TUESDAY: JESUS COMMENDS A POOR WIDOW (Mt. 12:41-44)

The Poor Widow

- **When A Lot Was A Little:**

⁴¹And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much. (Mk. 12:41)

- **When A Little Was A Lot:**

⁴²And there came a certain poor widow, and she threw in two mites, which make a farthing. ⁴³And he called unto him his disciples, and saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: ⁴⁴For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living. (Mk. 12:42-44)

TUESDAY: JESUS WEEPS OVER JERUSALEM (Mt. 23:37-39)

The Tears Over Jerusalem

- **The Desire** - What Jesus wants to do (23:37a): To gather and protect Israel
- **The Denial** - What Jesus could not do (23:37b): He had been rejected by Israel
- **The Desolation** - What Jesus must do (23:38-39): To remove His presence from Israel until The Great Tribulation

TUESDAY: JESUS DELIVERS HIS MT. OLIVET DISCOURSE (Mt. 24:1-25:46)

The Two Predictions

1. The Great Tribulation

- **The First Half (Mt. 24:1-8):** *⁸All these are the beginning of sorrows. (Mt. 24:8)*
- **The Second Half (Mt. 24:9-28):** *²¹For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be. (Mt. 24:21)*

2. The Second Coming

- **The Return Of Christ (Mt. 24:29-30):** *³⁰And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. (Mt. 24:30)*
- **The Re-Gathering Of Israel (Mt. 24:31):** *³¹And he shall send his angels with a great sound of a trumpet, and they shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other. (Mt. 24:31)*
