TWO

- C. “But it’s the truth,” he said. “Sin brings suffering!” (2:7-11)
- D. But then—the Lord to lead back to the land (2:12-13)

THREE

- A. “They’re eating my people alive!” (3:1-4)
- B. A good bribe, a good prophecy. No bribe, a bad prophecy! (3:5-7)
- C. But he was different (3:8)
- D. “Jerusalem will fall, and it’s all your fault,” he said (3:9-12)

FOUR

- A. The righteous city to become the ruling city (4:1-2)
- B. The ultimate in disarmament (4:3-8)
- C. But pain controls the present (4:9-10)
- D. His plan? To give them power over the pagans (4:11-13)

FIVE

- A. From the House of Bread will come the Bread of Life (5:1-7)
- B. Also the Lion from the tribe of Judah (5:8-15)
