- "Kitchen, Children, and Church"




Figure 3: GERMAN PROPAGANDA POSTER: 'MOTHERS WORKING WOMEN' (Propaganda Poster, n.d., https://www.alexautographs.com/auction-lot/german-propaganda-poster-'mothers-working-women' ADE494180C)

- Warden of the women's section of Bergen-Belsen.

- Commandant of the Plaszow Camp
- Made popular by Schindler's List




Figure 6: Commandant Amon Goeth stands with his rifle on the balcony of his villa in the Plaszow concentration camp. (Amon Goeth, n.d., https://collections.ushmm.org/search/catalog/pa31497)

The Hierarchy of "Worseness"

- To establish a hierarchy of suffering there too must be a hierarchy of worseness
- Separating the quantitative evidence and the emotional testimony
- Preconceived notions of gentleness and kindness often associated with the female gender
- When met with brutality the women appear worse

Post - Liberation Attitudes

- Their youth added to the curiosity of their brutality
- Shelly Cline
 - 84% of women convicted
 - 50% of men
- Their attitude and appearance in the trials




Figure 8: Irma Grese & Auschwitz: Holocaust and the Secrets of the The Blonde Beast, (Irma Grese Book 1, n.d., https://www.barnesandnoble.com/w/irma-grese-auschwitz-raymond-jennings/1123332997)

 actions and lives




Figure 9: Irma Grese: Hitler's WW2 Female Monsters Exposed. (https://www.amazon.com/Irma-Grese-Hitlers-Monsters-Exposed-ebook/db/B07JHZN1CC)
