PREDICTIONS BY JESUS, PLOTS AGAINST JESUS

WEDNESDAY: THE PREDICTIONS BY JESUS

Jesus Predicted His Sufferings, Death, And Resurrection On Four Key Occasions

1 - After Peter's Confession

²¹From that time forth began Jesus to shew unto his disciples, how that he must go unto Jerusalem, and suffer many things of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised again the third day. (Mt. 16:21)

2 - After His Transfiguration

²²And while they abode in Galilee, Jesus said unto them, The Son of man shall be betrayed into the hands of men: ²³And they shall kill him, and the third day he shall be raised again. And they were exceeding sorry. (Mt. 17:22-23)

3 - Just Prior To The Final Week

¹⁷And Jesus going up to Jerusalem took the twelve disciples apart in the way, and said unto them, ¹⁸Behold, we go up to Jerusalem; and the Son of man shall be betrayed unto the chief priests and unto the scribes, and they shall condemn him to death, ¹⁹And shall deliver him to the Gentiles to mock, and to scourge, and to crucify him: and the third day he shall rise again. (Mt. 20:17-19)

4 - Wednesday Of The Final Week

¹And it came to pass, when Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said unto his disciples, ²Ye know that after two days is the feast of the passover, and the Son of man is betrayed to be crucified. (Mt. 26:1-2)

WEDNESDAY: THE PLOTS AGAINST JESUS

Jesus Is Plotted Against On Two Key Occasions

• The Plot By The Jewish Rulers:

³Then assembled together the chief priests, and the scribes, and the elders of the people, unto the palace of the high priest, who was called Caiaphas, ⁴And consulted that they might take Jesus by subtilty, and kill him. ⁵But they said, Not on the feast day, lest there be an uproar among the people. (Mt. 26:3-5).

• The Plot By The Traitor:

³Then entered Satan into Judas surnamed Iscariot, being of the number of the twelve. (Lk.22:3) ¹⁴Then one of the twelve, called Judas Iscariot, went unto the chief priests, ¹⁵And said unto them, What will ye give me, and I will deliver him unto you? ¹⁶And they covenanted with him for thirty pieces of silver. And from that time he sought opportunity to betray him. (Mt. 26:14-16)
