orally approves of His Son
The approval by the Father	 It marks the first recorded example of Jesus' prayer life
"And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."	It serves as the introduction to His prophetical office

HIS TEMPTATION (Mt. 4:1-11; Lk. 4:1-13)

The Summary	The Significance
Jesus is attacked by the Devil! 1st. Temptation: "Turn stones into bread" 2nd. Temptation: "Jump off the Temple" 3rd. Temptation: "Fall down and worship me" Jesus is acquitted by the Scriptures! He counters each temptation by quoting God's Word Jesus is assisted by the angels "angels came and ministered to Him"	 The first Adam was tempted in a beautiful garden, the second Adam in a desolate wilderness Satan defeats the first Adam but was himself defeated by the second Adam This marks the first occasion where angels aided Christ It is the only time where Satan quotes Scripture! The purpose of the temptations was to prove Jesus could not and would not sin!
